## **Sponsor Statement for Committee Substitute for House Bill 424 (AM)**

House Bill 424 allows Alaskans to vote on a general obligation bond package for statewide education and educational research facilities.

The proposal totals \$397,200,000 for major K-12 and University of Alaska educational facilities around the state and would provide additional funding for Alaska's educational system. The proposal also funds a vocational center in Southeast Alaska.

House Bill 424 is similar to legislation that passed in 2002 which authorized \$236,805,441 in general obligation bond authority for statewide educational facilities. That proposal was adopted by 59.6% of the voters at the November 2002 general election. This was the first general obligation bond vote for education projects since 1978. Since statehood, Alaskan voters have approved over ten general obligation bonding packages.

Using state general obligation bonds is the right step in addressing our educational infrastructure backlog by accelerating the completion of many statewide projects. The bonds will be sold utilizing the "Build America Bond" financing mechanism that Congress passed in the stimulus package in 2009. Under this mechanism, the federal government would cover up to 35% of the interest over the 20 year maturity of the bond.

If adopted, this proposal would be placed on the ballot at this November's general election.

The Bill authorizes Alaska's voters to consider up to \$397.2 million in general obligation bonds. The bonds would carry the full faith and taxing authority of the State, and thereby achieve the lowest interest rate available. If the proposition were approved in November 2010 it is anticipated that bonds would be issued in early 2011, unless there are compelling financial reasons to sell the bonds more quickly. The current interest rate is very favorable with 20 year amortization debt for credits similar to Alaska achieving interest rates below 4% by using temporary programs like the Build America Bond program. Interest rate achieved will depend on market conditions at the time bonds are sold. For modeling purposes the Department used an assumed interest rate of 4.2% with a 20 year amortization, however in today's market debt service would be approximately \$1 million lower per year. Miscellaneous costs include statutory requirements related to public notice and information dissemination prior to the election.

RE: Election to Approve or Reject a State General Obligation Bond  
*LRS Report 10.243*

You asked about elections for voters to approve or reject general obligation (GO) bonds. Specifically, you wished to know when would be the earliest that a GO bond question could be before Alaska voters.

The November 2010 general election would be the earliest opportunity for a GO bond question to be placed before voters unless a special election were held for the purpose. There are two options for special elections, either of which could get the question to voters before November, but both have significant drawbacks:

- The Legislature could call for a special election independent of either the primary or general election. Because this would not be a regularly scheduled election, the Division of Elections would first need to gain preclearance from the U.S. Department of Justice under the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and amendments. Preclearance requires a *minimum* of 60 days. Division personnel would also need to marshal polling places and election workers—typically difficult during summer fishing seasons—as well as to print election materials and ballots. Printing and publishing materials on the election would not be possible until after preclearance. Realistically, a special election under this option would likely be unable to occur before the third week in July—about one month before the August primary—and would require an appropriation of nearly \$1 million. An election in July would likely receive less attention and see fewer voters than does the fall general election.<sup>1</sup>
- Alternatively, the Legislature could designate the August primary as a special election for the purpose. August elections, however, typically have lower voter interest and lower turnout than elections in November.
