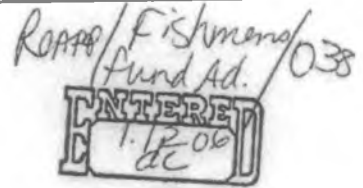

Dear Representatives:

I served with Lynn Keogh on a subcommittee appointed by the Board of Game. The purpose of the subcommittee was to see if consensus could be reached on methods of resolving conflicts between trappers and hikers with dogs. The subcommittee met six times and each meeting lasted most of a day. The Department provided significant support to the committee.

I was one of the hikers while Mr. Keogh was one of the trappers. I think consensus could have been reached, and at least one of the trappers worked hard, politely making the case for trappers. Mr. Keogh did not work hard to reach consensus.

Instead, Mr. Keogh started almost every meeting with a personal attack on the hiker members of the subcommittee. A great deal of time was wasted on his personal attacks, and the long process ended with no consensus. I strongly oppose his appointment to the Board of Game for that reason.

I have checked the Alaska Court system's website. There are numerous cases involving Mr. Keogh. The docket sheets of the more recent cases show at least four judgments against him, all of which appear to be unpaid. (I base the foregoing on the assumption the Court system's website is accurate.)

Some of the cases predate the court's system's conversion to the system now in use which provides some of this information on-line. I have not taken the time (and I cannot take the time) to check the actual court files for any of these cases.

But I think that the Legislature should check the court records for each of these numerous cases.

The Board of Game is an important State Administrative Board. I do not think there is a place on the Board of Game for a person with a general disrespect for the law. The numerous cases, and the available public records for each of these cases, may show that Mr. Keogh has no respect for the law.

My guess is that even the most ardent supporters of predator control and trapping will ask that Mr. Keogh's nomination be withdrawn if it should become clear that Mr. Keogh has a long record of demonstrated disrespect for the law. I urge you to withhold judgment until the public court records for each of these cases is obtained, and reviewed and summarized by objective Legislative staff members, and by at least some members of your committee.

PERSONAL BACKGROUND

Much of our diet comes from the wild food we harvest and each year's bounty from the garden.

I have no formal or professional training in wildlife management. My experience comes from a combination of personal field observation spending time in the natural environment, and a layman's study of applicable state and federal fish and game laws.

In part because of my personal interest in the outdoors, my work as a legislative aide often involved resource issues, which allowed me to hear many hours of testimony from Alaskans who expressed their perspectives and strong opinions on a wide range of fish and wildlife issues. I was also fortunate to have worked toward the passage of laws that have benefited hunters and trappers. My service on the board of directors of the Alaska Outdoor Council, including two years as president, has further broadened my understanding and appreciation of how important wildlife and the outdoors are to the people of the state. I have attended local Advisory Committee meetings, offered testimony to the Game Board, and provided public comments to the National Park Service on proposals of impact to the people, land, fish and game of my area.

Enabling present and future Alaskans to be responsible stewards of the resource, and to continue building and strengthening our outdoor heritage by assuring opportunity, are objectives I consider very meaningful and important. I believe they are goals that can be pursued and achieved through the efforts of the Board of Game, and I would be grateful for the opportunity to serve in that capacity.
