Orville Huntington was born in Huslia, Alaska and received a B.S. in Wildlife Biology from University of Alaska, Fairbanks. Mr. Huntington is dedicated to working closely with young people to promote the values of traditional Native elders combined with contemporary western knowledge. He is committed to protecting the aboriginal rights of Native people to continue to live a subsistence way of life and preserve the cultural beliefs associated with that way of life as it is consistent with State and Federal law. His primary responsibilities continue to be the preservation of Native subsistence hunting, fishing, gathering and trapping opportunities and the cultural events that surround those beliefs, and as a public servant for the village of Huslia and the 43 villages of the Tanana Chiefs Conference region.

Mr. Huntington currently works as the Wildlife and Parks Director for the Tanana Chiefs Conference. Prior to that, he served for 14 years as a Refuge Information Technician at the Koyukuk/Nowitna NWR Complex and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. As a scientist he worked closely with local village people in the villages of Kaltag, Nulato, Koyukuk, Galena, Ruby, Huslia and Hughes on subsistence surveys.

About the Board

The Alaska Board of Fisheries consists of seven members serving three-year terms. Members are appointed by the governor and confirmed by the legislature. Members are appointed on the basis of interest in public affairs, good judgment, knowledge, and ability in the field of action of the board, with a view to providing diversity of interest and points of view in the membership (see Alaska Statute 16.05.221).

The Board of Fisheries' main role is to conserve and develop the fishery resources of the state. This involves setting seasons, bag limits, methods and means for the state's subsistence, commercial, sport, guided sport, and personal use fisheries, and it also involves setting policy and direction for the management of the state's fishery resources. The board is charged with making allocative decisions, and the department is responsible for management based on those decisions.

The board meeting cycle is three years long. The Meetings generally occur from October through March. The Board of Fisheries meets four to six times per year in communities around the state to consider proposed changes to fisheries regulations around the state. The board uses the biological and socioeconomic information provided by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, public comment received from people inside and outside of the state, and guidance from the Alaska Department of Public Safety and Alaska Department of Law when creating regulations that are sound and enforceable.

Board of Fisheries Authority

The Board of Fisheries is established under Alaska Statute 16.05.221 for the purposes of the conservation and development of the fisheries resources of the state. The Board of Fisheries has the authority to adopt

regulations described in AS 16.05.251 including: establishing open and closed seasons and areas for taking fish; setting quotas, bag limits, harvest levels and limitations for taking fish; and establishing the methods and means for the taking of fish. The regulations the Board of Fisheries has authority over are 5 AAC Chapters 1- 77.

Mr. Paskvan,

On Monday, your Resources Committee will be vetting Karl Jonstone for re-appointment to the Board of Fisheries. As I'm sure you know by now, there are serious questions about his residency as well as his fitness to serve on that board. I know you are in possession of some documents that have been making the rounds pointing out some of the more serious allegations against him.

I will be signed up to testify at my local LIO, but that testimony does not offer the opportunity to ask questions of Mr. Johnstone. You, however, will have that opportunity.

As I mentioned in an email to Mr. Kawasaki, which I believe has been forwarded to you by his staff member, Mindy O'Neill, I am very concerned not only about Mr. Johnstone's residency, but also about the inclusion of Bob Penny in internal BOF emails. In the off-chance you did not get a copy of that email, I'm pasting in the content of my portion of that exchange below.

Bob Penny is a well-known, powerful, and influential Kenai businessman with a vested interest in eliminating as much of commercial salmon fishing in upper Cook Inlet as possible,

My hope is that as co-chair of the Senate Resources Committee, in addition to the residency questions, etc, you will ask pertinent questions of Mr. Johnstone regarding why on earth Mr. Penny has been included in internal BOF emails, and when he will be able to provide copies of all the emails that were blind-copied to Mr. Penny. I also would like to know who else has been included on that email chain, specifically which members of the Kenai River Sportfishing Association, such as Ricky Gease, Rueben Hanke, etc.

With regards to the question about him having flown to Georgia to have Billy Morris, of Morris Communications which owns the Alaska Journal of Commerce, kill a follow-up story about his residency, the person to whom he was overheard bragging that he did that was Rueben Hanke.

As I said in my email to Mr. Kawasaki, this all points to a level of corruption in the Board of Fisheries that is nothing short of astounding. The fact that it goes at least as far up the ladder as Kelly Hepler is unforgivable, and something that the legislature should be very, very concerned about. Is this the way we want the people's business to be conducted? Please, please look into these allegations before you move his confirmation out of committee.

Mr Kawasaki,

Thank you for asking the questions you did of Karl Johnstone at yesterday's hearing. I suspect he did indeed have those documents you were working from, he just hadn't figured out how to counter some of the allegations

yet. It would have been nice to have asked him if he had access to his email where he was so that he could have read them before you continued. That being said, I'm wondering when he will again be available in a public setting to answer the rest of your questions on the record?

One thing that did not make it into the documents you had, the State apparently tried to pay John Jensen a per diem at a meeting in Petersburg, his home town, (although he did not ask for it and did not cash it,) presumably to be able to say, "See, OTHER people get per diems in their home towns, too!" This would come out in an audit of Boards Support books.

One thing that bothers me almost as much as him not being a resident is the inclusion of Bob Penny in internal BOF emails. We have always known that Bob ran the Cook Inlet meetings; at the last round he would walk through the back of the room when the board took a break, nod his head, and the four board members who consistently voted with the sport fishermen would follow him out of the room (the votes were consistently 4-3). To find out that Bob is included in internal board business is just too much. And Kelly Hepler KNEW he was being copied, he REPLIED to him! I need to know, and so does everyone else in Cook Inlet, the extent of Bob's influence on this board and the broader ADF&G in Cook Inlet decisions, and the extent of his inclusion in internal board emails.

Please don't let this fall between the cracks. All of this is true and will be made public, Morris Communications is not the only game in town. The Board of Fisheries is corrupt in its current form, and any decisions made 4-3 when it turns out Johnstone was not a resident at the time of the 2011 Cook Inlet meetings should be thrown out. Please make the necessary investigations.

Dear Legislator,

On April 10 you will be asked to confirm a non-resident, KARL JOHNSTONE, to the Board of Fish (BOF). We ask you to say no to this appointment and ask the Governor to nominate a resident of Alaska who will fairly and objectively represent the resource for those who utilize our fisheries resources for work and recreation.

Karl Johnstone, the Governor's nominee, no longer lives in Alaska year round and is not qualified to serve on the BOF. News reports and documents received through the Freedom of Information Act from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game indicate that Mr. Johnstone lives in Arizona for at least eight months out of the year. His home in Anchorage, which he claims as his "primary residence," is occupied for only a couple of months during the summer. When Karl returns to Alaska for BOF Meetings in his "home town," he stays in a hotel on the State's dime, claiming per diem rather than opening the home he shutters for the winter.

Karl is the only Board or Commission member statewide receiving these special payments, contrary to Statute and the Alaska Administrative Manual. Why? Prior to his appointment to the BOF in 2008, Mr. Johnstone did not receive a Permanent Fund Dividend (PFD) check. Once appointed, he began claiming a PFD check. Public Records Requests were submitted and have brought residency problems to light which the Legislature should look into immediately. The financial records we have seen entered from the department indicate illegal payments were made. It is time for a Legislative audit of the Boards Support budget to discover if there are serious irregularities concerning a non-resident BOF Member. The Department and the Board process should be above reproach and fair and legal for all.

From the public records request, it is obvious that some staff in the Department knows Mr. Johnstone resides for a majority of the year in Arizona. Department staff should have informed the Governor to prevent him from making this nomination. In looking at Mr. Johnstone's history, it is revealed that there is a long history of ethical issues. Alaska residents should be able to rely on a vetting process within the Governor's office. A full review of Mr. Johnstone's records should occur to determine if Mr. Johnstone's appointment is legal, or has resulted in illegal payments as he travels from Arizona to Alaska for BOF meetings.

On March 4, the Alaska Journal of Commerce published a story on Mr. Johnstone that raised the issue of residency and illegal payments. Mr. Johnstone authored a full page opinion piece which spoke of how the BOF works, but never answered the original questions of residency and illegal payments. Mr. Johnstone was overheard boasting to "his constituents" that he was going to Georgia to get future stories concerning himself pulled. William Morris, the owner of the Alaska Journal of Commerce, lives in Georgia. What happened to the follow-up article? Did Mr. Johnstone pressure the Alaska Journal of Commerce to back off, one can only guess. In time, the answers will come out; we hope you will not embarrass Alaska residents by re-confirming this individual in the BOF.

Judge's integrity comes under question as election issue

Low ratings for integrity, by lawyers in general and by his fellow judges in particular, are why the Alaska Judicial Council recommended that Karl Johnstone be removed from the Anchorage Superior Court bench, according to council Executive Director Hal Brown.



Johnstone said the ratings are basically a popularity contest and pointed out that he has never been sanctioned or disciplined by any of the panels that oversee judicial conduct.

"My integrity is unblemished," he said.

Of 17 judges on the ballot for retention Nov. 8, only Johnstone has been deemed "not qualified" by the judicial council. Partly because voters rarely have independent information about how judges do their jobs, the council's judgment could spell real trouble for him.

The rating is done by lawyers, judges, police and probation officers in a written, anonymous survey.

Johnstone was rated by 631 people. He received acceptable or better ratings from lawyers and judges in categories dealing with legal ability and administrative skills; law enforcement officers in general rated him acceptable or better in all categories except "freedom from arrogance."

He ran into trouble in categories listed under judicial temperament and integrity, including an unacceptable integrity rating from judges in the Third Judicial District and from judges statewide.

An acceptable rating is 3. Johnstone was given an average rating of 2.8 by other judges.

He categorized it as the equivalent of a C-minus and

said he thought it should be better.

Judges who said they had substantial direct professional experience with Johnstone rated him slightly lower, at 2.8, according to council figures.

"We're talking about people who are not only lawyers," Brown said, "they're judges, presumably the people who are working most closely day to day with Judge Johnstone."

Said Brown: "No Superior Court judge has ever received an unacceptable survey rating in integrity, from the time that the judicial council started doing surveys, which was in 1978."

Judge Mark Rowland, Johnstone's colleague and longtime friend on the Superior Court bench, said he knows of no reason why anyone should question Johnstone's integrity.

"I've known Judge Johnstone for a long time. I know him to be an excellent judge and a valuable addition to the bench in Anchorage," Rowland said.

On the survey, integrity is defined as conducting oneself in a manner free from impropriety or the appearance of impropriety. Respondents do not have to back up their ratings with specific allegations.

Johnstone said he was disturbed and puzzled by his low marks. "It's impossible for me to respond to an anonymous rating on integrity."

Said Johnstone: "There's not a public employee in the state who gets rated on the basis of anonymous ratings."

He attributed the low grades to old grudges from lawyers and judges he pushed too hard during his early years on the bench in an effort to make the court system more efficient.

He was appointed by Jay Hammond in 1979.

"I pushed real hard initially, too hard initially; and I've been outspoken; and I've nev-

er adopted the company line or joined the fraternity that says leave well enough alone; and it's made me unpopular. ... Grudges just sometimes don't die. ... What better way to get back at a judge you don't like for one reason or another ... than to be able to anonymously attack his integrity without having to identify yourself and without having to be specific?"

Johnstone originally attributed the judicial council's recommendation that he not be retained to a 2.2 rating on "freedom from arrogance" — the lowest rating he received in any category. Brown said that was not so.

"His very poor ratings as far as arrogance were not the leading reasons. ... The focus would have to be on the integrity."

Brown also disputed John-

stone's suggestion that people who didn't like him simply voted across the board against him. "They marked him low on eight out of 20 categories. They didn't just go through and vote the entire ticket, so-called."

And although law enforcement officers in general gave Johnstone an acceptable 3.2 rating for integrity, those who said they had substantial direct professional experience with him rated him an unacceptable 2.8, Brown said.

Judge's integrity comes under question as election issue

Low ratings for integrity, by judges in general and by his fellow judges in particular, are why the Alaska Judicial Council recommended that Karl Johnstone be removed from the Anchorage Superior Court bench, according to council Executive Director Hal Brown.



But Johnstone said the ratings are basically a popularity contest and pointed out that he has never been sanctioned or disciplined by any of the panels that oversee judicial conduct.

"My integrity is unblemished," he said.

Of 17 judges on the ballot for retention Nov. 8, only Johnstone has been deemed "not qualified" by the judicial council. Partly because voters rarely have independent information about how judges do their jobs, the council's judgment could spell real trouble for him.

The rating is done by lawyers, judges, police and probation officers in a written, anonymous survey.

Johnstone was rated by 631 people. He received acceptable or better ratings from lawyers and judges in categories dealing with legal ability and administrative skills; law enforcement officers in general rated him acceptable or better in all categories except "freedom from arrogance."

He ran into trouble in categories listed under judicial temperament and integrity, including an unacceptable integrity rating from judges in the Third Judicial District and from judges statewide.

An acceptable rating is 3. Johnstone was given an average rating of 2.8 by other judges.

He categorized himself as the equivalent of a C-minus and

said he thought it should be better.

Judges who said they had substantial direct professional experience with Johnstone rated him slightly lower, at 2.6, according to council figures.

"We're talking about people who are not only lawyers," Brown said, "they're judges, presumably the people who are working most closely day to day with Judge Johnstone."

Said Brown: "No Superior Court judge has ever received an unacceptable survey rating in integrity, from the time that the judicial council started doing surveys, which was in 1976."

Judge Mark Rowland, Johnstone's colleague and longtime friend on the Superior Court bench, said he knows of no reason why anyone should question Johnstone's integrity.

"I've known Judge Johnstone for a long time. I know him to be an excellent judge and a valuable addition to the bench in Anchorage," Rowland said.

On the survey, integrity is defined as conducting oneself in a manner free from impropriety or the appearance of impropriety. Respondents do not have to back up their ratings with specific allegations.

Johnstone said he was disturbed and puzzled by his low marks. "It's impossible for me to respond to an anonymous rating on integrity."

Said Johnstone: "There's not a public employee in the state who gets rated on the basis of anonymous ratings."

He attributed the low grades to old grudges from lawyers and judges he pushed too hard during his early years on the bench in an effort to make the court system more efficient.

He was appointed by Jay Hammond in 1979.

"I pushed real hard initially, too hard initially; and I've been outspoken; and I've nev-

er adopted the company line or joined the fraternity that says leave well enough alone; and it's made me unpopular. ... Grudges just sometimes don't die. ... What better way to get back at a judge you don't like for one reason or another ... than to be able to anonymously attack his integrity without having to identify yourself and without having to be specific?"

Johnstone originally attributed the judicial council's recommendation that he not be retained to a 2.2 rating on "freedom from arrogance" — the lowest rating he received in any category. Brown said that was not so.

"His very poor ratings as far as arrogance were not the leading reasons. ... The focus would have to be on the integrity."

Brown also disputed John-

stone's suggestion that people who didn't like him simply voted across the board against him. "They marked him low on eight out of 20 categories. They didn't just go through and vote the entire ticket, so-called."

And although law enforcement officers in general gave Johnstone an acceptable 3.2 rating for integrity, those who said they had substantial direct professional experience with him rated him an unacceptable 2.9, Brown said.

2. Mr. Johnstone has failed to comply with an ADF&G public records request for copies of e-mails he sent to other BOF members along with upper level staff from ADF&G. He also apparently “BLIND” copied Bob Penny. Had Bob Penny not hit the “Reply to All” button, we would have never known Karl Johnstone was sending emails to non-BOF and Department individuals. We still don’t know is who else was “BLIND” copied on the emails. As a former Judge, he should comply with the public records request, just as other BOF members have and disclose this chain of e-mails before he is confirmed.
3. In 2000, Mr. Johnstone was publicly reprimanded by the Alaska State Supreme Court for creating the appearance of impropriety in the hiring of Richard McVeigh. <http://www.touchngo.com/sp/html/sp-5273.htm>
4. In December 2011, Mr. Johnstone accepted a car ride from a lobbyist for Kenai River Sport Fishing to and from a BOF meeting in Valdez. This financial gratuity from a lobbyist has never been disclosed.
5. When Mr. Johnstone was originally appointed to the BOF in 2008, he did not receive a PFD. But, he now “qualifies” for a 2009, 2010 and 2011 PFD because he returns for BOF meetings in the winter.
6. In 2007, 2008 or 2009, Mr. Johnstone did not qualify for the City of Anchorage residential property tax exemption. Now, in 2010 and 2011, he has received the exemption. Under the exemption rules, he must occupy his Anchorage residence for at least 185 days per year.
7. In 2010, as a “resident” of Arizona, he did not get the senior property tax exemption in the City of Anchorage. But now, beginning in 2011, he receives the exemption.
8. Mr. Johnstone is the only Board or Commission member in Alaska to receive a “waiver” for hotel and per diem payments while attending BOF meetings in his “hometown.” These payments have been in excess of \$8,000. Karl also receives a State of Alaska retirement of nearly \$10,000 per month. Does the State really need to pay for his hotel bill in Anchorage, which is “his hometown?” ADF&G

said these waivers were granted because it is in the State's interest to allow Mr. Johnstone to meet with constituents and allow time to prepare for the BOF meetings. These reasons would not seem nearly as contrived if other Board members were afforded the same accommodations. Mr. Johnstone's house was not available in the winter, and he did not stay in the same hotel the BOF meeting was held. In fact, the last two BOF meetings were held at a hotel which was nearer to Mr. Johnstone's house than the hotel where he stayed. Once again, this creates the appearance of impropriety.

9. In an e-mail exchange prior to the 2011 Valdez BOF meeting, Mr. Johnstone wrote that "If the flight from Anchorage to Valdez is cancelled or can't get into Valdez, I plan on checking into the Capt. Cook and I will wait for further information." First, he is flying in from Phoenix and going to a hotel in Anchorage, not his house, which certainly seems inappropriate. Secondly, this is five days prior to the meeting; there are no constituents to meet with. It would appear that some ADF&G staff are helping a non-resident cover up residency problems. Is Mr. Johnstone simply a "snowbird?" Is he really now a resident of Arizona? The Alaska State Legislature should start an investigation immediately to determine these residency issues.
10. And the number 10 reason that Karl Johnstone should not serve a second term on the BOF is quite simple: He is an arrogant, bombastic bully who abuses the public and ADF&G staff. A Kenai River Sportfish group and various guide and charter groups seem to control his vote. He is not objective or fair to other user groups. Perhaps that is how "business" is conducted in Arizona, but in Alaska we deserve better. This is not an allocation fight over sport and commercial fish; it is a fight over what is fair and legal. Confirming Karl Johnstone to the BOF for a second term needs to be prevented.

A recent story in the Alaska Journal of Commerce shows that Mr. Johnstone does not occupy his home in Anchorage during the winter. Dear Legislator,

On Friday you will be asked to confirm a non-resident to the Board of Fish, we ask you to say no to this appointment and ask the Governor to nominate a resident of Alaska who will fairly represent those who utilize our fisheries resources for work and recreation.

Karl Johnstone, the governor's nominee, no longer lives in Alaska full time. He is not qualified to serve on the board of fish. News reports and documents received from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game through a Freedom of Information Act request indicate that Mr. Johnstone lives in Arizona for at least eight months a year. A home in Anchorage, which he claims as his "primary residence," is only occupied a couple of months during the summer. When he returns to Alaska for Board of Fish Meetings in his "home town" he stays in a hotel on the state's dime, claiming per diem rather than open up the home he shutters for the winter.

Prior to his appointment to the board of fish in 2008, Mr. Johnstone did not receive a Permanent Fund Check. Once appointed, he began claiming a check.

He is the only Board or Commission member evidently statewide receiving this special dispensation, contrary to Statute and the Alaska Administrative Manual. Why? The answers we have seen from the department are ridiculous and ring of cover-up. It is time for a legislative Audit of the Boards Support budget to discover if there are serious irregularities and illegal acts that have aided a non-resident Board Member. Is ADF&G staff providing this support simply because Mr. Johnstone is powerful or is he delivering results that some upper level staff within the department are seeking. The Department and the Board process should be above reproach and be fair and legal for all, we can then argue for our share of the pie and feel like at least the playing field was level and fair.

From the partial FOI request it is obvious that upper level staff in the department knows Mr. Johnstone resides a significant portion of the year in Arizona and should have informed the Governor to prevent him from making this embarrassing spectacle necessary. Are these facts just Mr. Johnstone once again creating the appearance of impropriety or are they as we suspect a much deeper problem? We have just begun to look into Mr. Johnstone's appointment and have found a long history of ethical problems which have apparently continued to today without much notice. We should be able to rely on a vetting process within the Governor's office however it would appear this has been deficient. We intend to continue to press for full disclosure of the records to see if Mr. Johnstone's appointment is illegal or has resulted in additional expenses to the state so that he can return to Alaska for BoF meetings.

On March 4 the Alaska Journal of Commerce published a story on Mr. Johnstone that had many of these facts and which also alluded to a subsequent story; instead, Mr. Johnstone authored what appeared to be a full page op-ed piece which spoke of how hard the Board works, but never answered the original questions posed by the article. Mr. Johnstone was overheard boasting to "his constituents" at the most recent Board meeting that he went to Georgia and got the story killed, now we learn that William Morris the owner of the Journal lives in Georgia. What happened to the follow-up article, did Mr. Johnstone pressure the Journal to back off, one can

only guess? In time the answers will come out, we hope you haven't embarrassed the state by reconfirming this individual in the interim.

Under the rules he must occupy the house 185 days per year. He has used his airline tickets and PFD qualifications in 2010 and 2011 to qualify for the exemption; only problem he stays in a state paid for hotel and not his house during these Board meetings.

7. He did not get the City of Anchorage senior property tax exemption in 2007, 2008 or in 2009 but now beginning in 2010 and 2011 he receives the exemption which requires the same criteria as above. This one is worth \$2,300 per year and has been recently challenged.

8. Mr. Johnstone is the only Board or Commission member in Alaska receiving a "waiver" to stay in a hotel and receive per diem while in meetings in his "hometown" totaling roughly \$8,000. ADF&G has said these waivers were granted because it is in the State's interest to allow him to meet with constituents and because of the extensive reading he must do. Dear Governor Parnell,

My name is Andy Hall, and I am a Cook Inlet set net fisherman and lifelong resident of Alaska. I am writing to express my concerns over the actions and residency status of the current Board of Fisheries chairman Karl Johnstone.

Over the last few years Mr. Johnstone's actions on the BOF, at least in regard to upper Cook Inlet, appear to be focused on ending commercial fishing in the Inlet or at best rendering it economically unfeasible as a means to make a living.

Mr. Johnstone, along with fellow BOF members Mike Smith, Bill Brown and Tom Kluberton, hold a majority position on the board and have routinely voted to cut fishing opportunities for Inlet fishermen, limiting fishing time, closing waters to drift fishermen, etc.

I can list the actions that I see as negative but I'd be presenting them through my own biased perspective. I ask that you seek input from people you trust and ask them if Cook Inlet commercial fishermen have been treated responsibly and fairly by the BOF.

Justification for many of these actions has been provided by lobbyists for the guide industry while ignoring recommendations from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game. Certainly in-river guides should have a say in the decision-making process, but of late their action requests have been enacted without regard for their affect on other users and to the fishery itself. Action requests from commercial fishermen have been ignored. A quick look at the actions taken by the BOF in 2011 when it last took up Upper Cook Inlet management will support my last statement.

Cook Inlet has enough fish for all user groups to share, in good years and bad, under the wise management of state biologists. ADF&G's management of Alaska's salmon is renowned the world over but questioned and subverted by political interests in one body of water, Cook Inlet. Don't let this to spread to other Alaska fisheries.

Governor Parnell, you are about to decide whether or not to reappoint Mr. Johnstone to the BOF. I ask you to thank him for his work and allow his term to expire.

I'm sure you're aware of the recent story that ran in the Alaska Journal of Commerce indicating Mr. Johnstone may not even be a legal resident of the state. Yes, he has had a long and storied career in Alaska, but he lives elsewhere for eight months a year. How can he be eligible to serve on the BOF?

For the sake of maintaining public trust in the BOF process and sustaining a diversified and healthy Cook Inlet fishery that provides for sport anglers, personal use and commercial fishermen, please consider naming someone other than Karl Johnstone to the BOF.

Hello All:

I plan on using the committee of a whole process in Valdez instead of separate smaller committees as done in the past. Listed below are several reasons for this decision:

- 1) I have been advised by the Department of Law that using the committee of a whole process would help avoid any appearance of potential conflict with the Open Meetings Act.
- 2) I believe that we will have greater public awareness of our actions.
- 3) Members of the public that might wish to participate in more than one committee but could not sit in more than one at a time will be able to participate in any proposals that are of interest to them.
- 4) Since no report will be necessary, it will save significant staff resources.

It is my hope that having all members present for public discussion on all proposals that we will be better informed and prepared

in making our decisions. I realize that using a committee as a whole process may take more time than running concurrent committees. However, by eliminating the need for a committee report and then the need to refine that report, we might make up for some of the additional time needed doing the committee as a whole.

Committee of the whole Process

In order to facilitate this process, I intend on having proposals logically grouped together similar as we did when using the committee process. These groups will be given a number or letter designation. Three members of the Board will be assigned to each group, one of whom will be designated to lead the public discussion pertaining to the proposals in that group. Prior to the public discussion for each group the discussion leader, with the assistance of the other members assigned to the group, if needed, shall circulate a sign-up sheet for those public members who wish to speak during the discussion of the proposals in that group. Public members shall be selected for the purpose of maximizing public participation and with a goal of obtaining a fair and reasonable representation of those who may be affected by the proposals. After a reasonable sign-up opportunity, comment and questions from the public on that group of proposals will be limited to those who signed-up and were approved by the board members who obtained the signatures. The member who leads the discussion shall make sure that only those who have signed up are permitted to speak. However, I encourage flexibility in granting additional sign-ups any time prior to the public discussion when it may be necessary to get good representation. Those not listed to speak may ask questions or make comments by enlisting those who are approved to speak for them.

Deliberation Process

During deliberations the three board members assigned to any group, shall in addition to other deliberative discussions, initiate discussions of relevant policies and standards that are to be applied to all proposals in their group. Any other members may and are encouraged to participate in such standards and policy considerations together with engaging in all other relevant discussions. Should any board member believe that substitute language or an amendment to any proposal is in order they may, with the assistance of staff, develop and propose such changes at the proper time.

I have discussed these procedures with representatives of the Department of Fish and Game, the Board Support Executive Director, and the Department of Law lawyer representing the Board. They all believe that this process will be consistent with and not in violation of the Open Meeting Act or the APA, will help us develop a good record, and maximize public participation. Please let me have your comments and suggestions. I can't promise that I will incorporate them, but I will give them thoughtful consideration. This process will be used on a trial basis and may be modified appropriately as needed.

Hello, I am writing to inquire about a FOIA request sent to the Board Support office of ADF&G and the commissioner's office last Friday, Feb. 24. I have not heard back from anyone on this request and would like a confirmation it was received and a status update of when the information I've requested will be available.

In the interim, I need comments from the Commissioner and the Governor's office regarding information currently in my possession that shows that Board of Fisheries Chairman Karl Johnstone had \$1,440 in travel expenses for the October meeting in Anchorage. Given that Mr. Johnstone lives in Anchorage, the payment of per diem and other travel expenses such as hotel and mileage or rental car are against state law. I refer to

AS 39.20.185. Per Diem Prohibited in Community of Residence, which states:

"A state official or employee who is a member of the judicial council or a state official or employee appointed by the governor to a state board, commission, or committee established under the authority of law is not entitled to per diem when the meeting or other business takes place in the community of which the member is a resident."

AS 39.20.190 defines the terms "employee" or "state employee" as someone working for a state agency. It further defines "official" or "state official" as the head of a state agency, i.e. the commissioner of a state department. Mr. Johnstone is neither a state employee or a state official as defined in AS 39.20.190 and therefore is not covered by AS 39.20.185.

This section of Alaska Statutes specifically addresses state employees and/or officials who are appointed to a board or commission. For example, the current director of Enterprise Technology Services in the Department of Administration is also a member of the State Board of Education, and the commissioners of Revenue and Administration are both members of the Alaska Retirement Management Board.

My questions that need responses as soon as possible are as follows:

Why was Mr. Johnstone allowed to claim per diem and stay in a hotel during a meeting in Anchorage when he lives in Anchorage?

Travel costs for board members are addressed in AS 39.20.180, and further clarified in the State Administrative Manual (AAM 60.180, copy attached) promulgated by the Department of Administration under AS 39.20.160. The entire manual is available online at <http://doa.alaska.gov/dof/manuals/aam/>

The AAM delegates authority to the commissioner or designee to authorize reimbursement when a meeting takes place within the vicinity (within 50 miles) of the member's residence, when in the best interest of the state. Approval was granted to Mr. Johnstone because meeting days require long hours and work sessions in the evenings, and informal meetings with the public and other board members before and after formal, on-the-record sessions. Preparation for meetings also requires review of hundreds of pages of reading material.

Who within the Department of Fish and Game approved these travel expenses?

Authority to approve waivers to the "50-mile" rule has been delegated to me as Director of Administrative Services; and Cristine O'Sullivan, Finance Officer for ADFG. Ms. O'Sullivan approved the waiver for Mr. Johnstone (copy attached).

Is Commissioner Campbell aware that Mr. Johnstone was allowed to receive travel expenses in his community of residence in violation of state law? If she was aware, why has she allowed these reimbursements to be paid?

As discussed above, payment for expenses in the vicinity of the member's home is not a violation of state law, and is allowable under the State Administrative Manual. Commissioner Campbell was not aware of the request or the subsequent approval of the request at the time it was granted.

Has Mr. Johnstone received per diem and hotel expenses for other meetings in Anchorage?

Yes, a quick review revealed a similar approval for the February-March 2011 meeting, and also for the upcoming BOF meeting later this month (copies attached). As we compile information in response to your public records request for board member expenditures back to 2009, we will let you know if there are any other similar approvals.

Knowing that state law regarding per diem payments was violated during the October meeting in Anchorage, what if anything is being done to correct this situation?

Again, no violation has occurred. Any such request requires prior approval by an appropriate departmental authority based on legitimate business reasons.

The information in my possession was generated by ADF&G in a table format, and should be easily generated for the previous meetings for which I requested information. Similarly, the request regarding emails concerning the Valdez meeting in my FOIA is limited to a fairly specific time period and should not be difficult to collect. Please advise when I can expect to receive these records, and when I will be receiving responses soon to the above questions.




Dear Alaska State Senators & Representatives,

AVCP represents 56 federally recognized Native Villages located along the Yukon and Kuskokwim River drainages. Our villages depend on salmon and other fish as a central part of their diet. Salmon are also vital to the economic and cultural way of life of the people residing in the region.

It is absolutely essential that the BOF include a person from the Arctic-Yukon-Kuskokwim region and Orville Huntington will be a dedicated and effective representative for the region. This is a critical time for the salmon fishery resources in the region and the people who depend upon these stocks. The Chinook stocks on the Yukon and Kuskokwim River are in a serious cycle of decline. As a result of these declines, commercial fisheries are closed and subsistence fisheries are severely restricted. In these times, it is particularly necessary that Mr. Huntington be appointed to the Board. He has a broad and intimate knowledge and understanding of the salmon stocks and the users on the Yukon and Kuskokwim. His role in helping to arrive at regulatory solutions is essential.

SB 91

HOUSE HEARING TODAY ON GUIDE LICENSE SUNSET

The first House hearing of the session on extension of the sport fishing guide license and logbook extension is scheduled for 1 p.m. today in the **House Resources Committee**.

The Senate unanimously passed **SB 91**, without debate, on April 4. Sponsored by **Sen. Lesil McGuire** (R-Anch.) the bill moves the program sunset date to Jan. 1, 2017 from next Jan. 1. No House version was introduced.

HB 347

HOUSE DEBATING MUNY MUZZLE BILL

Stiffening opposition from local governments against **HB 347** didn't slow its progress through two committees to the House floor vote less than six weeks after it was introduced.

The bill got a second floor reading Friday, and a substantial amendment, but was held for its final House vote Monday.

The original bill said any spending by a municipality to influence a state or local initiative petition must first be approved in a local election. The amendment from Anchorage Democrat **Lindsey Holmes** deleted that provision relating to local initiatives and passed on a 20-16 vote, with 15 majority members in support.

Introduced Feb. 22 by Soldotna **Rep. Kurt Olson**, the bill has 12 fellow Republican cosponsors, all but Haines **Rep. Bill Thomas** and Ketchikan **Rep. Kyle Johansen** from Anchorage or Interior districts. The bill moved through the House State Affairs and Judiciary Committees with only one hearing in each.

"I believe this is a direct response to the coastal management initiative," said **Kathy Wasserman**, executive director of the **Alaska Municipal League**, at the bill's April 2 hearing in the House Judiciary Committee.

Unalaska Mayor Shirley Marquardt, current AML, president, also questioned the proposal. "I'm not seeing a reason why this has become a problem for the state and municipalities that it needs to be fixed," she said by teleconference.

Olson is adamant that his bill is not a reaction to municipal funding that helped pay for signature gathering for the **Sea Party** initiative petition that put revival of the **Alaska Coastal Management Program** on the next state general election ballot. He has complained, at hearings, about what he suggested were tens of thousands of local government dollars spent on petition signature gathering.

Reports filed through January with the **Alaska Public Offices Commission** show the North Slope and Bristol Bay Boroughs, respectively contributed \$25,000 and \$4,000 to the Sea Party. The Aleutian Pribilof Islands Community Development Association and **Western Alaska Community Development Association** gave \$10,000 and \$5,000 respectively and the **Bristol Bay Native Corporation** gave \$5,000.

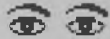
The local officials also bristled at Olson's assertion, backed by somewhat conflicting memos from Dept. of Law and legislative attorneys, that municipal governments have no free speech rights. "This is just trying to stifle our word. I don't know what some members are afraid of," Wasserman added with Olson sitting directly behind her.

Legislative attorney **Alpheus Bullard** wrote a Jan. 19 memo to Olson "to alert you to constitutional issues raised by the bill." He noted a 1988 **US Supreme Court** ruling that Colorado could not prohibit the payment of signature collectors because circulation of initiative petitions is "core political speech." 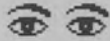

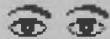

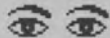

**MUZZLE BILL CONSTITUTIONALITY UNCERTAIN (From Page 1.)**

Assistant Attorney General **John Ptacin** wrote in a March 27 memo that the bill has no constitutional problems because government entities, "including municipalities have no independent **First Amendment** rights."

In an April 2 memo responding to Olson's specific constitutionality question, Bullard said the question is "broad (and) involving the complex government speech doctrine," then dodged it. He said HB 347 is only "state constraint on certain municipal expenditures."

Rep. Max Gruenberg (D-Anch.) questioned the bill's constitutionality in its State Affairs Committee hearing. He noted that Alaska's constitution has stronger personal rights protections than those of most other states and that Bullard's second memo cited no Alaska court cases to support his views. "Municipalities, as the representative of the people, may have very significant First Amendment rights of free speech," Gruenberg said.

He wrote 13 amendments for the bill's Judiciary Committee hearing but offer only five of which two were adopted. One, which Olson endorsed, added an Aug. 29 effective date to prevent the complications that could arise if the coastal zone initiative petition is on the Aug. 28 primary ballot and the bill took effect in the middle of the election campaign. The second amendment removed repetitive language.

Gruenberg offered and then withdrew another amendment to protect municipal officials from criminal prosecution for failure to comply with the bill after eliciting the statement from the legislature's attorney that local officials could be charged with crimes "It is on the record that a person can be criminally and civilly liable," Gruenberg said.

SESSION ADJOURNMENT DATE CONTROLS COASTAL ZONE INITIATIVE BALLOT SCHEDULE

It's all but official that the legislature won't pass a bill to reestablish a coastal zone management, but the timing of end of the session remains an important factor in the fate of the **Sea Party's** initiative petition that does so.

Article 11, Sec. Four of the **Alaska Constitution** says a properly qualified initiative petition, which the Sea Party's is, appears on the next statewide election ballot "more than 120 days after adjournment of the legislative session following the filing."

That's the current session and if it ends by its statutory, 90-day deadline of April 15, the 120th day falls on Aug. 3 and the petition appears on the Aug. 28 primary.

If lawmakers ignore the 90-day limit and the session continues under the constitution's 120-day limit, then April 28 becomes the deadline for adjournment to keep the petition on the primary election ballot.

These events would also impact HJR 4, Rep. Peggy Wilson's resolution putting a constitutional amendment to re-establish a dedicated transportation projects fund on the next general election ballot. The resolution is in the Senate Finance Committee.



HJR 26 SECOND SENATE SEA OTTER HEARING TODAY

Rep. Peggy Wilson's resolution calling on federal authorities to do something to address the impact on subsistence and commercial fishing from the expanding sea otter population in the Southeast Panhandle should move out of the **Senate Resources Committee** after its second hearing this afternoon.

HJR 26 was reviewed there without action last Wednesday.

The resolution asks for an amendment to the **Marine Mammal Protection Act** to replace references to "authentic" and "traditional" products with the phrase "Alaska Native articles of handicraft." The change would allow Native artisans to create modern items, for example with zippers, and could enhance the economic prospects for Native-run tanneries in Sitka and possibly other communities in the region.

The resolution also asks federal managers to "expand and enhance" small business and broader economic opportunities for residents of the region.

Sen. Tom Wagoner (R-Nikiski), cochairman of the Senate Resources Committee expressed support for the resolution and said **Kachemak Bay** and other locales outside the Southeast region area also being decimated by sea otter population growth. Other lawmakers showed some skepticism.

"It's always a little bit dangerous when mankind tries to plays around with the ecological balance," said **Sen. Bill Wielechowski** (D-Anch.).



'DUDE' FISHING LICENSES MAY COST STATE \$390K

Two members of the **Fishermen's Fund Advisory & Appeals Council** are calling for an increase in the fee for 7-day nonresident commercial fishing crew licenses to close a loophole that may be costing the state more than \$390,000 a year.

The current fee schedule could threaten the long-term viability of the self-supporting \$11 million fund that pays for medical treatment of on-the-job injuries to harvesters without health insurance, warned **James Herbert** and **Clay Bezenek**, at their **Senate Resources Committee** hearing, April 6.

"By our calculations may be as much as \$393,000 that the state is not realizing from the sale of nonresident crew member licenses 'cause of the way this is structure," Herbert said. **Gov. Sean Parnell** named Herbert to a fourth term, and Bezenek to a second on the council.

In an April 4 letter responding to questions from **Rep Paul Seaton** (R-Homer), Herbert said sales of the 7-day commercial fishing crew license, first offered in 2004 to help promote "dude fishing" excursions for tourists, have steadily increased, resulting in a drop in overall state income and revenues to the Fishermen's Fund.

"We are unaware of any business in the state that regularly advertises 'Dude Fishing,' though we imagine it happens occasionally," Herbert wrote with reference to the advisory counsel.

The one-week license cost \$30 regardless of residence. Full year licenses cost \$60 for residents and \$200 for nonresidents. "CFEC cannot readily tell us where these licenses were issued and how many were sold to the same individual. Regardless, something is wrong here," Herbert wrote.

"More than likely this is a large and attractive loop hole in the licensing process for some of our

crewmen," he continued.

"We feel for the most part this is coming out of the **Bristol Bay** region where the fishery is about one month long," added Bezenek at the hearing.

Using **Commercial Fishing Entry Commission** data for 2011, Herbert wrote that the state would have earned \$459,200 if all 2,296 nonresident crewmembers working in Alaska that year had bought \$200 crew licenses. If those nonresidents all bought only one 7-day license their total bill would have been \$68,880.

Herbert said nonresidents could save money even if they bought as many as six one-week licenses at the current rate to see them through the **Bristol Bay** sockeye season.

Under state law the Fishermen's Fund receives 39% of the value of each crew license sold up to \$50. Herbert acknowledged that the fund would receive more revenue if one person bought six 7-day licenses instead of a seasonal license but suggested that's not happening.

"Personally I doubt that there are that many people buying six 7-day nonresident licenses. I think the numbers point in the direction that this is an unfortunate loophole in the fee schedule that benefits nonresidents and hurts the state," he wrote.

"Enforcement only samples a small portion of the fleet, so it could be that some individuals only buy one license and hope for the best," he added.

Herbert's letter said the "simplest solution" is an increase in the 7-day fee for nonresidents to \$100. That would make it, like the equivalent resident license, half of the full-season rate and probably avoid any legal difficulties from overcharging nonresidents.

Bezenek suggested the law could also be changed to allow the same person to buy only one 7-day license per year. "I don't think it'll hurt the dude fishing industry that hasn't really picked up yet," he added.



AOC CITES SELECTIVELY IN HUNTINGTON FISH BOARD OPPOSITION

With a broad blast at the knowledgeability of recent **Board of Fishery** members, the **Alaska Outdoor Council** declared its opposition to the confirmation of new appointee **Orville Huntington** at his **House Fish Committee** hearing, April 5.

Spokesmen for other sport fishing organizations either endorsed or declared their neutrality on Huntington's appointment. No representatives of any commercial fishing organizations testified.

"Lately we have observed a disturbing trend. The trend is the governor nominating and the legislature confirming people to the Board of Fisheries who do not know the laws that are working with it," said **Rod Arno**, executive director of the AOC in testimony during the confirmation hearings.

Arno did not comment specifically during the subsequent hearing on the qualifications of **Karl Johnstone**, a former judge and current board chairman who was appointed to his second full term by **Gov. Sean Parnell**. Huntington was named to his first 3-year term.

Selectively quoting a passage from a two-paragraph biography of Huntington provided by the governor's office, Arno suggested Huntington did not demonstrate sufficient knowledge, or perhaps support, of Alaskans' equal rights to subsistence harvest opportunities.

Earlier in the hearing Chairman **Steve Thompson** (R-Fairbanks) said the same passage in which Huntington referred to defending "aboriginal rights" of Native people "jumped out at me." Thompson noted that aboriginal rights in Alaska were extinguished by the **Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act**.

"That was when I worked for Fish & Wildlife," Huntington said with reference to the US Fish & Wildlife Service. "There's no aboriginal rights in the State of Alaska, except for **Metlakatla**, maybe," Huntington added, with reference to the only "Indian reservation" in the state, on the southern Southeast island.

During the hearing's public comment period Arno quoted part of a line from the biography, which declared that Huntington "is committed to protecting the aboriginal rights of Native people to continue to live a subsistence way of life and preserve the cultural beliefs associated with that way of life."

"This statement that he wants to protect aboriginal rights is a cause for concern," Arno continued.

The origin of the short biography is also unclear, as Arno heard if he was listening to the committee's questions before he testified, but Arno ignored the uncertainty and suggested it didn't matter when the statement was written, or who wrote it. "It is troubling that he wrote it in the first place," he declared.

Rep. Alan Austerman (R-Kodiak) then noted that Arno had not read the full sentence, but left off the final phrase, which indicated that Huntington supported the Native aboriginal right "as it is consistent with State and Federal law."

"Does that make any difference to you as the AOC or did you only want to read the first part of his sentence?" Austerman asked.

Arno claimed that he left the nine words out "for time's sake," adding, "It doesn't make a bit of difference."

Where the entire biography came from was never clarified. **Rep. Scott Kawasaki** (D-Fairbanks) noted that it is written in the third person and asked for its origin.

Huntington said it came from the governor's office and may have been written by **Jason Hooley**, director of the Office of Boards & Commissions, or **John Moller**, the governor's senior rural affairs advisor.

Contacted after the hearing **Sharon Leighow**, the governor's press secretary, said in a phone message, "We did not write it. We did supply it, though, to the committee." She added that Huntington apparently used the biography in previous job applications.

In his opening statement by teleconference, Huntington, who works for the **Tanana Chiefs Conference**, said he volunteered for the Fish Board "because I thought I could be fair to all the fisheries users of Alaska. I thought Interior would be well represented by me on the board."

Asked to define "subsistence user," Huntington said, "A subsistence user is anyone who relies on fish or wildlife for part of what they eat and what they have for their own culture whether it's sport fishing or sport hunting or subsistence hunting. It's all the same really."

A lifetime resident of **Huslia**, Huntington said his father, Jimmy, was a member of the Alaska Legislature and his uncle, Sidney, a former Game Board member. He said he no longer owns any commercial fishing permit because of the continuing closure of Interior river fisheries.

"I just found it was better to actually work than to try to fish. There was no money in it," he said.

Rep. Thompson noted that nine "Huntingtons" were listed as permit holders in Commercial Fishery Entry Commission records from 2010 and asked Orville for his views on conflicts of interest.

"I don't think it's right that we vote any time there is something to be gained," Huntington declared, noting that two cousins are permit holders.

Huntington said he would base his board votes on scientific information, primarily from the **Dept. of Fish & Game**. "Their staff seems to have the best science."

"As long as you can defend it scientifically I'll support it. It doesn't matter if it's from my own back yard. I won't support it," Huntington added.

Thompson also noted a 2004 court case in which Huntington was convicted of misdemeanor harassment and asked for an explanation "so that we know that it's not a temper problem."

Huntington said the incident occurred shortly before his wife died. "It was a hard time in my life. I pleaded no contest but it was set aside by the court. It's not an anger problem," he said.

The **Kenai River Sportfishing Association** neither endorsed nor opposed Huntington's confirmation but Exec. Dir. **Ricky Gease** said, "Although we're neutral, I'm looking forward to sitting down with Mr. Huntington in the future and talking about our local issues." He said Huntington answered the committee's questions "in a fair and honest manner. He cleared up some ... what could be troubling issues for us."

Melvin Grove, noting that he is president of the **Prince William Sound Charterboat Association**, but speaking only for himself, said of Huntington, "If he does believe all Alaskans are subsistence users I would support his nomination."

Speaking for **Kawerak**, the Nome-based regional nonprofit group, **Rose Fosdick** strongly endorsed Huntington. "He understands the **Yukon River** and knows the salmon population history and health," she said.

Committees no longer vote to endorse or oppose the confirmation of gubernatorial appointees.



SUPREME COURT CENSURED FISH BOARD CHAIRMAN FOR APPEARANCE OF IMPROPRIETY WHILE JUDGE

The chairman of the **Board of Fisheries** was publicly reprimanded by the **Alaska Supreme Court** in 2000 for leaving "the appearance of impropriety" in his appointment of the state coroner for Third Judicial District where he was presiding judge when he retired from the state bench in 1996.

Although **Karl Johnstone** was vaguely questioned by one lawmaker about "allegations of improprieties" relating to his homes in Anchorage and Prescott, Arizona, at his April 5 confirmation hearing in the **House Fish Committee**, the high court censure was not mentioned last week, nor during his first legislative review after he was appointed to the board in 2008 by **Gov. Sarah Palin**.

"Our independent review of the record convinces us that, in their totality, the events of this case give rise to an overwhelming appearance of impropriety; they would leave an objectively reasonable person with the indelible impression that (Coroner) McVeigh's hiring involved favoritism," the Supreme Court declared in the May 19, 2000 opinion.

The opinion also implicates former **Chief Justice Daniel Moore**, who was presiding when the events of the matter occurred and a personal friend of McVeigh.

The **Senate Resources Committee** has Johnstone slated for a confirmation hearing this afternoon at 3:30. A House/Senate session is scheduled for Tuesday morning to vote on all of **Gov. Sean Parnell's** new board and commission appointees.

Parnell announced the appointments of Johnstone and Huslia resident **Orville Huntington** to the Fish Board on March 31. For the first time in at least two decades the **House Resources Committee** will not hold a confirmation hearing on new Fish Board appointees.

The Supreme Court opinion came in response to Johnstone's challenge to a ruling by the **Alaska Commission on Judicial Conduct** that his appointment of coroner **Richard McVeigh** created the appearance of impropriety. The high court issued the public reprimand, apparently Johnstone's only punishment, at the recommendation of the commission.

"Judge Johnstone's conduct was negligent at best ... And at worst, given that the judge was repeatedly advised of the undesirable appearance that his actions would create, his mental state could be classified as recklessness or actual knowledge" of wrongdoing, the opinion declared.

McVeigh was appointed coroner in January 1995. The commission received a complaint shortly afterwards and began a preliminary investigation of the matter that February, according to the opinion.

Johnstone retired from the bench after 17 years in July 1996 but the investigation continued. A special counsel was hired in February 1997 and the commission issued a complaint about three months later. A three-day, formal disciplinary hearing was held in October 1997.

On a 3-5 vote the commission "declined to find clear and convincing evidence of actual impropriety" but unanimously **found the evidence sufficient to support the charge that it created the appearance of impropriety.**

Beside challenging the substance of the commission's finding, Johnstone also claimed it had no jurisdiction because he was retired.

Johnstone rejects hiring process after Chief Justice suggests applicant

The Supreme Court rejected that argument and its review of the case indicates that Johnstone largely caused his own problems after the previous coroner resigned.

As presiding judge of the district, Johnstone had the authority to directly appoint a replacement to the partially exempt post. Instead he directing area court administrator **Albert Szal** to commence a standard merit recruitment process, which includes various public notice, application and deadline requirements.

After the recruitment bulletin was issued the court personnel office found 39 qualified applicants and narrowed the eight finalists. A committee appointed by Szal ranked the finalists and agreed that one person clearly topped the list, but two others followed not far behind.

"At some point during the recruitment process," the opinion continues, Johnstone informed Szal that he wanted the new coroner to have legal training and experience, criteria that had not been included in the recruitment bulletin.

When Szal provided Johnstone with the results of the recruitment process in December 1994 Johnstone, apparently inaccurately, "expressed dissatisfaction that none of the top-ranked candidates had any legal training," the opinion notes.

Johnstone discussed the situation with then-Chief Justice **Daniel Moore**, who "suggested that Richard McVeigh either had applied or might apply for the coroner position," the opinion continues.

It notes that McVeigh has legal training, previous public employment and "he was also a personal friend of the chief justice."

Johnstone contacted McVeigh about the job shortly afterwards and McVeigh applied the next day with a cover letter and resume rather than completion of the form required of all other applicants.

While Szal was on a short vacation Johnstone contacted his secretary and ordered that the personnel committee interview McVeigh. It did so but largely retained its previous ranking and placed McVeigh sixth among the now nine finalists.

Johnstone said he would appoint McVeigh anyway. He met again with the chief justice and Szal and, during the meeting was advised against hiring McVeigh by **Stephanie Cole**, then deputy court administrative director.

Johnstone ignored warning of risk to court credibility

"Cole warned that accepting the late application could jeopardize the credibility of the court system's hiring process," the opinion continued. She said McVeigh was ineligible for hiring because he had applied after the deadline and that the only proper way he could be considered was to throw out the previous process and begin again.

Johnstone gave that order, but Szal noted that the first applicant pool had included other attorneys and that the administrator "could not justifiably declare all 39 candidates unsuitable for the job."

In a December 21, 1994 letter Szal informed the previous candidates that Johnstone had not selected any of them and that a "subsequent selection process" would occur.

That never happened. Instead, Szal contacted McVeigh to discuss his appointment as

coroner only to find that he first was reluctant to take the job for fear that he would jeopardize his state retirement payments.

Johnstone then ordered the appointment of McVeigh on a temporary basis, allowing him to collect his retirement and a new salary.

Cole, the deputy administrator, first counseled against this approach. She later concluded a temporary appointment for an indefinite term would be illegal, and counseled Johnstone against signing appointment order, the opinion said.

Johnstone, "through Szal, then submitted a second order by fax, proposing to appoint McVeigh as temporary coroner for a term of eleven months," the opinion continued without further explanation.

In a Jan. 6 memo to Johnstone, Cole wrote, "I asked Al Szal today if, in fact, Mr. McVeigh's appointment had an expected duration of eleven months or less. Al indicated that he did not know."

Cole also provided Johnstone with another way to sidestep the law by applying through administrative channels for an exemption authorizing him to hire a temporary coroner. A Jan. 11 memo from Szal to Cole declared, according to the opinion, "Presiding Judge Karl Johnstone has informed me that he does not expect Richard McVeigh to occupy the position of coroner for more than 11 months. Therefore, . . . Mr. McVeigh can be placed on the payroll as a temporary employee."

McVeigh was then appointed.

More recently, Johnstone was in the news for collecting preapproved per diem payments for hotel rooms in downtown Anchorage for board meetings last October and last month, despite having a permanent residence on Potter Valley Road about 12 miles away.

Photos of Johnstone's home, published March 1 by the **Alaska Journal of Commerce**, showed several feet of snow completely surrounding a house that had no appearance of recent occupation. The magazine reported that the **Dept. of Fish & Game** approved \$108 for surface transportation, \$792 for a hotel room and \$540 in meal expenses for the board's Oct. 4-10 meetings and preapproval for expenses for this week's sessions.

Johnstone labeled Fish Board 'commuter'

Rep. Bob Herron (D-Bethel) said during last week's hearing that he had receive "lots of emails ... most of the time, to be perfectly honest, it's about having a Board of Fisheries member who, quote unquote, commutes from the Lower 48."

It wasn't clear where Johnstone was during his confirmation hearing, but he said by teleconference that he had heard the same complaints after his original appointment.

"Because I own a home in Prescott does not in my opinion, I believe legally anyway, mean I'm not a resident," Johnstone said. "While I'm not there fulltime it's certainly enough to constitute a residence," he added.

Declaring that it was his choice to avoid Alaska's cold winters he said, "many people do it, including some legislators."

Also at last week's hearing **Rep. Scott Kawasaki** (D-Fairbanks) asked Johnstone if he had received copies of "some things that were written opposing your confirmation to a second term."

Johnstone indicated he had received the information but Kawasaki said the apparently anonymous information had been distributed to the other committee members and that he wanted to review "several pages of documents with allegations of improprieties on your homes in Arizona and Anchorage."

"When things are not signed and people throw out random stuff I don't usually trust it, but I want to make sure you got it before House Resources," Kawasaki said.

Johnstone then explained that after his early board meetings in 2009 he "realized my job, like yours as lawmakers, is not 8 to 5."

Before the past winter's Anchorage meetings Johnstone said he asked the Fish Board's executive director about per diem policy and let him know Johnstone's home was 15 miles from the downtown Anchorage meeting location.

Johnstone added that if his preference would be to work an 8 to 5 meeting day if he had to drive home and "didn't want to be wined and dined and stay up late and find himself fatigued and drive home at 10 p.m."

"I never asked for anything. I never demanded anything, but apparently I was issued a waiver by board executive director," Johnstone said.

Despite his history, Johnstone was strongly endorsed for reappointment by fellow board members **Bill Brown**, of Juneau, former board member **Howard Delo**, of Big Lake, and several sport fishing and professional guide's organizations.

The **United Fishermen of Alaska** endorsed Johnstone's appointment in 2009 but did not comment at his hearing last week.



HCR 18**SENATE PASSES 'GRAY OF FLEET' RESOLUTION**

The Senate unanimously agreed to the plan to appoint two lawmakers to keep an eye on **University of Alaska** efforts to expand its seafood industry-related curriculum and help more Alaskan youth make it their career at some level.

HCR 18, sponsored by the **House Fish Committee**, originally intended to prompt legislative action to reverse the aging or "graying" of Alaska's commercial fishing fleet. As passed the resolution directs the House speaker and Senate president to appoint one member each who will serve as liaisons to the university. The liaisons are directed to report, quarterly, on the university efforts and to offer any recommendations for changes by Jan 20, 2013.

"This helps these young people get started in an industry that's going to be here in Alaska for a long, long time," said **Sen. Tom Wagoner** (R-Nikiski), a commercial fisherman, before the Senate vote.

'BUY ALASKAN' LOAN RATE CUT PASSED BY HOUSE

Rep. Paul Seaton's bill allowing the state to cut two percent off commercial fishing loans used mainly to buy machinery or equipment manufactured in Alaska passed the House, April 4, on a 40-0 vote.

HB 59 has no Senate twin and was referred to the **Senate Resources and Finance Committees**.

The bill allows the **Div. of Economic Development** to offer a two percent cut in interest rates on engine upgrade and energy efficiency loans from the **Commercial Fishing Revolving Loan Fund** if at least 50% of the borrowed amount is spent on gear manufactured in the state.

The loan portfolio operates with a three percent floor on interest rates and the current low prime interest rate effectively means even if the bill becomes law it won't provide any rate relief until commercial interest rates rise. The bill was amended in the House Finance Committee to apply only to new energy efficiency loans and its permissive language means loan managers are free to reject rate reduction requests in any case.

"The purpose of this bill is to support and create jobs in Alaska," said Seaton (R-Homer). He noted that the Alaska Diesel Electric Co., in Anchorage, and **Coastal Refrigeration**, in Homer, manufacture equipment that could be purchased with loans that would qualify for the bill's interest rate cut.

**SB 203/HB 336****ENERGY ASSISTANCE VOUCHERS NEAR PASSAGE**

The chance that Alaskans will receive a little help with their energy bills this fall increased slightly with the advancement of **HB 336** out of the House Energy Committee, April 3.

With a week remaining in the session **HB 336**, sponsored by Rep. Steve Thompson (R-Fairbanks), still faces House Labor & Commerce and Finance Committee hearings. The bill had been there since it was introduced on Feb. 22.

The substantially identical Senate version, **SB 203**, moved out of the Senate Finance Committee, April 6 and faces a Senate floor vote today.

The **Dept. of Revenue** fiscal note on **HB 336** estimates costs from \$115 million to \$430 million. The broad range is a result of projections using what it said are the current state average cost of kilowatt-hours of 15.5 cents and the \$3.50 average for 2010 heating fuel prices, with a note that the latter has probably risen. The Permanent Fund Div. said the bill will cost another \$291,000 to cover its hold harmless provision for welfare recipients.

As amended in the Energy Committee the bill gives all adults eligible for Permanent Fund dividend checks a voucher worth 250 gallons of heating oil, 35,000 cubic feet of natural gas or 1,500 kilowatt-hours as applicable to their permanent residences. Voucher values would be based on local prices on a date chosen by the Alaska Housing Finance Corp., which would administer the program.

A provision added at the request of Energy Committee Chairman **Neil Foster** (D-Nome) to cover wood-heating homeowners is not present in the Senate bill. It allows residents without "reasonable access" to heating oil, natural gas or electricity to receive a \$500 check, the rough equivalent of a two-month supply of cordwood. Renters who certify that they pay no direct heating or energy costs may receive a \$250 check or have their voucher transferred their landlords. Landlords would be required to deduct the "full value" of the voucher from their tenants' rent.

**SB 159****SENATE SENDS SUSITNA FOREST BILL TO HOUSE**

With a 20-0 vote the Senate, April 4, passed **SB 159**, **Sen. Linda Menard's** bill to create Alaska's fourth state forest. No House version was introduced.

The Susitna State Forest would include 763,200 acres among 14 parcels. Designation as a state forest prioritizes the included lands for logging and clears the way for the Div. of Forestry to invest in logging roads and other subsidies to allow long term timber harvests.

"This is set aside, like I said, for hunters, fishers, for mining," Menard said in her comments before the Senate vote. The bill has an April 10 hearing in the House Community & Regional Affairs Committee

**Senate, House, Governor agree on \$3.2B total
CAPITAL BUDGET ON SENATE FLOOR MONDAY**

A fiscal 2013 capital budget said to have House and executive branch agreement on a final total in the \$3.2 billion range is scheduled for a Senate floor vote on Monday after being adopted, but not reported out of the Senate Finance Committee shortly after 9 p.m. Saturday.

The committee draft of **SB 160** contains \$2.63 billion in spending, including \$720 million in Senate project and no changes from \$1.8 billion in projects included in **Gov. Sean Parnell's** original bill, according to **Sen. Bert Stedman** (R-Sitka), cochairman of the Senate Finance Committee. The House will add another \$720 million worth of projects as part of the three-way agreement that should result in minimal vetoes, he added.

"That's what I'd expect, that there wouldn't be a lot of that.

We had a set target and we stayed within it. Unless there's an issue with one of the projects, technical issue, then I would expect him to step in with his veto pen for checks and balances. That's what it's for," Stedman said.

OMB Dir. **Karen Rehfeld** was present for the seven-minute hearing, which included only adoption of the new draft and a brief description by Stedman's aid **Wes Eiler**.

The bill includes \$56.1 million and \$43.5 million, respectively, from the Parnell Administration FY 12 capital and operating expenses.

A spending breakdown by House Districts released with the Senate bill shows top recipients as \$380 million for Anchorage area wide, \$155.3 million for Fairbanks area wide, \$104.4 million Bering Straits, Kodiak \$87 million, Kenai \$82.7 million, Ketchikan \$76.7 million and Mat-Su area wide \$76.5 million.

The Capital City was in the middle of the pack with \$45 million. At the bottom were Richardson/Glenn Highways (Dist. 12) with \$20.5 million and the Northwest Arctic Region (Dists. 39, 40) with \$15.9 million.

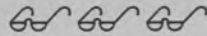
**HJR 4****DEDICATED TRANSPORTATION FUND MOVES TO
SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE**

Rep. **Peggy Wilson** thinks the Senate will pass her resolution for a constitutional amendment to reestablish a dedicated transportation projects fund if it gets the chance to take a vote. **HJR 4** moved out of the Senate Transportation Committee, April 3, into the growing line of bills awaiting Senate Finance Committee review.

If ratified by the voters the resolution deposits all revenues from motor fuel, studded tire and vehicle rental taxes, plus their license and registration fees into the **Alaska Transportation Infrastructure Fund**. Wilson (R-Wrangell) wants "ATIF" endowed with a \$1 billion appropriation, which she

hopes will provide \$100 million annually for projects that would be prioritized by a stakeholder panel but finally chosen by the legislature.

Sen. Charlie Huggins (R-Wasilla) said at the hearing that he'd support a \$2 billion endowment.



SENATE SHRINKING SOUTH CENTRAL PORT FUNDING

Funding for a railroad extension to **Port MacKenzie** will be cut from \$110 million to "probably \$30 million" in the statewide general obligation bill, Senate Finance Committee Cochairman **Bert Stedman** (R-Sitka) said Saturday. The new draft of **SB 163**, the general obligation bond bill, should get a hearing today.

Stedman said total funding in the bill will remain at \$450 million as introduced but other changes are forthcoming.

The **Senate Transportation Committee**, last month, added \$50 million each for a deep-water port at Cape Blossom near Kotzebue and improvements to the Port of Nome.

The Anchorage port project should end up with \$100 million, half of the governor's request. The GO bond bill will contain \$50 million, another \$25 million is in **SB 160**, the FY 13 capital projects bill and Stedman said he was "optimistic" the House would add another \$25 million.

Stedman said the Port MacKenzie project is surviving only on its political connections.

"If that dysfunctional project was anywhere with a smaller population it would be stopped by the state and they'd be forced to either go through **AIDEA** (Alaska Industrial Development & Export Authority) with a business model that works or come up with some package," said. "I'm not in a position to put the kibosh on it, or I'd stop it in its tracks," he added.

Stedman agreed with reporters that the Anchorage port project suffered up to \$30 million in "waste."

Asked to assess the cost overruns in the Goose Creek prison, **KABATA (Knik Arm Bridge And Toll Authority)** and port projects Stedman said, "Let me put it this way, in my district we don't have those problems."

OTHER BILLS & NEWS

HB 219

HOUSE OK'S EMERGENCY SERVICE SUBSCRIPTIONS

Legislation exempting volunteer fire, ambulance and other emergency departments operated by local government and nonprofit agencies from state insurance law passed the House on a 40-0 vote, April 4.

HB 219, sponsored by **Rep. Eric Feige** (R-Chikaloon), is a response the **Div. of Insurance's** interpretation that annual optional "subscription" fees paid by local residents to support the emergency services amount to insurance policies subject to state regulation. Feige is a founder and chief of the **Chikaloon Fire Dept.**

No Senate version was introduced and HB 219 was referred to the Senate Community & Regional Affairs and State Affairs Committees.



HB 125**HOUSE BACKS ABC BOARD MOVE TO DCCED**

HB 125, the hotly debated bill to move the **Alcohol Beverage Control Board** from the **Dept. of Public Safety** to the more business-friendly **Dept. of Commerce** easily passed the House, April 4, after adoption of an amendment delaying the administrative relocation one year to July 1, 2012.

Sponsored by the **Legislative Budget & Audit Committee**, the bill is a top priority of the **Cabaret, Hotel, Retailers & Restaurant Association**, which has argued that the state should do more to promote the liquor industry.

Rep. Bill Stoltze (R-Chugiak) called the bill, "probably not the best politics (but) ... important public policy."

Opposition to the move came mainly from Democrats including majority caucus members Neal Foster, Bob Herron and Reggie Joule. Anchorage Rep. **Anna Fairclough** was the only Republican to vote against the bill. No Senate version was introduced.

HB 125 was referred to the Senate Labor & Commerce and Finance Committees.

**HB 64****HOUSE PASSES PERMANENT VEHICLE, TRAILER REG ADDS SOFT CAP ON LOCAL REG TAXES**

Legislation offering permanent registration to owners of motor vehicles at least eight years old and any noncommercial trailers passed the House on a 39-0 vote, April 5, after the bill's effective date was moved from 2015 to the end of this year.

HB 64 sets the permanent fee at a one-time combination of the current biennial registration fees plus \$25. Those are \$100 and \$30 for motor vehicles and trailers, respectively. The bill also allows collection of a \$2 fee on permanently registered vehicles if they are under an emission control inspection program.

Permanent registration expires if the item is sold.

The size of the bill's impact on local governments is unknown but negative on the 16 that now impose vehicle registration taxes. The Alaska Municipal League spoke against it when it was introduced last year but has grown silent in large part because House Finance Cochair **Bill Stoltze** (R-Chugiak) is its prime sponsor.

The bill allows the **Div. of Motor Vehicles** to continue to collect the local taxes for municipalities, but only if they are no more than \$100.

**HB 312****ENERGY CONVERSION LOAN UP FOR HOUSE VOTE**

Rep. Tammie Wilson's expanded bill offering effectively free loans for home heating improvements was amended in the House Finance Committee and is scheduled for a House floor vote today.

In what would be another program managed by the **Alaska Housing Finance Corp.**, **HB 312** offers ten-year loans, at one percent interest, for the lesser of \$7,500 or the actual cost of a new heating device powered by natural gas, propane, electricity, biomass (meaning pellets) or district heating. The device must be the primary heating source for the residence.

To qualify for a loan, the home must first be inspected by a certified energy-rater or mechanical contractor to confirm that the device will improve energy efficiency. The cost of the inspection, labor and materials for the installation would be paid by the homeowner.

**SB 23****FILM TAX EXTENSION STILL IN SUBCOMMITTEE**

The subcommittee on the proposed ten-year extension of Alaska's film tax credit may be ready to take the issue, and even a new version of **SB 23** back to the full **House Finance Committee** on Monday.

Rep. Mia Costello (R-Anch.), chair of the subcommittee, said after its sixth

session, Friday, that she wants to find a way to link the level of credits allowed for salaries of film stars, screen writers, producers and directors, known as "above the line" expenditures, to an increase in "below the line" spending, which includes jobs and vendor contracts for Alaskans.

Costello also suggested the creation of a small "film board" of perhaps three members, that would oversee program administration generally and specifically review the movie scripts and production proposals for their treatment of oil and other resource development issues.

"Above the line" costs may account for over 50% of a feature film budget but the bill limits credits to no more than 15% of total qualified expenditures for a single project.

Joe Mathis, vice president of **NANA Development Corp.** said the regional Native corporation subsidiary supplies many "below the line" services. He said the bill must be passed this year to allow the growing flow of Alaskan film projects to continue. Mathis called for a "competitive cap" on above the line spending and provisions for the state to buy credits back from producers to assure they would receive full value.

Film credits generally trade in the 85 to 90 percent range among the several states offering them.

In a 20-minute address the head of the **University of Alaska** film program called for creation of a comprehensive workforce training program, state subsidies for sound stages and other infrastructure and direct grants to Alaskan film projects.

Jerry LaVine, owner of **Connection Films**, in Anchorage, opposed the bill without major changes and said increases in "below the line" credits hurts his business by making it more attractive for Hollywood producers to use their regular Lower 48 contractors. LaVine also charged that the bill contains a "loophole" that allows Alaskan businesses to serve effectively as fronts for Outside vendors.

"The industry was growing before the incentive program began distorting the economics," LaVine said.

Mark Brinser, a 30-year industry veteran in Homer who produces TV commercials and documentaries, spoke against the bill and spent more than ten uninterrupted minutes lashing the Hollywood film industry as "a traveling circus of carpetbaggers wandering around the country" taking advantage of film credits.

"These people are the master chefs at cooking the books," Brinser said.

General: Please comment on the most important issue facing the Fisherman's Fund Advisory and Appeals Board and how you intend to approach that issue.

Grant approved to improve shellfish testing program

Posted: Thursday, January 04, 2001

KETCHIKAN (AP) -- The Ketchikan Gateway Borough has approved a grant to improve a paralytic shellfish poisoning testing program.

The assembly on Tuesday unanimously approved appropriating \$15,000 for the Southeast Alaska Regional Dive Fisheries Association. The money will pay for consultant Cheryl Sutton to work with the Department of Environmental Conservation on the program to allow for pre-opening testing.

Geoduck clams are in demand in the Orient but processors can't guarantee timely delivery because the clams must be tested after fishery openings, fisherman Clay Bezenek told the assembly.

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation does not perform pre-fishery testing in Southeast Alaska because the geoduck fishery near Ketchikan is too far from the state testing laboratory in Palmer, Bezenek said.

Dive fisheries in Canada and Washington are more competitive because authorities conduct tests in the weeks before fisheries open and continue testing during fishing periods, he said.

Clam beds are either approved as being free of toxins or are closed to fishing. Dive fishermen, therefore, can ship the clams directly from the grounds to customers in China and other nations.

The 104 licensed divers in Southeast took about 400,000 pounds of clams in the last year. The dive association is projecting that the fishery will soon produce more than a million pounds a year.

The price for live geoducks has increased from 50 cents a pound a few years ago, to \$6 or more a pound, Bezenek said.

I am a geoduck diver in Southeast Alaska and would like to respond to Mr. Pihlman's letter (Empire, Feb. 21) regarding the Southeast Regional Dive Fisheries Associations {SARDFA} letter (Empire, Feb. 13) regarding the geoduck aquaculture permit applications.

Mr. Pihlman's letter has some "Clintonesque" statements in it that I'd like to respond to. "Clintonesque" in my opinion, means putting make-up on a half or mistruth, and hoping people don't call you on it. Well, people became well-aware of Clinton's tactics and it's time for you to be aware of the real truths regarding the whole geoduck aquaculture fiasco.

The reason that people have become so venomous regarding the geoduck resource in Southeast is because the clams have become one of the most highly sought after seafood products in the world! The prices in Washington normally range from \$7-10 per pound for these mollusks, and the outlook remains good. So people are trying to gain access to these animals at any cost.

I would like to start out by saying that I haven't heard a single harvest diver say that they're against aquaculture for geoducks. What they do have a great problem with is aquaculture permittees gaining access to large amounts of wild geoducks on their sites.

A couple examples of what some permittees said on their applications to the state are: "No naturally occurring geoducks here..." The state, with their own survey, found this applicant to have roughly 325,000 pounds of clams on his proposed site.

Another applicant claimed, after 20 survey dives, to have seen marginal geoduck distribution of wild clam on his sites... The Fish and Game survey results: 615,000 pounds of clams! Does everybody see our point now? I'll do the math for you. At \$4.50 live price, which I received for my live clams this year, the first site equals \$1.46 million, the second \$2.77 million.

This isn't the idea that any of us commercial fisherman had to what "farming" was all about! We believe that you plant a seed, keep the predators out, then harvest your product. What is happening is the Aquatic Farm Act is being loopholed to death so some people can capitalize off our state's resources.

And by the way, SARDFA has been the best thing to happen to the dive fisheries in Southeast since the drysuit! We have developed a working relationship with the Legislature, Fish and Game, and our local municipalities that is second to none. Our executive director, Julie Decker, has gone beyond what any fisheries executive director I have been associated with. As far as ethics and integrity goes, she's won the respect of a lot of people in Southeast Alaska.

Mr. Pihlman's letter is in poor taste and really doesn't deserve any reply. I'm just letting you people of Juneau hear my version of the truth. All my statements can be verified by the state of Alaska.

As a member of the Southeast Alaska Regional Dive Fisheries Association, SARDFa, and geoduck diver I would like to comment on the recent debate over aquaculture. I have seen the geoduck fishery in Alaska go from almost nothing 15 years ago to now almost less than nothing in terms of dollars we make. I wonder if it's time to take a different look at how we manage some of our fishery resources

Aquatic farmers for geoducks want to go into areas that are not being used by our dive fishery and develop aquatic farms using the existing stock to increase the productivity of the bed. If we are not using the resource and it doesn't conflict with the fishery, I don't see why another commercial user group shouldn't have the opportunity for another use.

If someone can come up with a better way to bring more value to the fishery or resource then I feel we should listen. Part of the problem in Alaska is that we have heard so much hype about what others in Washington and Canada are making from the geoducks resource that we can't seem to properly assess our own resource.

I have seen the letters from SARDFa Executive Director Julie Decker and SARDFa members Clay Bezenek and Lance Pihlman. I have no vested interest in any of the proposed aquatic farms and as a geoduck diver eligible for a limited entry permit I support the geoduck farmers.

What I don't support is Mrs. Decker saying that SARDFa believes that these farmers will "rob" and "destroy" the resource. Those are ridiculous statements and unfounded.

I find it frustrating that Mrs. Decker and members like Clay Bezenek say they are not opposed to aquatic farms, yet we are just now finding out that SARDFa has taken thousands of dollars from our self assessment fund to hire lawyers to file briefs against "all" of the geoduck farmers in the lawsuit against the state. Who is robbing who here? This is my money and they are taking it to fight against something that many of us support. What these members of SARDFa are really saying is that they are not against geoduck farms, just anybody who is currently trying to do it.

Mr. Bezenek talks about the 800,000 pounds of resource on the proposed farm sites, but fails to point out that there are about 18 million pounds of geoduck bio-mass dedicated to the current fishery. He also fails to point out that fishery is still open today because nobody wants the product.

By next year limited entry will be in place that will give sole commercial access to 104 divers with only 52 of these permits being transferable, and the majority of those permits going to out of state divers. Using Mr. Bezenek's numbers and logic, by next year, 52 mostly out-of-state diver will have the sole rights to buy and sell \$81 million worth of geoduck resource and he believes any future commercial expansion of the resource should go entirely to this one group.

Mr. Bezenek talks about the geoduck aquaculture fiasco. In my opinion the real fiasco here is SARDFa and the Alaska Department of Fish & Game (ADF&G). In my view all of the misinformation and nonfacts have been coming from SARDFa and ADF&G.

If you look at how we are taxing ourselves it really doesn't make a lot of sense. For example, we are currently taxed on our sea cucumber fishery, yet the fishery is fully developed and completely funded through ADF&G's budget. The tax this year increased ADF&G's budget for this fishery by 250 percent. This money goes into the general fund and then goes directly back to ADF&G.

In my view SARDFA will likely end up being a good example of how not to manage or develop fisheries. What we have done here, is to completely politicize an industry that really just needed a little funding and some good science and management.

1. Do I need a guide?

Nonresidents who hunt Brown Bear, Dall Sheep, or Mountain Goat must be accompanied in the field by licensed Alaska Big Game Registered Guide-Outfitter or be accompanied in the field by an Alaska resident 19 years or older who is within the second degree of kindred.

Nonresident aliens (non-U.S. citizens) hunting any big game must be accompanied in the field by an Alaska Big Game Registered Guide-Outfitter.

2. How can I receive a list of big game guides?

Download List of Licensees from Internet.

To receive a list in the mail of all currently licensed Big Game Master/Registered Guides-Outfitters and Transporters, submit a check or money order in the amount of \$5 (U.S. currency), made payable to the State of Alaska. Upon receipt of your written request and \$5 fee, a list will be forwarded to you. The \$5 fee and written request can be mailed to:

If a guide-outfitter intends to provide big game services during the calendar year, the roster will provide the guide use area(s) that the master or registered guide-outfitter is authorized to provide big game services and the addresses of the master/registered guide-outfitters and transporters.

3. How do I get a list of big game guide-outfitters that provide services for a particular species?

Obtain the most current hunting regulations from the Department of Fish and Game, Wildlife Conservation (907 465-2376), to determine which Game Management Unit(s) list the type of species you are interested in hunting. Once you have determined the Game Management Unit(s) you want to hunt in, you can request a list of currently licensed big game master/registered guide-outfitters who provide services in the unit(s) (see number 4 below).

4. Can I obtain a list of guide-outfitters who are providing big game services in a specific Game Management Unit (GMU)?

There are two ways you can obtain this information:

7. Can I pay application, examination, license, or the big game guide-outfitter and transporter list fees by credit card?

8. I am a registered guide-outfitter in need of an assistant who is looking for work. Does the board maintain a list of guides seeking employment?

The board does not maintain a list of licensed guides seeking employment. However, you can purchase a list of all currently licensed guides or you can download the information from the Internet. **See FAQ #2.**

9. How do I notify the office of a change of address?

We must have the request for address change in writing. We will accept a fax, E-mail, or written notice that comes directly from you. We cannot accept a telephone call for a change of address.

10. I lost my license and I need a new one, how do I get a copy? Can you fax it?

To obtain a copy of your license, submit a written request and a duplicate license fee of \$5 (U.S. Currency). The duplicate license fee can be paid in the form of a check or money order made payable to the State of Alaska, and mailed to the address above. Upon receipt of your written request and \$5 duplicate license fee, we will mail the duplicate license to you. We do not fax licenses.

11. When will I receive my license renewal form?

Master/Registered Guide-Outfitter, Class-A Assistant Guide, Assistant Guide, and Transporter licenses expire on December 31 on odd-numbered years. Renewal forms are mailed to all current licensees

approximately 30 days prior to the expiration date.

12. I am a guide/outfitter in another state. Does the Alaska Big Game Commercial Services Board have reciprocity with any other states?

The board does not offer reciprocity. To become a contracting guide in Alaska, you must have performed the services of either a licensed class-A assistant or assistant guide in the state for a part of each three years (Alaska Statute (AS) 08.54.610(6)) and meet the requirements of AS 08-54.605 and .610.

Application forms describe the qualification requirements for licensure.

13. Can a nonresident or nonresident alien obtain a guide or transporter license?

A nonresident can obtain a guide or transporter license by meeting the qualifications under Alaska Statute 08.54 and 12 AAC 75.

A nonresident alien may also obtain a guide or transporter license by meeting the qualifications under Alaska Statute 08.54 and 12 AAC 75.

Although the board may issue a nonresident alien a professional license, that does not mean the board is giving the individual authority to work in the United States. Licensees must meet all the requirements of the State and Federal government. The board advises each nonresident alien who obtains a professional license to contact immigration officials regarding the process for receiving authority to actually work in the United States.

14. Can I take the Registered Guide-Outfitter or Game Management Unit Certification examination in another location or time other than what is specified on the examination schedule?

The Registered Guide-Outfitter and Game Management Unit (GMU) certification examination locations and dates are predetermined and set by current statute (Alaska Statute 08.54.600(8) and regulations 12 AAC 75.100-.110)

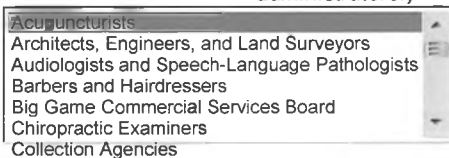

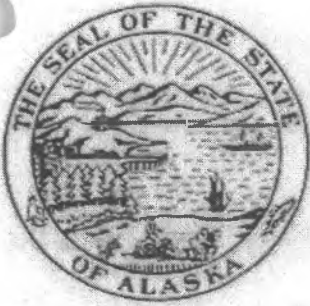



Alaska opens Delta Junction bison hunt early

FAIRBANKS - The state is opening the Delta Junction bison hunt two months early to help cut down on damage to local crops.

The early hunt that begins Monday will be for bulls only and will take place in limited areas.

Hunters with permits can take bison on private and public land north of the Alaska Highway. One parcel of private agricultural land south of the highway also will be open.

The early season does not apply to the 90,000-acre Delta Junction Bison Range or military lands south of the Alaska Highway. This is where bison typically roam before moving into farm fields.

A crop damage assessment conducted last fall estimated that bison caused more than \$142,000 worth of damage to crop lands.

"We're hoping an early hunt can be a helpful management tool," biologist Steve DuBois with the Alaska Department of Fish and Game said in a statement.

The Delta bison hunt, which normally opens Oct. 1, is the most popular drawing permit hunt in the state. It attracts more than 10,000 applications each year for about 100 permits. The state issued 70 bull permits and 50 cow permits this year.

Crop damage caused by bison has been a long-standing problem for farmers in the area. The 400-head herd spends about half its time on private agricultural land, where the animals eat, tromp and destroy crops like barley, hay and potatoes.

Some farmers have called for fencing the herd in or fencing their crops in, as well as reducing the size of the herd. Hunters have strongly opposed those options, resulting in a stalemate over the issue.

The early hunt was a suggestion from the Delta Bison Working Group, an advisory committee created by Fish and Game. The group, which has representatives from farming and hunting interests, has not come to any kind of consensus over decreasing herd size or fencing.

Delta farmer Mike Schultz, who represents the farming community in the group, said opening the season earlier is "worth a try."

Don Quarberg, one of two hunting representatives, agreed.

"I don't think (an earlier hunting season) is going to be the salvation but it can't be any worse," he said. "At least they're doing something."

Delta Junction farmers call for multimillion-dollar bison fence

FAIRBANKS — If you build it, they will still come. But at least they won't be able to get in.

That's the premise behind a proposal from an advisory group to the Alaska Department of Fish and Game to fence in 100,000 acres of private agricultural land in Delta Junction to prevent crop damage caused by a herd of wild bison.

The proposal includes approximately 160 miles of fence around two large blocks of agricultural land and a 45-mile "drift" fence on the south side of the Richardson and Alaska highways from the Tanana River to the Gerstle River to keep bison out of areas that will not be fenced in.

At this point, nobody really knows how much the project would cost, where the money would come from to pay for it, what state agency would lead the project, or whether the Alaska Legislature would even give its needed approval.

"It's kind of pie in the sky," is how Don Quarberg of Delta, a hunting representative on the working group, put it.

Fencing is one of the topics that will be discussed Thursday during a public meeting sponsored by the Department of Fish and Game to discuss an update of the Delta Bison Management Plan. The meeting is at 7 p.m. in the Alpine Lodge.

The department is also proposing to reduce the size of the herd in an attempt to reduce crop damage. The department's management objective is 360 bison before spring calving, and the state is proposing a new objective of 275 to 325 pre-calving. The herd currently numbers about 340 animals.

The purpose of Thursday's meeting is to get feedback on the proposals and future management, state wildlife planner Randy Rogers with the Department of Fish and Game in Fairbanks said.

"We expect we will get quite a lot of public comment," he said

Hunters will likely provide a good portion of that comment. A permit to hunt Delta bison is the most coveted hunting permit in Alaska. Last year, the department received more than 20,000 applications from hunters for 120 drawing permits.

The hunting community has offered no support for fencing, whether it's fencing the bison in or out, Rogers said. Hunters also oppose any reduction in the herd.

But some farmers say something has to be done. Bison get approximately half their food supply from agricultural land. In addition to eating crops like hay and

barley, bison damage plants by tromping through them.

The Department of Fish and Game has a mandate from the Legislature to manage a free-ranging bison herd, so “we don’t consider any fencing options as part of the plan right now,” Rogers said.

The Legislature has shown little interest in Delta bison management, Rogers said, though Rep. Eric Feige, R-Chickaloon, co-chairman of the House Resources Committee, asked the department for an estimate of how much it would cost to fence the bison onto the 90,000-acre Delta Bison Range, which was established by the Legislature in 1977 to provide food for the bison.

Based on Fish and Game’s rough estimate of \$50,000 per mile, it would cost roughly \$3.15 million to fence in the bison range, which has a circumference of 63 miles. That compares to approximately \$8 million to build 160 miles of fence to enclose private agricultural land and \$2.25 million to build a 45-mile drift fence on the south side of the Alaska Highway to keep them away from agricultural lands.

Division of Agriculture Director Franci Havemeister, meanwhile, agreed that fencing is the only way to keep bison out of agricultural land.

“Ultimately it’s a funding issue,” she said. “Who’s going to pay for it?”

Delta cooperative extension agent Phil Kaspari, a farmer and member of the bison working group, would like to see some kind of fence to protect farmers’ crops.

“I see that as a huge improvement for the agricultural community, but I’m not optimistic in seeing anything happen for years,” he said.

A written comment period of at least 30 days will follow Thursday’s meeting, Rogers said.

Alaska Game Board Chairman Ron Somerville Apologizes for Offensive Remarks to Natives

Implies Absent Natives Off Drinking Beer

The new Board of Game chairman apologized Wednesday for implying that Natives absent from a recent meeting may have been off drinking beer.

Ron Somerville, who has a long history of angering Natives with outspoken views on subsistence, added that the uproar in the Native community over the comments is a diversionary tactic.

The Game Board is restricting subsistence hunts in the Nelchina basin north and east of Anchorage, including the popular caribou hunt, and Natives from the region strongly oppose the changes.

Somerville, of Juneau, said he was trying to lighten tension at the end of a long Game Board meeting last month when he made his comment about beer drinking.

"If I offended somebody, I'm terribly, terribly embarrassed by that, if it was taken other than as just a way of breaking the tension and I apologize for that. I don't think I have to, to be honest with you, but if that's what happened and someone took it wrong ..." he said.

A Native woman privately complained to him at the meeting that the comments were offensive, he said. He had not heard of any other complaints until now, he said.

The Alaska Federation of Natives voted Saturday to ask the U.S. Department of Justice, the Alaska Human Rights Commission and the state ombudsman to investigate the remarks.

Alcohol is a sensitive topic in Native villages, where it's blamed for high rates of violent crime, suicide, fetal alcohol syndrome and other ills.

If the remarks are deemed "inappropriate, discriminatory, oppressive or discourteous," AFN will ask the state to pursue "corrective action," including removing Somerville, according to a resolution passed at the AFN convention.

Somerville made his remarks Oct. 7. During a public comment period, he called on three people in a row signed up to speak but who weren't there, according to a recording provided by Game Board staff.

The three were part of a group of more than 50 Alaska Natives from Copper River-area communities who had been speaking throughout the day.

Some charged the board with wanting to restrict subsistence hunting to create a surplus of caribou, leaving enough to open a sport hunt for the first time in 17 years next year.

After the third speaker didn't show, Somerville said:

"There must have been a run on free beer or something."

Somerville called Donna Hicks of Copper Center to speak.

Hicks was present. "Don't like beer, Donna?" he asked.

Some general laughter followed the statements, though it's impossible to tell from the recording who is laughing.

Several Natives in the audience were offended.

"I was like, 'That was uncalled for, especially since he knew we were all Indians,' " said Tammany Straughn of Cantwell. "It's stereotyping, like, 'Oh they're drunken Indians.' That's the way I felt."

Board member Ben Grussendorf of Sitka "kind of stiffened up" when he heard the comment, he said.

There were about 45 people in the audience. About six Natives looked at each other, apparently questioning the remarks, he said.

Grussendorf said the meeting had become somewhat informal, even conversational.

"I think he meant it in jest, and it just didn't sit well," Grussendorf said.

Somerville, appointed chairman at that October meeting, is no stranger to political fire storms or Native issues.

For much of the 1980s, he headed the pro-sport hunting and fishing Alaska Outdoor Council, leading efforts to overturn the state's old rural priority for subsistence.

In 1991, Gov. Wally Hickel suggested Somerville to head the Department of Fish and Game, touching off a statewide flurry of protests by Alaska Natives.

The appointment, ultimately rejected by the fish and game boards, was critical because the state was seeking new ways to provide subsistence hunting and fishing. The state's rural priority had been ruled unconstitutional in 1989.

The AFN delegates were told of Somerville's comments by Brenda Rebne of Ahtna Inc., the Glennallen-based regional Native corporation for the Copper River area.

The board wants to make the Nelchina rules so cumbersome that people won't apply to subsistence hunt, Rebne announced at the convention.

She pointed out that the Game Board has made it impossible for many young people to proxy hunt for elders, among other restrictions.

In October, the board also reduced the number of caribou permits per household from three to two.

The board plans to continue discussing, but not make decisions on, Nelchina subsistence hunts at its Nov. 10-15 meeting in Wrangell, said Matt Robus, state director of wildlife conservation.

Further restrictions the board might consider at an Anchorage meeting in March include reducing ATV and other vehicular use, such as planes and RVs that take hunters nearer to prey, and awarding permits based in part on household income.

The Nelchina caribou hunt has been contentious for years, with many hunters saying it's unfair and excludes too many.

Thousands of Alaskans apply every year to hunt caribou in the basin, an area roughly framed by the Parks, Denali, Richardson, Glenn and Tok Cutoff highways, but sometimes only a small percentage win permits.

Once the board finishes rewriting the rules, it will redefine the amount of caribou and moose necessary for subsistence hunts. If there's a surplus of caribou, the board could create a general drawing hunt for all Alaskans after subsistence needs are met.

That's not the board's intent, Somerville said Wednesday, but it might end up that way.





AS 16.05.221. Boards of Fisheries and Game.

(a) For purposes of the conservation and development of the fishery resources of the state, there is created the Board of Fisheries composed of seven members appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by a majority of the members of the legislature in joint session. The governor shall appoint each member on the basis of interest in public affairs, good judgment, knowledge, and ability in the field of action of the board, and with a view to providing diversity of interest and points of view in the membership. The appointed members shall be residents of the state and shall be appointed without regard to political affiliation or geographical location of residence. The commissioner is not a member of the Board of Fisheries, but shall be ex officio secretary.

(b) For purposes of the conservation and development of the game resources of the state, there is created a Board of Game composed of seven members appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by a majority of the members of the legislature in joint session. The governor shall appoint each member on the basis of interest in public affairs, good judgment, knowledge, and ability in the field of action of the board, and with a view to providing diversity of interest and points of view in the membership. The appointed members shall be residents of the state and shall be appointed without regard to political affiliation or geographical location of residence. The commissioner is not a member of the Board of Game, but shall be ex officio secretary.

(c) Members of the Board of Game serve staggered terms of three years and, except as provided in AS [39.05.080](#) (4), each member serves until a successor is appointed. An appointment to fill a

vacancy in the membership of the Board of Game shall be made in the same manner as the original appointment and, except as provided in AS [39.05.080](#) (4), an appointment to fill a vacancy is for the balance of the unexpired term.

(d) Members of the Board of Fisheries serve staggered terms of three years. The terms of members of the board begin on July 1. Notwithstanding AS [39.05.080](#) (1), by April 1 of the calendar year in which the term expires, the governor shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy that will arise on the board due to expiration of the term of a member of the board and submit the name of the person to the legislature for confirmation. If a vacancy arises on the board, the governor shall, within 30 days after the vacancy arises, appoint a person to serve the balance of the unexpired term and submit the name of the person to the legislature for confirmation. A person appointed to fill the balance of an unexpired term shall serve on the board from the date of appointment until the earlier of the expiration of the term or the failure of the legislature to confirm the person under AS [39.05.080](#).

Board of Game

The Board of Game consists of seven members serving three-year terms. Members are appointed by the governor and confirmed by the legislature. Members are appointed on the basis of interest in public affairs, good judgment, knowledge, and ability in the field of action of the board, with a view to providing diversity of interest and points of view in the membership (see Alaska Statute 16.05.221).

The Board of Game's main role is to conserve and develop Alaska's wildlife resources. This includes establishing open and closed seasons, areas for taking game, setting bag limits; and regulating methods and means. The board is also involved with setting policy and direction for the management of the state's wildlife resources. The board is charged with making allocative decisions, and the Department of Fish and Game is responsible for management based on those decisions.

The board meeting cycle generally occurs from October through March. The board considers changes to regulations on a region-based schedule. Each region will be discussed on a Two-year cycle. Board of Game meetings vary in duration from 5 to 11 days and occur in communities around the state. The board may also meet due to a court action, legislation or an emergency situation. The board uses biological and socioeconomic information provided by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, public comment received from people inside and outside of the state, and guidance from the Alaska Department of Public Safety and Alaska Department of Law when creating regulations that are sound and enforceable.

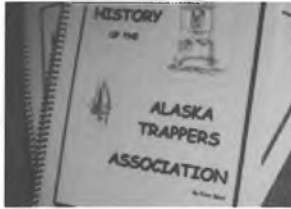

Governor Parnell, show some respect for wildlife, and Alaskans

Former of Fish & Game Conservation Director Corey Rossi's wildlife violations are an embarrassment to Alaska, a disgrace to the Parnell administration, an insult to the good people who work at Fish & Game and an affront to all Alaskans. Unfortunately, Rossi was not the only individual in Alaska's wildlife management who should resign.

Cliff Judkins, the current chair of the Board of Game, was with Corey Rossi and former BoG member Bob Bell on a musk ox hunt during which they were caught with trophy horns that were supposed to have been destroyed as a condition of their subsistence hunt. Nevertheless, Governor Parnell did not ask Judkins to step down from the BoG or even from his position as chair.

Members of Advisory Committees (local volunteer groups statewide that send recommendations on proposals to the Board of Game and the Board of Fish) are not currently vetted. While most AC members are dedicated, knowledgeable citizens, some recent and/or current AC members in our state have wildlife violations, sex violations; and even though the Juneau-Douglas Advisory Committee is a deservedly well respected group, one of its former members was a convicted felon. (Note that the JDAC now asks each applicant about his/her record, even though the state does not require such vetting.)

The Joint Boards (Board of Game and Board of Fish) is currently addressing this AC vetting problem, however some members of the Board of Game and the Board of Fish have wildlife violations themselves, including Parnell's most recently confirmed appointee. Parnell knew of this appointee's wildlife violations when he appointed him, but chose not to tell our legislators during the confirmation process.

And Parnell's most recent appointee, Lynn Keogh, Jr., who is currently in the process of being confirmed by the state Legislature, has a fairly lengthy civil court record (<http://www.courtrecords.alaska.gov/pa/pa.urd/PAMW6500>) including listings in Anchorage, Glennallen, Homer, Kenai, and Palmer. Additionally, despite the state mandate for diversity in the Board of Game, Mr. Keogh's resume clearly shows that he brings nothing new to the BoG.

Predator control in Alaska is out of control because many of those who manage Alaska's wildlife are out of control. Governor Parnell, stop letting underqualified and disreputable people manage Alaska's wildlife. Clean up your house: Replace Mr. Rossi with someone who has the professional qualifications, education, experience, and personal integrity necessary for the position; reform wildlife management in the last frontier, and appoint reputable people with diverse backgrounds to our Board of Game. Alaska's wildlife belongs to all Alaskans. Start treating it — and the Alaskans whom you represent — with respect.

As you consider appointing new members to the Board of Game, please rebalance the Board so that the residents' interests are considered on an equal basis with the commercial guide interests.

Many residents are concerned with the focus of the current Board of Game. For example, in January there were 23 proposals presented to the BOG Statewide Meeting requesting some preferences for resident hunters and the board rejected all requests. Now, residents will have to wait until 2016 when the Board of Game will consider statewide proposals.

Dear Senator Paskvan and Staff:

Recently I contacted your Juneau office with my concerns about Mr. Keogh Jr. I elaborate on them bit more further along in this email. Suffice it to say Gov. Parnell's choice of this individual is a real slap in the face to the 85% of Alaskans who neither hunt or trap yet constitutionally are equal owners of our wildlife resource. Of specific interest are his interactions with the state court system, which have been many. I have been told his 2011 PDF check was garnished and he owes several thousands of dollars to the courts, which assertions should be documented in the attached PFD files.

To be specific:

1. As a guide and hunter he provides no diversity to a state entity originally designed to exhibit such. In fact, the Board as presently constituted offers no diversity whatsoever leaving the 85% of Alaskans who neither hunt or trap with no voice concerning a resource the State Constitution holds as equally owned by all residents.

2. Narrow viewpoint and lack of insight. Mr. Keogh is anti-predator. He has already shown this perspective in recent votes in which he has participated on the board. For instance, when the board took up airborne killing of wolves on the Kenai Peninsula, there were 380 comments sent to the members against the program and only 6 supporting it. Mr. Keogh and the others voted airborne killing into place. Though Fish and Game had noted the habitat is already very limited in providing moose forage due to decades of fire suppression, and even though one BOG member said he couldn't see where predator control would make any difference, it was enacted.

Similarly, when Rep. Seaton at the recent House Resources Comm. hearing on Keogh's nomination noted that the moose forage in his district has been devastated by an abundance of hares competing for the vegetation, Mr. Keogh correctly noted the plants will produce toxins that keep the hares from eating them. What Mr. Keogh apparently did not understand is this is a process that can take months. Apparently, he expects the moose to suspend foraging while waiting for this to take place. Such a lack of insight and understanding is distressing in someone in such a position.

3. He has apparently little appreciation for state laws as evidenced by his encounters with the court system over the years. Included below are just some records revealed by a search of the state files. Also, you can find Mr. Keogh Jr.'s (note the birthdate in distinguishing between Sr. and Jr.) extensive court record at: <http://www.courtrecords.alaska.gov/pa/pa.urd/PAMW6500> Given the recent debacle with Corey Rossi it would behoove any entity associated with wildlife management in Alaska to be held to a high degree of integrity. His documented history would fail such scrutiny.

At a time when Alaskans are becoming more aware of the failings and biases of our Board of Game, of how it fails to represent but a select, elite group of people, appointments to this Board should be able to pass a litmus test of considerable quality and intensity for certainly they will be subject to such each time they meet with the public.

Of specific interest are his interactions with the state court system, which have been many, and the perpetuation of the status quo he brings to the Board of Game as yet another guide and hunter.

1. As a guide and hunter he provides no diversity to a state entity originally designed to exhibit such. Seaton at the recent House Resources Comm. hearing on Keogh's nomination noted that the moose forage in his district has been devastated by an abundance of hares competing for the vegetation, Mr. Keogh correctly noted the plants will produce toxins that keep the hares from eating them. What Mr. Keogh apparently did not understand is this is a process that can take months. Apparently, he expects the moose to suspend foraging while waiting for this to take place. Such a lack of insight and understanding is distressing in someone in such a position.

4. **Keogh apparently has little appreciation for state laws,** as evidenced by his encounters with the Alaska court system over the years. Court records at <http://www.courtrecords.alaska.gov> show at least 13 violations over the past several years. Given the recent highly publicized debacles involving former Alaska Department of Fish & Game Commissioner Corey Rossi and BOG member Cliff Judkins (who still sits on the Board), a wildlife management nominee must be held to the highest degree of integrity. Keogh's documented history fails such scrutiny. It is unconscionable to let a person make crucial decisions when he has demonstrated a long-standing pattern of poor judgment.

5. **At least 4 people who are currently on the applicant list for the BOG would bring diversity to the Board** by representing the vast majority of residents who do not hunt or trap. All of these applicants have clean court records, and all are respectable Alaskans we can trust to make wildlife management decisions based on science. Keogh is not one of them.


6. **Keogh has already joined the BOG's war on bears.** Many, many Alaskans and potential visitors are outraged and discouraged by recent BOG-approved programs such as bear baiting and snaring. Given his resume and his votes at the recent Fairbanks BOG meeting, Keogh would continue to support extreme control (killing) programs targeting bears and other predators. Each year visitors

spend millions of dollars hoping to see Alaska's bears and other wildlife; policies favored by Keogh give the state a "black eye" and cause economic harm to the tourism industry.

7 Several years ago AWA Advisory Board member Kneeland Taylor served with Keogh on a committee set up to work out a compromise between trappers and hikers with dogs. Kneeland reports that Keogh began most meetings with verbal personal attacks on the hikers, and did his best to sabotage the committee's work. He ultimately succeeded, and the result was no compromise.

At a time when Alaskans are becoming more aware of the failings and biases of our Board of Game, of how it fails to represent but a select, elite group of people, appointments to this Board should be able to pass a litmus test of considerable quality and intensity for certainly they will be subject to such each time they meet with the public.

Dear Senator Paskvan:

This email comes from a deep concern over the latest Board of Game appointment by Gov. Parnell, i.e., Lynn Keogh. My hope is to bring sufficient attention to the total inadequacy of Mr. Keogh for this position to the pertinent members of the Senate and House.

There are three major points (and perhaps many other near-major) to be made in objection to this appointment.

1. Lack of diversity. Mr. Keogh is a guide and a hunter. The BOG already has two guides and all members are hunters. Yet the state constitution says the board should represent all Alaskans as we are all equal (and I stress "equal") owners of this resource. What this reality means is, for instance, if you neither hunt nor trap you have no representation on the board that sets all the regulations concerning your wildlife. For instance, when the board took up airborne killing of wolves on the Kenai Peninsula, there were 380 comments sent to the members against the program and only 6 supporting it. Mr. Keogh and the others voted airborne killing into place. Though Fish and Game had noted the habitat is already very limited in providing moose forage due to decades of fire suppression, and even though one BOG member said he couldn't see where predator control would make any difference, it was enacted.

Similarly, when Rep. Seaton at the recent House Resources Comm. hearing on Keogh's nomination noted that the moose forage in his district has been devastated by an abundance of hares competing for the vegetation, Mr. Keogh correctly noted the plants will produce toxins that keep the hares from eating them. What Mr. Keogh apparently did not understand is this is a process that can take months. Apparently, he expects the moose to suspend foraging while waiting for this to take place. 3. Court violations. A quick search of COURTVIEW reveals that Mr. Keogh (Jr.) has had 13 violations lodged against him in the past several years. That is a minimum of the 27 listed as at times it is hard to distinguish between Jr. and Sr. Regardless, it shows a rather astounding lack of concern in following state laws, a lack that is quite liable to have diffused into other areas of his life. In view of the recent debacle of Corey Rossi and our game laws, one would think the governor would take pains to present an appointment of unquestionable integrity. This is most definitely not the case with Lynn Keogh.

At a time when wildlife issues are splitting the state in so many ways; at a time when outside trophy hunting organizations are expanding their influence on our wildlife management, it would seem there is all the more need for a diverse, knowledgeable, upstanding Board of Game. Instead, in all these respects our board fails to measure up.

I hope I have piqued your interest in this issue. Mr. Keogh's nomination will be going before the Senate Resources Committee soon then it starts its journey to a final joint hearing at the end of the session. It is my hope Mr. Keogh will be denied a position on the Board of Game for the above reasons. We need a Board of Game that responds to the needs of the management issues rather than to the wishes of a few trophy hunting organizations with influence in Alaska. There are numerous possible nominees far more qualified in all respects on the list of potential BOG nominations. Mr. Parnell could have chosen far more wisely.

His record as an active hunter and trapper would surely guarantee yet another voice for those pursuits, despite the fact that the majority of Alaskans neither hunt nor trap. For example, there was overwhelming public opposition to the airborne killing of wolves on the Kenai Peninsula, and yet Keogh voted in favor and the plan was approved.

Even if you cared nothing about Alaska's wildlife, many tourists who live outside of Alaska do, and Alaskan tourism suffers. There are others on the applicant list for the BOG who would bring diversity to the Board by representing the majority of Alaskans who do not hunt or trap, and I urge you to vote for one of them instead.

The Alaska Outdoor Council supports the nomination of Mr. Lynn Keogh to the Alaska Board of Game.

The Alaska Outdoor Council (AOC) is a statewide organization of 10,000 Alaskans who hunt, fish, trap and enjoy the Alaska outdoor lifestyle. Our members depend on the Board of Game to make reasoned decisions on the allocation of the public game resource. Mr. Keogh has distinguished himself in this regard. He has participated in a limited number of meetings of the Board since his appointment, but has already contributed a great deal. AOC generally likes to see nominees be familiar with the BOG process. Mr. Keogh has a long record of service to his local Fish and Game Advisory Committee and has participated in that capacity in the Board of Game process. We also like to see a working familiarity with the basic provisions of the constitution, statutes and regulations that guide the board. Mr. Keogh has demonstrated this knowledge, both through the questions he asks of the public, his fellow board members and the department, but also in the statements he has made about his votes.

As you might expect, there is organized opposition to Mr. Keogh. Those organized against Mr. Keogh, representing a small percentage of Alaskans, hope to force the Governor to appoint someone with a limited perspective on how game resources are used. This opposition is based (but not always stated) on his votes on proposals before the board to implement scientific management. AS 16.05.255 (h) is clear: "The Board of Game shall establish population and harvest goals and seasons for intensive management of identified big game prey populations to achieve a high level of human harvest." While we understand that some people disagree with this policy as established by the legislature, we hope you will agree that it would be patently unfair for legislators to vote against Mr. Keogh based on his vote to implement a policy that the legislature itself established. Further, Mr. Keogh's votes during his short tenure on the board have been consistent with other board members who were confirmed by the legislature by sizable majorities.

The AOC communicates with its members through a variety of media. These votes on confirmations to the Board of Game are some of the most important issues before the

legislature to AOC members. 
The Fairbanks Fish and Game Advisory Committee (FAC) supports the confirmation of appointed Board of Game member Lynn Keogh.

“Go after every one of them who votes against Keogh?” Mr. Arno and Mr. Ruedrich may wish to note that legislators do not take an oath to special interest groups, nor to their political party. They take one to the people.

Lynn Keogh’s appointment to the Board of Game needs to be confirmed by the legislature for him to keep his seat on the board. Keep in mind that the Board of Game is supposed to represent a diversity of wildlife interests – hunting, trapping, biology, photography, tourism, bear watching, and those who simply enjoy the opportunity that the outdoor life in Alaska affords to sometimes catch sight of its amazing wildlife. This diversity isn’t just a suggestion, or an idealistic goal – it is mandated by statute that demands a diversity of interest and points of view.

At this point in time, the Board is overrun with only a couple of these groups, namely big game hunting and trapping. Does Keogh bring anything new to the board? Hardly.

So far he has approved killing both wolves and bears from helicopters, and also the baiting of brown bears – all extreme and controversial positions that would have been unimagined in Alaska until recently. He also voted to approve total extermination of bears in a 540 square mile area and to reduce wolves to the “lowest level possible” in a 1,360 square mile area.

Not only that, but in the growing tradition of Parnell appointments who do not appear to have been vetted, Mr. Keough has a civil court record as long as your arm. He is the defendant in all cases, and the plaintiff is the State of Alaska. Most of the long list of offenses are for traffic violations, but four are of particular interest, and involve illegal use of a high horsepower motor while guiding, and not paying boat launch fees. He seems to have a problem with issues of respecting rules, and repeatedly trying to get away with things about which he should know better. One wonders with a list this long of times he did get caught, how many times didn’t he?

Dear Senators,

The Alaska Outdoor Council supports the nomination of Mr. Lynn Keogh to the Alaska Board of Game.

The Alaska Outdoor Council (AOC) is a statewide organization of 10,000 Alaskans who hunt, fish, trap and enjoy the Alaska outdoor lifestyle. Our members depend on the Board of Game to make reasoned decisions on the allocation of the public game resource. Mr. Keogh has distinguished himself in this regard. He has participated in a limited number of meetings of the Board since his appointment, but has already contributed a great deal. AOC generally likes to see nominees be familiar with the BOG process. Mr. Keogh has a long record of service to his local Fish and Game Advisory Committee and has participated in that capacity in the Board of Game process. We also like to see a working familiarity with the basic provisions of the constitution, statutes and regulations that guide the board. Mr. Keogh has demonstrated this knowledge, both through the questions he asks of the public, his fellow board members and the department, but also in the statements he has made about his votes.

As you might expect, there is organized opposition to Mr. Keogh. Those organized against Mr. Keogh, representing a small percentage of Alaskans, hope to force the Governor to appoint someone with a limited perspective on how game resources are used. This opposition is based (but not always stated) on his votes on proposals before the board to implement scientific management. AS 16.05.255 (h) is clear: "The Board of Game shall establish population and harvest goals and seasons for intensive management of identified big game prey populations to achieve a high level of human harvest." While we understand that some people disagree with this policy as established by the legislature, we hope you will agree that it would be patently unfair for legislators to vote against Mr. Keogh based on his vote to implement a policy that the legislature itself established. Further, Mr. Keogh's votes during his short tenure on the board have been consistent with other board members who were confirmed by the legislature by sizable majorities.

The AOC communicates with its members through a variety of media. These votes on confirmations to the Board of Game are some of the most important issues before the

legislature to AOC members. It should come as no surprise to you that we will be making available to AOC members and clubs information about the confirmation process, as well as how individual legislators vote, so they can be informed as they participate in their democracy. PERSONAL BACKGROUND

I grew up in a family where being outdoors - well out of town and away from the crowds - was considered a great thing. As a child, my five siblings and I spent summers with our mother, father, aunt, uncle and grandparents at the family cabin, where we literally got our feet wet, our faces dirty, and our hearts and minds filled with a deep appreciation for "the woods." We learned to fish with a rod and reel, handle firearms, and to clean and eat what we killed. As adults, we have continued these traditions and we have the pleasure of now passing them on to our children, nieces and nephews.

I personally have had the good fortune of many wonderful hunting opportunities for moose, caribou, sheep, bear, and deer, as well as ducks, ptarmigan and grouse. My husband, Bill, runs a trapline in the winter and as often as possible I join him to learn from and share the experience. We live in a log home, haul water, run a propane cook stove and lights, and provide our own part-time power system. Much of our diet comes from the wild food we harvest and each year's bounty from the garden.

I have no formal or professional training in wildlife management. My experience comes from a combination of personal field observation spending time in the natural environment, and a layman's study of applicable state and federal fish and game laws.

In part because of my personal interest in the outdoors, my work as a legislative aide often involved resource issues, which allowed me to hear many hours of testimony from Alaskans who expressed their perspectives and strong opinions on a wide range of fish and wildlife issues. I was also fortunate to have worked toward the passage of laws that have benefited hunters and trappers. My service on the board of directors of the Alaska Outdoor Council, including two years as president, has further broadened my understanding and appreciation of how important wildlife and the outdoors are to the people of the state. I have attended local Advisory Committee meetings, offered testimony to the Game Board, and provided public comments to the National Park Service on proposals of impact to the people, land, fish and game of my area.

Enabling present and future Alaskans to be responsible stewards of the resource, and to continue building and strengthening our outdoor heritage by assuring opportunity, are objectives I consider very meaningful and important. I believe they are goals that can be pursued and achieved through the efforts of the Board of Game, and I would be grateful for the opportunity to serve in that capacity.

Dear Senator Paskvan:

I am writing to ask you do not confirm Teresa Sager-Albaugh to another term on the Board of Game.

She has shown her unwillingness to listen to public input when, before she was first confirmed but had been appointed, she voted against the wishes of the 500 signatories to a petition supporting the continuation of the Denali Buffer Zone. She voted in favor of 5 recreational trappers. In doing so she also chose to ignore the testimony of the park superintendent.

She brings absolutely no diversity to the Board, being a former president of the Alaska Outdoor Council and an NRA member. Once again, the vast majority of non-hunting Alaskans are being ignored and have no real voice in this resource which is owned equally by all Alaskans according to the state constitution. Sager-Albaugh has consistently, often against the science, voted in favor of Intensive Management. In short, she is one of the worst choices for continued service on the BoG.

As for Mr. Mumford, I take heart in his considerable experience as a wildlife trooper. I hope that will serve him well should he be confirmed. But once again I see no diversity in his presence as he is a hunter, NRA member, member of the Alaska Professional Hunters Association, and cannot be said to represent that constantly-ignored 85% of non-hunting Alaskans.

While I cannot speak to Mr. Mumford's perspective, definitely Ms. Sager-Albaugh brings nothing good from her previous term and promises only more of the same mismanagement that anymore is the mark of the present Board of Game.
