11 person as a retired veteran or a veteran of the armed forces of the United States
12 discharged under honorable conditions. The department may not charge a fee solely
13 for the designation. To receive a veteran designation, the person shall provide proof of

1 veteran status that shows the person is retired or discharged under honorable
2 conditions. With the approval of the person, the department shall make available to the
3 Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs the name and address of a person
4 receiving a veteran designation under this subsection. Notwithstanding (a) of this
5 section, the department may charge a fee of \$5 for replacement of a valid
6 identification card with a new identification card with a veteran designation.

7 * **Sec. 2.** AS 28.15.111 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

8 (c) At the request of an applicant, the department shall provide a veteran
9 designation and United States flag replica on a license identifying the driver as a
10 retired veteran or a veteran of the armed forces of the United States discharged under
11 honorable conditions. The department may not charge a fee solely for the designation.
12 To receive a veteran designation, the driver shall make available proof of veteran
13 status that shows that the person is retired or discharged under honorable conditions.
14 With the approval of the applicant, the department shall make available to the
15 Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs the name and address of a driver
16 receiving a veteran designation under this subsection. The department may charge a
17 fee of \$5 for replacement of a valid driver's license with a new license with a veteran
18 designation. A replacement license with a veteran designation issued for \$5 under this
19 subsection shall retain the expiration date of the license it replaces.

Sponsor Statement CSHB 180 (FIN)

House Bill 180 seeks to help Alaska veterans receive more of the benefits they have earned through their sacrifice and service in uniform, and to which they are entitled by law and custom. With the approval of the person/applicant, this bill would allow the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to add the United States Flag background to state drivers' licenses or identification cards signifying the holder's status as a veteran, and would allow DMV (with permission of person/applicant) to share that information with the state's veterans benefit office.

Alaska is among the most veteran-friendly states in the Union. Many businesses and organizations demonstrate their appreciation by offering various discounts, preferences and other benefits to *bona fide* veterans. However, veterans must usually prove they qualify by presenting certified copies of their discharge documents – the DD-214, DD-215, or NGB-22 forms, exposing these critical documents to wear, damage or loss.

By giving veterans a way to carry reliable and convenient proof of their status on state-issued cards, this bill would help them more easily enjoy the full range of personal, business and social benefits offered to them by a grateful state.

HB 180 could also help relieve the situation in which tens of thousands of Alaska veterans may be missing out on significant government benefits, because they have no contact with the state's Office of Veterans Affairs. Should a an applicant express interest and permission, HB 180 would allow DMV to provide the names and addresses of those who are issued veteran-designated driver's licenses or ID cards to the state veterans' office. That office could then reach out to make more veterans aware of programs available to them, and to help them receive any benefits owed to them.

I respectfully request your support for House Bill 180.

Explanation of Changes in CSHB 180(FIN)

"An Act authorizing the Department of Administration to note a person's status as a retired veteran or a veteran discharged under honorable conditions on the person's driver's license or identification card, to provide certain information to the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, and to charge a fee for replacing a valid driver's license or identification card with a new license or card that includes the veteran designation; and providing for an effective date."

CS for HB 180 adopted the following changes from the State Affairs Version:

- In both sections we added provisions that the applicant or person must give *permission* to the DMV to
 - (a) receive the designation on their license or ID card
 - (b) forward their names/addresses to Veterans Affairs to assist in their efforts to disseminate information to all known veterans in Alaska
- In this version the Finance Committee added that it be a United States Flag designation on the card that signifies their veteran status
- CSHB 180 also allows DMV to charge \$5 for the card upon renewal, a reduction from the standard \$15 replacement fee
- The effective date was changed to March 2013, giving the Department of Motor Vehicles ample time to implement the technology necessary to redesign the cards and data programs for the new designation

Analysis

The effective date of this bill is March 1, 2012. For purposes of this fiscal note, the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) assumes the bill will be amended to take effect March 1, 2013.

Expenditures

- 1) The DMV's antiquated database is almost 30 years old; the way it was programmed makes it difficult to effect even minor changes.
 - a) Add a 'veteran' field to DMV's database - **160 contract hours**
The field must be added to 40-50 programs within the database; each program will have to be tested prior to deployment. Since DMV shares data with Dept of Public Safety, a field will also need to be added to the shared program, then tested and deployed.
 - b) Redesign the driver's licenses and ID cards to accommodate the designation - **160 contract hours**
With the current license/ID design, there is no space to add a designation. Either the font will need to be reduced and/or items rearranged to accommodate the veteran designation. DMV issues 40 different types of licenses and IDs. Each type will have to be modified, tested, and deployed.
 - c) Create a reporting feature for notification to DMVA - **80 contract hours**
The bill does not specify exactly what would be required. The 80 hour estimate is based on producing a scheduled weekly mainframe report showing additions only.

Total estimated contract hours: 400

Cost per hour: \$143 (this is the contract rate per the State's task order system for IT professional services)

Total programming cost: 400 x \$143 = \$57,200

- 2) Cost to produce duplicate licenses/IDs for existing population of Alaska veterans. DMV anticipates that 50% of qualified veterans will opt for the designator within the first year. Of those who opt for the designation in the first 12 months after the March 1, 2013, effective date, approximately one-fifth will have licenses/IDs that expire within those first 12 months; DMV will be required to issue duplicate licenses/IDs to the remaining four-fifths of veterans opting for the designator within the first 12 months.







- 1) The Division of Motor Vehicles' (DMV) antiquated database is almost 30 years old; the way it was programmed makes it difficult to effect even minor changes.
- a) Add a 'veteran' field to DMV's database - **109 contract hours**
The field must be added to 40-50 programs within the database; each program will have to be tested prior to deployment. Since DMV shares data with Department of Public Safety, a field will also need to be added to the shared program, then tested and deployed.
- b) Create a reporting feature for notification to Department of Military & Veterans Affairs - **60 contract hours**
The bill does not specify exactly what would be required. The 60 hour estimate is based on producing a scheduled weekly mainframe report showing additions only.

Total estimated contract hours: 169**Cost per hour: \$143 (contract rate per the State's task order system for IT professional services)****Total programming cost: 169 x \$143 = \$24,167**

- 2) Cost to produce replacement licenses/IDs for existing population of Alaska veterans. DMV anticipates that 50% of qualified veterans will opt for the designator within the first year. - 2) Reduced the estimated percentage of qualifying veterans who opt for the designation from 75% to 50%, based on comments made in the House Military & Veterans' Affairs committee meeting. This reduces both the cost for duplicate cards and the revenue from providing duplicates.
- 3) Allocation of costs and revenue between FY12 and FY13 resulting from the change in effective date.

Analysis

Expenditures

- 1) The Division of Motor Vehicles' (DMV) antiquated database is almost 30 years old; the way it was programmed makes it difficult to effect even minor changes.
 - a) Add a 'veteran' field to DMV's database - 160 contract hours
The field must be added to 40-50 programs within the database; each program will have to be tested prior to deployment. Since DMV shares data with Dept of Public Safety, a field will also need to be added to the shared program, then tested and deployed.
 - b) Redesign the driver's licenses and ID cards to accommodate the designation - 160 contract hours
With the current license/ID design, there is no space to add a designation. Either the font will need to be reduced and/or items rearranged to accommodate the veteran designation. DMV issues 40 different types of licenses and IDs. Each type will have to be modified, tested, and deployed.
 - c) Create a reporting feature for notification to DMVA - 80 contract hours
The bill does not specify exactly what would be required. The 80 hour estimate is based on producing a scheduled weekly mainframe report showing additions only.

Estimated hours: 400

Cost per hour: \$143 (this is the contract rate per the State's task order system for IT professional services)

Total programming cost: 400 x \$143 = \$57,200

- 2) Cost to produce duplicate licenses/IDs for existing population of Alaska veterans. DMV anticipates that 50% of qualified veterans will opt for the designator within the first year. Of those who opt for the designation in the first 12 months after the March 1, 2012 effective date, approximately one-fifth will have licenses/IDs that expire within those first 12 months; DMV will be required to issue duplicate licenses/IDs to the remaining four-fifths of veterans opting for the designator within the first 12 months.

This bill would require the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to print a designator on a driver's license identifying the driver as a veteran. This bill would also require DMV to provide the name and address of the license holder to the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs (DMVA).

Expenditures

- 1) Programming will be required to:
 - a) add a 'veteran' field to DMV's database;
 - b) redesign the driver's license to accommodate a designation; and
 - c) produce a reporting feature for notification to DMVA.

Estimated hours: 400

Cost per hour: \$143

Total programming cost: $400 \times \$143 = \$57,200$

- 2) Cost to produce duplicate licenses for existing population of Alaska veterans. If the designator will provide benefits to the veteran, such as store discounts, DMV anticipates that 75% of qualified drivers will opt for the designator within the first year.
