### Sponsor Statement

House Bill 205 "An Act relating to traffic offenses committed in a school zone; and prohibiting changing lanes in a school zone."

House Bill 205 focuses on safety in schools zone. It does this in two ways.

1. Doubling traffic fines in school zones. These are fine schedules already exist for highway work zones, and traffic safety corridors. It is common sense to add school zones to this list.
2. It bans changing lanes in school zone when the school zone light is flashing.

**Analysis**

HB 205 requires that the amount of bail or fine set for vehicle or traffic offenses be doubled if the offense occurs in a school zone.

The bill also prohibits changing lanes in a school zone equipped with a flashing light while the light is flashing. The penalty is a misdemeanor. It would provide for double the penalty otherwise applicable for a misdemeanor in Title 28 which is a fine of not more than \$500, incarceration for not more than 90 days, and suspension or revocation of the privilege to drive or vehicle registration. Thus the maximum would be, for example, a \$1,000 fine for the offense in a school zone with the flashing light operating.

The Department of Law does not anticipate a fiscal impact.

**Analysis**

This bill doubles the fines for traffic violations committed in a school zone. It also makes it a misdemeanor to change lanes in a school zone when the zone is effective.

A misdemeanor under Title 28 is punishable by a term of imprisonment of not more than 90-days. At the current daily cost of care the Department could see an impact ranging from \$0.0 (no time served) to \$14,280.3 (for a 90-day sentence) for each offender convicted under this legislation.

The Department will continue to monitor the potential future impacts of this legislation.

To Whom It May Concern:

For teachers and education support professionals, student safety is always our number one concern. From the morning bell until the time our last student goes home, we are responsible for Alaska's most precious resource.

School zones are busy places, with busses and parents dropping students off and picking them up, with other children walking to school. Our youngest students especially are difficult to see from behind the wheel of a vehicle. That's why it's so important for drivers to respect the speed limit in all our school zones.

Too often, rush hour drivers prioritize their own schedules and forget our students' safety. House Bill 205, by doubling the traffic fines for speeding in a school zone, sends a clear message to those drivers: slow down or pay the price. RULES OF ADMINISTRATION Rule 43.1 2013-2014 edition

**Rule 43.1. Traffic Bail Forfeiture Schedule.**

Pursuant to AS 28.05.151, the following vehicle and traffic offenses are amenable to disposition without court appearance upon payment and forfeiture of the bail amounts listed. If a person charged with one of these offenses appears in court and is convicted, the penalty imposed for the offense may not exceed the bail amount for that offense listed below.

Effective April 30, 1999, the bail amounts listed below are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed within a highway work zone, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990 and 13 AAC 40.010(b). Effective May 27, 2006, the bail amounts listed below are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed within a traffic safety corridor, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990.

Pursuant to AS 28.15.131 and 13 AAC 04.008, a citation for an offense listed as "Corr" must be dismissed (or voided) if proof of correction is presented to an inspection official within the time allowed. If the required repair is not made, the offense may be disposed of without court appearance upon payment and forfeiture of the bail amount listed.

Effective August 27, 1998, as a condition of the disposition of an offense without appearance, the defendant shall pay the surcharge prescribed in AS 12.55.039 in addition to the bail forfeiture amount listed below. A court may allow a defendant who is unable to pay the surcharge to perform community work under AS 12.55.055(c) in lieu of the surcharge. The surcharge must be deposited into the general fund in a separate account designated for such surcharges.

Effective September 1, 2003, pursuant to AS 28.05.151(e), an offense listed on this schedule may not be disposed of without court appearance if the offense is in connection with a motor vehicle accident that results in the death of a person.

The maximum bail amount for any of the offenses listed below in which the bail is stated as an amount per mile, per foot, per lamp, per reflector, per tire, or per wheel is the maximum fine allowed by statute for the offense. These maximum amounts are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed within a highway work zone, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990 and 13 AAC 40.010(b), or committed within a traffic safety corridor, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990.

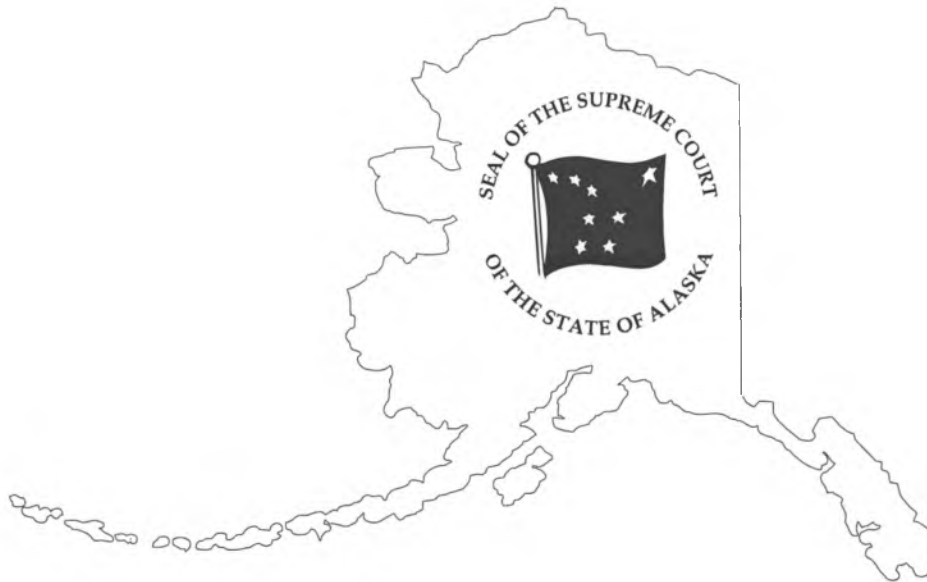

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## INTRODUCTION

### Bail Amounts

The "bail" amounts on the following lists are set by the Alaska Supreme Court under the authority of AS 28.05.151 (for motor vehicle and traffic offenses), AS 45.75.133 (for oversize vehicle offenses) and AS 05.25.090(c) (for watercraft offenses). These statutes require the supreme court to determine those offenses that are appropriate for disposition without court appearance and to establish a schedule of bail amounts for them. The bail amounts are listed in Administrative Rules 43.1, 43.6, and 43.8.

Any recommendations for changes in the bail amounts should be sent to the following address before July 1 each year. Please include an explanation of the reason for the recommendation.

If a bail amount is set for an offense, a person charged with that offense can dispose of the charge (by mail or in person) by checking the "no contest plea" box on the back of the citation and paying the bail amount plus any surcharge established by statute. For many courts, some citations may also be paid online on the court system website at <http://courtrecords.alaska.gov/ep>. The person may also choose to appear in court and contest the citation. If found guilty, the maximum sentence which may be imposed is the bail amount (plus any surcharge). AS 12.25.230(c), AS 45.75.133(e), and Administrative Rules 43.1, 43.6 and 43.8. Therefore, a person charged with an offense for which a bail amount has been set (whether it is an infraction, a violation, or a misdemeanor) does not have a right to a jury or to a court-appointed lawyer.

If no bail amount is set for an offense, the defendant must appear in court for arraignment (unless another statute or regulation makes the offense correctable as discussed below).

Maximum Amount. The maximum bail amount for any offense in which the bail is stated as an amount per mile, per foot, per lamp, per reflector, per tire, or per wheel is the maximum fine allowed by statute for the offense. For example, AS 28.90.010(c) sets the maximum penalty for infractions defined in 13 AAC at \$300. Therefore, the maximum penalty for the speeding offenses defined in 13 AAC is \$300. These maximum amounts are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed within a highway work zone or traffic safety corridor. Administrative Rule 43.1.

### Correctable Offenses

If the "Bail" column for an offense lists "Corr" followed by a number, the offense is a Correctable/Optional Appearance offense. A defendant charged with one of these offenses has three options for responding to the charge. The defendant can:

1. Show the police proof of correction and get the citation dismissed, or
2. Appear in court for arraignment, or
3. Mail in his/her plea (or pay online at the court system website for some courts).

The bail amount for the offense is the amount written after "Corr." When an officer charges one of these offenses, the officer must check the "Correctable" box on the citation and also write in the bail and surcharge amounts and the total due. If the defendant shows an inspection official proof that the defect has been corrected, the citation must be dismissed (or voided). District Court Criminal Rule 8(d)(4).

An offense is listed as correctable only if there is a statute or regulation authorizing dismissal upon correction. Therefore, the only offenses in this category are: AS 28.15.131 (failure to carry license and exhibit it on demand) and equipment violations on non-commercial vehicles under 13 AAC 04.008.

Note: Although AS 28.05.099(b) makes failure to provide a child safety device [AS 28.05.095(b)] a dismissible offense the first time it is charged, we have not included it among the "Corr" offenses because subsequent charges are not dismissible.

### Mandatory Appearance Offenses

If the "Bail" column for an offense lists any of the following three abbreviations, a defendant charged with the offense must appear in court:

Mand/Inf = a traffic infraction which requires a mandatory appearance in court for arraignment. A defendant charged with a traffic infraction does not have a right to a jury or to a court-appointed lawyer. AS 28.90.010(d).

Mand/Cr = a misdemeanor or felony which requires a mandatory appearance in court for arraignment. A defendant charged with a misdemeanor or felony for which no bail forfeiture amount has been set has a right to a jury trial and (if indigent) to a lawyer at government expense.

Mand/Viol = a violation which requires a mandatory appearance in court for arraignment. A defendant charged with an offense classified as a "violation" does not have a right to a jury or to a court-appointed lawyer. AS 11.81.900(b) (61).

## Points

Points for traffic offenses are not set by the supreme court. They are set by the Department of Administration in Alaska Administrative Code regulation 2 AAC 90.310 (printed on the inside of the back cover of this booklet).

The purpose of the point system, according to AS 28.15.221, is to identify "habitually reckless or negligent drivers and habitual or frequent violators of traffic laws." Under this law, a person's driver's license can be suspended or revoked by the Department of Administration if the person accumulates "12 or more points as a result of offenses committed during any consecutive 12-month period or 18 or more points as a result of offenses committed during any 24-month period."

The statutes concerning the point system are AS 28.15.221 to AS 28.15.261. The regulations which were written to carry out the legislature's intent are in the Alaska Administrative Code: 2 AAC 90.310 to 2 ACC 90.380.

When recommending changes in the points, please keep in mind the following limitations on the point system:

1. By statute [AS 28.15.221(a)], points are to be assigned "for convictions for violations of traffic laws that are required to be reported to the [Department of Administration] under AS 28.15.191 and AS 28.37.130."
  - a. The term "traffic laws" is defined in AS 28.15.261 to mean "statutes, regulations, and municipal ordinances governing the driving or movement of vehicles."
  - b. Convictions which are required to be reported under AS 28.15.191 are convictions "of an offense under [Title 28] or a regulation adopted under [Title 28], or another law or regulation of this state, or a municipal ordinance that regulates the driving of vehicles." A conviction of a standing or parking offense need not be reported.
2. Points may not be assigned to laws, regulations or ordinances "regulating standing, parking, equipment, size, or weight; nor may points be assessed for violations by pedestrians, passengers or bicycle riders, or for violations of provisions relating to the preservation of the condition of traffic-control devices on the highways. Points shall be assessed for violations of oversize or overweight permits relating only to restrictions upon speed or hours of operation." AS 28.15.231(b).

### Processing Codes

The processing codes in the fifth column of the numerical list of offenses are selected by the Division of Motor Vehicles from a list of codes and definitions required by the federal government. The codes are used by the clerks who enter traffic ticket information into the APSIN (Alaska Public Safety Information Network) computer. These codes designate the description of the offense which will appear on the defendant's driving record. They also cause the computer to assign the correct number of points to the offense.

Note: The ZZZ code means there is no code for the offense on the national list of required codes. Offenses with a ZZZ code do not have points and do not appear on people's driving records.

Also Note: The processing codes for watercraft offenses are established by the Department of Public Safety.

### Penalty Section

The last column on the numerical list cites the penalty section for each offense. These "penalty section" statutes describe the possible penalties which the court can impose for each offense.

However, in spite of the penalty section statutes, the maximum penalty for any offense for which a bail amount has been set is the bail amount (plus any surcharge). This is true whether the defendant pleads no contest or chooses to contest the citation. See AS 12.25.230(c), AS 45.75.133(e) and Administrative Rules 43.1, 43.6 and 43.8. The penalty sections for all the offenses with bail amounts are marked with two asterisks (\*\*).

Note: If the bail amount is an amount per mile, per foot, etc., see the paragraph about "Maximum Amount" at the bottom of page 1.

### Charging Document

An offense for which a bail forfeiture amount has been established must be charged on a citation form, not on a formal criminal complaint form. District Court Criminal Rule 8(c)(2) and Administrative Rules 43.1, 43.6 and 43.8.

All other offenses may be charged on either a citation form (if allowed by AS 12.25.180) or a formal criminal complaint form.

### Municipal Fine Schedules

Cities that want to use a mail-in system for processing traffic citations must establish, by city ordinance, a fine schedule listing those city traffic offenses which do not require court appearance. See AS 28.05.151 and the other statutes revised by chapter 76 SLA 1987. There are no longer any "bail forfeiture" schedules for city offenses.

### **Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (49 CFR)**

The "49 CFR" (Code of Federal Regulations) offenses listed on pages 23-28 can be found at the following website: [www.fmcsa.dot.gov/rules-regulations/rules-regulations.htm](http://www.fmcsa.dot.gov/rules-regulations/rules-regulations.htm) or at the Government Printing Office (GPO Access) website: [www.gpoaccess.gov/executive.html](http://www.gpoaccess.gov/executive.html)

### **Police Training Surcharge**

AS 12.55.039 adds a surcharge to the fine or other penalty for most offenses. The surcharge is not part of the fine. It must be assessed separately, listed separately on the citation and on the judgment, and receipted using a separate accounting code.

The surcharge is mandatory. It may not be waived, deferred or suspended. However, a judge may allow a defendant who is unable to pay the surcharge to perform community work service under AS 12.55.055(c) in lieu of the surcharge. AS 12.55.039(b).

In imposing a fine, the court may not reduce the fine by the amount of the surcharge or otherwise consider the applicability of a surcharge to the offense. AS 12.55.035(f).

AS 18.65.225 provides that the legislature may appropriate money collected under the surcharge law to the Alaska police training fund.

AS 29.25.074 requires cities to authorize the imposition of this surcharge for violation of their ordinances and to deposit the money collected into the state general fund.

A copy of the surcharge statute and AS 29.25.074 are printed on the back cover.

### **Doubled Bail Amounts for Offenses in Highway Work Zones and Traffic Safety Corridors**

Effective April 30, 1999, the bail amounts are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 (i.e., the 13 AAC regulations and some 2 AAC regulations) committed within a highway work zone. Administrative Rule 43.1 and AS 28.90.030. A copy of the statute and rule are printed on the last page in the booklet (page 34).

Effective May 27, 2006, the bail amounts are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed within a traffic safety corridor, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990. Administrative Rule 43.1, AS 28.90.030, and AS 19.10.075. See page 34. The website showing the traffic safety corridors is:

If an offense occurs in one of these zones or corridors, the officer charging the offense must state that on the citation.

### **Default Judgments For Failure To Respond**

If a defendant fails to respond to a citation or fails to appear for arraignment or trial, the court may either issue a bench warrant or enter a judgment of conviction against the defendant. District Court Criminal Rule 8 (d)(5), (d)(6), (e)(2) and (g). At least 15 days before such a judgment of conviction (called a “default” judgment) is entered, the defendant must be sent a notice explaining the consequences of failure to respond. If a default judgment is entered, it will be for the scheduled bail or fine amount or, if there is no scheduled amount, for the maximum penalty for the offense. In addition, the default judgment will require the defendant to pay any surcharge established by statute, \$25 in court costs and \$25 in collection costs. If, instead, a bench warrant is issued, the defendant must pay a \$75 bench warrant fee, regardless of whether the defendant is convicted. Note, however, that the court may waive the collection costs and bench warrant fee upon a showing of good cause. District Court Criminal Rule 8 (h).

### **Fatal Accidents – Court Appearance Required**

Effective September 1, 2003, pursuant to AS 28.05.151(e), an offense with a bail amount may not be disposed of without court appearance if the offense happens in connection with a motor vehicle accident that results in the death of a person. If this happens, the offender must be required to appear in court. Administrative Rule 43.1.

**Doubled Bail Amounts For Offenses Committed Within Highway Work Zones (Effective April 30, 1999) and Traffic Safety Corridors (Effective May 27, 2006)**

**AS 28.90.030. Fines for offenses committed within highway work zones and traffic safety corridors doubled.** (a) Whenever a person violates a provision of this title or a regulation adopted under the authority of this title within a highway work zone or traffic safety corridor, notwithstanding the amount of the fine or the maximum fine set under this title, the fine, or maximum fine, is double the amount provided in this title. (§ 2 ch 64 SLA 1998; am §§4, 5 ch 45 SLA 2006)

**AS 28.90.990. Definitions.**

(a)(14) “highway work zone” means an area identified by advance signing where road construction, repair, or maintenance work is being done on or adjacent to a highway, whether or not work is actually being done at that time.

(a)(26) “traffic safety corridor” means a portion of a highway on which signs have been erected designating that portion as a traffic safety corridor under AS 19.10.075

**Administrative Rule 43.1, Traffic Bail Forfeiture Schedule,** states (in its second paragraph):

Effective April 30, 1999, the bail amounts listed below are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed within a highway work zone, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990 and 13 AAC 40.010(b). Effective May 27, 2006, the bail amounts listed below are doubled for violations of AS 28 and regulations adopted under AS 28 committed with a traffic safety corridor, as that term is defined in AS 28.90.990.

**AS 19.10.075. Designation of Traffic Safety Corridors; fines.**

(a) To promote traffic safety, the department may designate a portion of a highway to be a traffic safety corridor. The commissioner shall establish criteria for the designation and continuation of traffic safety corridors. In establishing the criteria, the commissioner may consider accident data and reports, the type and volume of vehicular traffic, engineering and traffic studies, and other relevant factors. Before the department designates a traffic safety corridor, the commissioner shall consult with the commissioner of public safety and shall consult with other local, state, and federal agencies with responsibility for traffic safety. A motor vehicle or traffic offense committed in a traffic safety corridor is subject to a double fine as provided in AS 28.90.030. The department shall erect signs designating traffic safety corridors and alerting the public that motor vehicle and traffic offenses committed within a corridor are subject to double fines. A claim for damages may not be made against the state or its officers, employees, or agents for an act or omission relating to the designation of and erection of signs regarding a traffic safety corridor.

(b) The legislature may appropriate 50 percent of the fines for offenses committed in a traffic safety corridor imposed under AS 28.90.030 and collected and separately accounted for by the state under AS 37.05.142, to the division of the Department of

Transportation and Public Facilities responsible for highway safety planning, for highway safety programs. (§ 1 ch 45 SLA 2006)

**AS 28.15.221(c). Point System - Two Points For Illegal Passing in Traffic Safety Corridor.**

(c) The regulations adopted under (a) of this section shall include a two-point addition to a licensee's assessed total if the licensee, while in a designated traffic safety corridor, overtakes and passes another vehicle in a zone designated by a safety control device that prohibits passing.

**2 AAC 90.310. (b) In this section, "habitually reckless or negligent drivers and habitual or frequent violators of traffic laws" means vehicle operators whose demerit point totals, less deductions, have reached the level requiring mandatory suspension or revocation of the driving privilege.

## **Police Training Surcharge**

### **AS 12.55.039. Surcharge.**

- (a) In addition to any fine or other penalty prescribed by law, a defendant who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, forfeits bail for, or is convicted of a
  - (1) felony shall be assessed a surcharge of \$100;
  - (2) violation of a misdemeanor offense under AS 28.33.030, 28.33.031, AS 28.35.030, or 28.35.032, or a violation of a municipal ordinance comparable to a misdemeanor offense under AS 28.33.030, 28.33.031, AS 28.35.030, or 28.35.032 and adopted under AS 28.01.010, shall be assessed a surcharge of \$75;
  - (3) misdemeanor or a violation of a municipal ordinance if a sentence of incarceration may be imposed for the misdemeanor or ordinance violation, other than a provision identified in (2) of this subsection, shall be assessed a surcharge of \$50;
  - (4) misdemeanor for which a sentence of incarceration may not be imposed, a violation or an infraction under state law, or a violation of a municipal ordinance imposing a penalty authorized by AS 29.25.070(a) if a sentence of incarceration may not be imposed for the ordinance violation, shall be assessed a surcharge of \$10 if the fine or bail forfeiture amount for the offense is \$30 or more.
- (b) A court may not fail to impose the surcharge required under this section. The surcharge may not be waived, deferred, or suspended. A court may allow a defendant who is unable to pay the surcharge required to be imposed under this section to perform community work under AS 12.55.055(c) in lieu of the surcharge.
- (c) The surcharge shall be paid within 10 days of imposition or such shorter period of time as ordered by the court. Failure to pay the surcharge is punishable as contempt of court. Proceedings to collect the surcharge may be instituted by the state, the municipality, or by the court on its own motion.
- (d) Money collected under this section shall be deposited into the general fund and accounted for under AS 37.05.142. (§ 2 ch 119 SLA 1994; am § 4 ch 56 SLA 1998; am § 1 ch 24 SLA 2000)

### **AS 29.25.074. Surcharge.**

- (a) A municipality may not enforce a penalty for violation of an ordinance for which a surcharge is required to be imposed under AS 12.55.039 unless the municipality authorizes the imposition of and provides for the collection of the surcharge. The surcharge shall be deposited into the general fund of the state and accounted for under AS 37.05.142. Subject to appropriation, the legislature may reimburse a municipality that collects a surcharge required to be imposed under AS 12.55.039 for the cost to the municipality in collecting the surcharge and transmitting the surcharge to the state. The reimbursement may not exceed 10 percent of the surcharge collected and transmitted to the state.
- (b) This section applies to home rule and general law municipalities. (§ 8 ch 56 SLA 1998; am § 2 ch 24 SLA 2000)

Good afternoon and thank you for this opportunity to speak to you. My name is Caroline Reader Kauer, born in the Territory in Nome, and known out here on Seward Peninsula as Cussy (Kauer). I thank our Representative Neal Foster for bringing forward the proposed changes to state statute which would include school zones as a place which qualifies as part of the traffic offenses resulting in double bail, double fine. The driving population in our State needs to be educated and aware that when one puts our children at risk by bad driving behavior the consequences are now more severe through the passage of House Bill 205.

I would like to present my testimony today as that of the voice of Jamison Thrun, 4<sup>th</sup> generation Alaskan, and an eleven year old student at University Park Elementary, Fairbanks, Alaska. Please take a moment to write down his name. (J-A-M-I-S-O-N T-H-R-U-N.)

Jamison: "A bright sunny August morning me and my little brother Kayden were walking to school and Kayden forgot his soccer ball. I told him to go back home and get it, that I would wait for him. He started running back to our house, and I heard the screaming of tires."

That day, August 30, 2011, changed the lives of our family, my daughter Kelly, her husband, her children, and those of many across Alaska as we mourned the instant killing of Jamison, just 15 days after he left Nome for his new Fairbanks home. Kayden returned with his soccer ball, and witnessed his brother laying in the grass while EMT's prepared him for the ambulance. He put his hand over his eyes as he passed by, and ran the rest of the way to school, and in shock, waited for his big brother Jamison, who would never come. Jamison had plans for a new life, in his new home, at his new school, in his new town, but he died on the streets of Fairbanks, on his way to school. He wanted to play football. He had just gotten a new trampoline two days earlier. I know Jamison is in heaven, and his mother is missing his mother terribly, (as is his brother Kayden, his little sister Karley, and his Dad, Shannon.) Yes, Jamison had plans, and I assure you residing in Birch Hill Cemetery was not part of them.

Parents should expect when their child leaves home for school in the morning, the next time they will see them that evening is at the supper table, not laying opened up on an operating table. Highway work zones involve men and women exposed to an element of risk and danger as they are performing their work tasks, sometimes only protected by a hard hat, vulnerable to the driving behaviors of fellow Alaskans and the public. The same care and caution should be exercised by drivers where there are high concentrations of our most precious, which includes school zones, school yards, and school drop drive-throughs. While this bill does not address these other properties, by passing HB205 and amending current statute, it is one small step down a long path I intend to take, with the help of all of you, and on behalf of my grandson, Jamison Thrun.

Other areas of concern and things to work on in the future:

If I had my way, any traffic incidences in these particular areas (highway work zone, school zone, traffic safety corridor) resulting in a fatality, I would suggest THAT penalty, already legislatively established within current sentencing parameters, should be doubled, as well.

Aged and medicated drivers – how licenses are passed out. When the Troopers pulled the woman out of her vehicle at the scene after she killed Jamison, they thought she was drunk and started field sobriety tests. Imagine this is the physical condition you present at 8:30 in the morning. Imagine walking into a DMV office and renewing your drivers' license, presenting in that condition. Need to check areas of compliance as to how you continue to obtain/renew license. What training do DMV officials receive to recognize impairment? How are/would decisions be reached to hand over a license to drive? Need to review the licensing processes, don't loose site of the job at hand – licensing safe drivers, not finding ways to easily or more conveniently push them through the system.

Mandatory reporting of impaired/reckless driving by school volunteers or staff to School administrators and further, to Troopers/Police with consequences, as children are being dropped off at the school front door. Mandatory consequence.

Mandatory reporting by the crosswalk guards, contracted or otherwise, for intersection traffic violations – not just reporting when there is a child in a crosswalk. Mandatory consequence.

Mandatory response to public complaints by Alaska State Troopers. Complaints had been made two years earlier on same driver who killed Jamison, they went over to the residence, nobody was home, Troopers never went back to continue investigation to complaint.

With approval of the family, I would like to see Jamison's picture, with him identified, as part of the REDDI promotion, and that this promotion and these posters be displayed in all Alaska schools, all Alaska DMV offices and any vendor outside State offices where licensing/vehicle transactions occur.

While I am preferential to the simplicity of our Alaskan license plate utilizing the colors blue and gold, I suggest once you are convicted of DUI/driving impaired you must surrender your blue

and gold license plate, or what ever style you have, and purchase a Red one, which must be displayed at least for a year. A Red plate serves the general public and the enforcing traffic officials as a warning that the driver, or the vehicle, has a propensity toward driving impaired, and to steer clear. Too often the only public embarrassment or notification for one driving impaired/DUI is one or two lines in a local newspaper. With a change in plate color, one would be humiliated every day the vehicle is on the road, and now the Alaskan driving public is warned visually the driver has no respect for the law.

Penalties for killing should be greater than those received for selling a sack of pot.
