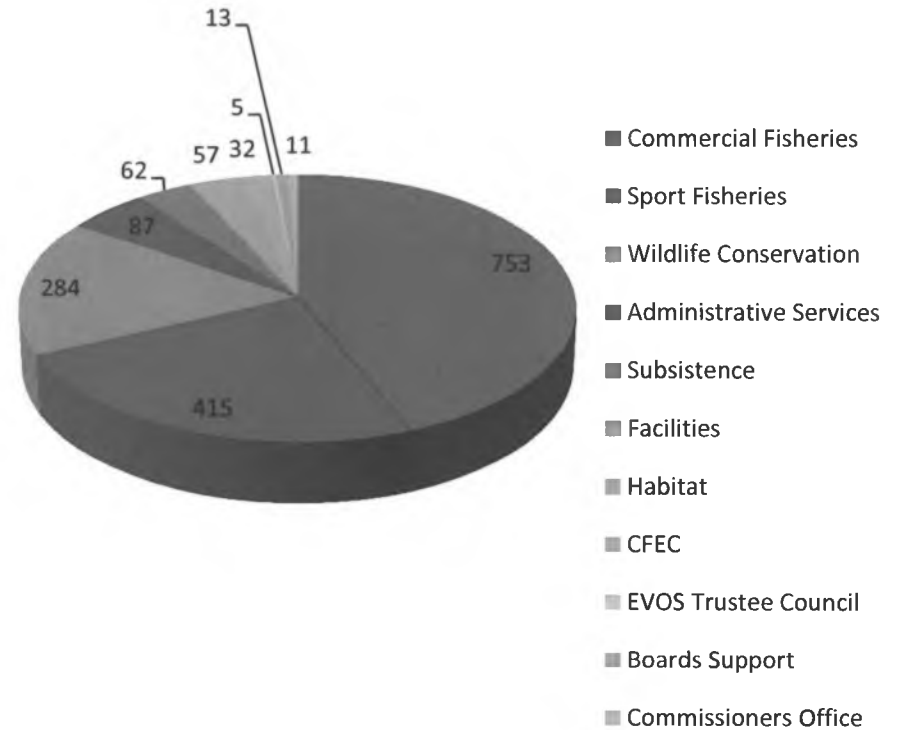


FY14 Positions

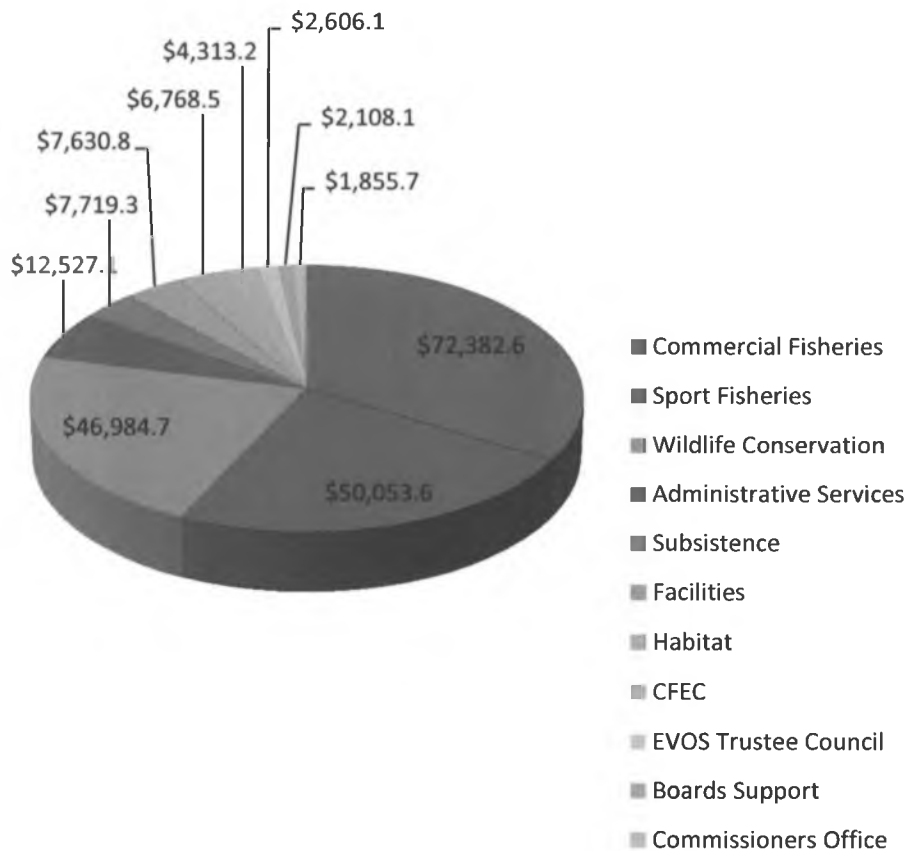


FY2014 Total Positions
(1,719)

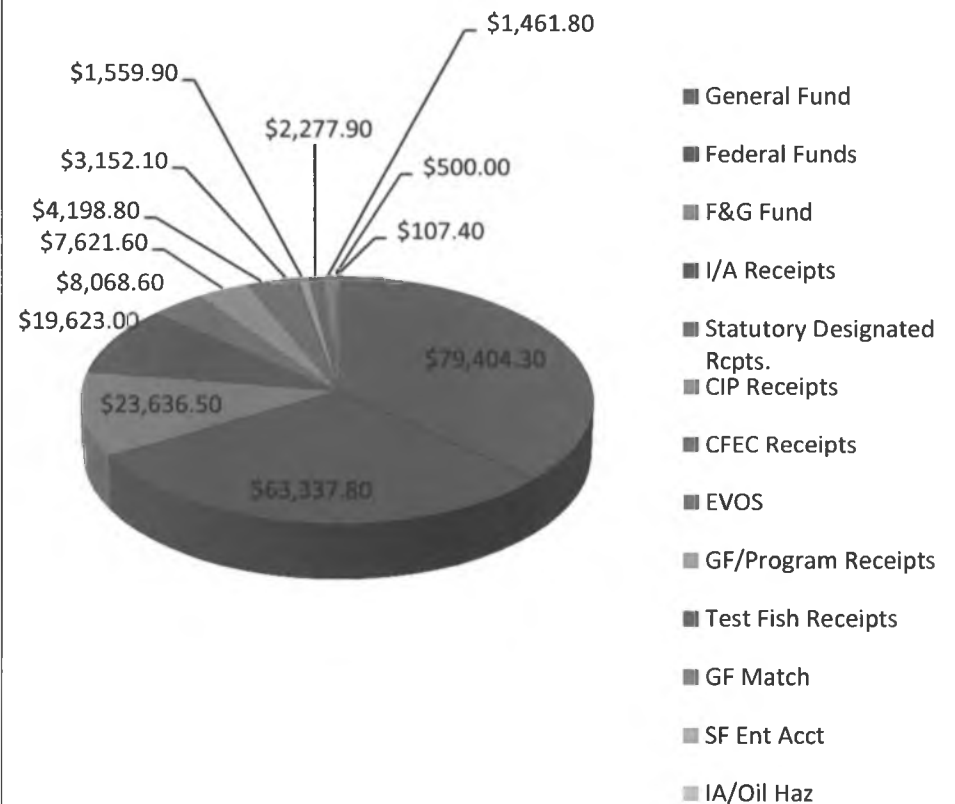


FY14 Budget

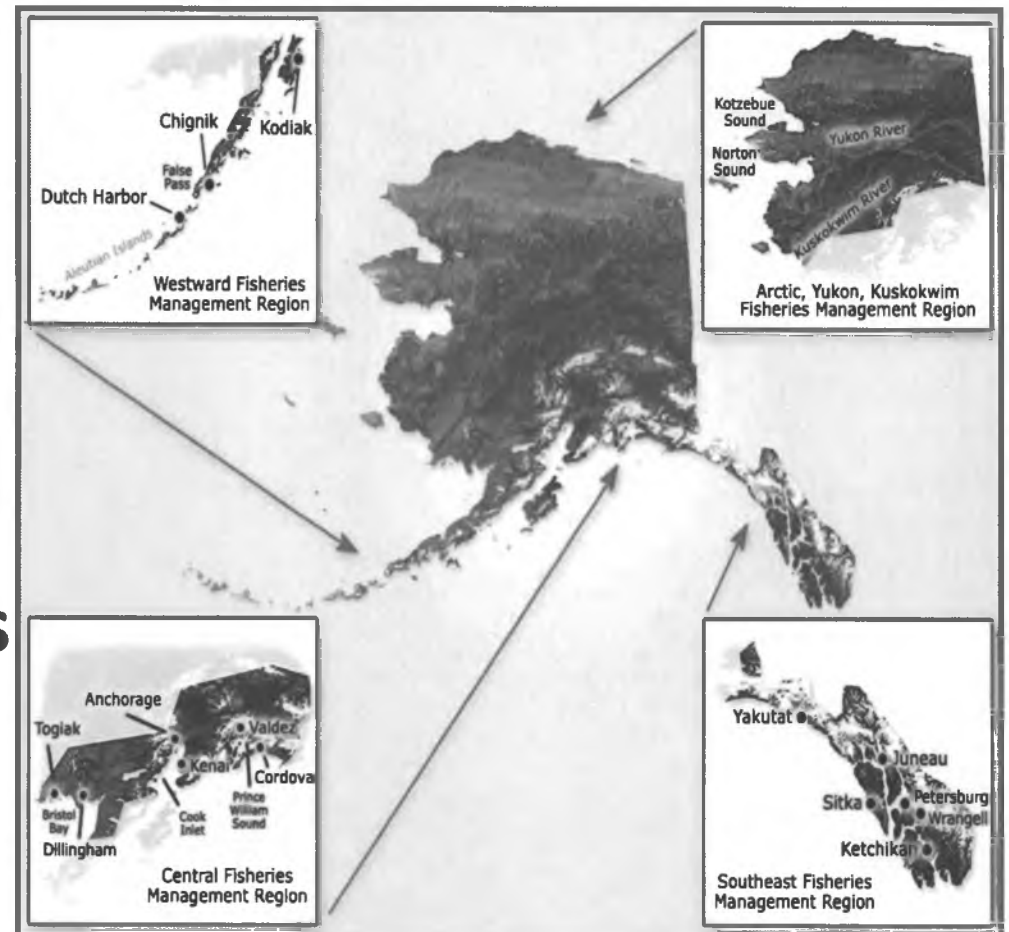

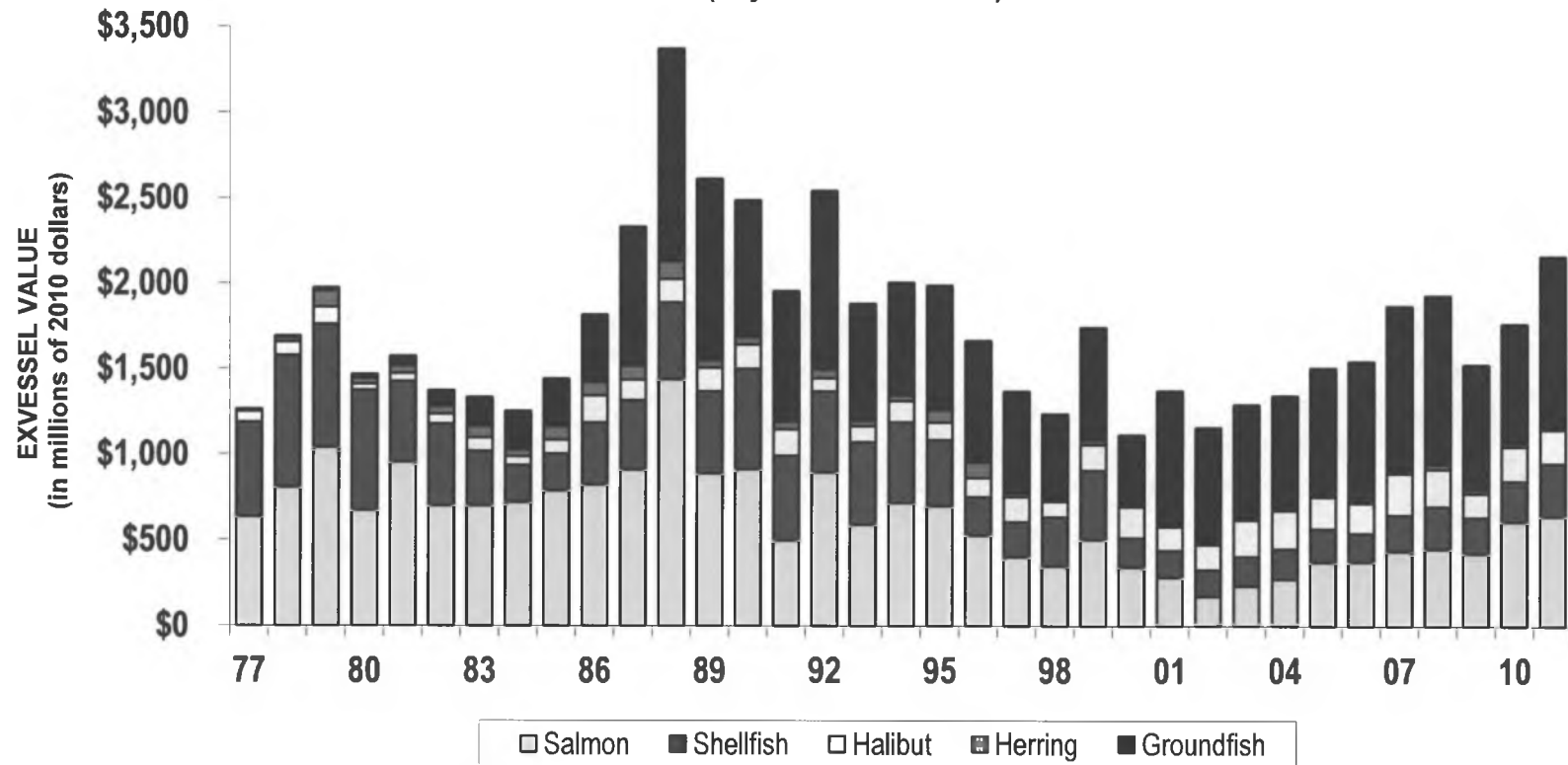

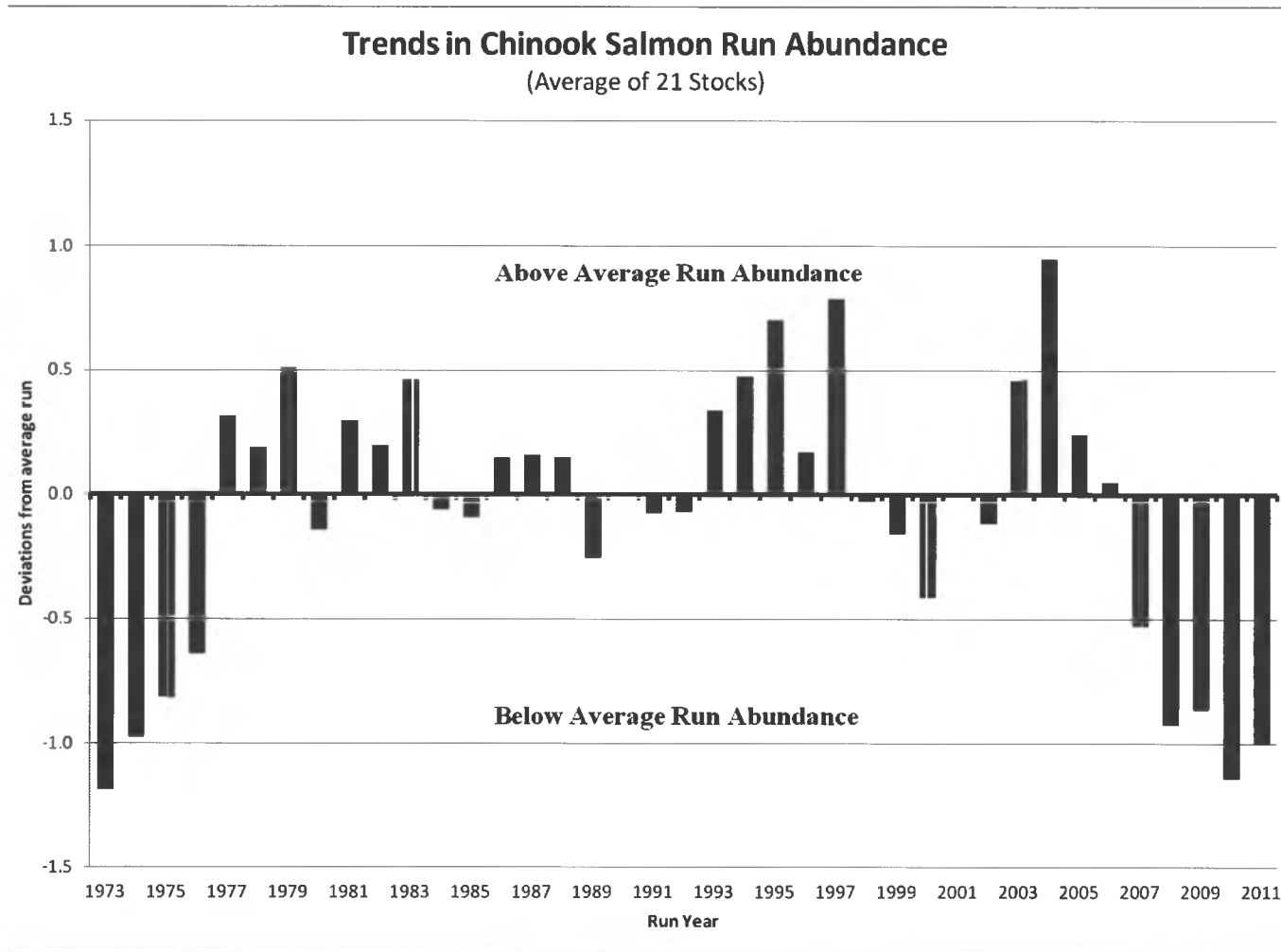
Chinook Salmon Abundance and Productivity

Research and Management Issues

Alaska Department of Fish & Game



Chinook salmon stocks have been in a period of low production statewide since 2007.



- Management actions to ensure spawning escapements created economic and social hardships to all user groups.
- Current knowledge does not allow for complete understanding of causes of productivity declines.





- Chinook salmon are critically important to the economic and social well being of Alaskans.
- These fish are major drivers of commercial, subsistence, and sport economic activity throughout the state.

Federal Disaster Declaration

- July 14, 2012 – Request for federal disaster declaration from the US Dept. of Commerce – Yukon and Kuskokwim.
- August 16, 2012 – Request for federal disaster declaration from US Dept. of Commerce – Cook Inlet.
- On September 12, 2012, the request was granted for all three regions, authorizing federal assistance under the Magnuson-Stevens Act.
- Determination provides basis for Congress to appropriate disaster relief funding.

Goal: Improve Chinook salmon stock assessment statewide so that management can provide better opportunities for sustainable harvests, even during times of low productivity.

- Prepared a Chinook Salmon Gap Analysis
- Solicited stakeholder input through a public Chinook Salmon Science Symposium
- Using stakeholder input, drafted a long term Chinook Salmon Research Plan

FY 2014 Capital Budget Request

- \$10 million request is the first component of a five-year, \$30 million proposal.

- Includes local and traditional knowledge (LTK) and subsistence harvest studies.

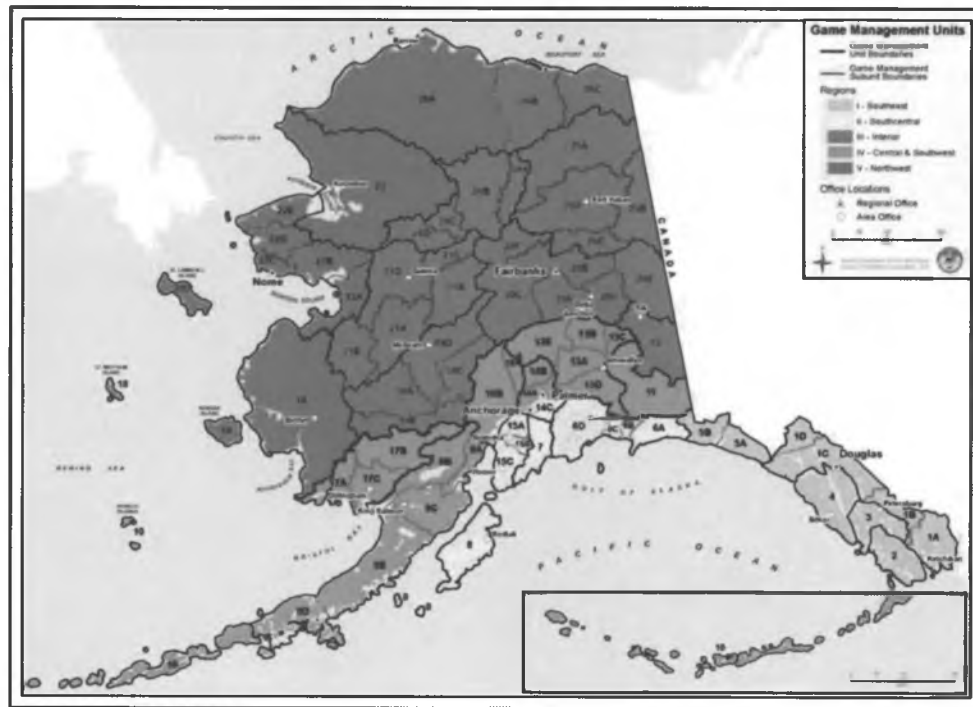



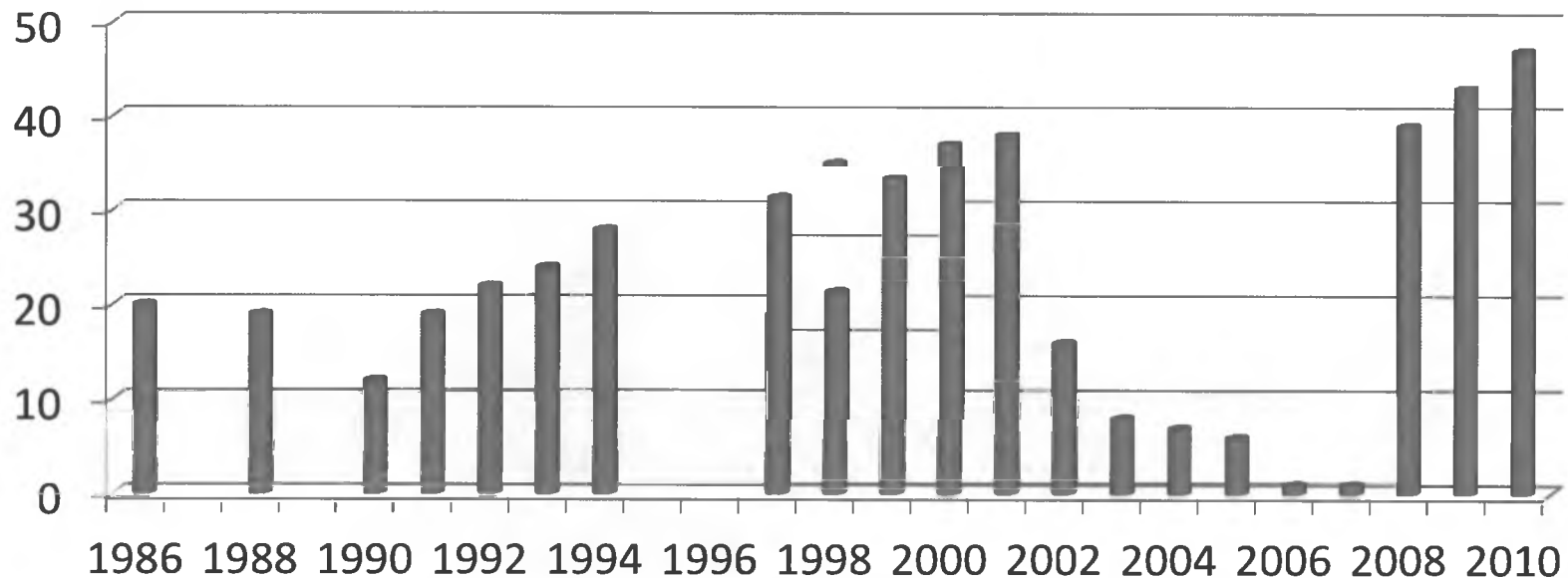

Not surprisingly, after removing less than 50 wolves over 3 years, the calf recruitment increased by 100 fold, and the herd size increased by 50%

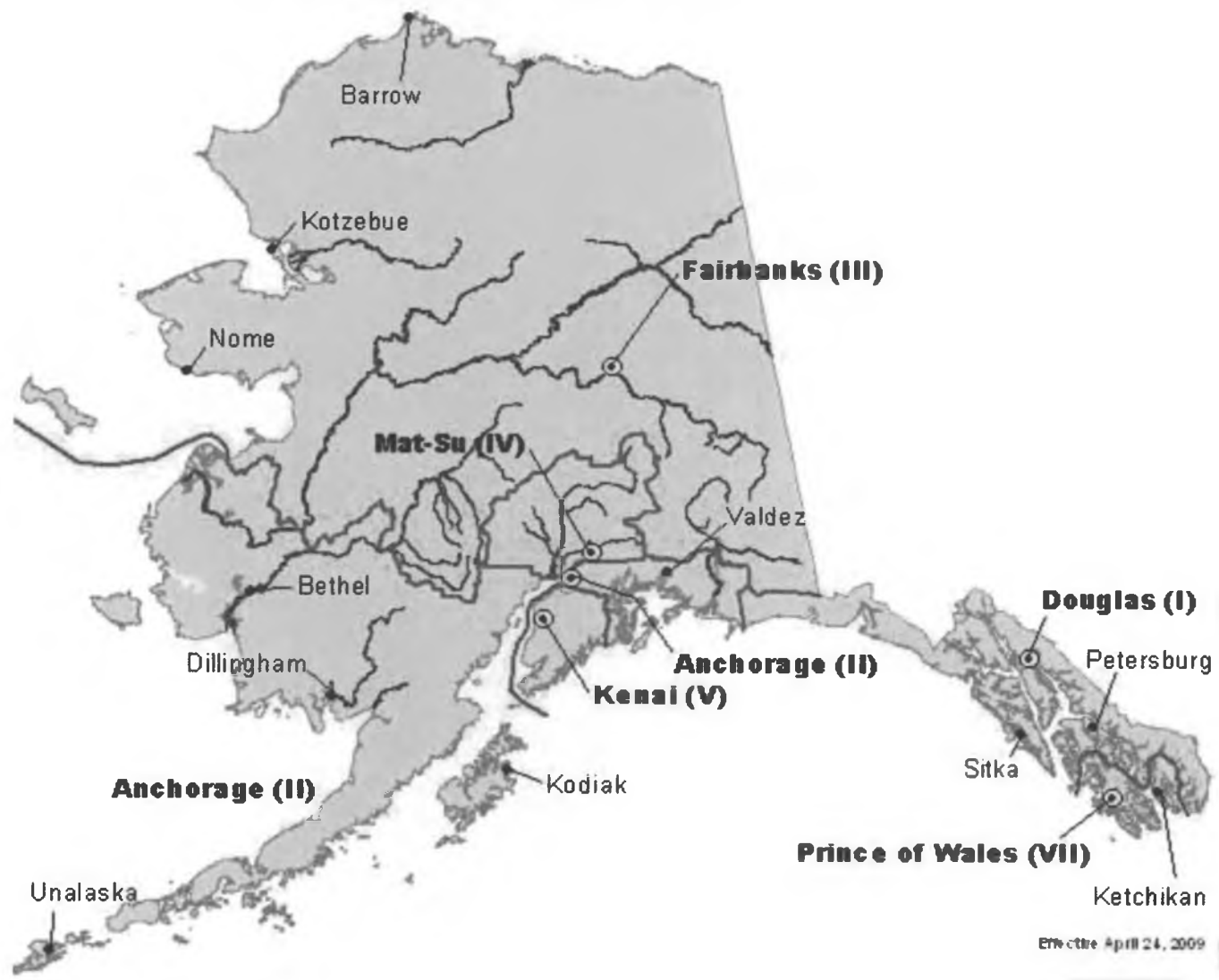

Division History

- Anadromous fish habitat and fish passage responsibilities legislated shortly after statehood.
- Over the years, 32 refuges, critical habitat areas and sanctuaries were also established.
- Functions initially distributed throughout Department.
- “Sections” created in Sport Fish (Access Section), Comm. Fish (Water Rights), and Game Divisions (Lands).
- 1969-70, the above sections were consolidated into the “Habitat Section.”
- Division responsibilities expanded in late 1970s-early 1980s when state and federal planning efforts escalated.
- Habitat granted “Division” status in 1981.
- In 2003, Habitat was moved to DNR, and renamed the “Office of Habitat Management and Permitting.”
- In 2008, Habitat was moved back to ADF&G, and re-established as the “Habitat Division.”
- The Habitat Division currently has 57 positions located in 3 Regional Offices, 3 Area Offices, the State Pipeline Coordinator’s Office, and ADF&G Headquarters.

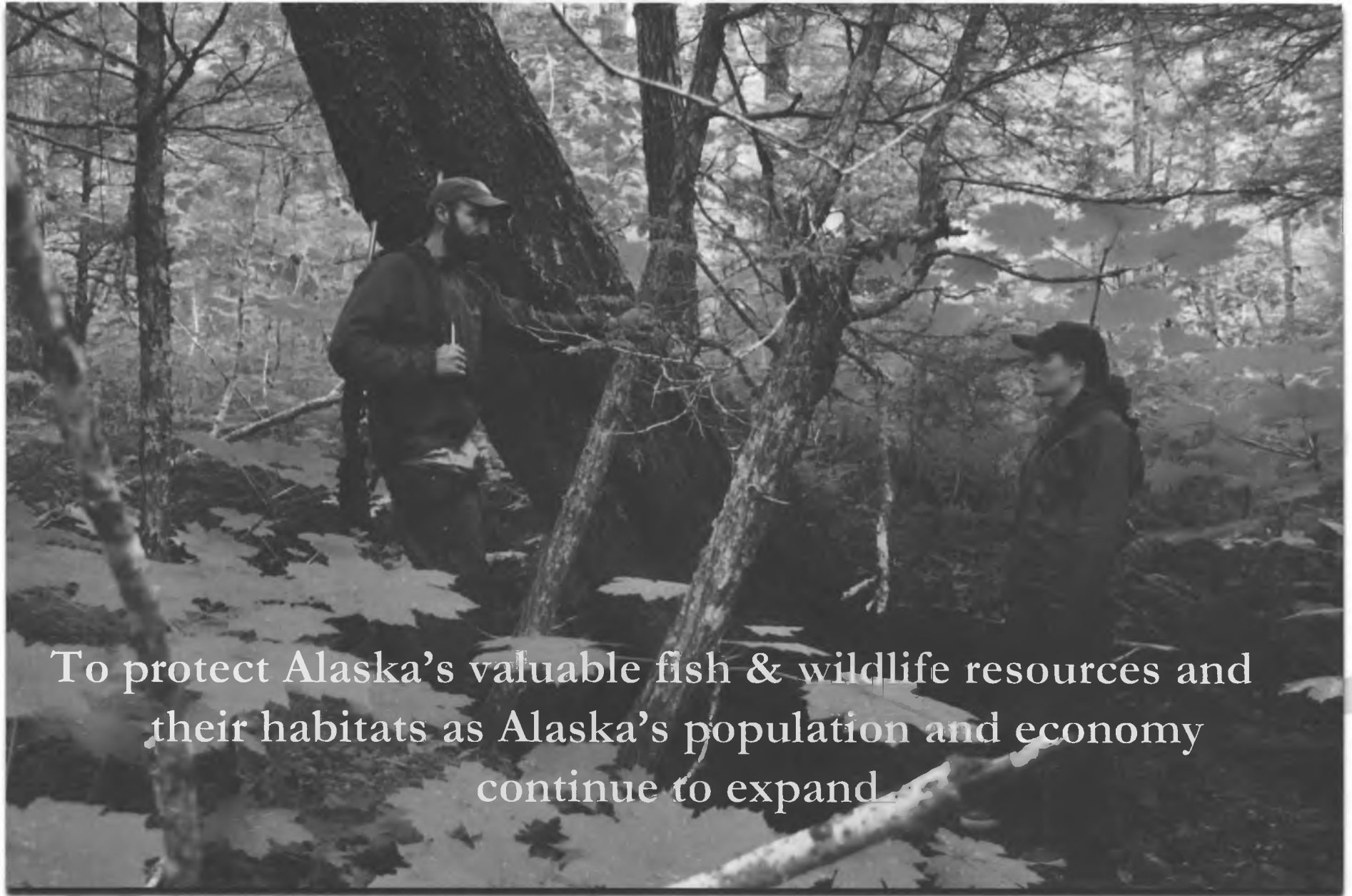


Sockeye Salmon, Steep Creek, Juneau


The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G), Division of Habitat would like to thank and commend Chevron Environmental Management Company for your recent efforts to rehabilitate the reserve pit located adjacent to the Ivan River Pad within the Sashim Flats State Game Refuge. Other than the planned revegetation of the area (which will occur during the spring of 2013), this work fulfilled the corrective action plan for closure.

Extensive research was completed over the last several years and the project was well thought out and implemented. Approximately 10,500 cubic yards of material were excavated from the pit and transported to a facility in Oregon via barge for proper disposal. A similar amount of gravel fill was transported in from an off-refuge location and replaced within the pit. This work took place over approximately four months during the summer and fall of 2012 with little impact to refuge resources or users.

The completion of this long-standing project required a substantial commitment on Chevron's part. We appreciate Chevron's willingness to work with the ADF&G towards successful completion of this project.

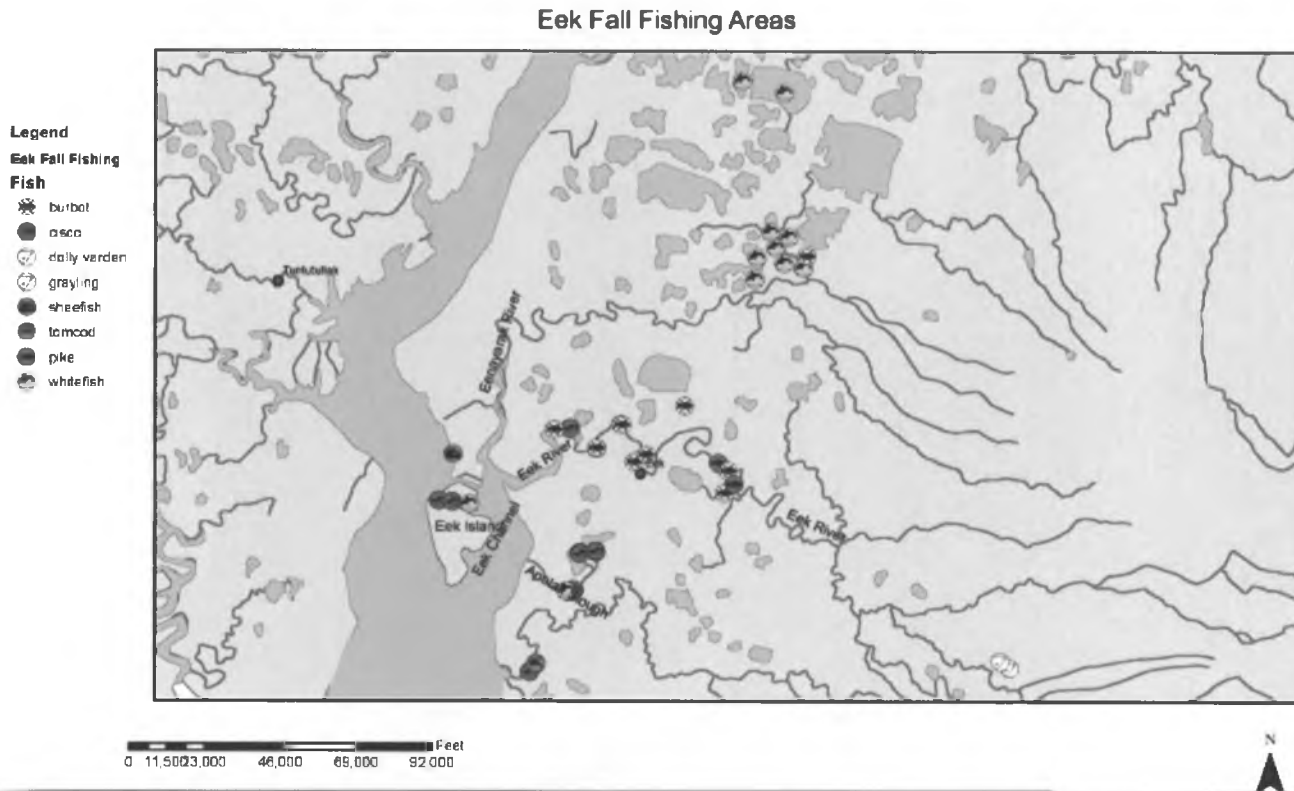

Status on Wood Bison Reintroduction

Prepared by ADF&G for the House Resources Committee

- Over the past three years, the state and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) have worked closely to develop a detailed, *proposed* federal rule that would designate wood bison as a Non-essential Experimental Population, making sure to include provisions that would protect other land uses and resource development in Alaska. It is this proposed rule that is being announced today.
- This contains several elements identified by the state as necessary to move forward with the possible release of wood bison onto the Alaskan landscape. These include:
 - ADF&G is named the principle managers of released wood bison.
 - Regulated hunting is allowed and managed by ADF&G
 - Take associated with legal activities (e.g., resource development) is allowed and managed by ADF&G
 - In the event the reintroduction is deemed a failure OR the legal status of wood bison changes, the state is allowed to remove wood bison from the landscape using any method it determines feasible.
- We believe this is a positive step forward in the continuing process to restore these animals onto the Alaskan landscape.
- We expect the final rule to be published by the end of this year.
- At that time the state will review the final rule. We will closely examine it to ensure it contains adequate provisions to protect other land uses and development and an allowance for the state to be the principle manager of bison and their take.
- It is our continued hope that an acceptable final rule can be published that will allow for wood bison to be released into the wild, perhaps by 2015. The current area for release would be the Lower Yukon/Innoko River area.

Endangered Species Act Issues Update

Prepared by ADF&G with Assistance from Dept. of Law

Steller Sea Lion

Delisting Petition--Eastern Stock: In August 2010, the state filed a petition with the U.S. Department of Commerce to remove the Eastern Distinct Population Segment (DPS) from the list of threatened species. On the same day the states of Washington and Oregon filed similar petitions. On April 18, 2012, National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) published a proposed rule to delist the Eastern DPS, and the state submitted comments in support of delisting. NMFS has until April 18, 2013 to make its final decision and we expect the final decision to be published in the federal register in April or May of 2013.

Appeal of Biological Opinion for the Western Stock--ESA section 7 requires NMFS to consider the impact of federal actions—federal projects, federal funding, or issuance of federal permits--on listed species. NMFS issued a final biological opinion (BiOp) in November 2010 concluding that existing groundfish fishing regulations jeopardized the continued existence of the Western DPS of Steller sea lions and adversely modified critical habitat for the sea lions. The state sued NMFS, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and the U.S. Department of Commerce to challenge the interim final rule implementing significant changes to the federal groundfish fishing regulations. Alaska claimed that the process used to develop the BiOp and issue the fishing regulations was flawed and that the BiOp and reasonable prudent alternative lacked adequate scientific support. In support of its claim the State conducted an independent review which was critical of the conclusions reached in BiOp. The Alaska Seafoods Cooperative and the Freezer Longline Coalition also filed lawsuits raising claims similar to the state's claims. Oceana, Inc. and Greenpeace, Inc. intervened to support the actions by NMFS.

The trial court decision (January 19, 2012), held that NMFS violated National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) by not completing a full environmental impact statement (EIS) but upheld the BiOp and interim final rule changing the fishing regulations. On March 5, 2012, the court issued a second order granting NMFS 23 months to complete a full EIS but allowed the fishing regulations—and closures—to remain in place. The State chose to appeal this decision. On December 4, 2012, oral argument was held on the appeal before the Ninth Circuit. A decision is expected at any time. The court is aware that the new fishing season started January 1 and that the actual fishing effort picks up towards the end of the January. Should the state receive a favorable decision, NMFS potentially could make in-season changes as part of its management of federally regulated fisheries.

Just before the final briefing before the Ninth Circuit was filed, NMFS received peer reviews it had solicited for the review of its decisions. The reports by the Center for Independent Experts were extremely critical of the conclusions reached by the BiOp. However, these critical reviews have not yet caused NMFS to change course. Upon completion of the EIS, NMFS could make such changes.

Polar Bear

There are two polar bear populations associated with Alaska totaling about 3,500 animals. The Chukchi Sea bears are shared with Russia and the Southern Beaufort Sea bears with Canada. Only a portion of these bears are within U.S. jurisdiction at any given time and represent just a small portion of the world-wide population of 20,000-25,000 polar bears. The world-wide population is healthy numbers overall, and the state's comments to the listing rule argued that it is premature to list the species as "threatened" based solely on modeling projections of seasonal sea ice loss to occur 45 years or more into the future, a period beyond which reliable predictions can be made. The state also argued that the period of "foreseeable future" used by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) in making its projections was not appropriate because it was a period of years exceeding three polar bear generations. In addition, the USFWS failed to adequately consider existing conservation measures protecting polar bears. These measures have corresponded with a doubling of polar bear numbers over the past 40 years. It also failed to recognize the importance of Canada's conservation program to polar bears (through loss of funds generated by conservation hunting). Most of the polar bear population is in Canada. The decision to list a species that on a world-wide population basis is healthy and numerous is also a concern because it adds unnecessary regulatory burdens and sets a dangerous precedent for listing currently healthy populations based solely on speculated threats into the distant future.

Listing Cases--There were about ten cases asserting various claims involving the polar bear listing decision and associated special 4(d) rule. All the cases were ultimately moved to the District of Columbia. The state's lawsuit sought withdrawal of the final listing rule because the rule was adopted without procedure required by law, without adequate consideration of the relevant listing factors, and was not based on the best scientific and commercial data available. Information which indicated that the polar bear was not likely to become an endangered species in the foreseeable future was not adequately considered. The trial court denied the state's motion for summary judgment. But the trial court also denied the environmental groups' claim that the rule should be remanded to consider "endangered" rather than "threatened" as the appropriate listing status. The state (along with Safari Club International, California Cattlemen's Association, the Congress for Racial Equality, and Conservation Force), filed an appeal in the D.C. Circuit and argued the case on October 19, 2012. A decision is expected at any time.

Special 4d Rule Cases--The State was also a defendant-intervenor in two other polar bear-related cases brought by the Center for Biological Diversity, et al., and Defenders of Wildlife. These cases challenged the special rule issued by the USFWS under ESA Section 4(d). If polar bears ultimately remain listed, the state argued in favor of keeping the special 4(d) rule because it limited some of the negative impacts from the ESA listing. Arctic Slope Regional Corporation and the Alaska Oil and Gas Association also intervened as defendants to support the special 4(d) rule. The court upheld the substance of the special 4(d) rule but vacated and remanded it because USFWS did not comply with NEPA when it adopted the rule. The vacated final rule was helpful because it did not require certain ESA protections to be applied and instead left it to Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA) to regulate interactions with polar bears. The final rule also stated that greenhouse gas emissions originating outside the range of the polar bear would not be considered an incidental take.

Critical Habitat Cases--The USFWS designated 187,000 square miles in Alaska and adjacent United States territorial waters as critical habitat for polar bears. The State sued along with numerous other plaintiffs, challenging the designation. The state claimed that the USFWS disregarded federal law by including geographical areas in the designation for which there is little or no evidence of physical or biological features essential to polar bear conservation. On January 11, 2013, the court ordered the final rule vacated and remanded to the USFWS to make changes correcting deficiencies in both substance and process.

Beluga Whales

Listing--Alaska sued NMFS, NOAA, and the U.S. Department of Commerce in 2010, challenging the October 2008 listing of the distinct population segment of beluga whales in Cook Inlet as an endangered species. The State claimed that the listing process was flawed, in part, because it did not adequately involve the state or consider the conservation measures already in place to protect beluga whales in Cook Inlet. Several parties, including the Alaska Center for the Environment, Center for Biological Diversity (CBD), Cook Inletkeeper, Defenders of Wildlife, Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), and North Gulf Oceanic Society, intervened along with Escopeta Oil Company, LLC. On November 21, 2011, the court denied all claims raised by the State. After careful review of the decision, the decision was not appealed by the state.

Critical Habitat--The final rule designating critical habitat for belugas was issued on April 11, 2011. The state filed a Freedom of Information Act request with NOAA to obtain the information used in making the decision. Those documents have been received. If sufficient reason is found to challenge the designation, NMFS must first be served with a 60-day notice of intent to sue stating the reasons for the challenge to the critical habitat designation. The time to challenge the designation will expire 6 years from April 2011. We have been looking forward to the decision in the polar bear critical habitat case to aid in this review and will now review the beluga information in light of the polar bear critical habitat decision.

Apache Alaska Corporation/MMPA Issues--NMFS issued an incidental harassment permit for Apache Alaska Corporation to conduct seismic testing in Cook Inlet. CBD, together with Native Village of Chickaloon, NRDC, and Center for Water Advocacy, filed suit on May 15, 2012 challenging the permit. The State, together with various industry groups, intervened to support the permit. The State's brief was filed on November 7, 2012. Oral argument is now scheduled for February 1, 2013.

Seals

Ribbon Seals--NMFS initially decided that listing ribbons seals as endangered or threatened, based solely on projected loss of sea ice in 50 years, was not warranted. CBD challenged this decision, and the state participated in the case to support NMFS. The decision was upheld by a federal court in California. However, NMFS later agreed with CBD and Greenpeace to conduct another status review of the ribbon seal by January 2013, recently extended by an additional 6 months, in exchange for a stay of the appeal filed in the upholding the "not warranted" decision.

As noted below, NMFS has listed other ice seals and we expect NMFS to now consider listing ribbon seals using the same 100 year forecast for loss of sea ice.

Bearded and Ringed Seals—NMFS previously issued a 12-month finding that listing may be warranted for bearded and ringed seals. The state testified at the NMFS hearing on bearded and ringed seals and filed written comments. A final decision to list was announced on December 21, 2012. The final rule was published on December 28, 2012 and is effective 60 days from that date. The listings are based on a 100-year foreseeable future review of sea ice and snow loss. Critical habitat will be designated next and that will be another opportunity to provide comments. The listing decisions are under review to determine the state's options.

Iliamna Lake Seals--On November 19, 2012, CBD filed a petition with NMFS to list seals found in Iliamna Lake, a freshwater lake through which the Bristol Bay sockeye salmon pass. The seals in Iliamna Lake may be Pacific harbor seals. The stated reason for listing is the threat of potential pollution from the Pebble mine (not yet developed) and climate change impacts on salmon stocks— i.e., ocean acidification. NMFS has 90 days to make a decision on whether the petition is warranted. This is very low bar.

Pacific Walrus

Pacific walrus numbers are estimated to be between 200,000 and 250,000 animals. Walruses migrate seasonally with the advance and retreat of the sea ice habitat on which they rely for survival. The Pacific walrus is not presently listed as threatened or endangered under the ESA. Listing of the species was found to be warranted but precluded by higher priority species. Walruses have been placed on the candidate species list. Under the terms of a settlement agreement in several cases filed by WildEarth Guardians and CBD challenging the delay by the USFWS in evaluating species on the candidate list, the USFWS will complete another review of the Pacific Walrus by FY 2017.

Kittlitz's Murrelet

Kittlitz's murrelet are a small marine bird. This bird is currently a candidate species for listing under the ESA with the USFWS. Under the terms of a settlement agreement in several cases filed by WildEarth Guardians and CBD challenging the delay by the USFWS in evaluating species on the candidate list, this species is currently undergoing a 12-month status review after which a decision will be made to list or not list the species and if listed whether to designate critical habitat. These birds utilize nearshore waters important for fishing.

Yellow-billed Loon

The yellow-billed loon inhabits Alaska's North Slope and western Alaska coastlines. This bird is currently a candidate species for listing under the ESA with the USFWS. Under the terms of a settlement agreement in several cases filed by WildEarth Guardians and CBD challenging the delay by the USFWS in evaluating species on the candidate list, this species is scheduled to undergo a 12-month status review in 2014 after which a decision will be made to list or not list

the species and if listed whether to designate critical habitat. These birds utilize lakes within areas important for oil and gas development.

Other

On August 20, 2012, CBD filed a petition to list 43 species of Alaska deep water coral as endangered due to perceived threats from climate change, particularly ocean acidification. NMFS missed the 90-day deadline for its initial response but that is not unusual. However, given the low bar set for 90-day findings, NMFS could make an initial warranted determination. However, there is extremely little data available on these corals and the state will have several opportunities to submit comments. The state submitted comments during the 90-day review that stated we felt listing is not warranted.

On August 10, 2011, CBD filed a petition to list the Alexander Archipelago wolf as threatened or endangered. To date, USFWS has not responded and CBD has sent a 60-day notice of intent to sue to the USFWS. The time for responding to the 60-day letter has also passed, and CBD is free to file a complaint compelling a 90-finding at any time. To our knowledge, a complaint has not yet been filed. The state submitted comments during the 90-day review that stated we felt listing is not warranted.

NMFS conducting a 12 month status review of herring in southeast Alaska. NMFS has also received a petition to list the Great white shark which is an infrequent visitor to our state. The state submitted comments during the 90-day review that stated we felt listing is not warranted and that these sharks are only infrequent visitors to Alaskan waters and that any decision to list or designate habitat should not apply to Alaskan waters.

Other ESA items include a re-evaluation of the status of large whales underway by the NMFS, development of recovery plans for beluga whales in Cook Inlet and sea otters in western Alaska, and review of Biological Opinions or assessments as required under the ESA for listed species.
