Analysis

Currently, under AS 44.66.010(a)(5), the Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (CDVSA) will terminate on June 30, 2014, and will have one year from that date to conclude its administrative operations.

This bill extends the termination date for the CDVSA to June 30, 2022, as recommended by the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee in its report dated August 5, 2013.

RE: Amendment to SB 124

Attached you will find an amendment I intend to offer to Senate Bill 124 in the Rules Committee meeting scheduled for this Thursday, April 3rd. The amendment is being offered to clarify the legislative record on House Bill 4 which clearly reflects the intent that the Governor can appoint from the widest possible field of expertise, without limiting that field to Alaskans. Under AS 31.25, the Governor shall consider an individual's expertise and experience in natural gas pipeline construction, operation, and marketing; finance; large project management; and other expertise and experience that is relevant to the purpose, powers and duties of the corporation.

One of the Governor's appointees to the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation is Richard Rabinow. I realize that Mr. Rabinow is a resident of Texas. However, he has pipeline expertise spanning over four decades. There are very few individuals in the United States with his level of historical knowledge and executive leadership in the pipeline industry. Mr. Rabinow has a national perspective of the pipeline industry which includes an understanding and hands-on experience with Alaska's pipeline projects. Even after retirement, Mr. Rabinow continues to stay connected to the pipeline industry and has kept up with events in Alaska. He has expertise in project conception, logistics planning, maintenance, operations, project management, environmental safety, open seasons and timing of market initiatives, qualifications that are very difficult to find in one individual. I, for one, am very grateful a candidate of his caliber is willing to serve the Alaska public on AGDC's Board of Directors, despite his being a nonresident.

The appointment of one nonresident on a board with four Alaskans and two commissioners from the administration balances the interests of Alaskans with the need for worldwide expertise in specific areas and I believe these appointments will generate the best possible results for Alaska.

Although I would prefer to find another bill for this amendment or attach this amendment to Senate Bill 138, the timing of the Joint Session for confirmations precludes the use of Senate Bill 138. Other vehicles for the amendment are also not readily available at this time.

RICHARD A. RABINOW BIOGRAPHY

Richard A. Rabinow, with extensive background and leadership in the petroleum industry, is the President of The Rabinow Consortium, LLC. Following a 34 year career with ExxonMobil, Mr. Rabinow was the President and CEO of Longhorn Partners Pipeline, LP, has been a consultant to the pipeline industry and has served on industry and government panels. Current activities include serving on the boards of the Houston First Corporation, the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation and Sunnova Energy Corporation. Mr. Rabinow is a member of the Houston Committee on Foreign Relations and the World Affairs Council of Houston.

Recent activities include serving on the Committee for a Study of Pipeline Transportation of Diluted Bitumen of the National Academies' Transportation Research Board (TRB), the Houston Mayor's Metro Transition Team, and the board of Standard Renewable Energy LP.. Previously Mr. Rabinow had served on the TRB's Committee for Pipelines and Public Safety and the Committee on Alaska's Oil and Gas Infrastructure and on the Steering Committee for the Pipelines and Informed Planning Alliance (PIPA) sponsored by the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration in the U.S. Department of Transportation. He also had been a member of the Executive Committee and Chairman of the Association of Oil Pipelines and a member and chairman of the Owners Committee of the Trans Alaska Pipeline System.

At the time of his retirement from ExxonMobil in 2002, Mr. Rabinow was the President of ExxonMobil Pipeline Company (EMPCo), a position he had held at EMPCo and its predecessor, Exxon Pipeline Company, since 1996.

Mr. Rabinow, a native of New Jersey, earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering Mechanics from Lehigh University and received Masters degrees in Mechanical Engineering and in Management from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Mr. Rabinow joined Exxon Company, U.S.A. (EUSA) in 1968 at the Bayway Refinery where he held several engineering and supervisory positions. In 1973 he transferred to EUSA's Supply Department in Houston and in 1975, Mr. Rabinow moved to the Baton Rouge Refinery where he held several managerial positions. Following an assignment as a project executive, Mr. Rabinow returned to Houston in 1980 as Executive Assistant to the President of Exxon Company, U.S.A.

In 1981, Mr. Rabinow became the Supply Department Planning Manager and was named Baytown Refinery Manager in 1984. Mr. Rabinow returned to Headquarters in 1987 as Manager of the Office of Corporate Affairs for Exxon Company, U.S.A. In 1991, Mr. Rabinow became Manager of EUSA's Environmental and Safety Department.

During 1994 and 1995 Mr. Rabinow held the position of Senior Vice President, Integrity & Compliance Projects, while on loan to the Alyeska Pipeline Service Company (the operator of the Trans Alaska Pipeline System) in Anchorage, Alaska. After returning to Houston in 1995 he held management positions in Exxon Pipeline Company.
