During the February 19, 2013, hearing for House Bill 104, Representative Hughes asked how many absentee ballots the division received between the current 10th and 15th day ballot receipt deadline. I indicated I would research the answer to her question and provide a response following the hearing. My initial response was sent to you on February 19, 2013.

Representative Hughes had a follow up question after receiving my initial response. She wanted to know how many of the eleven by-mail ballots that were accepted between the 10th and 15th day ballot receipt deadline were from military voters and how many were from overseas voters. She also asked for the reason the 7 ballots were rejected.

11 ballots were counted	3 were from overseas military voters and 8 were overseas citizens.
2 ballots were rejected due to being received after the 10 day domestic deadline.	1 was from a domestic military voter and the second was from a non-UOCAVA voter.
4 ballots were rejected due to being postmarked or witnessed after Election Day.	3 were from overseas military voters and 1 was a domestic non-UOCAVA voter.
1 ballot was rejected due to lack of signature.	It was from a domestic non-UOCAVA voter.

8 shall be held on the first Tuesday in October. The lieutenant governor may adopt
9 regulations governing an election conducted under this subsection.

10 *** Sec. 2. AS 15.05.011 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:**

11 (e) Notwithstanding (b)(1) of this section, a person residing outside the United
12 States may register and vote absentee if

13 (1) the parent or legal guardian of the person was domiciled in the state
14 immediately before leaving the United States;

1 (2) the director determines that the person meets the requirements of
2 (b)(2) - (5) of this section.

3 * Sec. 3. AS 15.10.170 is amended to read:

4 **Sec. 15.10.170. Appointment and privileges of watchers.** The precinct party
5 committee, where an organized precinct committee exists, or the party district
6 committee where no organized precinct committee exists, or the state party
7 chairperson where neither a precinct nor a party district committee exists, may appoint
8 one or more persons as watchers in each precinct and counting center for any election.
9 Each candidate not representing a political party may appoint one or more watchers
10 for each precinct or counting center in the candidate's respective district or the state for
11 any election. Any organization or organized group that sponsors or opposes an
12 initiative, referendum, or recall may have one or more persons as watchers at the polls
13 and counting centers after first obtaining authorization from the director. A state party

16 than one watcher on duty at a time in any precinct or counting center. A watcher must
17 be registered to vote in the state. The watcher may be present at a position inside the

20 results certified by the election board or the data processing review board. The
21 election board or the data processing review board may require each watcher to
22 present written proof showing appointment by the precinct party committee, the party
23 district committee, the organization or organized group, or the candidate the watcher
24 represents that is signed by the chairperson of the precinct party committee, the party
25 district committee, the state party chairperson, the organization or organized group, or
26 the candidate representing no party.

1 (5) attempt to benefit a personal or financial interest through coercion
2 of a subordinate or require another public officer to perform services for the private
3 benefit of the public officer at any time; or

4 (6) use or authorize the use of state funds, facilities, equipment,
5 services, or another government asset or resource for a partisan political purpose
6 [PURPOSES]; this paragraph does not prohibit use of the governor's residence for
7 meetings to discuss political strategy and does not prohibit use of state aircraft or the
8 communications equipment in the governor's residence so long as there is no charge to
9 the state for the use [; IN THIS PARAGRAPH, "FOR PARTISAN POLITICAL
10 PURPOSES"]

11 (A) MEANS HAVING THE INTENT TO
12 DIFFERENTIALLY BENEFIT OR HARM A

13 (i) CANDIDATE OR POTENTIAL CANDIDATE
14 FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE; OR

Under the authority of Article III, Section 18 of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill relating to election practices and procedures; and relating to the election of an advisory school board in a regional educational attendance area.

The bill would make a number of changes to the Election Code and related statutes. These good government changes are necessary to assure voter access to his or her ballot, and to maximize efficiency in conducting State-run elections while harmonizing certain provisions of State and federal election law.

The bill would also shift the date of the primary election and associated candidacy withdrawal and petition deadlines. The bill would move the date of the primary from the fourth Tuesday in August to the second Tuesday in August of every even-numbered year. The purpose of moving the date is to assure that the Division of Elections can timely comply with provisions of federal law requiring the Division to transmit ballots to military and overseas voters 45 days before a federal election. Candidates would be required to withdraw their name 52 days rather than 48 days before the primary, and judges up for retention would be required to withdraw 64 days rather than 48 days before a general election. Similarly, deadlines governing the nomination of candidates by party petition where an unopposed incumbent dies, is disqualified, or is incapacitated, and for filling vacancies by party petition, would change.

The bill would specify that the Division of Elections may conduct elections for advisory school boards in regional educational attendance areas. The Division already is required to conduct elections to regional educational attendance area boards, and this change would specify that the Division could – but would not be required – to do the same for local advisory boards.

The bill would allow a qualified voter residing outside the United States to register to vote absentee if the qualified voter's parent or guardian was domiciled in Alaska immediately before leaving the

United States. This provision is aimed at voters who reach 18 years of age while living abroad with their parent or guardian.


The bill would allow the Division of Elections to designate municipal clerks to act as absentee voting officials to distribute absentee ballots to qualified voters and their representatives. This portion of the bill aims to resolve difficulties associated with finding individuals to act as absentee voting officials, particularly in more rural areas of the state, by allowing municipal clerks to act in this capacity and thereby reach greater numbers of absentee voters.

The bill would also streamline several aspects of the absentee voting process. The bill would clarify that voters (other than uniformed services voters or overseas voters) who apply to receive their ballots by electronic transmission must, by regulation, be required to comply with the same ballot application deadlines applicable to absentee voting in person. The bill would repeal the concept of the "special absentee ballot" and make official ballots for overseas and military voters available 45 days before a federal election. All regular statewide elections also have federal offices on the ballot. Federal law requires the Division of Elections to transmit ballots to military and overseas voters 45 days before an election. The purpose of the State change would be to eliminate the 60 day advance "special absentee ballot" and make a single, official ballot available to voters overseas, in the military, and in remote areas of the state available on a timeframe consistent with federal law. Sending two ballots often causes voter confusion.

Finally, the bill would harmonize State and federal law by adding definitions of "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas voter" to the Election Code.

I urge your prompt and favorable action on this measure.

Analysis

This bill addresses election practices and the election of a school advisory board in a regional educational attendance area (REAA). This fiscal note and analysis responds to section one covering the REAA election of a school advisory board, the remaining sections of the bill do not directly impact chapter 14 Education and therefore are not discussed in this analysis.

The Alaska legislature delegates to REAA school boards the authority to operate the public schools in those areas, subject to law. Both REAA school districts and municipal governments operate through a Regional School board. The election of the Regional School board is provided for in 14.08.071 (b) for the REAA and through municipal elections law for the organized school districts.

State law provides for advisory school boards in REAAs. Regional school boards shall establish advisory boards in each community and prescribe the manner of selection and organization by regulation. Regional school boards could establish advisory school boards through an election process. Current law does not provide for the division of elections to administer an election for an advisory board.

Section one of this bill allows the election process of advisory school boards to be conducted by the division of elections, and for the ability to adopt regulations governing the election process.

House Bill 104 – Version N

“An Act relating to election practices and procedures; relating to the election of an advisory school board in a regional educational attendance area; and providing for an effective date.”

Sectional Analysis

Section 1 - specifies that the division may conduct elections for advisory school boards in regional educational attendance areas.

Section 2 - allows a child turning 18 who resides outside the U.S. to register and vote absentee if their parent or guardian was domiciled in Alaska immediately before leaving the U.S. This section is aimed at voters who turn 18 while living abroad with their parents or guardians.

Section 3 - Amends AS 15.10.170 to require that poll watchers be persons that are registered to vote in the state.

Section 4 - Amends AS 15.10.180 to require that persons on the state ballot counting review board be registered voters in the state.

Section 5 - Amends AS 15.13.374(f) to provide that the *name of a person requesting an advisory opinion* from the Alaska Public Offices Commission is confidential and must be redacted from both the request and the opinion before the opinion is made public.

Section 6 - allows the division to designate municipal clerks to serve as absentee voting officials in municipalities where the division does not have an absentee voting station.

Section 7 - clarifies that voters (other than uniformed services voters or overseas voters) who wish to receive their ballot by electronic transmission must comply with the same ballot application deadlines applicable to absentee voting in person.

Section 8 - clarifies that ballots are sent to voters as soon as they are available for distribution with the exception of uniformed services and overseas voters whose ballots must be mailed 45 days prior to the election.

Section 9 - removes the reference to receipt of by-mail ballots (postmarked from overseas) 15 days following the election.

Section 10 - adds harmonizing language from federal law that ballots for uniformed services and overseas voters will be mailed 45 days prior to an election. Also adds that voters living, working, traveling outside the U.S. at election time or those living in remote areas of the state will have a ballot mailed 45 days prior to an election.

Section 11 - removes the reference to receipt of by-mail ballots (postmarked from overseas) 15 days following the election.

Section 12 - changes the date of the primary election to the second Tuesday in August (currently is the fourth Tuesday in August).

Section 13 - changes the withdrawal date for primary election candidates to 52 days prior to the primary election (currently is 48 days).

Sections 14 and 15 - change the date to replace unopposed incumbent candidates to 54 days prior to the primary election (currently is 50 days) and filling of vacancy by party petition to 52 days prior to the primary election (currently is 48 days).

Sections 16 and 17 - change the date to replace a candidate nominated at the primary election to 64 days before the general election (currently is 48 days).

Section 18 - changes the withdrawal date for a candidate appearing on the general election ballot to 64 days prior to the general election (currently is 48 days).

Section 19 - changes the withdrawal date for judicial candidates to 64 days prior to the general election (currently is 48 days).

Section 20 - Adds a new subsection amending AS 15.58.030 to require the lieutenant governor to publish an electronic election pamphlet on the division's internet website before each state election. Photograph and statement are provided and paid for by candidate and that the information must be published within one week from receipt of the information.

Section 21 - adds federal definitions of absentee uniformed services voters and overseas voters.

Section 22 - allows municipal clerks to serve as absentee voting officials in municipalities where the division does not have an absentee voting station.

Section 23 - repeals provision for ballots postmarked from overseas to be received 15 days following election (all ballots would be received 10 days following the election as provided in AS 15.20.081(e)); repeals the allowance of an absentee application from a uniformed services or overseas voter to be extended for two general elections (harmonize with federal law); repeal the requirement to send special absentee ballots.

Section 24 - provides for an effective of January 1, 2014.



Failure to comply, or failing the examination, results in disqualification of the Participant, and said Participant forfeits any and all entry money, prizes or prize money.

Elfin Cove Charter Fined for Sport Fishing Violations

(SITKA, Alaska) – Elfin Cove Eagle Charters Alaska, LLC, an Elfin Cove fishing charter corporation, was sentenced in Sitka today in connection with numerous sport fishing violations from a 2009 undercover investigation.

Vancouver, Wash. resident Joe Kulavik, the owner and operator of Elfin Cove Eagle Charters, entered a guilty plea on behalf of the corporation to one consolidated count of sport fish guide violations. The corporation was fined \$150,000 with \$90,000 suspended, informal probation for a period of three years, with the conditions that the corporation commit no new fish and game violations and obey all court orders. Four boats used to commit violations had been seized during the investigation. As part of the plea agreement, the State agreed to return the four vessels that were seized.

In August and September of 2009, Alaska Wildlife Troopers (AWT) conducted an investigation into the charter company where Troopers witnessed violations committed by four separate charter captains employed by the corporation. The violations included sport fishing guides fishing for and retaining halibut, the taking of over limit of salmon and halibut, fishing an excess number of rods, waste of sport caught fish, use of sport caught fish for bait, failure to retain non-pelagic rock fish and failure to accurately record the daily catch in the guide's saltwater log book. All of the above offenses are class A misdemeanor offenses that carry a maximum fine of \$200,000 per count with respect to corporate liability.

The AWT Wildlife Investigations Unit received assistance from the Department of Law, Office of Special Prosecutions and Appeals; National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration Office of Law Enforcement in Juneau; game wardens with the Washington Division of Fish and Wildlife; game wardens with the South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks; and Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office, Bureau of Investigation.

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CEC Elections-2010

The election for Board members of Community of Elfin Cove held on August (?), 2010 was marked by many irregularities. The election was to be held during the regular monthly community meeting, but then it was announced there would be no election, just a meeting. The Secretary of CEC, Susan Abel had resigned in the week(?) before and it was uncertain that an election could be legally held. St. of AK Dept. of Commerce was contacted in regard to proper election procedures and info was posted on community building. (Emails to&from Bill Roszen and what was posted by BOD) Due to the prior announcement of the postponement of the elections some local commercial fisherman stayed out on the fishing grounds and did not come back to EC for the meeting. Then hours before the meeting, it was announced that there would be a meeting and elections. At the appointed hour, people gathered in the community building , but no meeting was ever held. There was no call to order, no sign in of members or no minutes read & approved. Although there was a printed list of voters with some names penciled in at the bottom, there was no voter sign in. Before the balloting, Patti Lewis, a longtime resident of Elfin Cove, stood up and told Joe Kulavik of Eagle Charters that he should be ashamed of himself for bringing in his employees and crew to vote in the election (in which Joe Kulavik was a candidate). Joe Kulavik did not respond. There were questions of the legality of the election raised by members of the audience, but the balloting proceeded. The Chairman of CEC Dennis Meier of Tanaku Lodge walked through the crowd of people (audience??) and handed out paper ballots to anyone that wanted to take one, except for (2?) people who had objected that their names were not on the printed list. These (2?) people were registered AK voters and had attended the required three (3) community meeting, but due to the Secretary's resent resignation their names were not recorded as having attended, consequently they names were not on the voter list. Dennis Meier once again walked through the crowd and collected the ballots. He took them to the table in front of the audience and with BOD members Debbie Hemenway(Treasurer) and Mike Nelson(Director) counted the ballots. No one else saw the ballots. The outcome was announced for the three positions up for vote:

Vice-Chairman: 21- Steve Stromme to 19- Travis Lewis

Treasurer: Debbie Hemenway- unopposed

Director: 17- Joe Kulavik to 16- Lane Ply

Due to the irregularities of this election we contacted St. of AK Dept. of Commerce Deputy Director, Elisabeth Manfred... her only advice to us was to get a layer and sue.

CEC Elections 2011

Because of the efforts of AFA, the 2011 elections were conducted differently. The elections were announced and moved to August 12th(?) to allow for the commercial fishery closure allowing more fishers to attend. Voting was held in the Community building from 10am to 5pm. The poll was manned by BOD members not standing for election and volunteer citizens with a voter sign-in to receive a printed ballot, with 2 voting booths and a secure ballot box. When the poll closed the ballots were counted by a committee of BOD members and volunteer citizens. The results were:

Chairman: 25- Dennis Meier to 17- Travis Lewis

Secretary: 28- Susan Abel to 14- Lane Ply

Director: 34- Steve Alexander- unopposed

Director: 34- Mike Nelson- unopposed

The reformed election process worked, but a problem remains- who is allowed to vote. The CEC by-laws concerning membership and voter eligibility were modified in July 2011. The by-laws governing the 2010 CEC BOD elections had as requirements for voting membership: "shall be determined by the last published list of the ST. of AK Precinct Voter Registration List for Elfin Cove, or being able to qualify for such" and "a voter must have attended at least three (3) community meetings or committee meetings in the previous 14 months". The requirements for the 2011 CEC BOD elections were changed to "those registered to vote in Elfin Cove, as determined by the ST. of AK Precinct Voter Registration List for Elfin Cove. In addition a member must have an Elfin Cove mailing address, and must maintain a domicile in Elfin Cove, Port Althorp, Inian Islands or Idaho Inlet. A member must be registered to vote in Elfin Cove for 30 days in order to be eligible to vote at meetings or any elections".

According to the 2010 U.S. Census there are twenty (20) residents of Elfin Cove. Yet there are sixty-eight (68) people listed on the St. of AK Precinct Voter Registration List for Elfin Cove. Many of these people on the voter registration list are legitimate Alaskan residents. But others come to Elfin Cove for the 3-4 month summer season and then leave Alaska to return to their primary residents in other states. These people are using their Limited Liability Corporation's properties as their primary "Domicile" to legitimize their claim of Alaska residency. Some of these people or their spouses have businesses in other states and their children attend school there. Some of their spouses are also registered voters of those states.

The application for the State of Alaska voter registration has three requirements: to be a U.S. citizen, be at least 18 years old and be a resident of Alaska. The application requires a complete physical residence address- P.O. Box and commercial address are not accepted. The application includes a Voter Certificate that by signing, under penalty of perjury, certifies that the information given in the document is true and correct. It further certifies that the signer is a resident of the State of Alaska.

So now that we have reviewed the voter registration application let's take a closer look at the Precinct Voter Registration List for Elfin Cove...

Elfin Cove fishing derby shut down before it begins

State gaming officials say contest was being run by businesses, instead of nonprofits

State gambling regulators have moved to shut down an Elfin Cove fishing derby designed to benefit lodges there, a derby that was offering a grand prize of \$100,000.

In Alaska, only nonprofit organizations can operate gambling enterprises, including fishing derbies that require entry fees.

“We have issued them a notice of violation,” said Jeff Prather, supervisor of the Department of Revenue’s Gaming Unit.

“They were a for-profit group that was advertising a fishing derby,” he said.

The Sea King 2012 derby would have cost \$400 to enter, offering weekly prizes, as well as a possible \$100,000 grand prize, depending on ticket sales.

It was sponsored by several Elfin Cove lodges in an effort to promote the Icy Strait-area businesses, said Donna Forte, with the Elfin Cove Lodge.

“Our hopes as lodges were people would want to be in the tournament, and they’d need lodging, they’d need to rent boats,” she said. “It helps people know about Elfin Cove.”

Other lodges involved in the abortive venture were Fishmasters Inn, Tanaku Lodge and the Cove Lodge, according to the derby website.

Forte said they had hoped to use Juneau's Moose Lodge as a nonprofit sponsor, but a series of misunderstandings and errors has ended chances of holding the derby.

"The tournament is canceled," she said.

She blames state officials, however.

"The state's making us jump through too many hoops," she said.

One of the biggest of the errors and misunderstandings, she said, was the derby website going live before they had a permit.

Forte said that wasn't Elfin Cove's fault. They'd hired a web designer to build a site for them, but he then went live with the site without permission and stopped communicating with them.

The state's notice of violation was issued May 23, and the site was still up Friday, though it was down by Monday.

Forte said they'd paid a "couple thousands bucks" for the web design, and finally had to get state officials to intercede with the web hosting firm to take the site down.

Forte acknowledged mistakes, but said there was no bad intent.

"We weren't trying to do anything bad — all the money was for charity," she said.

She said she hoped the tournament would raise a maximum \$200,000 in entry fees, with expenses of about \$40,000 and \$60,000 left for charity along with the \$100,000 payout.

The published contest rules show no guarantee of a payout, however.

According to the derby's website, its profits were to go to the Southeast Conference, the community of Elfin Cove, and a new scholarship fund for families of commercial fishermen. Forte said that the Moose Lodge was also to get a share.

Forte said she and the other lodges that sponsored the derby believed as long as the proceeds went to a non-profit, everything was OK.

They later found out that it had to be a nonprofit with a gaming license, and which had been around for at least five years.

Moose Lodge Administrator George Damian said they were willing to work with Elfin Cove, but had some initial concerns about the sponsors there.

He said the Moose frequently work with local nonprofits, including Relay for Life, school raffles, and other good causes.

Damian said state officials appeared skeptical of the Elfin Cove effort, and then wanted somebody from the Moose Lodge on site in Elfin Cove during the summer-long derby.

“That just isn’t going to work,” Damian said.

If the lodges get together start now working for a derby next summer, that might work, he said. They’d probably have to find a local Elfin Cove nonprofit to get a gaming license to make it work.

Now, Forte said they’re out about \$14,000 in expenses, including the website and a commercial which has been created but which will now not be aired. No money was collected from entry fees, she said.

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Elfin Cove Lodge Owners Charged Over Residency

The two owners of a sport fishing lodge on the north end of Chichagof Island have been charged with making false statements and other violations of state fishing laws and regulations.

Charges filed in Sitka Superior Court allege that James H. Benton, 44, and Dennis Meier, 57, co-owners of the Tanaku Lodge at Elfin Cove, claimed benefits of Alaska residency while they actually were legal residents of other states.

Meier, who is Benton's brother-in-law, was charged with five counts of unsworn falsification from 2008 to 2012, and one count of making a false statement on an application for a license, tag, permit or sport fishing vessel registration.

Meier was served a summons on the charges Jan. 17 at his home in Sammamish, Wash., according to court records.

Benton was charged with nine counts of knowingly making a false statement on an application for a license, tag or sport fishing registration and 12 counts of unsworn falsification between 2007 and 2012. He was also charged with unlawfully taking a Sitka blacktail deer without a nonresident locking tag.

Benton's home address is listed as Bend, Ore. His claims of Alaska state residency go back to 1998, according to court documents.

Alaska State Troopers said they opened an investigation after receiving complaints from the nonprofit group [AlaskansForAlaska.com](#) claiming that both Meier and Benton, and Benton's wife, were receiving resident benefits when they were not Alaska residents.

Troopers said their investigation showed that Meier applied for Alaska resident sport fish license and crew member licenses, and a resident commercial halibut permit, between 2008 and 2012, when he was actually a legal resident of Sammamish, where he owns a home. During those years he registered to vote in Alaska, claiming residency in Elfin Cove, the charges state.

Troopers said Meier's wife and children obtained nonresident sport fish licenses during the same years. The state had no record of Meier's ever applying for an Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend.

Troopers collected statements from Elfin Cove residents, who videotaped the lodge from time to time to document their claim that it was empty in the off-season and was not a year-round residence.

Trooper investigator Jake Abbott wrote:

"I was unable to determine whether or not D. Meier had ever spent a consecutive 12 months in the state of Alaska. I found no indication that Meier had ever owned a residence in the state of Alaska, other than he is a part-owner in a seasonal sport fishing lodge in Elfin Cove. It did appear, however, that D. Meier's intent was not to remain a permanent resident in the state of Alaska, but rather to return to the state at the start of each fishing season to run his business, then to return to Sammamish, Wash., where

his wife and children reside, to live with them. In fact in D. Meier's own statements he indicated that was his intention."

Meier is to appear in Sitka Superior Court court on Feb. 19, and a court date of Feb. 26 was set for Benton.

Troopers said that the charges against Benton are similar to the ones against Meier.

Troopers said the investigation showed that Benton was not a legally defined Alaska resident when he applied for a number of resident sport fish and hunting licenses. They said he owns a home in Bend, Ore., and spends the summer fishing season running the lodge at Elfin Cove.

In addition to numerous fishing license applications, Troopers said that Benton also applied as an Alaska resident for the Etolin Island Elk Drawing permit, a general season deer harvest ticket and a drawing for a moose permit.

"Based on my investigation, it appeared that J. Benton was not a true resident of the state of Alaska," said the Trooper investigator Abbott in his report. He said Benton's wife and children live almost the entire year in Oregon, his vehicles are registered in Oregon, and most of his airline tickets to Alaska were purchased as round trips from Oregon.

The Troopers said state records show Benton obtained Permanent Fund dividends a number of years through 2003.

"His actions are consistent with that of a seasonal business owner who comes up to the state of Alaska to run a sport fish charter business during the summer months then returns to his true home state once the season is over instead of electing to stay in the state in which he is claiming resident benefits," Abbott wrote.

An Alaska resident under state definition is a person who is "physically present in Alaska with the intent to remain indefinitely and make a home here, has maintained the person's domicile in Alaska for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding this application for a license and is not claiming residency or obtaining benefits under a claim of residency in another state, territory or country"

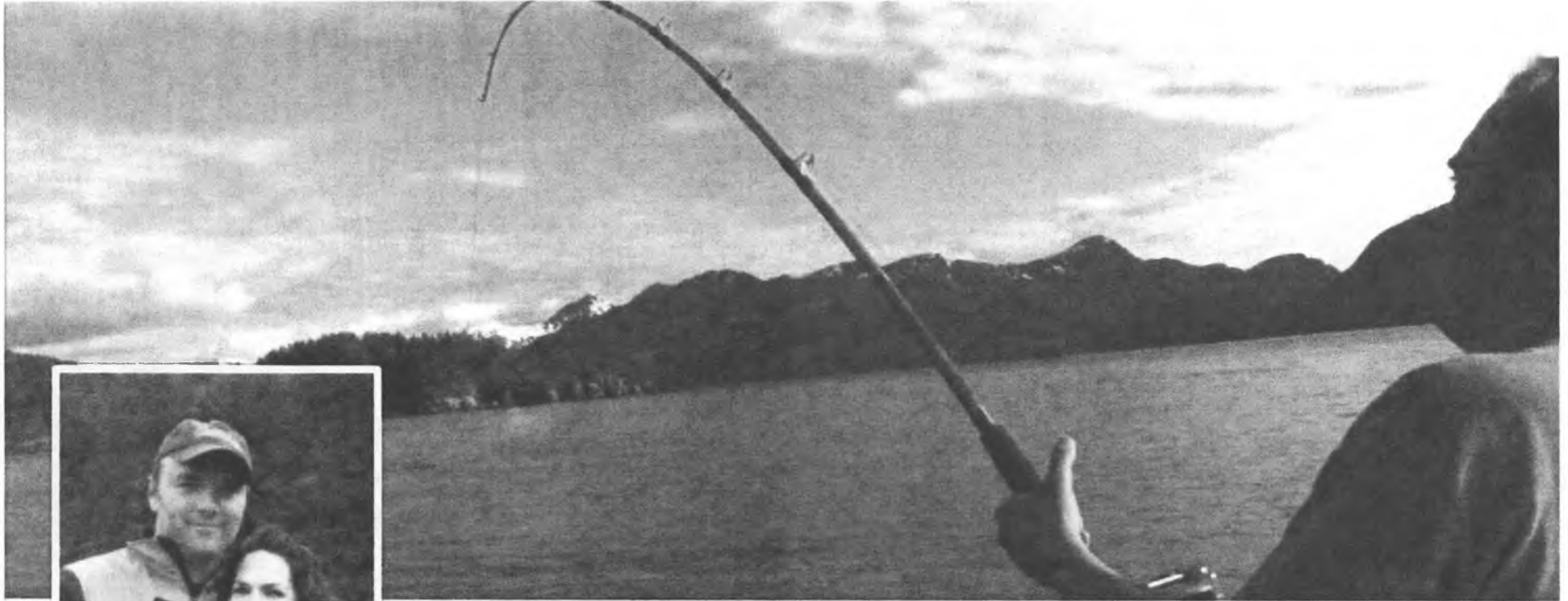

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Doc Warner's sentenced for selling sport fish

Posted: Sunday, January 16, 2011

A Juneau judge ordered Doc Warner's Lodge to pay a \$10,000 fine for illegally selling fish that had been sport caught by clients and/or employees, the Alaska Department of Public Safety announced Thursday.

Judge Thomas Nave sentenced the lodge to pay \$40,000, but suspended \$30,000 of that amount, a release from DPS states. The amount was set out in a plea agreement reached by Doc Warner's and the Office of Special Prosecutions and Appeals. Nave also imposed informal probation for two years, conditioned on the lodge not breaking the law again during that time.

Doc Warner's Alaska operations are located on Excursion Inlet about 30 miles west of Juneau, according to the lodge's website. Only the lodge, which operates as a limited liability corporation, faced charges; no people were accused of wrongdoing.

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
