During my tenure, CITC has expanded from an organization with an annual budget of \$8 million to one of more than \$40 million, and from a staff of less than 70 to almost 300.

I have built my career on the philosophy that true self-determination is based in self-sufficiency and the ability to take responsibility for one's own life, family, and community. For the past decade, I have worked to mold CITC into an organization that provides a "hand up instead of a hand out." 
