Analysis

This legislation provides an extension for one year the deadline for the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) to adopt and prescribe a method of bulk testing under AS 44.42.420 (a) and develop and implement administrative requirements under AS 44.42.420 (b).

The FY15 Governor's request includes the funds for a half-time position under personal services, travel to work with other agencies, consultants and to conduct public meetings and consultant services with expertise in naturally occurring asbestos.

SPONSOR STATEMENT

SB 197 – Naturally Occurring Asbestos

The 27th Legislature passed and the Governor signed HB 258 which put into place a system and requirements to allow for the use of gravel aggregate containing naturally-occurring asbestos. The regulations have not yet been adopted.

This legislation, SB 197, provides for a one year extension to the deadline for DOT&PF to adopt and prescribe a method of bulk testing under AS 44.42.420(a) and to develop and implement regulations.
