Dear Governor Parnell:

Respectfully, I ask you to consider reappointing me to the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC). I would welcome the opportunity to help complete the substantial work in progress before CFEC.

Before Governor Jay Hammond first appointed me to the commission, I had 10 years' experience as a lawyer suing state and federal bureaucracies on behalf of Alaskans and also representing Alaska fishermen before the Limited Entry Commission. My experience made me sensitive to the effects of limited entry on Alaskans (especially rural Alaskans) and qualified me to help the Commission avoid unnecessary legal issues and controversy. Enclosed is a copy of my resume.

I believe limited entry is a tool for the development and protection of the resource, as well as a historic means to protect local jobs and families. We do everything we can under the law to help keep limited entry permits in the hands of Alaska's local residents.

For more than 10 years, I advocated for local and regional groups to participate in a loan guarantee program with the State Commercial Fishing Revolving Loan Fund to help local residents acquire and keep limited entry permits. The Bristol Bay Economic Development Corporation has such a program in progress.

Additionally, I have worked closely with the IRS to help keep limited entry permits in the hands of local people. To help provide Alaska fishermen a tool to achieve voluntary compliance with their federal tax obligations, I worked for passage of a bill reinstating the Tax

Obligation Loan Program within the Commercial Fishing Revolving Loan Fund. As the result of my work with the IRS, the U.S. Treasury Secretary appointed me to the National Taxpayer Advocacy Panel (TAP), where I was elected chairman of the TAP Multilingual Initiative Committee, served from 2002-2006, and did my best to ensure that remedies for taxpayers under the 1998 IRS Reform Act continued to be available and known to Alaska commercial fishermen and other taxpayers.

At the request of an earlier administration, I was a principal author of the *Outline of Options for Fleet Consolidation in Alaska's Salmon Fisheries*, a paper to provide Alaska fishermen with fundamental information about various potential remedies for the crisis in Alaska's salmon fisheries. The paper has helped fishermen take a realistic view of the various options and continues to be a basis for discussion of salmon remedies today.

In addition to these overriding issues affecting the rights and well being of Alaska fishermen, my primary focus at the commission is on our fundamental tasks. During the period I have served on the commission, the commission limited entry into some 35 fisheries (overall, some 68 Alaska fisheries are currently under limitation).

While limiting entry is always controversial, we have spent considerable time communicating with members of the industry in an effort to ensure actions by the commission are predictable and understandable. We believe the fishing industry deserves a climate of regulatory stability at a time when there are few other sources of stability in commercial fishing.


In addition to limiting fisheries, our primary responsibility is adjudicating the high volume of cases that has been before the commission. I have participated in and written more than 3,000 commission decisions. My experience enables me to work efficiently and to make our decisions stick: from 1996, in the course of 32 appeals from our decisions, the commission has suffered only 2 partial reversals by the Alaska Supreme Court. Reversals of limited entry decisions can have serious consequences, because the courts may apply them retroactively to open cases previously closed and thereby undermine limitations of entire fisheries.

CFEC's decisions affect people in such personal and emotional ways (much like decisions affecting our children's health and education) that our decisions are always controversial. Nonetheless, since 1982, the number of pending court appeals from commission decisions has dropped from approximately 150 to 1 today. (This reduction in court appeals is despite the fact that an applicant can continue to fish as long as the individual can maintain an appeal.) Fewer appeals save the state money and provide stability to the fishing industry. Additionally, fewer appeals is a measure of acceptance by those affected. Although we must often disagree with claimants, I believe generally they regard the commission as fair.

Protecting fishermen's rights and preserving our ability to perform the fundamental tasks of the commission present some creative opportunities to shape cases that we know will go to court. For example, our favorable decision from the Alaska Supreme Court in *Simpson v. State*, CFEC, 101 P.3d 605 (Alaska 2004), will protect permit holders and enhance the commission's ability to complete adjudications expeditiously.

In short, at the Entry Commission, we have work in progress that serves the goals of your administration. I am asking you to please grant me the opportunity to complete these tasks.

**SELECTED CASES,
AND DECISIONS:**

Simpson v. State, CFEC, 101 P.3d 650 (Alaska 2004).
The Alaska Supreme Court affirmed the commission's optimum number decision for the Northern Southeast Inside sablefish fishery.

Crivello v. State, CFEC, 59 P.3d 741 (Alaska 2002). The Alaska Supreme Court affirmed a CFEC decision that advanced commission adjudications by limiting the extent to which the commission was required to grant additional hearings under *Forquer v. State*, CFEC, 677 P.2d 1236 (Alaska 1984).
