Sponsor Statement for House Bill 113

"An Act relating to the membership of the Alaska Fire Standards Council"

The mission of the Alaska Fire Standards Council is "to establish professional standards for fire service personnel, and curriculum requirements for the certification of training programs."

Currently there are 11 members of this council. They are:

- two chief administrative officers or fire chiefs from local government;
- four representatives of fire fighters (including one from the Alaska Fire Fighters Association);
- two volunteer fire fighters (one from a community of 2,500 or less and one from a community with a population greater than 2,500);
- two members of the public (one from a community of 2,500 or less and one from a community with a population greater than 2,500);
- the State Fire Marshall or his/her designee.

HB 113 will specify that one of the four fire fighters will be a representative of the Alaska Professional Firefighters Association (APFA). The APFA represents approximately 500 career fire fighters and is the Alaska affiliate of the International Association of Fire Fighters.

HB 113 will also add an additional member to the council which will represent the Alaska Fire Chiefs Association (AFCA). The AFCA is a membership organization representing fire chiefs throughout Alaska.

The intent of HB 113 is to ensure that the three statewide organizations that represent those in the fire service are represented on the council and can speak with the full confidence of their respective organizations.

HB 113 is supported by the Alaska Fire Standards Council, Alaska Professional Firefighters Association, Alaska Fire Chiefs Association, and the Alaska Firefighters Association.

FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS #2

BILL NO. HB 113

Analysis

HB 113 amends AS 18.70.330(b) to add one seat to the Alaska Fire Standards Council (AFSC) and designate one existing firefighter seat to the Alaska Professional Firefighters Association (AKPFFA).

Designating an existing firefighter seat to the AKPFFA will provide representation at AFSC meetings and will have no fiscal impact.

The addition of one AFSC seat to include the Alaska Fire Chiefs Association (AFCA) will provide designated representation for the AFCA at the AFSC meetings. The addition of this seat will increase travel costs related to AFSC meeting attendance.

Cost for attendance per AFSC member includes airfare, hotel, ground transportation, and per diem. The current average cost for each members' attendance is \$1,150 per meeting, with two meetings occurring per year. Future estimates for travel are based on travel cost increases from the past three years.

Alaska Fire Standards Council

Mission:

To establish professional standards for fire service personnel, and curriculum requirements for the certification of training programs.

Vision:

- Maintain the highest level of professional standards for the safety and welfare for fire service personnel and their communities
- Maintain comprehensive certification program requirements
- Enhance the capability and capacity of fire service response personnel
- Preserve public confidence in fire service professionals
- Enhance interoperability within Alaska's emergency response system

Values:

- Firefighter safety
- Effective open communications
- Public service
- Continuing education and training
- Professional credibility and integrity
- Community support
- Transparent process

Term: Four years

Description: 11 members - 10 appointed by the Governor: 2 chief administrative officers or fire chiefs of local governments (only one of these may be from a local government where the fire department consists entirely of paid employees); 4 representatives of fire fighters, including at least one fire fighter administrative officer from the Alaska State Fire Fighters Association (these members may not, while serving on the council, be a fire chief); 2 volunteer fire fighters, one from a community with a population of 2,500 or less and one from a community with a population greater than 2,500; and 2 members of the public at large with at least one member from a community with a population of 2,500 or less. In addition, the state fire marshal or a designee of the state fire marshal shall serve on the council during his or her continuance in office.

Function: The council may adopt regulations for the administration of AS 18.70.320-18.70.369 including establishing minimum training and performance standards for certification of fire services personnel; establish minimum fire training curriculum requirements for certification of training programs that are designed to enable trainees to meet these standards; govern the procedure for certification of fire services training programs that meet the minimum curriculum requirements; govern the procedure for certification of individuals who satisfy the minimum

training and performance standards; govern the procedure for revocation of the certificate of a person or program; consult and cooperate with municipalities, agencies of the state, other governmental agencies, universities, colleges, and other institutions concerning the development of fire services training schools and programs offered in the state; employ an administrator and other persons necessary to carry out its duties and charge and collect fees determined by the council to be necessary.
