Planned Parenthood representatives have announced a partnership with select public school systems in California, Illinois, and Maryland. Planned Parenthood representative Janice Morley told reporters during a press conference that she is hopeful the partnership will extend to several additional states by late 2016.

Planned Parenthood currently provides resources regarding sex education on their [website](#), however with the new partnership they will be allowed to provide on-site direct resources to high school students at select public schools.

A detailed outline of the curriculum/proposal has yet to be released, however, Planned Parenthood representative Janice Morley provided a high level overview of the partnership and what role Planned Parenthood representatives will play within the schools during an interview with an [ABC affiliate](#) station. According to Morley, each high school within the participating school districts (*approximately 57 schools*), will be provided with one Planned Parenthood representative. The Planned Parenthood representatives will be provided with an office within the school and will be on-site 2-3 days per week. All students within the school will be able to schedule confidential consultations with the school's Planned Parenthood representative and are guaranteed confidentiality and anonymity.

The Planned Parenthood representatives will not be able to administer medication or provide any services on-site, however will be able to provide information and counsel on any services offered by the organization and can direct students to their local Planned Parenthood clinic.

The services offered and areas of expertise according to the Planned Parenthood [website](#) include:

- Abortion
- Birth Control
- Body Image
- General Healthcare
- Men's Sexual Health
- Morning-After Pill (Emergency Contraception)
- Pregnancy

- Relationships
- Sex & Sexuality
- Sexual Orientation & Gender
- STDS
- Women's Health

Planned Parenthood has received federal funding since 1970, because of this, many are speculating that the participating schools may be receiving additional funding or incentives. When asked if the relevant schools would be receiving additional federal funding or incentives for their participation, Morley declined to comment.

Morley concluded her brief interview by making the following statement, "The partnership is still in its infancy/pilot stage, we (*Planned Parenthood*) are excited for the program to evolve and expand throughout the year".

My name is Tabitha Ellis. I am a concerned community member. I have worked in a variety of day care centers and elementary schools. I also have teenage siblings, whom this bill would affect.

I am personally against Planned Parenthood presentations in public schools. Aside from moral opinions, I also have some developmental concerns that I would like to address:

I personally feel that youth and children should ideally learn about sexual issues and puberty from their parents or a trusted adult, such as a teacher or nurse at their school. Parents and teachers know the youth better than some random representative from Planned Parenthood or a similar organization, and they would be able to adapt their discussions based on the young person's personality and development. I remember attending a brief version of "sex ed" in high school. It only lasted a couple of days out of a whole semester of health class. All that was really talked about was birth control and how to use a condom. I don't remember much discussion about abstinence or how to refuse sexual advances; mainly just how to have "safe sex." I felt like I couldn't ask questions or make comments without being teased because the class had both boys and girls. I would have felt much more comfortable with the subject matter if I were just in a class with my female peers. It was very awkward and ineffective. I feel that sexual behavior and reproductive development isn't something that can be covered over a couple of class periods; it should be a series of age appropriate discussion over a period of time, as the child grows. That's another reason why I feel that parents and teachers are a better option for teaching children and youth about sex and puberty than a Planned Parenthood representative.

I am writing to request you support SB 89. This bill has passed through both education committees and is before your committee due to provisions regarding the prohibition on abortion providers offering these services. For this reason, I will confine my comments there.

While my interest in this legislation focuses on the parents' right to opt out of testing, the right of parents should really extend beyond mere matters of testing. Planned parenthood is one particular provider that has been active in courses beyond units in reproductive units in other states. This bill is aimed at preempting their reach into other areas of the curriculum. The Alaska Standards, like the common core, has reading and writing standards in science, technology, and social studies. This provides an opportunity for some entities to enter areas of the curriculum where they might not otherwise be found.

As a case in point, a teacher named Bill Diss, a math and technology teacher, was terminated for refusing to allow planned parenthood to present material in his math classes.(This was to access students who had parent's refuse the unit in other classes). It is one thing to offer units on sex education, but it is beyond the pale for abortion providers to go into other areas of discipline and politicize the curriculum.

While the case was in Oregon, the prior Deputy Commissioner in Alaska borrowed extensively from various ideas implemented in Oregon. It is also noteworthy that the AK STEP accountability consultant, Indestar "Shepherd", is based in Oregon. For this reason, many parents involved in the grassroots battle against the implementation of common core thought the abortion provider provisions were prudent to add to the legislation. Public schools should focus on core concepts of reading, writing, and mathematics and academic content and should not be political battlegrounds.

As a side note, PPH is not the only entity that is involved in offering sex education and health materials. Several entities that do not provide abortions, such as Step-Up also provide these services. In comparing STD rates in the interior of Alaska offered by the CDC, areas where Step-UP is involved have lower STD rates than their PPH Co-hort group in other communities. Planned Parenthood has been in many school districts for years, and yet STD rates are rising. If their curriculum is so effective, why is it that the CDC shows declines in areas where Step-Up has been implemented rather than Planned Parenthood?

However, it should be noted that AASB and other groups did have opportunities to comments on this bill, and in some instances, those wishes were included, such as the issue of teacher physicals. The education provisions are consistent with the new provisions of the new ESSA.

Please pass SB 89.

I am writing you with comments pertaining to SB 89 from an experience I had when my son was in 8th grade at Gruening Middle School in Eagle River.

I hope this will provide useful information for you as you debate and make decisions on that bill.

When I found out that there was going to be a course section on sexuality in my son's class, I decided to attend so I could discover what was being taught. There were classes on two different days. The first day's material was given by a person from an organization that I don't recall the name of. The second day's class was given by a representative of Planned Parenthood. Both groups were equally knowledgeable and, I think, effective. I had only one concern about either presentation, and that was the one by the PP rep. She told the young people about some of the services at PP, which on its face seemed innocent and non-controversial enough. However, at the end of her talk she made a strong pitch that these children could use the services of PP without telling their parents, and that PP would not tell the parents about any of the services used. It was clear from her invitation to use PP's services that she was promoting PP's business, and also that she was demoting open communication between parents and children about the issues of sexual behavior, birth control and

abortion. Because I am a strong advocate of families and of the role of parents in trying to encourage their children to make wise decisions, and in protecting them from harm, I concluded that the PP rep's comments were undermining of the family unit and its need for transparent communication in this very important area of life. I also concluded that there must be any number of people and organizations that could present the same material PP presented but without the elements of advertising a business and encouraging secrecy among family members.

My wife and I ask that you incorporate the above information as you consider this bill.

“How do you sell an abortion? In the US it’s very simple: You do it through sex education,” former abortion clinic owner Carol Everett told participants at the Rose Dinner following the National March for Life on Thursday in Ottawa.

Everett, who ran a chain of four abortion clinics in Texas from 1977-1983 — where an estimated 35,000 unborn children were aborted before her dramatic conversion and departure from the industry — told about 430 participants at the dinner that she had a goal of becoming a millionaire by selling abortions to teenage girls.

“We had a goal of 3-5 abortions from every girl between the ages of 13 and 18, because we all work on a straight commission inside the abortion industry,” she said. With every customer, Everett became a little richer.

But in order to reach her financial goal, Everett said she first had to create a “market for abortions.” That meant convincing young people from the earliest age possible to see sexuality in an entirely different way than previous generations.

“We started in kindergarten. In kindergarten you put the children in a circle and you go around the room and you ask them all the same question: ‘What do your parents call your private parts?’”

“You know and I know that every family in this room has a different name for the private parts. So by the time you reach the third or fourth child it is clear to those children that parents simply do not know what they have. But we did. We said: ‘Boys this is what you have and girls this is what you have and don’t be ashamed of your private parts.’”

Everett explained how sex education at the earliest ages aimed at eroding in the children what she called “natural modesty.” Everything was calculated to “separate the children from their values and their parents.”

By third grade, children were shown explicit ‘how to’ diagrams of intercourse. By fourth grade, children were encouraged to masturbate, either alone or in groups of the same sex.

It was during the fifth and sixth grade that Everett herself supplied the missing link between sex-ed and abortion.

“My goal was to get them sexually active on a low dose birth control pill that we knew they would get pregnant on. How do you do that? You give them a low dose birth control pill that, in order to provide any level of protection, has to be taken accurately at the same time every single day. And you know and I know, there’s not a teen in the world who does everything the same time every day.”
