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

SUBJECT: Legislative Confirmation of Governor's Appointments

The question you asked is if a committee does not address, or otherwise fails to make a report and recommendation concerning a governor's proposed appointment, does the committee's action prevent confirmation by the legislature in a joint session.

The brief answer is no.

Uniform Rule 46 refers to the process in AS 39.05.080, and art. III, secs. 25 and 26, Constitution of the State of Alaska, for the process the legislature follows when considering appointments by the governor.¹ AS 39.05.080 directs the presiding officer of

¹ Rule 46. Confirmation of Appointments.

Appointments by the governor are made pursuant to AS 39.05.080. Such appointments are subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the full membership of the legislature in joint session. (Secs. 25 and 26, Art. III, State Constitution.)

Section 3.25 - Department Heads.

The head of each principal department shall be a single executive unless otherwise provided by law. He shall be appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by a majority of the members of the legislature in joint session, and shall serve at the pleasure of the governor, except as otherwise provided in this article with respect to the secretary of state. The heads of all principal departments shall be citizens of the United States.

Section 3.26 - Boards and Commissions.

When a board or commission is at the head of a principal department or a regulatory or quasi-judicial agency, its members shall be appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by a majority of the members of the legislature in joint session, and may be removed as provided by law. They

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each house to assign the name of each of the governor's proposed appointments to a standing committee of each house for "a hearing, report, and recommendations. . . ." AS 39.05.080(2)(B) goes on to direct that "the legislature shall, before the end of the regular session in which the appointment is presented, in joint session assembled, act on the appointments by confirming or declining to confirm by a majority vote of all of the members the appointments presented." If the legislature fails "to act to confirm or decline[s] to confirm" an appointment during the regular session in which the appointment is presented, this constitutes a "declination to confirm." AS 39.05.080(3).

If a standing committee assigned to conduct a hearing regarding a prospective appointment fails to: (1) hold a hearing on the appointment; (2) write a report or make a recommendation to the body; or (3) make a recommendation not to approve the appointment, the result under all of these scenarios is the same: the legislature may still take up the name on the floor for confirmation despite the committee action or inaction, as provided in AS 39.05.080(2)(B) and art. III, secs. 25 and 26 of the Constitution of the State of Alaska. The legislature will either confirm or decline to confirm the appointment. While it is less likely, given the requirement in AS 39.05.080(2)(B) that the legislature "shall" in joint session, act on appointments, it is possible under AS 39.05.080(3) that the legislature could take no action, thereby declining the appointment. If the legislature chose to take no action to decline an appointment, a court would likely find AS 39.05.08(2)(B) a rule of internal legislative procedure, and a non justifiable question. *Aboud v. League of Women Voters*; 743 P.2d 333 (Alaska 1987).
