




19 with the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs to determine the proof
20 necessary to show that a person is a Lao veteran or a Hmong veteran. With the

23 designation under this subsection. Notwithstanding (a) of this section, the department

28 under this subsection. The department may charge a fee of \$5 for replacement of a
29 valid driver's license with a new license with a veteran designation. A replacement
30 license with a veteran designation issued for \$5 under this subsection shall retain the
31 expiration date of the license it replaces."

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

4 * **Section 1.** AS 28.10.181 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

5 (ii) Special request plates commemorating the Blood Bank of Alaska. Upon
6 application by the owner of a motor vehicle, the department may issue registration
7 plates commemorating the Blood Bank of Alaska. The commissioner, after consulting
8 with representatives of the Blood Bank of Alaska, shall determine the design and color
9 of the plates. The department may disapprove the issuance of registration plates under
10 this subsection when the requested plates are a duplication of an existing registration.

11 * **Sec. 2.** AS 28.10.421(d) is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

12 (25) special request Blood Bank of Alaska plates \$50
13 plus the fee required for that vehicle under (b), (c), (h), or (i) of this section; the fee
14 required by this paragraph shall be collected biennially in the same manner as the fee

1 required under (b), (c), (h), or (i) of this section; the commissioner of administration
2 shall separately account for the fees received under this paragraph that the department
3 deposits in the general fund; notwithstanding (g) of this section, the annual estimated
4 balance in the account that is in excess of the cost of issuing special request plates may
5 be appropriated by the legislature to the Blood Bank of Alaska.

Sponsor Statement for Senate Bill 154

By the Senate State Affairs Committee, by Request

“An Act relating to special registration plates commemorating the Blood Bank of Alaska.”

Senate Bill 154 creates an opportunity for Alaskans to express support for the Blood Bank of Alaska by creating a special license plate for purchase at the Division of Motor Vehicles.

Blood Bank of Alaska (BBA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization founded in 1962. As an independent Alaskan-based nonprofit, managed by an all-Alaskan volunteer Board of Directors, its sole mission is fulfillment of Alaska’s need for blood, blood products, and related services. For over 50 years it has been entrusted with the privilege of service to Alaska.

BBA provides blood products to virtually every hospital in the state; including all tribal and military medical facilities. Blood Bank of Alaska is a first responder organization, and is a unique and vital member of our state’s critical response infrastructure. In the event of a crisis, disaster, or any emergency, BBA is the only Alaska-based organization that recruits, collects, tests, processes, and distributes blood and blood products as a source within the state.

With the recent completion of a new state-of-the-art blood bank facility, BBA is now able to help meet the changing needs of Alaska’s healthcare emergency response needs. By offering a way for Alaskans to show support for the Blood Bank of Alaska, we can help support the ongoing efforts of this vital organization.

FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 154

Analysis

SB 154 amends AS 28.10.181 to allow creation of a new license plate commemorating the Blood Bank of Alaska. The plate will have a biannual registration fee of \$50. DMV will work with the Blood Bank of Alaska representative to design the plate. The Commissioner of the Department of Administration will have final approval on the license plate design.

Production time:

There is a 3-4 month timeframe to have a plate created and available for order on DMV's website.

Cost to DMV:

There is a \$250 charge to create a new plate.
