


## Remodeled shooting range opening in Butte

BUTTE – A new sign went up on Thursday at the beginning of a dirt road in the small community of Butte.

For Kenny Barber, who lives nearby, it marks more than simply the way to get to the Maud Road Shooting Range. To him, it represents a community's reached goal.

"People just came out and shot everything they wanted to," Barber said.

The Knik River Public Use area has a bad reputation for being full of illegal dumping and shooting.

"We were having round impacts into people's homes, we were having numerous police calls of close calls, people walking down the trail and someone chose that to be their target area," explained Department of Natural Resources Land Manager Travis Jensen.

The former Maud Road Shooting Range closed down over the summer for renovations. The construction is now complete and the range is set to reopen Saturday, Aug. 22.

"Responsible shooting is what I hope it creates," Barber said as he unloaded new trashcans and rifle benches made by hand.

The new range has a paved parking lot, two brand new shooting pavilions and wheelchair accessible lanes. The state spent nearly \$1 million on the improvements, which Jensen says will make the area a safer place for people to shoot.

"This is the only state-run range, essentially, in the area," Jensen said.

The nearest home is three miles down the Maud Road. Some neighbors argue the range doesn't belong on their street and are worried about increased traffic and noise pollution.

"That's one of the reasons we put a covered pavilion on the site," Jensen said. "We spent about \$25,000 on sound abatement."

The hope now is that people will respect the Knik River Public Use Area, shoot responsibly and keep it clean for everyone to enjoy.

The range will be open every day from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. except Wednesdays, when the range will be closed.

“Phase II construction is complete. It's normal schedule of 10:00am to 8:00pm. The range will be closed every Wednesday. There are now 18 lanes of fire on the 100 yard range, and 10-12 lanes of fire on the 25 yard range. Parking has also been expanded and portable lavatories have been provided.

**USE OF THE KRPUA SHOOTING RANGE IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.**

That being said, please ensure you have read and understood all the **Range Rules** (PDF) site. Both land managers and the State Troopers will cite violations of the KRPUA regulations. Please pick up your debris and remind others to do the same. Damage and maintenance costs will take away resources that could enhance the facility.

Located between Palmer and Butte Alaska, the Knik River Public Use Area Shooting Range is off of the Maud Road Extension, approximately 2.7 miles from the end of the paved section of Maud Road. It is approximately 1000' ft. past Mud Lake with appropriate signage marking its location.

## RULES OF THE KRPUA SHOOTING RANGE

### GENERAL RULES

1. Hours of operation are 10 am - 8 pm. The range is closed every Wednesday.
2. Vehicles are not allowed on range.
3. Shotgun shot is not allowed (slugs and sabot only).
4. Fully automatic weapons, explosives, cannons, .50 caliber center fire rifles and non-firearms are not allowed.
5. Only paper, wood or clay targets may be used (no aerial targets). Targets must be placed at least at minimum distances. The State of Alaska reserves sole discretion.
6. No fires of any sort are allowed on site.
7. No alcoholic beverages may be consumed on site.
8. Pistols, revolvers, and black powder firearms are allowed.
9. Please wear proper safety equipment. People acting in an unsafe manner will have to leave the site.
10. Be sure your weapon is safe to operate and you know how to use it.

### FIRING LINE RULES

1. Treat every weapon as if it were loaded.
2. Never point your weapon at anything you do not intend to shoot.
3. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to fire.
4. Keep your weapon on safe until you intend to fire.
5. Be aware of your target's foreground and background.
  - Minimum Distance for 25yd Range is: **3 yards**
  - Minimum Distance for 100yd Range is: **10 yards**
6. Designate a range officer when none are present or assigned.
7. While on the firing line, always point your weapon down range. Weapons may only be fired from the established firing line.
8. Unload, remove the magazine, open the action, and place on ground or bench all firearms during a cease fire. Do not handle any firearm or stand at the firing line where firearms are present while others are down range.
9. Clean up your lane of fire when you are done; this includes all shell casings, targets and debris.
10. Ground targets are not authorized.

FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. SB 204

**Analysis**

DNR anticipates that there will be no fiscal impact to the department from this legislation.

**Section 1** of the bill proposes to enact AS 38.40.375 to name the shooting range located near Mud Lake on Maude Road within the Knik River Public use Area the Kenny and Patti Barber Shooting Range.

**Section 2** of the bill proposes to amend the uncodified law of the State of Alaska by adding a new subsection that would prohibit the state from replacing a state-owned sign identifying the shooting range unless the existing sign is damaged or due for replacement according to regularly scheduled maintenance.
