13 fields of practice for which applications for licensure or endorsements are pending.

Sectional Analysis for the HCS (RLS) to Senate Bill 51 – Extending the Board of Veterinary Examiners and relating to the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers Version I

Section 1 amends AS 08.03.010(c) (22) to extend the Board of Veterinary Examiners through June 30, 2025.

Section 2 amends AS 08.13.040 to grandfather previously practicing manicurists from complying with licensing criteria outlined in HB 131.

Section 3 amends AS 08.13.080(a) to eliminate the requirement for 250 hours of manicuring instruction to become a licensed manicurist.

Section 4 adds a new subsections in AS 08.13.080 that

- (e) Provides that an applicant for a license for manicuring shall
 - (1) Complete a 12 hour health, safety and hygiene class
 - (2) Pay the fee
- (f) Provides that an applicant for an endorsement for manicuring
 - (1) Hold a current license
 - (2) Request an endorsement
 - (3) Complete 250 hours of instruction in manicuring
 - (4) Pass exam for Advanced Manicurists

Explanation of Changes

Senate Bill 51 – Extending the Board of Veterinary Examiners and relating to the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers

The Rules CS for SB 51 (Version I) extends the Board of Veterinary Examiners through June 30, 2025 while simultaneously addressing the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers' statutory oversight of manicurists. CSSB 51 returns the regulation of manicurists to its status prior to HB 131, which passed the 29th Alaska Legislature in 2015 and added burdensome educational requirements to practicing nail technicians. The Rules CS will correct this oversight and keep hundreds of experienced nail technicians working and supporting their families.

Explanation of Changes

Senate Bill 51 – Extending the Board of Veterinary Examiners and relating to the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers

The Rules CS for SB 51 (Version I) extends the Board of Veterinary Examiners through June 30, 2025 while simultaneously addressing the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers' statutory oversight of manicurists. CSSB 51 returns the regulation of manicurists to its status prior to HB 131, which passed the 29th Alaska Legislature in 2015 and added burdensome educational requirements to practicing nail technicians. The Rules CS will correct this oversight and keep hundreds of experienced nail technicians working and supporting their families.
