SPONSOR STATEMENT – House Bill 368

An Act relating to child custody; and amending Rule 90.3, Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure

HB 368 seeks to amend the Alaska Statute 25.20.060 to state that during a divorce proceeding the court would make a rebuttal presumption that a child should be with each parent 50% of the time and would prevent one parent from relocating the child without permission from the other parent or a court finds that relocation is in the best interest of the child.
