Jahna Lindemuth, Attorney General for the State of Alaska

Ms. Lindemuth started her new role as Attorney General for the State of Alaska on August 8, 2016. Before becoming Attorney General, she spent 18 years in private practice at Dorsey & Whitney, LLP. As a partner in the commercial litigation group, she represented clients in complex commercial disputes in state and federal courts, administrative agencies, and private arbitrations. Her work brought her before the Alaska Supreme Court and the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals on many occasions, helping to hone her skills in legal research, writing, and oral argument. She has broad experience in many types of law including oil and gas, consumer protection, Alaska Native law issues including the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) and the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, ethics and fiduciary duty issues and telecommunications. Clients have commended Ms. Lindemuth's "strategic approach" to dispute resolution, as well as her invaluable insight, problem solving skills, and excellent judgment.

Ms. Lindemuth's advocacy and leadership have earned her the respect of clients, opposing counsel, the judiciary, and industry media organizations. In addition to being AV rated by Martindale-Hubbell, she was named as a Top 10 Attorney in Alaska for 2014 and 2015 by Super Lawyers, a Local Litigation Star by Benchmark Litigation for 2013-2015, one of the Top 250 Women in Litigation by Benchmark Litigation for 2012-2015, and is ranked Tier One by Chambers USA.

While keeping up a full caseload, she donated many hours providing pro bono legal services to clients who could not afford an attorney, including representing one of the Fairbanks Four in a post-conviction relief proceeding in 2015. In reaching a settlement with the State of Alaska in December 2015, she secured the Fairbanks Four's release after eighteen years of imprisonment and the court vacated their convictions.

Ms. Lindemuth managed Dorsey's Anchorage office for eight years before leaving Dorsey to become Alaska's Attorney General, and was recognized for her leadership skills. For example, she was named Partner of the Year at Dorsey in 2012 because of her effective mentorship of junior attorneys.

Born and raised in Anchorage, Alaska, Ms. Lindemuth obtained her J.D. from University of California at Berkeley (Boalt Hall School of Law) in 1997, graduating Order of the Coif, and clerked for the Honorable Robert L. Eastaugh on the Alaska Supreme Court from 1997 to 1998. Ms. Lindemuth served on the Alaska Supreme Court Appellate Rules Committee for more than ten years, the Alaska Bar's Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection Committee for several years, and was Co-Chair of the Appellate Law Section of the Alaska Bar before being named Attorney General.

Ms. Lindemuth will go before the legislature in the spring of 2017 for her confirmation as required by the Alaska Constitution.

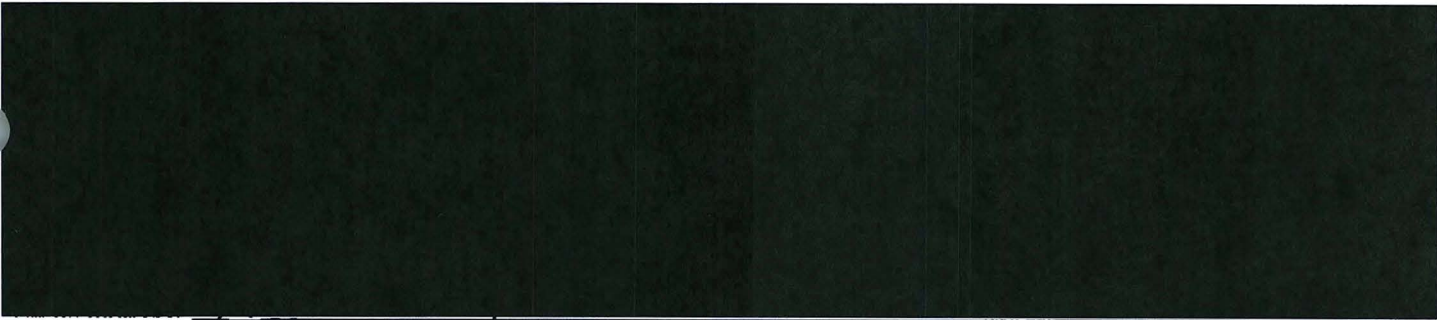

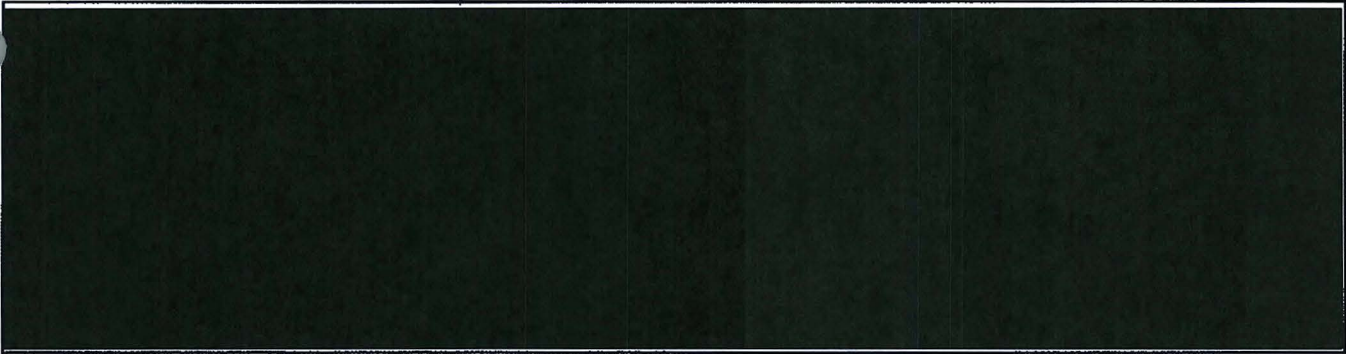

Biography of Wendi Shackelford

Wendi Shackelford served as a uniformed police officer with the Anchorage Police Department from November 14, 1994 to January 31, 2015, when she retired. She worked within the patrol division until May 2003, when she transferred to Chugiak High School as one of the first School Resource Officers (SRO) within the Municipality of Anchorage. She served ten years as an SRO within Chugiak High School, Mirror Lake Middle School, and four Eagle River/Chugiak area elementary schools to answer police calls for service, teach DARE and other topics, and build positive relationships with students, staff, parents, and the community. She was assigned full time with the patrol division as CIT Coordinator from June 1, 2013 to January 31, 2015.

Wendi was an FBI/LAPD-trained hostage negotiator for APD from December 1997 to January 2004. She has served as the Coordinator and lead instructor for the Anchorage Police Department's *Crisis Intervention Program* (CIT) program since its inception in October 2001. At the CIT training, mental health and other professionals voluntarily provide expert instruction to law enforcement/first responders during an intensive 40 hour course in which attendees are educated about mental illnesses, medications, suicide and crisis intervention, active listening skills, de-escalation techniques, empathy, and respect. The attendees also participate in extensive role playing exercises which illustrate these principles. As a result, consumers and their families receive an immediate response to crisis by police officers who are educated in mental illness and de-escalation techniques. In addition, consumers are identified and provided access to appropriate mental health care by those officers.

Wendi had the opportunity to attend the 40 hour Crisis Intervention Team training in Memphis, Tennessee (the home of CIT) in October 2001 with Steve Montooth (mental health provider), Yvonne Evans (family member), and Doug Moore (mental health consumer). Since that time, the Anchorage Police Department, led by Wendi, has conducted fifteen (15) Crisis Intervention Team academies, training 400 first responders, law enforcement, and other professionals across the State of Alaska. Since retirement, Wendi has assisted the APD with two additional CIT academies. She is currently providing technical assistance to the Mat Su CIT Coalition on developing its own CIT 40 hour training course, slated for February 2017. In addition, Wendi attended a 36 hour course in Colorado in 2007 designed for School Resource officers for CIT approaches with youth.

Wendi was awarded her Advanced Police Certificate from the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) in 2001. She was certified by the APSC in 2006 as an instructor for the Crisis Intervention Team and DARE. In 2015, Mental Health First Aid for Public Safety was added to her instructor certification with APSC and she has recently requested Youth Mental Health First Aid, Adult Mental Health First Aid, and QPR Gatekeeper suicide prevention curriculums be added to her instructor certificate (June 2016).

In addition, the International Conference of Police Chaplains (ICPC) credentials her as a basic chaplain (January 2011) and liaison officer (July 2012). She was also credentialed as a basic chaplain with the Chaplain Fellowship Ministries Inc (CFMI) in July 2012 and as a Disaster Response Chaplain by the Southern Baptist Convention (January 2012). She successfully completed the basic chaplain academy with 46 hours of intense instruction through the Police and Fire Training Academy hosted by Tacoma Pierce County Chaplaincy (TPCC) in May 2014.

Wendi has completed eight FEMA ICS courses including 100SCa, 200b, 300, 400, 700a, 701a, 703a, and 800b. In addition, she has been certified in the following ICISF® courses: Group Crisis (October 2002, June 2010, May 2013), Individual and Peer support (June 2010 and October 2012), and Advanced Group (July 2011). Even in retirement, Wendi has continued to participate in CISD's as a law enforcement peer and to serve individual officers in need of one-on-one peer support, with referrals to vetted professionals as necessary.

She is a certified trainer in NAMI New Hampshire Connect™ Postvention (June 2012) and has co-instructed four classes with approximately 80 total attendees.

She also obtained her certification as a trainer for Mental Health First Aid USA™ in November 2013 and has co-instructed more than 14 adult classes. In 2014, she obtained her certification to instruct the MHFA Law Enforcement module and her first class included the entire 6-person department of Hoonah Police Department in Hoonah, Alaska. Wendi introduced elements of Mental Health First Aid to the first APD police academy in September 2014 and has taught the full course in two APD police academies. Wendi obtained her certification for Youth Mental Health First Aid in March 2015 and has taught 37 classes to a variety of adult participants from all over Alaska.

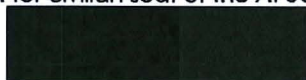

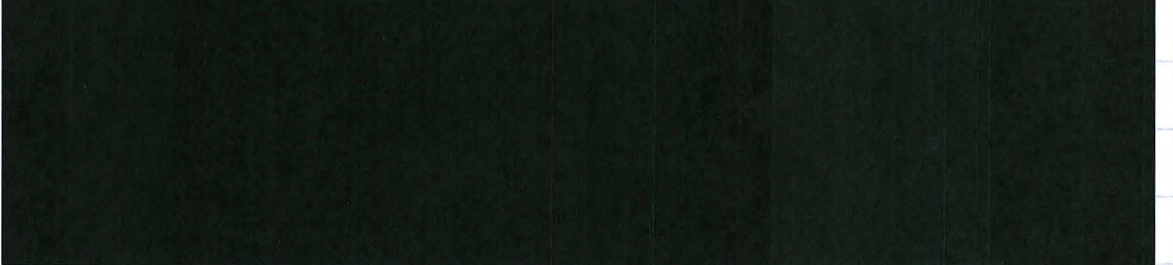

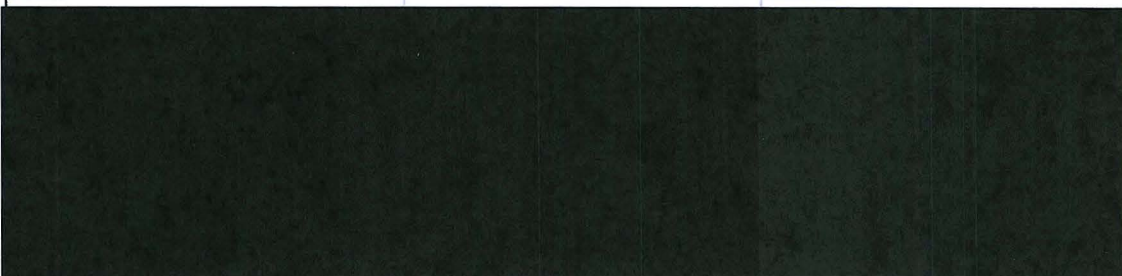
