February 11, 1972

House Bills 471 and 554 are similar in that they both provide funding for civic improvement projects. However, HB 554 calls for a bond issue while HB 471 is an appropriation from the General Fund.

The intention of the committee is to offer alternative plans in case one bill should fail. Civic Center feasibility studies in Juneau and Anchorage are currently being completed. Funding for these studies were provided for some ten areas under AS 43.18.300.

Other communities expressing interest in securing State matching funds are: Barrow, Dillingham, Sitka, Unalaska, and Kotzebue. It is estimated that the majority of the \$200,000 fund will be exhausted by June 30, 1972.

This reflects only the first phase of the total program as detailed in AS 43.18.300. Those communities with sufficient impetus to embark upon the land acquisition, planning and construction phase will, in our opinion, create the following impact upon State funding:

III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

\$270,000 will cover only 38 out of 59 locations where there are Case 450 tractors or where buildings are needed. As the cost for buildings is figured at \$7,000 per unit delivered and erected, the total cost comes to \$266,000 for 38 units, leaving a balance of \$4,000. The figure of \$7,000 per unit is based on an informal quote of \$5,500 per metal unit 20'x30' F.O.B. Anchorage. This figure includes erection, but not transportation to sites outside of Anchorage. Some savings may result in shipment of the buildings, however, the figure of \$1,500 per unit seems fair by taking into consideration possible increases in wages and freight rates. Code 400, Commodities, reflects a 50 percent increase per year for materials for general upkeep on buildings. Attached for informational purposes is a list of locations and type of equipment located at these stations.

We propose to first select 30 small municipalities, which we feel have high priority, and to contract, with overall supervision from our Local Government Specialist I, for a basic accounting and bookkeeping system for the municipalities. Then to contract for the teaching in the municipality. We would judge that with travel, five days would be spent in each municipality.
