House Bill 801

As I explained in our telephone conversation of this date, it would be most difficult without a great deal of detailed analysis to provide information on the potential economic impact of this proposed legislation. It is my impression that the bill calls for a "judicial RDA program."

I understand HCR 49 also has to do with the subject of courtroom facilities in rural areas. Apparently the Court System has at least made a preliminary study of the facilities ideally required in bush areas.

Through a copy of this memorandum, I am asking Byron Mallott of the Local Affairs Agency to provide you any comment he might have on the subject legislation, although I am not at all certain that Mr. Mallott is in any better position than I am to comment on the cost.

Gentlemen:

I have reviewed HB 830 which seeks to change the requirements of AS 43.20.030(d).

Under the current statute a taxpayer is required to notify the Department in writing within 20 days of any change of his Federal income tax or a recomputation of the tax or a deficiency. This requirement is consistent with our income tax philosophy of self-assessment. Under a self-assessment system the taxpayer takes the responsibility for notifying the government of his tax and the details leading to his computation of the tax. This system results in very small administrative costs since the government is then required only to be concerned with those who do not comply with the laws.

Under HB 830 we have the contrary to that philosophy. This bill would seek to put the onus on the government to assess the tax in case of a change in the taxpayer's Federal tax liability. This would not only be costly and contrary to modern philosophy of income tax administration but may be impossible.

Although we receive copies from the Internal Revenue Service of many of the adjustments they make to tax returns having an Alaskan address, they do not send us any copies of adjustments made to those taxpayers who do not have an Alaskan address. This group of nonresident taxpayers represents some 15 to 18 per cent of our total income tax-paying population. In cases of adjustments made to the Federal tax liabilities of these individuals the State of Alaska would not be notified and would not be able to collect any of the additional tax due.


It is difficult to estimate the loss in revenues due to this legislation. However, based on statistics relating to previous IRS adjustments we have received and comparing them with the number of nonresident filers, we can assume that the loss in income tax receipts would be \$100,000 a year at a minimum.

It can be easily seen from the attached Fiscal Note that the cost/benefit ratio is very poor compared to our other tax programs. This is due to the fact (mentioned above) that this bill proposes a government assessment of tax rather than a self-assessment by the individual. The Fiscal Note provides for an audit staff based in Seattle to handle the nonresidents as well as additional staff in Juneau to support the operation.

In conclusion we can say that it becomes very difficult and costly to try to administer any law which contains two counter-veiling philosophies. On the one hand we have the bulk of our income tax statutes based on a self-assessment system. On the other hand, under this bill we would have a portion of that law based upon a government assessment system. The efficiency of this proposed system, as has been shown, is very poor. The self-assessing system is by far the most efficient and should be retained intact.
