The duties assigned this position are unique to state service in that they combine the responsibility for the development of long-range and immediate plans for the implementation of non-commercial broadcasting facilities throughout the State of Alaska with that of providing engineering services in the design, layout and physical development of those facilities. These responsibilities are not found in any other position in the state and call for an individual with expertise in both the areas of broadcast communications engineering and broadcast communications planning.

Assignment to Salary Range 23 is recommended for this class to recognize the broad area of these responsibilities. Responsibilities are statewide and the position must act with a great deal of independence. The recommended range will recognize this broad area of assignment, the high degree of technical expertise necessary to meet these assignments, and, hopefully, will be adequate to attract applicants with the experience necessary to meet the demands of the job.

ATTACHMENT #1

The major reasons for requesting that this position be assigned to the new class of Broadcast Facilities Planner were covered on the P-402A form attached to this description. One other thing should be mentioned here, as it is very important to this job; that is the necessary experience requirements that are essential for success.

As mentioned, this is a split job responsible for both communications engineering and for long and short range facilities planning. In order to be successful in this position a person will require a minimum of ten years of increasingly responsible work in the broadcast communications field. This experience must have included responsibility for both the planning, layout and design of broadcast communications facilities and in supervising the actual construction of those facilities.

For this reason, and those stated on the P-402A form, the new class of Broadcast Facilities Planner is not only recommended, it is essential to meet our needs.

SUBJECT: Current Status of Reenlistment Bonus and Educational Grant Funds

As of this date, all monies in the reenlistment bonus and educational assistance grant have been expended. The grant received an allocation of \$30,000 for the entire FY 72. The department's initial budget request for FY 72 in this area was \$90,000. Budget was computed at an average rate of \$150/individual reenlistment bonus and \$200/month average for academic educational assistance; \$300/month average for flight training assistance and \$150/month vocational skill training.

FY 71 EXPENDITURES

- Reenlistment bonuses: \$38,000.30 paid to a total of 276 individuals of whom 220 recipients (80%) were members of the Eskimo Scout Battalions
- Educational Assistance: \$ 7,824.24 The program was implemented in March 1971, therefore this figure pertains to a 4 month period (March-June 1971) with payment to 11 participants (6 academic; 5 flight training)

FY 72 DATA

- Reenlistment Bonus: \$21,829.55 Paid to date to a total of 145 individuals of which 101 (70%) recipients, were members of the Eskimo Scout Battalions
- \$19,000.00 required to fund for the remainder of FY 72 to pay a remaining estimated total of 155 individuals due reenlistment bonuses in FY 72.

The educational assistance program, unlike a strictly academic program, has no set cycle for applications each year. Submission of application is dependent first on the completion of military obligation and subsequent reenlistment.

Our academic applicants are scheduled during the academic year, but, flight training and vocational skill training can commence at any time the individual finds himself free to start the course at any time during the year.

Therefore, from the above figures, the reenlistment bonus and educational assistance requires a minimum additional supplemental allocation of \$39,000 just to fulfill existing FY 72 requirements as follows:

- ① - \$19,000.00 for unfulfilled reenlistment bonuses
- ② - \$11,700.00 for unfulfilled and already obligated educational assistance
- ③ - \$4,000.00 for pending educational assistance applications -
- \$34,700.00 required needs to fulfill existing situation and not including future FY 72 applicants.

SUBJECT: Current Status of Recruitment Bonus and Educational Grant Funds

Not to mention additional educational assistance applicants for the remainder of FY 72 which we estimate at 17 individuals (5 flight, 2 academic, 2 vocational) utilizing \$14,400. Thus, this department requires a total supplemental allocation of approximately \$50,000.

In addition, to the \$30,000 already funded the grant in FY 72, this makes for a total budget of \$80,000. Our total minimum estimated budgetary requirements for FY 72 was \$70,000. However, a number of individuals who would normally have enrolled in the educational assistance program became uncertain about committing themselves to a continuous academic, flight or vocational skill training program due to the money shortage situation. Therefore, our educational assistance enrollment can be considered lower than usual.

FY 72 Requirements

Recruitment Bonus:	\$45,000
Educational Assistance:	\$45,000

This figure as you can see from the FY 72 data is minimal only and allows for no growth in either our retention program (which we anticipate growing at a 30% rate of recruitment) or in the educational assistance program; which at this budgetary rate will support only approximately 25 individuals, (at least half of whom will be continuing enrollees from FY 72). We have pruned our FY 73 budgetary request for the recruitment bonus and educational assistance back to the bare minimum estimates, as you can see.

I am in hopes of your support for our budgetary requirements in this area both for a supplemental allocation to continue our program in FY 72 and to provide the minimum necessary for FY 73.

Anticipated Expenditures in Reenlistment Bonus FY 72 \$40,000. (Approximately \$19,000 additional required for remainder of FY 72).

As of 1 September 1971 we had enough educational applicants to obligate \$23,539.05 for FY 72. With reduction of flight training participation, we saved \$5,000 that was originally obligated (making for \$18,539.05 obligated).

In October applications which were approved by the Board brought the obligated funds up to \$19,939.05. So by 15 October we have effectively utilized \$20,000 planned for educational benefits. As of 1 November 1971, we have an additional \$3,427 of applications which have not been brought before the education board for approval. Approval of these applications will expand our obligations way beyond our budget.

The educational assistance program, unlike a strictly academic program, has no set cycle for applications each year. Submission of application is dependent first on the completion of military obligation and subsequent reenlistment. Our academic applicants are scheduled during the academic year, but, flight training and vocational skill training can commence at any time the individual finds himself free to start the course at any time during the year.

Therefore, from the above figures, the reenlistment bonus and educational assistance requires a minimum additional supplemental allocation of \$35,000 just to fulfill existing FY 72 requirements as follows:

\$19,000.00 for unfulfilled reenlistment bonuses

\$11,768.00 for unfulfilled and already obligated educational assistance

\$ 4,000.00 for pending educational assistance applications

Not to mention additional educational assistance applicants for the remainder of FY 72 which we estimate at 10 individuals (5 flight, 3 academic, 2 vocational) utilizing \$14,400. Thus, this department requires a total supplemental allocation of approximately \$50,000.

In addition, to the \$30,000 already funded the grant in FY 72, this makes for a total budget of \$80,000. Our total minimum estimated budgetary requirements for FY 72 was \$70,000. However, a number of individuals who would normally have enrolled in the educational assistance program became uncertain about committing themselves to a continuous academic, flight or vocational skill training program due to the money shortage situation. Therefore, our educational assistance enrollment can be considered lower than usual.

FY 72 Requirements

Reenlistment bonus:	\$45,000
Educational Assistance:	\$45,000

This figure as you can see from the FY 71 data is minimal only and allows for no growth in either our retention program (which we anticipate growing at a 30% rate of reenlistment) or in the educational assistance program; which at this budgetary rate will support only approximately 27 individuals, (at least half of whom will be continuing enrollees from FY 72). We have pruned our FY 71 budgetary request for the reenlistment bonus and educational assistance back to the bare minimum estimates, as you can see.

I am in hopes of your support for our budgetary requirements in this area both for a supplemental allocation to continue our program in FY 72 and to provide the minimum necessary for FY 73.

The educational assistance program, unlike a strictly academic program, has no set cycle for applications each year. Submission of application is dependent first on the completion of military obligation and subsequent reenlistment. Our academic applicants are scheduled during the academic year, but, flight training and vocational skill training can commence at any time the individual finds himself free to start the course at any time during the year.

Therefore, from the above figures, the reenlistment bonus and educational assistance requires a minimum additional supplemental allocation of \$39,000 just to fulfill existing FY 72 requirements as follows:

\$19,000.00 for unfulfilled reenlistment bonuses

\$11,768.00 for unfulfilled and already obligated educational assistance

\$4,000.00 for pending educational assistance applications

\$34,768.00 required needs to fulfill existing situation and not including future FY 72 applicants
