
Dear Mr. LaBate:

EXPLANATION:

Attached hereto is a copy of a stipulation for dismissal with prejudice dated May 7, 1971, and a copy of an undated and unsigned release of claims.

As you will note from the attachments, the defendant, State of Alaska, has fully compromised and settled the claim of Jack Lee. The subject claim arose out of an incident which occurred on or about June 24, 1968, wherein an employee of the Department of Fish and Game allegedly caused the crash of an aircraft owned by the plaintiff, Jack Lee.

The amount of \$15,314 was agreed upon between the attorneys in this case as full consideration for settlement and release of all claims by the plaintiff. The aforementioned amount is presently a liability of the State of Alaska and is due and owing the plaintiff.



FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the payment to it of the sum of FIFTEEN THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FOURTEEN DOLLARS (\$15,314.00) and other good and valuable consideration, Jack Lee, d/b/a Lee's of Alaska, has released and discharged, and by these presents does for himself, his successors and assigns, release, acquit and forever discharge the State of Alaska and any and all other persons, firms and corporations of and from any and all actions, causes of action, claims or demands for damages, costs, loss of use, loss of service, expenses, compensation, consequential damage, interest, attorney's fees, property damage and loss, or any other thing both known or unknown whatsoever on account of, or in any way growing out of, resulting from, or to result from an incident that happened on or about June 24, 1968, wherein the said State of Alaska, its agents, contractors or employees and specifically the Department of Fish and Game and its employee, Art Bratlie, allegedly caused the crash of one Piper aircraft No. 36942, Model PA-12 in the vicinity of the Kenai National Moose Range, Alaska. Said incident is the subject matter of a lawsuit entitled Jack Lee d/b/a Lee's of Alaska vs. State of Alaska, now pending in the Superior Court of the State of Alaska, Third Judicial District, No. 70-16150. Counsel for Jack Lee is the firm of McCutcheon & Gruening, Attorneys at Law, Anchorage, Alaska.

Jack Lee, d/b/a Lee's of Alaska, hereby acknowledges and assumes all risk, chance or hazard that all damages and losses arising from said incident may be more extensive than is now known, anticipated or expected. No promise or inducement which is not herein expressed has been made to him, and in executing this release, he does not rely upon any statement or representation made by any person, firm or corporation hereby released, or any agent or other person representing him, concerning the nature and extent of said damages or losses or the legal liability therefor.

Jack Lee, d/b/a Lee's of Alaska understands that this settlement is the compromise of a disputed claim, and that the payment is not to be construed as an admission of liability on the part of the State of Alaska.

The undersigned acknowledges that it is familiar with the decision of the Alaska Supreme Court in the case of Frank P. Young v. State of Alaska and Peter Klavitt Sons Co., Opinion No. 559, dated June 13, 1967, and it is still its true intent and desire herein to fully release all individuals, firms or corporations who could at any future date be possible defendants in any action arising out of this matter as fully as though they were specifically listed and named herein.

This release contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto, and the terms of this release are contractual and not a mere recital.

Jack Lee, c/o/a Lee's of Alaska further states that he has carefully read the foregoing release and knows the contents thereof, and it signs the same as its own free act.

We concur with S.O.S. that it is an obligation which should be paid.



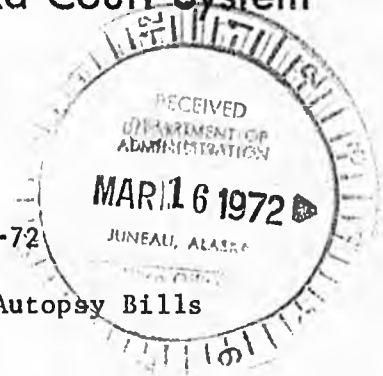



Dear Mr. Chairman:

The answers to the questions you asked in your letter of February 10, 1972 are as follows:

1. The FY 72 budget requested \$4,000 in the program maintenance level for grants, claims and shared revenues. The total appropriation was approximately \$35,000 less than the program maintenance level and within this allocation, your program modification contained \$1,000 for grants and claims. Please explain the utilization of this \$1,000 and the reasoning behind the reduction in the administrative allocation from the requested \$4,000.

Upon receipt of our FY 73 budget we reviewed the funds to take into consideration the decrease and to best utilize the amount granted. The history for grants, claims and shared revenue from which we pay small judgments against the state was as follows:

FY 1968	\$275.36
FY 1969	442.40
FY 1970	610.80
FY 1971	365.50 (as of May 31)

The fiscal 71 amount listed is as of May 31 when the program notifications were prepared. Ultimately for that fiscal period we paid \$19,118 in judgments since we had the funds. In view of this we decreased the judgments to \$1,000 and increased the commodities by \$3,000 to cover library expenditures and office supplies for eight offices.

At present we have \$891.78 in the grants, claims and shared revenues and no other fund has a surplus from which we can request a transfer of funds to pay the \$2,500 judgment pending for this fiscal period.

2. Mr. Gorsuch described the circumstances surrounding the claim in Luchs vs. Paukan and the State. The Committee would like a detailed, written statement on this matter.

Luchs vs. Paukan and the State. In February of 1970, there was a collision between the plaintiff's car, Mr. Luchs', and an Alaska National Guard truck. The collision occurred in the vicinity of Sand Lake and International Airport Roads in Anchorage. The plaintiff sued alleging personal injury and property damage. His automobile, which was valued at \$600 at the time of the accident, was completely totaled. The personal injury claimed by the plaintiff was an injury to his foot. As a result of the injury, he is apparently suffering from a permanent residual arthritic condition. The accident occurred while the Alaska National Guard was on a two week maneuver. The attorney for the plaintiff, Peter Labate, Esq., and the attorney for the state, Sanford M. Gibbs, Esq., Assistant Attorney General, settled the case on July 12, 1971 for a total amount of \$2,500. A special appropriation is necessary because the Alaska National Guard was not covered by liability insurance at the time of the accident. Therefore, the state rather than an insurance carrier must pay the sum for which the case was settled.

3. The Committee would like a letter from your department indicating whether the Alaska National Guard is now covered by liability insurance.




