Attached is a request for a supplemental budget request for FY 74. It is to fund the Alaska Energy Allocation Assistance Office, which was created by Administrative Order 21. A recent agreement with the Federal Region X Energy Office makes the establishing of this division necessary.

Administrative Order 21

Pursuant to authority established through Article 3, Section 23 of the Constitution of Alaska, I hereby direct that there is administratively established the Alaska Energy Allocation Assistance Office within the Office of the Governor.

In conjunction with a recent agreement between the State of Alaska and the Energy Office for Federal Region X, the Alaska Energy Allocation Assistance Office shall employ necessary personnel to work in concert with a federally assigned Deputy Regional Director for fuels allocation.

As a part of the duties assigned this office the Alaska Energy Allocation Assistance Office shall be responsible for the allocation of any state "set aside" of allocable petroleum distillate fuels in conformance with federal regulations.

These duties include, but are not limited to, assisting emergency and hardship allocation requirements to local wholesale purchasers and end users of allocable energy fuels as defined in regulations of the Federal Energy Office adopted January 15, 1974.

It shall also be a requirement of the Alaska Energy Allocation Assistance Office to establish and maintain an informational program through the public media advising Alaskans of the services available through the office and to conduct an informational effort to inform the public regarding energy conservation measures.

You have requested a brief description of the administrative procedures this Department would observe in the implementation of House Bill 505.

The basic purpose of HB 505 is to assist impacted municipalities to maintain essential local public services during the initial period of population growth directly attributable to impact of construction of the trans-Alaska pipeline. The principal administrative duties in the act relate to the municipal grant eligibility computation formula outlined in Section 4(a). According to this formula, an impacted municipality may qualify, over the term of the act, for a measure of financial assistance proportionate to its actual population growth and its established level of locally-provided services.

Specifically, the formula provides that, for each new resident in excess of the four percent impact threshold set by Section 2, the impacted municipality will be eligible for grant assistance equal to its most recent year's per capita general fund expenditures.

Grant application is at the initiative of the municipality, which would be required to submit its estimated population and a statement of the planned uses of the requested grant funds. We expect that the Department would prepare standard application forms for uniformity of administration. However, we also feel that HB 505, as introduced, provides legislative guidelines adequate to obviate adoption of administrative regulations.

For purposes of "costing out" HB 505, the Department has already assembled the basic information - current and projected municipal population estimates and relevant municipal fiscal data - needed

to implement the act. Therefore, we believe we will be able to review and respond to prepayment applications in a timely manner. Processing of quarterly grant applications beyond the prepayment entitlement will also require departmental review of municipal estimates of actual population growth and review of the municipal financial report (as per Section 7(a)) on the status of previous grants under the act, to insure that grant funds have been or are being expended in compliance with the purposes of the act.


After departmental review of grant applications, its recommendations for grant action will be submitted through the Office of the Governor to the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee for its approval of disbursements of grant funds. At the direction of the Governor and with the approval of the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee, disbursements will be made by the Department.

Finally, HB 505 requires that municipal administration of impact assistance grants observe the statutory provisions specified in AS 29.48.220 for annual financial reports to the Department, with the additional requirement that expenditure of impact grant funds be separately identified and accounted for. Again, the Department will review the financial reports for legal compliance.

We anticipate the services of one Local Government Specialist will be necessary to perform the tasks related to the administration of this municipal assistance program and provide technical assistance to those municipalities receiving assistance under this program and affected by pipeline construction activity.

The Department of Revenue has raised the question of "short funding" the Treasury Management unit by requested amounts of Teachers and Public Employees Retirement System funds. These amounts total \$130,000 and have been improperly identified in the General Appropriations Act as Interagency Receipts.

A bill amending the General Appropriations Act by cancelling \$130,000 Interagency Receipts funding of the General Government category operating budget and substituting amounts of \$64,000 T.R.S. and \$66,000 P.E.R.S. funds would solve the fiscal crisis for the Department of Revenue.

Recently, the Legislature's budget has come under sharp criticism as an essentially "confusing" and "inaccurate" document. Regarding this specific funding error, I submit the following:

- (1) The confusion in funding began with Treasury's preparation of the budget. (See enclosed Form 4-A from Governor's Budget workbooks.) The T.R.S. and P.E.R.S. funds are listed twice, once for each fund and again as a sub-total "other". In the Governor's Budget column, the Governor appears to have deleted T.R.S. and P.E.R.S. funding. From there we picked the funding up as Interagency since we do not appropriate from simply "other".
- (2) The enclosed letter from the Governor covered an extensive list of "comments" regarding the Senate version of the General Appropriations Bill and was used by the Free Conference Committee on the budget during its entire deliberations. The section of the letter dealing with General Government contained detailed comments on 15 BRU's ranging from the Governor's Office to Youth in Government. But nowhere did it mention Treasury Management which is funded in the Senate bill exactly as it is in the FCC version.

As we have discussed informally, Ch. 91, SLA 1973 (Appropriation Act) in appropriating \$655,200 to Treasury Management in the Department of Revenue utilized \$130,000 of Inter-agency funds. The Free Conference Report (Blue covered book) for General Government on page 49 indicates that they wanted \$130,000 of Other revenue to be appropriated (specifically 64,000 of Teachers Retirement System funds and 66,000 of Public Employee Retirement System funds).

It would appear that this conflict between the actual law and the intent documents was caused by a clerical transposition in naming which funds should have been appropriated. Needless to say it is an impossibility for the agency to receive inter-agency funds to support their appropriation, resulting in an appropriation shortage of \$130,000.

Accordingly we would appreciate your bringing this matter to the attention of the Budget and Audit Committee, and the House and Senate Finance Committees next session in hopes that one or the other will initiate corrective legislation.
