




Dear Representative Malone:

I would like to bring to your attention two bills presently in House Finance, House Bill (496) and House Bill (497). Passage of these bills will enable the State of Alaska to implement any wage contracts negotiated with the Tri-Trades Council, the Confidential Unit, and the Marine Transportation unions. We are presently negotiating with the Tri-Trades Council and the Confidential Unit for their 1975 wage contracts. It does not seem likely that we will have concluded our negotiations with these two groups by the time the legislature adjourns. The Marine Transportation unions' contracts expire June 30, 1975 and we will begin negotiations with those unions very shortly. Should the legislature not pass these two bills, our options would be as follows:

1. Not grant any pay raises negotiated until the legislature meet in 1976 and passes the supplemental appropriation for the wage increases.
2. Call the legislature into a special session in order to pass an appropriation to implement the contracts. Obviously, this would not be a desirable option although we would have much pressure from the members of the bargaining groups to seek this alternative.

The Pelican High School is a modularized and panelized wood and steel frame structure of approximately 9,200 square feet on a treated wood piling foundation. Construction was begun in June 1974 with the award of the contract for the foundation. The contract for the school building was awarded in February, 1975. Construction is in progress.

Funding was provided by two state grants totaling \$390,000, local funds and material contribution.

The current budget is as follows:

Re: Pelican High School

Item 1, classroom ceiling would provide a suspended acoustical ceiling in the classroom and extend the duct work to provide better ventilation distribution. Currently the roof structure and foil backed insulation are exposed in the classroom.

Item 2, flooring, would replace vinyl asbestos tile with a multi-use sport tread which would provide greater resiliency and traction.

Item 3, casework, provides approximately 64 lineal feet of cabinets and counters for storage, work and display surfaces. No casework is included in the existing contract. Also included is plumbing for science tables.

Item 4, shelving, would provide 100 ft. of 6'-0" high shelving that would also serve as classroom area dividers. The classroom is now one large area, 56' x 56', and is totally open.

Item 5, chalk and tackboards would supply 48 lineal feet of chalkboard and 44 lineal feet of tackboard to serve 4 program areas. None is currently provided.

Item 6 would provide the minimum to play a full court game of basketball. No athletic equipment is in the current contract.

Item 7, seating, would allow student and community seating at sporting and other school and local events held in the multi-purpose room. Without seating the only alternative will be the floor.

Item 8, student lockers, would provide 30 steel lockers for students' books and coats, and 20 steel lockers for gym clothes. No student or gym lockers are included in the current contract.

Every economy was employed in the construction of this facility. Construction was phased, design fast-tracked, materials value engineered and intensive and multiply use of space employed.

The construction costs under the basic bid including the foundation come to \$39.40 per square foot. If all of the deleted items are added the cost is only \$46.41 per square foot. The total figure \$46.41/s.f. is within \$0.29 of the cost of the Kake School bid in 1971, \$5.70 less than the Tanana School Addition bid in 1970, and \$15.00 less than current estimates of wood frame school construction in Southeast Alaska.
