A review of Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 605, by Mr. Eric E. Wohlforth, State Bond Counsel has disclosed the necessity for further amendatory language for the proposed legislation.

I am enclosing a copy of a letter dated March 15, 1976 and a copy of a proposed Senate Finance Committee Substitute for CS for House Bill No. 605, as prepared by Mr. Wohlforth. The amendatory language will not weaken the intent of the original bill but will prevent taxation of interest of the obligations of certain Alaskan non-profit corporations such as the Anchorage Building Corporation and the University of Alaska Heating Corporation who issued tax exempt bonds pursuant to specific IRS ruling.

The information from Mr. Wohlforth was hand delivered at an earlier date to the Senate Community and Regional Affairs Committee at the time such Committee was considering CS for House Bill No. 605, but was not acted upon.

SUBJECT: House Bill 605

This bill provides that the interest paid on obligations of the State of Alaska or a political sub-division thereof will be the only municipal interest that will be granted tax exempt status under the Alaska Statutes. The effect on the Treasury, as a result of this proposed legislation, would be minimal. It is anticipated that we would receive an additional \$50,000 in revenue with no related increase in costs.

The major benefit of this kind of legislation would be to encourage Alaskan's to invest in Alaska bonds. Also, please note that the proposed bill does not provide an effective date, which is very necessary. I would suggest an effective date of January 1, 1976.

This same provision is also included in Senate Bill 510, which is being proposed by the Governor to make this and several other minor changes in the Alaska law.







Attached is the draft bill we have prepared per your request transmitted by your committee secretary.

The precise format you requested, however, could not be adhered to. As we see it, because port facility development projects, under AS 30.15, require a local match of 10 or 20 per cent depending on the population of the community to which the grant is made, the projects must be set out separately from those for small boat harbors which do not require any local contribution/match under AS 35.15. Flood control projects also involve an outright grant to the community and require no match.

Moreover, AS 24.30.037 requires the identification of these projects in terms of a brief description of the project, location and dollar amount portion of the total. Lumping the port facility development and small boat harbor projects together would, in our judgment, be in violation of that statute, however desirable the flexibility that might be achieved by so drafting the bill. Also, we think the provisions of sec. 5 of the bill, providing for a "contingency/cost overrun" fund also would be violative of AS 24.30.037 (although I see no problem with it, legally, so long as its purpose is explicitly identified). We understand that the state's bond counsel has communicated his objections to that kind of language.

We hope this draft will meet with your approval, if not and if we can be of further assistance, please contact us.



Dear Representative Malone:

In compliance with your request to Don Statter, Director of the Division of Water and Harbors, I am enclosing a tabulation of the status of projects to be funded from the 1972 \$10 million Small Boat Harbor bond program.

The amount shown in the third column under "RECOMMENDED REALLOCATION OF FUNDS NEEDED TO ASSURE FEDERAL PARTICIPATION" represents the minimum funding required to satisfy Federal criteria for non-Federal cost participation. This generally includes basin dredging and/or costs in excess of the Federal monetary limitation for general navigation facilities. In most cases, the amounts listed are insufficient to complete the inner harbor improvements such as floats, docks, grids, etc. The amounts listed in the next to last column under "AMOUNT NEEDED TO COMPLETE PROJECTS" represents the dollar amount required to complete the inner harbor improvements based on 1976 estimates.

Please let me know if I can be of further assistance.

- Anchorage - Construction of Phase III, Terminal III, Anchorage Port Facility.

- Juneau - Phase II Port Development includes construction of an extension to the existing Alaska Steam and Foss dock properties, and possible acquisition of waterfront properties between Southeast Skyways and the subport area. Dredging of the undeveloped area in the Douglas Small Boat Harbor and installation of additional mooring facilities is also contemplated.

- Ketchikan - Future port developments will consist of an extension of the Cold Storage Wharf across the seaward face of the Tongass Trading Company property. It is anticipated that half of the available funding will be used for the above and half for construction of mooring facilities at Bar Point Harbor in conjunction with the proposed Corps of Engineer's harbor expansion project.

- Whittier - First phase construction of a new small boat harbor at Shotgwa Cove.

- Cold Bay - Construct new dock facility to provide logistics support and fueling capability to the Cold Bay Airport. Existing dock is beyond repair.

- Cordova - Corps of Engineer's harbor expansion project currently under investigation. Non-Federal cost (basin dredging and inner harbor improvements) must be borne by the State and the City of Cordova.

- Petersburg - Construct a barge landing, tourist facilities and information area, and small boat harbor facilities at the site of the new Petersburg Port Facility.

- Seward - Phase II reconstruction and expansion of the Fourth Avenue dock complex (old railroad dock).

- Haines - A million dollar Federal harbor project is expected to be under construction in 1976. Existing bond funds are not sufficient to underwrite excess Federal cost and installation of inner harbor improvements. The City and State are jointly negotiating for acquisition of the military Dry Cargo Dock in Lutak Inlet. Existing funding sources are not adequate to meet the expected purchase price.

- Kodiak - A 7 million dollar Federal harbor project is expected to be underway in FY 78. Additional funds are needed for installation of inner harbor improvements.
- Sitka - The recent extension of the Sitka Airport runway to the south has created a protected area suitable for construction of small boat harbor facilities. Present harbor facilities in Sitka are at maximum capacity.
- Wrangell - Construct inner harbor improvements in the new Wrangell Showmaker Bay small boat harbor.
- Bethel - The proposed Phase II project will include construction of a berthing area in Browns Slough to accommodate the smaller shallow draft barges used to transfer materials and supplies to up-river villages. Also included would be construction of basic warehouse facilities.
- Skagway - Expansion of the existing Skagway Small Boat Harbor is proposed in preparation for the projected impact resulting from the opening of the Carcross Highway.
- Valdez - Expansion of mooring facilities in the undeveloped portion of the existing small boat harbor.
- Homer - Construct an addition to the small boat harbor dock to accommodate increased handling of fishery products.
- Kake - Construction of a concrete floating breakwater to provide protection to the existing small boat harbor facility at Portage Cove.
- Kenai - Potential expansion and improvement to the existing small boat facility. Project would include bulkheading, fill and acquisition of boat handling and storage equipment.
- King Cove - Construction of additional harbor facilities in the new King Cove small boat harbor.
- Naknek - City has indicated a desire for some type of public dock or bulkhead facility for for loading and unloading freight and fishery products.
- Port Lyons - A Corps of Engineer's small boat harbor study is nearing completion with indications of a favorable project. Funding will be required for the construction of inner harbor improvements.

- Seldovia - Dredging of additional harbor area to accommodate potential increased usage due to expected OCS activity.
- Unalaska - Additional funding is required to supplement existing allocations from 1974 bonds in order to develop a viable port project.
- Yakutat - City has indicated a desire to expand and improve the existing City dock and cold storage facility.
- Other - For other unspecified projects throughout the State to be determined by the Commissioner of Public Works in accordance with the provisions of AS 30.15 and 35.10.
