In accordance with AS 24.30.060(b) and the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legislature, I am transmitting a bill for a supplemental appropriation to fund necessary expenditures for initial review of the gas pipeline proposals. This review of the proposals submitted by the competing gas companies will be conducted primarily to insure that consideration is given to Alaska's unique environment. The staff of the Office of the Pipeline Coordinator will provide technical support to other state agencies involved in determining the routing of the gas line and conditions of the right-of-way lease. PROPOSAL IS DESIGNED TO:

1. Correct serious shortcomings in eligibility standards now in existing law.
2. Provide inclusion of the Alaska Naval Militia in the program which was inadvertently omitted in passage of original law in 1973. Currently the Alaska Naval Militia has no impact on the Department of Military Affairs Program.
3. Current law allows credit for past Alaska Guard service only if the member was an active member of the Alaska Guard on 1 Jan 73. When a person joins after that date, his past service (no matter how lengthy) is not creditable for retirement plan purposes. The proposal corrects this discrepancy by allowing credit for all past service in the Alaska National Guard/Naval Militia.
4. Current law, as interpreted by the Attorney General, provides that the member must have completed 20 years total service with the Alaska National Guard only. This does not give any consideration to the past service of the individual in other components. This proposal corrects this inequity by allowing a member to be eligible for retirement credit upon completion of 20 years TOTAL service in the regular and reserve components combined. But payment by the State of Alaska remains only for the service in the Alaska National Guard/Naval Militia and upon reaching age 55 as established in current law.
5. This proposal provides that the member may be separate from the service after 20 satisfactory years of total service at any age with payment of benefits to begin at age 55 (or later if deferred) and then only for the same number of months that the member was active in the Alaska National Guard/Naval Militia.
6. It is anticipated that this proposal will require an extra \$46,400 in FY 77 to support. Current program request is for \$40,000 in FY 77.

4. Current law, as interpreted by the Attorney General, provides that the member must have completed 20 years total service with the Alaska National Guard only. This does not give any consideration to the past service of the individual in other components. This proposal corrects this inequity by allowing a member to be eligible for retirement credit upon completion of 20 years TOTAL service in the regular and reserve components combined. But payment by the State of Alaska remains only for the service in the Alaska National Guard/Naval Militia and upon reaching age 55 as established in current law.
5. Current law, as interpreted by the Attorney General, provides that the member MUST be in an active status at age 55 in order to be eligible for receipt of benefits, unless discharged earlier for failure to meet federal eligibility standards. This proposal provides that the member may be separate from the service after 20 satisfactory years of total service at any age with payment of benefits to begin at age 55 (or later if deferred) and then only for the same number of months that the member was active in the Alaska National Guard/Naval Militia.
6. It is anticipated that this proposal will require an extra \$46,400 in FY 77 to support. Current program request is for \$40,000 in FY 77.
