The Department of Public Works requests your approval to increase the allocations for the ten small boat harbor projects specifically listed in the \$10,000,000 Chapter 201, SLA 1972 Small Boat Harbor Bond Authorization. In addition the Department requests an initial allocation of funds for the Ketchikan and Kasilof projects from the same 1972 Bond Authorization. The increases in allocations and requested initial allocations total \$3,600,000 which is the amount listed in the bond project list under "Other Harbor Projects".

The increases in allocations to the existing ten projects are due to a variety of reasons but generally result from the rapid inflation of estimated construction costs. Federal funds to construct the outer breakwaters have generally been received at a slower rate than originally anticipated. The State funding participation is generally on the inner harbor portion of the projects and can only be expended when the construction of the outer protection is sufficiently in progress to insure protection.


Approval of the increased allocations will result in a more realistic estimated construction cost and will lessen the possibility of misinterpreting the availability of funds for other projects.

Several bills were introduced last session relating to the composition of the Board of Fish and Game. The Bill numbers and their status are as follows:

HB 117 - Would create two seven member boards, one for fish and one for game. The Bill is presently in House Resources.

SB 131 - Would create two seven member boards, one for fish and one for game. This is essentially the same as HB 117 with a few changes. The Bill was passed and became law in 1975. (206 SLA 75)

HB 470 - Would increase the membership of Board of Fish and Game from 12 to 13 members. This Bill is presently in House Finance.

SB 193 - Would provide for a "section 26" board similar to the board of education. The seven member Board would be responsible for hiring and firing the Commissioner of Fish and Game and would take a more active administrative role. The Bill is in Senate Resources.

Under the present law members of either the Board of Fisheries or Board of Game "shall be residents of the State and shall be appointed without regard to political affiliation or geographical location of residence."

It is doubtful whether it would be legal to elect the members of the board of fisheries or game. This conclusion is based on the following facts:

- (1) The Alaska Constitution provides that "each principle department shall be under the supervision of the governor."

(Section 24, Article III, Alaska State Constitution). Thus, even though Section 26 does not apply to the present Board of Fisheries or Game, it is clear that the constitution intended the executive power of government to be vested in the governor.

- (2) From an examination of the proceedings of the Alaska constitutional convention it would appear that the idea of an elected rule making board within the executive branch was never considered. Nevertheless, it is very clear that the majority of delegates to the constitutional convention wanted only two elected officials in the executive branch of State government. There were repeated amendments to create more elected offices. All were defeated.
- (3) Of the 88 commissions, advisory councils, Boards and public corporations in the executive branch, only one rule making board provides for an electoral procedure in selecting members. This is the Public Employees Retirement Board. Three members are appointed by the governor and two members are elected by members of the retirement system.

Nevertheless, while it does not appear feasible to elect members to the Board of Fisheries or Board of Game from electoral districts, there is ample precedent for requiring the governor to make selections to the Boards from either certain occupational group or geographical areas.

The attached Draft Bill would require that members to the Boards of Fisheries or Game be selected according to major hunting and fishing areas.
