



The Division of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities utilizes the service of licensed physicians as the medical and psychiatric staff and medical superintendent at the Alaska Psychiatric Institute, the regional psychiatrist for Northern and Southeastern regions, and the Director of the Division. The total compliment is 10 licensed physicians funded in three BRU's:

Alaska Psychiatric Institute--7, State Operated Mental Health Centers--2,
Administration--1

Some mental health medical staff are in a contract relationship and others are in the classified service as covered state employees. House Bill 887 will place all 10 physicians in the exempt personal service as employees of the state and will eliminate the use of contracts for these full time services.

During Fiscal Year 1977 under House Bill 887, the personal service cost for these 10 positions is projected at 698.7. This will support existing positions at the approved salary rates required to be competitive for these specialized services and will fund the conversion of the present contract staff to full time employees. The cost for Fiscal Year 1977 reflects the 698.7 personal cost being reduced by the 401.3 contract funding.

A 137.8 difference between budgeted Fiscal Year 1977 and projected under House Bill 887 reflects the payment of "benefits" required for all employees as well as the hourly rate increase necessary to attract applicants as employees. This 137.8 is broken down as:



It is the intent of the House Finance Committee in recommending the passage of CSHB 887 that the State place itself in a position where it is able to compete with the private sector for the services of psychiatrists, petroleum geologists, and petroleum engineers. At the present time the Division of Mental Health is finding it difficult to retain competent psychiatrists because of the disparity between the current state salary levels and the average income of a psychiatrist in private practice. This is also true of the petroleum geologists and engineers within the Department of Natural Resources, where several authorized positions remain vacant in spite of intensive efforts to recruit qualified persons. The Committee believes these services are too vital to the public interest to allow the present situation to continue.

In March 1975 the Division was instructed to terminate these full-time personal services contracts and hire medical personnel as full-time employees. Salaries were offered which corresponded to the existing salary ranges plus benefits plus compensations for 24 hour coverage of the Alaska Psychiatric Institute.

The FY 77 cost of this package is projected at \$698.7., \$560.9 of this funding is presently available in existing 100 and 300 codes within the Division of Mental Health. This approach to hiring medical staff (psychiatrists) will require \$137.8 GF additional in the 100 code of the Alaska Psychiatric Institute. Although this additional 137.8 GF is not directly attributable to the passage of H.S. 887 it does represent a current cost over and above our budgeted request for FY 77. It is projected that this can be absorbed under the requested V & T.

As of this date the staff psychiatrists providing direct care by contract have thus far declined full-time employment. Only the Director and Supt. of the Division's psychiatric staff have indicated a willingness to accept employment. Although the Division believes that our current salary ranges are reasonable, they apparently are not competitive when one considers the low status, long hours and excellent salaries afforded other highly trained professionals within the State. In addition the opportunities available through part-time contracts and a private practice where the established local rate is \$50.00-\$70.00 an hour adversely affects our ability to employ a full time competent medical staff. At the present time it is impossible to predict the outcome of these negotiations, however, the Division predicts that a 10 - 15% across the board increase may be necessary to achieve stability with this group.
