Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 744, an Act providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$31,152,600 for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing and remodeling correctional facilities was referred by the Senate Finance Committee to the Senate Rules Committee on April 30, 1976.

The State's Bond Counsel, Mr. C. Richard Walker of Orrick, Herrington, Rowley & Sutcliffe has advised that general obligation bonds of the State and nearly all other state and local government bonds are issued in the denomination of \$5,000, the standard unit.

Using Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 744 as an example, according to Mr. Walker, this would result in issuing less than the total amount of bonds or in issuing one odd bond in denomination of \$2,600 along with 6,030 bonds in the usual denomination of \$5,000.

Issuing a bond in an odd denomination requires extra time, expense and confusion in connection with the preparation of the resolution, notice of sale, official statement and other documents relating to the bonds, the printing of the one odd bond with all of its special coupons, and all of the selling, accounting, paying and other activities with relation to the bonds.

On the other hand, it would be highly unusual to find an estimate of expenditures, used in connection with determining the principal amount of a thirty-one million dollar bond issue, that was within \$5,000 of being a perfectly precise estimate. Consequently, it is respectfully recommended that the principal amount of the proposed bond issue be

rounded off to the nearest \$5,000 by making the principal amount in the proposed bill to read either \$31,155,000 or \$31,150,000 and make an upward or downward adjustment in one of the projects enumerated to correspond.



Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 744, an Act providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$31,152,600 for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing and remodeling correctional facilities was referred by the Senate Finance Committee to the Senate Rules Committee on April 30, 1976.

The State's Bond Counsel, Mr. C. Richard Walker of Orrick, Herrington, Rowley & Sutcliffe has advised that general obligation bonds of the State and nearly all other state and local government bonds are issued in the denomination of \$5,000, the standard unit.

Using Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 744 as an example, according to Mr. Walker, this would result in issuing less than the total amount of bonds or in issuing one odd bond in denomination of \$2,600 along with 6,030 bonds in the usual denomination of \$5,000.

Issuing a bond in an odd denomination requires extra time, expense and confusion in connection with the preparation of the resolution, notice of sale, official statement and other documents relating to the bonds, the printing of the one odd bond with all of its special coupons, and all of the selling, accounting, paying and other activities with relation to the bonds.

On the other hand, it would be highly unusual to find an estimate of expenditures, used in connection with determining the principal amount of a thirty-one million dollar bond issue, that was within \$5,000 of being a perfectly precise estimate. Consequently, it is respectfully recommended that the principal amount of the proposed bond issue be

rounded off to the nearest \$5,000 by making the principal amount in the proposed bill to read either \$31,155,000 or \$31,150,000 and make an upward or downward adjustment in one of the projects enumerated to correspond.
