There currently exist an extremely hazardous flying condition at the Naknek Airport. At times it is necessary for float planes using Nornek Lake to cross the east-west runway.

You are aware that the surface of Nornek Lake is located several feet below the runway and due to this condition there exist a blind spot where neither float planes taking off from Nornek Lake or planes using the east-west runway can see each other. Also Nornek Lake is rather short for proper take off.

To eliminate these problems the land between the west end of Nornek Lake and the east end of another pond should be dredged and a small dam constructed at the lower end of the pond to prevent the water level in Nornek Lake from dropping.

By lengthening take off distance will in itself help reduce existing hazardous conditions as air taxi operations, charter service operations, hunting and fishing guides and private planes make extensive use of Nornek Lake.





This road when completed will have considerable economic impact upon the community.

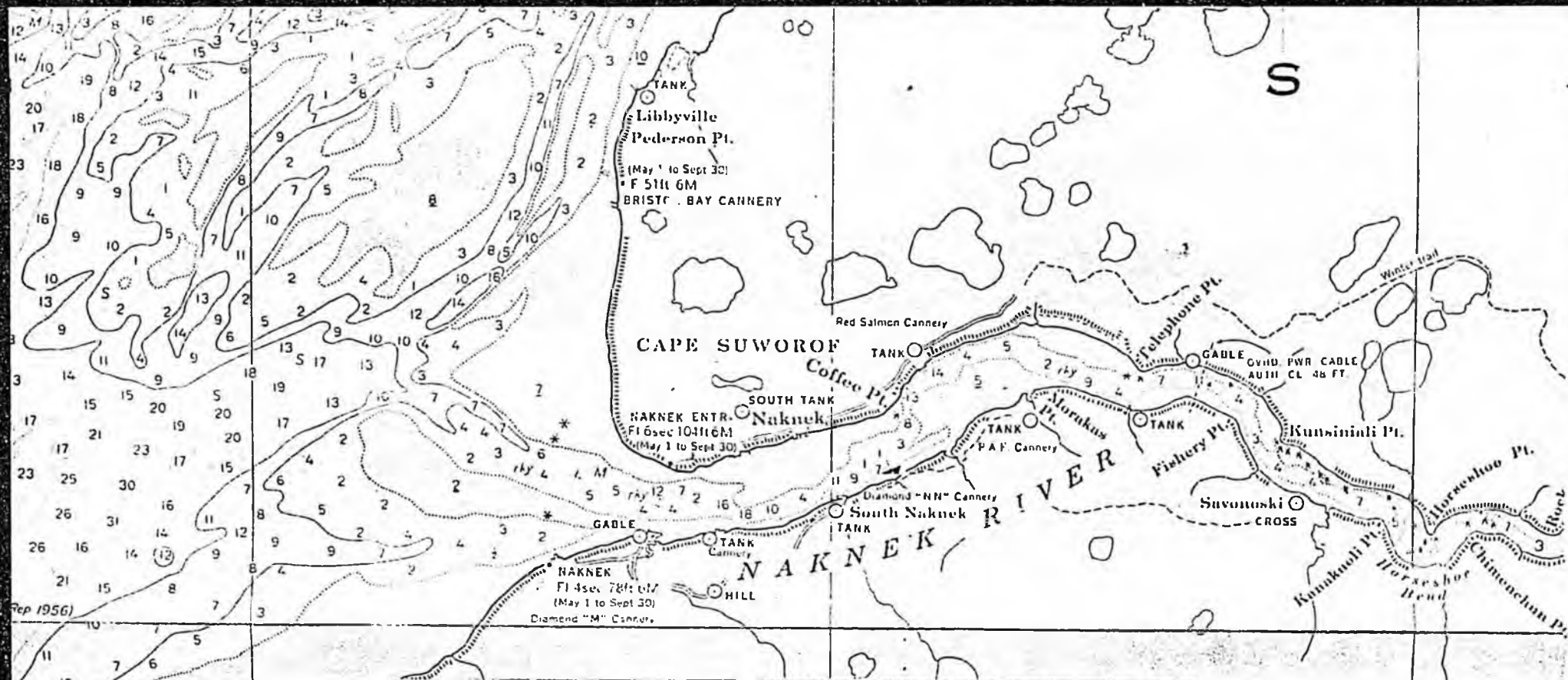

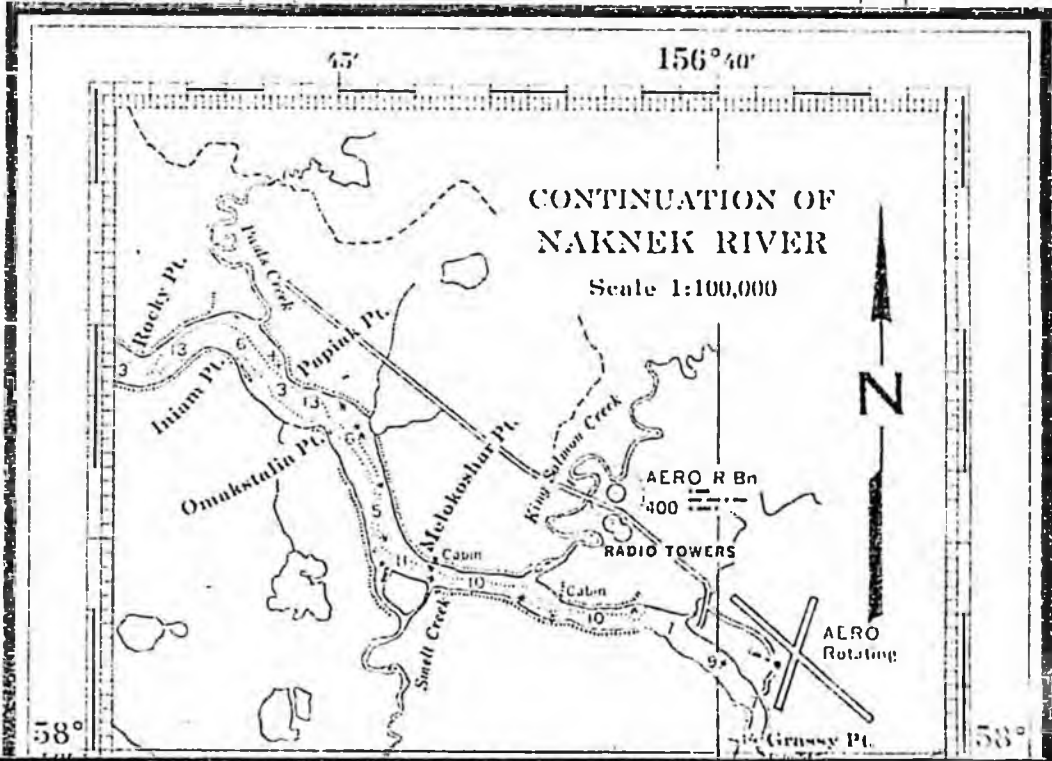

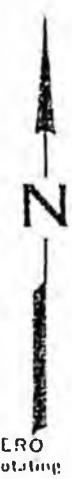
SOUNDINGS IN FEET

NAKNEK-KING RIVERS




