



A supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$192,000 is requested for the Division of Minerals and Energy Management for the purpose of acquisition of seismic data for the establishment of the approximate risk value of the Beaufort Sea lease area in order to determine the optimum cost to benefit leasing method.

Establishment of the level of royalty and other pre-leasing decisions would be made on the basis of the results of the analysis of the data. The result of the analysis would also be used to aid in determining tract or low bid rejection criteria after the lease or sale.

If the lease sale is to occur within 15 months, it is imperative that we obtain seismic data as soon as possible. The State now has, with its new Division of Minerals and Energy Management, the technical staff to manage the acquisition, reduction and interpretation of the data and then perform the economic evaluation of the area. It will take one year at minimum to carry out the program. Therefore, the sooner we initiate the required lease study, the sooner the State will be able to have the lease sale.

Unfortunately, the first area of evaluation is also one of the highest data acquisition cost areas in the State. Even the old data is nearly as costly as new industry group seismic surveys. From the results of the Department of Natural Resources Leasing Study (copy enclosed) the investment necessary to obtain the seismic data is more than worthwhile. Acquisition of data by the State may be a very lucrative investment because the return in higher bids could be from 20 to 45 times the cost of data acquisition.

In order to obtain the first of the State's seismic data there was originally \$27,000 budgeted for this fiscal year (1977) and \$110,000 budgeted for the next fiscal year. These monies were intended to initiate a regional determination of areas in which more detailed resource investigation would be carried out. In fact, the budgeted money will be used as it was originally designated and the \$192,000 of supplemental funds that are being requested will be used to evaluate the resource potential of the State's Beaufort Sea submerged lands.

Additional funds may be needed at a later date in order to complete the structural investigation and thereby build a final geological model. If additional funds are requested, at that time a sufficient amount of knowledge will have been gained from the first data purchased to justify further expenditures.

Sec. 44.33.035. POWERS. SUBJECT: HOUSE BILL 365

The Senate Finance Committee may wish to incorporate the substance of HB 365, which would make loans available to adult foster homes, group homes, and institutions to meet licensing standards, into the existing statutes for the child care facility revolving loan fund, AS 44.33.240-275. The language establishing the two funds is parallel except for a certificate of need provision for child care facilities.

The child care facility revolving loan fund currently has \$40,000 cash available for loans, having loaned out only \$10,000 since its creation in 1976. Moreover, it can make loans totaling up to \$350,000 because the law requires the Department of Revenue to purchase loans offered from the fund up to a total of \$300,000.

**BACKGROUND:** The Ninth Legislature commissioned a study of dependent-adult health facilities. The results of the study found a serious need, because of the unsafe and sometimes unsanitary conditions in these private facilities, for the State to license the 52 facilities around the State. Last year, the legislature passed such a licensure law unanimously.

**INTENT:** During committee deliberations on the licensure bill last session, it became clear that if standards were imposed on these facilities - and most of the facilities are only marginally profitable - a number of them might be forced to shut down as they would be unable to meet the financial requirements mandated to upgrade the facility. Hence, HB 365 and 366 were introduced to ease this burden. The revolving loan program is patterned after the existing Child Care Facility Revolving Loan Fund.

**PROVISIONS:** The bills provide for:

- the creation of a Revolving Loan Fund;
- no loan to be made unless applicant cannot obtain funding from private institution;
- maximum loan is \$20,000;
- 6% interest; 10-year term;

- if facility closes, loan is due on date of closure.
- Commissioner of Revenue may purchase up to \$300,000 in mortgages and notes.
- Capitalization of fund is \$300,000

COMMENTS: There has been no opposition from the Department of Revenue to this legislation. The Director of Business Loans has stated no new positions will be needed to administer this program.

The licensure legislation passed the House and Senate unanimously last year. HB 365 and 366 passed the House this year with only two dissenting votes.
