





Date: February 8, 1978

BACKGROUND: The Ninth Legislature commissioned a study of dependent-adult health facilities. The results of the study found a serious need, because of the unsafe and sometimes unsanitary conditions in these private facilities, for the State to license the 52 facilities around the State. Last year, the legislature passed such a licensure law unanimously.

INTENT: During committee deliberations on the licensure bill last session, it became clear that if standards were imposed on these facilities - and most of the facilities are only marginally profitable - a number of them might be forced to shut down as they would be unable to meet the financial requirements mandated to upgrade the facility. Hence, HB 365 and 366 were introduced to ease this burden. The revolving loan program is patterned after the existing Child Care Facility Revolving Loan Fund.

PROVISIONS: The bills provide for:

- the creation of a Revolving Loan Fund;
- no loan to be made unless applicant cannot obtain funding from private institution;
- maximum loan is \$20,000;
- 6% interest; 10-year term;

- if facility closes, loan is due on date of closure.
- Commissioner of Revenue may purchase up to \$300,000 in mortgages and notes.
- Capitalization of fund is \$300,000

COMMENTS: There has been no opposition from the Department of Revenue to this legislation. The Director of Business Loans has stated no new positions will be needed to administer this program.

The licensure legislation passed the House and Senate unanimously last year. HB 365 and 366 passed the House this year with only two dissenting votes.







Loan Application

The City of Sitka is requesting a loan in the amount of \$427,500 which represents 95% of the funds required for the evaluation and pre-construction studies for the Green Lake hydroelectric project. It is anticipated the project can be developed to deliver 15,000 KW to the load center during periods of peak load and will be capable of an output of 52,000,000 KWh of firm energy, or a plant factor of approximately 40% based on available water.

Green Lake is located approximately 12 miles from Sitka and about 7 miles from Blue Lake at the end of Silver Bay. The lake is a part of the Vodopad River and has formed about 1,500 feet upstream of the mouth. The existing outlet of the lake is a relatively narrow gorge which controls the existing lake level at about elevation 230.

It is anticipated that raising the lake level to elevation 420, by means of a concrete arch dam at the present outlet, will provide sufficient reservoir storage for control of the runoff and adequate head to develop economic power from the site. The power conduit is tentatively proposed as a short tunnel 300 feet which would also serve for river diversion during construction. A 78-inch diameter steel penstock approximately 1,300 feet long would be connected to the downstream portal of the tunnel. A surface powerhouse will be constructed at ground level near Silver Bay. It is anticipated that two horizontally-mounted Francis reaction turbines would be installed, each delivering about 11,500 hp at best gate, under average net head, and connected by a horizontal shaft to a generator rated at 9,300 KVA with about a 90% power factor (8,300 KW). It is estimated that, including generator, transformer, and transmission losses, each unit will deliver 7,500 KW to the load center at peak load conditions, at best gate operation of the turbines, under winter reservoir levels.

The existing facilities in Sitka include:

1. The Blue Lake Hydroelectric Project which consists of two Francis turbines, each rated at 3,750 KVA. These two units can be safely operated to produce a dependable capacity of 7,000 KW during the winter peak period and approximately 5,600 KW during the summer months due to the reservoir level.
2. Unit #1 - Fairbanks-Morse diesel rated at 375 KVA, dependable capacity is 300 KW.
3. Unit #2 - Enterprise diesel rated at 625 KVA, dependable capacity is 500 KW.

4. Unit #3 - GMC diesel rated at 375 KVA, dependable capacity is 300 KW.
5. Unit #4 - Fairbanks-Morse diesel rated at 2,500 KVA, dependable capacity is 2,000 KW.

The diesel units have a combined dependable capacity of 3,100 KW.

In addition to these units operated by the city, Alaska Lumber and Pulp Company operates a stream generation plant with a capacity of 5,000 KVA. The maximum capacity available to the city is 2,500 KW. The city and Alaska Lumber and Pulp have an agreement where power is exchanged being repayable in kind on a monthly basis.

The maximum capacity of the City of Sitka system is 10,000 KW with up to an additional 2,500 KW from Alaska Lumber and Pulp. The minimum reserve requirement is 3,500 KW. The maximum power available to the City of Sitka, less reserve, is 9,100 KW.

The peak load in 1974 was 5,895 KW,
1975 was 7,114 KW,
estimate 1976 is 8,297 KW,
" 1979 is 9,678 KW.

Using these figures, additional sources of power will be required by 1979. The Green Lake facility will also relieve the city of its dependence on Alaska Lumber and Pulp.

The current rate in Sitka is 3.8¢ per KW. This is one of the lowest rates in the state. The rate will increase in an amount sufficient to cover debt servicing of the new facility. This rate cannot be determined until the complete project costs are known.

The project appears to be feasible and the Sitka Utilities appear to be well run.

2. Interest payments of ^{25,000}\$25,650 to be due one year from the date of loan closing and each year thereafter until the loan is repaid in full.
3. A resolution from the City and Borough of Sitka authorizing this loan.

It should be noted that the City of Sitka has already invested over \$50,000 cash in this project. These funds paid for the initial report by Beck & Associates (\$25,000) and a preliminary geological survey (\$25,000). Other municipalities are going to want their 5% to be past investments and we should decide now if we're going to allow it, and if so it should apply here.


Dear Representative Cowper:

CSHB 373 would amend the state income tax statute by allowing taxpayers a deduction for the costs of child adoption. The amount of the deduction would be limited to \$3,000. The Department of Revenue supports this bill as providing a reasonable tax deduction which would help to defray the costs of adoption.

We estimate that the annual revenue effect would be approximately \$29,000. In estimating the costs of adoption which would be available for the tax deduction we have used information supplied by the Department of Health and Social Services. From that information it is estimated that the number of adoptions in the current year will be approximately 750. Of that total, approximately 70 percent are either step-parent adoptions or adoptions placed through the Department of Health and Social Services. For these adoptions the costs are relatively low and it is estimated that the average cost is about \$250 per adoption. The remainder of adoptions are made through private agencies and the costs could range from \$500 to \$4,000 depending upon the agency used.

There would not be any added fiscal impact on the department.



SUBJECT: House Bill No. 373

This bill would provide that a taxpayer could take either a tax credit or deduction for expenses incurred in adopting a child. A tax credit is normally enacted to encourage some type of a specific activity which will be of benefit to a broad segment of society. The proposed credit/deduction would fail to meet this basic criteria, since there is absolutely no need to encourage adoptions in the State of Alaska at this point in time. Upon contacting all local adoption agencies, I have been advised that they have very long lists of people waiting to adopt children.

It would appear that the authors of this bill did not recognize the true relationship between allowing a credit of up to \$1,000 or a deduction of \$2,000 at the option of the taxpayer. The disparity between the two provisions is so great that it would negate any election. The credit of \$1,000 is a direct reduction of tax up to the sum of \$1,000, while for the average taxpayer in Alaska the deduction of \$2,000 would give them a potential tax reduction of \$110. Conversely, the \$1,000 credit has the same value to a taxpayer as an \$18,182 deduction. Obviously, no taxpayer under any circumstances is going to take a deduction when he has that kind of a credit available to him..

It should also be remembered that the State of Alaska has made a maximum effort to follow the Internal Revenue Code in the determination of taxable income. This would be yet another deviation from the Code which just further complicates return preparation for the Alaskan taxpayer and in many cases may be the final straw which forces him/her to go to a tax preparer to have the return done.

Further, this bill is obviously special interest legislation for a small number of taxpayers in the State of Alaska. It is estimated that there are 650 adoptions in the State each year. Comparing this to the anticipated number of returns that we will receive this year of at least 200,000, this provision would benefit only 1/3 of 1 percent of those filing returns.

Based on the estimated number of adoptions in Alaska each year, this would result in an additional loss of revenue in the amount of \$650,000.

In summary, there appears to be very little justification for a provision such as this. It is not needed to encourage adoptions in the State, would be a further deviation from the Internal Revenue Code and would benefit a very small group of taxpayers in the State of Alaska. For these reasons, this legislation is not justified.






SUBJECT: CS for House Bill No. 373

CSHB 373 would amend the state income tax statute by allowing taxpayers a deduction for the costs of child adoption. The amount of the deduction would be limited to \$3,000. The Department of Revenue supports this bill as providing a reasonable tax deduction which would help to defray the costs of adoption.

We estimate that the annual revenue effect would be approximately \$29,000. In estimating the costs of adoption which would be available for the tax deduction we have used information supplied by the Department of Health and Social Services. From that information it is estimated that the number of adoptions in the current year will be approximately 750. Of that total, approximately 70 percent are either step-parent adoptions or adoptions placed through the Department of Health and Social Services. For these adoptions the costs are relatively low and it is estimated that the average cost is about \$250 per adoption. The remainder of adoptions are made through private agencies and the costs could range from \$500 to \$4,000, depending upon the agency used.

There would not be any added fiscal impact on the department.

SUBJECT: House Bill No. 373

This bill would provide that a taxpayer could take either a tax credit or deduction for expenses incurred in adopting a child. A tax credit is normally enacted to encourage some type of a specific activity which will be of benefit to a broad segment of society. The proposed credit/deduction would fail to meet this basic criteria, since there is absolutely no need to encourage adoptions in the State of Alaska at this point in time. Upon contacting all local adoption agencies, I have been advised that they have very long lists of people waiting to adopt children.

It would appear that the authors of this bill did not recognize the true relationship between allowing a credit of up to \$1,000 or a deduction of \$2,000 at the option of the taxpayer. The disparity between the two provisions is so great that it would negate any election. The credit of \$1,000 is a direct reduction of tax up to the sum of \$1,000, while for the average taxpayer in Alaska the deduction of \$2,000 would give them a potential tax reduction of \$110. Conversely, the \$1,000 credit has the same value to a taxpayer as an \$18,182 deduction. Obviously, no taxpayer under any circumstances is going to take a deduction when he has that kind of a credit available to him..

It should also be remembered that the State of Alaska has made a maximum effort to follow the Internal Revenue Code in the determination of taxable income. This would be yet another deviation from the Code which just further complicates return preparation for the Alaskan taxpayer and in many cases may be the final straw which forces him/her to go to a tax preparer to have the return done.

Further, this bill is obviously special interest legislation for a small number of taxpayers in the State of Alaska. It is estimated that there are 650 adoptions in the State each year. Comparing this to the anticipated number of returns that we will receive this year of at least 200,000, this provision would benefit only 1/3 of 1 percent of those filing returns.

Based on the estimated number of adoptions in Alaska each year, this would result in an additional loss of revenue in the amount of \$650,000.

In summary, there appears to be very little justification for a provision such as this. It is not needed to encourage adoptions in the State, would be a further deviation from the Internal Revenue Code and would benefit a very small group of taxpayers in the State of Alaska. For these reasons, this legislation is not justified.
