Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 384

The board endorses the attached fiscal note as its fiscal analysis of CSHB 384.

A majority of the board recommends that CSHB 384 do not pass; one member has no recommendation; and one member was absent.

There appears at this time to be no impact on terminations because of the reorganization of the Department of Transportation. If terminations occur in the future, the affected individuals should seek redress through the legislative process. The board is not addressing itself to the question of severance pay.

SUMMARY OF CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 384

(assuming adoption of amendment suggested by Legislative Affairs Agency)

Retirement system affected: PERS

Provides that a public officer or employee whose job is abolished as a result of the creation of the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities is entitled to the following benefits if he is terminated and no similar job is available to him in the same geographic area:

1. He is entitled to severance pay equal to six months' salary;
2. If he has completed fewer than 15 years of credited service, he is granted two additional years of credited service for purposes of calculating his retirement benefit; if he has completed at least 15 years of credited service he is granted an additional two years of credited service and is eligible for early retirement with no reduction in benefits.

Takes effect immediately and is retroactive to March 10, 1977.
