



Dear Mr. Cowper;

I am writing in regard to House Bills 411 and 412. I understand they have been referred to the Finance Committee of which you are chairman. Wherever they are, I hope you will consider my opinion.

I am strongly opposed to these Bills. I am a dog musher. I belong to the Alaska Dogmusher's Association (the Fairbanks dogmusher association) and have run dogs for 4 years, 3 of those in competition.

I am also a tax payer.

Dog mushing is a well established sport in this state. Monies for races regularly are raised from private and commercial contributions, commercial advertising, and musher entry fees. Few races have any trouble raising money for their purse.

Dog racing is a sport. Few mushers actually make much money or expect to make money from prize money. Most of us train and race dogs for fun. There are a few notable exceptions, of course!

I resent using State money to subsidize a sport..... particularly one which doesn't need money. Participation in dog racing is optional and can only be done by people who have enough money to feed and care for dogs in the first place. Although, many mushers might disagree with me, I consider it a luxury sport compared to other sports which require less capital input.

If the State subsidized dog racing, what about subsidizing women's basketball, snow machine races (heaven forbid!), or any other sport? I know dog racing is the state sport, but it has and certainly can survive quite well without state financial support.

I think the most important fact to consider is that it would be state money going to a luxury cause. There are so many other areas where state money would be a matter of life and death for people in the State: improved health care, rabies vaccinations, rape centers, child and spouse abuse preventive programs, day care facilities, teaching programs for disadvantaged persons, etc., etc.... I'm sure you're more aware than I of other needy areas.

I am also chair of the North Pole Winter Carnival Committee. If any dog race needs money, we do... but we shall raise it from the community.. from people and businesses who want to contribute, not from a public with no choice.







Dear Mr. Speaker:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18 of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.30.060(b) and the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legislature, I am transmitting a bill making a special appropriation to the Department of Administration for the purpose of making advances to the University of Alaska. This bill would ensure that the University of Alaska is able to meet its financial obligations during the remainder of FY 77, and will ensure that the burden of any problems arising from the University's cash flow will not be passed on to its vendors.

Dear Representative Cowper:

Following consideration by the House HESS Committee next week HB 432 will come to your committee for review. As I cannot make another trip to Juneau this Legislative session may I at this time submit written testimony for consideration by your committee.

In February I helped draft these proposed amendments to Title 47.40, and I wholeheartedly support the Bill. The changes which this bill will allow will assure that the private providers of child care are reimbursed for the services to the State of Alaska and children in care.

Last year alone at the Care Center we spent 15% more than State reimbursement for the children placed in our group home. However, our average daily population has jumped over 25% since last year, and since it is possible to provide services to more children less expensively it is possible that if cost settling were in effect this year we would owe the State money rather than them owing us. The providers are not asking to make a profit, we only hope to be reimbursed for offering a good program to benefit children and families. For many of the smaller organizations lacking other funding sources passage of this bill is a matter of survival. It is a fact that the private sector provides better quality service and more economically than the State can. One institution alone, API, has an 8 million dollar annual budget, more than private child care for the whole state would cost with cost settling.

I have recommended four slight changes in the bill to the HESS Committee, but basically support Legislative intent of HB 432. If further supporting information would be beneficial please do not hesitate to contact me.
