



GENERAL GOVERNMENT BARGAINING UNIT

The General Government Bargaining Unit negotiated a new contract effective January 1, 1977.

The contract calls for a 5% prepay for cost-of-living retroactive to January 1, 1977. Current estimates of the rise in the Anchorage CPI is 6.7, The same as 1976. Historically, the Anchorage CPI has risen the greatest during the 3rd quarter. Given last years pattern, the Anchorage CPI increased over 6% in the 3rd quarter. The contract calls for a 1 to 1 increase retroactive to the quarter the CPI rises above 6%. An additional increase is figured effective July 1, 1977 and an additional 5% prepayment effective January 1, 1978.

The projections for the General Government Bargaining Unit are based upon actual payroll for the first two quarters of FY 77, including overtime and shift differential, for an average of 5,513 general government monthly and hourly employees.

Other items of fiscal impact include a one-step increase in Home for an average of 91 general government employees located there, an insurance study for \$25,000, and one-half the cost of a hearing officer to conduct a study and determine who is eligible for overtime benefits for \$40,000. General Government employees will also be eligible for leave redemption of up to 5 days per calendar year. \$112,600 is included for the annual leave redemption in FY 78.

The House Select Committee on Telecommunications has duly considered House Bill 527, "An Act making a special appropriation to the Alaska Public Broadcasting Commission and providing for an effective date," and has passed it out of committee with a majority vote of "Do Pass." House Bill 527 is designed to provide the villages of Levelock, Manokotak, New Stuyahok, Koliganak and Aleknagik with taped television programming via mini-transmitters.

This bill, since it is an appropriation bill, does not fully describe what would be the intent of the Legislature in the course of its passage. In view of this, and of the exceptional nature of this committee's support for HB 527, we offer the following:

LETTER OF INTENT

During the Eighth Session the Alaska Legislature enacted a bill to provide the aforementioned communities with translator based television. Errors in translator design, however, resulting in extreme unreliability and prohibitive maintenance costs, attended the project from an early stage. The purpose of HB 527 is to provide these communities with reliable delivery of a high quality television signal, and so fulfill an old obligation. In consideration of this, the House Committee on Telecommunications wishes to emphasize that its support of HB 527 is not motivated by any policy or change in policy with regard to the provision of television services, but rather, by the belief that its passage will satisfy a longstanding commitment.

The Committee furthermore wishes to bring the following observations to your attention:

Four of the five communities are prospective small earth station locations. The mini-transmitter mode of delivery is directly compatible with the video reception capability of a small earth station.



* Sec. 2. The sum of \$185,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Alaska State Housing Authority for the purpose of settlement of potential claims of persons who own and occupy units of housing constructed from the proceeds of the state general obligation bond authorized and issued under ch. 180, SLA 1970.

* Sec. 3. The unexpended and unobligated portion of the appropriations provided in secs. 1 and 2 of this Act: lapse into the general fund June 30, 1978.

* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the effective date of a version of a bill authorizing the Alaska State Housing Authority to settle claims of owners and occupants of housing constructed under the remote housing program of 1971 and the remote housing bond program of 1970.




