18 the Department of Labor, (second injury fund), for the purpose of contributing
19 to a lump sum settlement for injuries to Peter J. Tremont.

20 * Sec. 4. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
21 070(c).

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18 of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.30.060(b) and the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legislature, I am transmitting a bill making supplemental appropriations to the Department of Labor in the total amount of \$149,300.

Section 1 of the bill provides for \$39,300 for FY 78 supplements to weekly wage compensation benefits being received by some ninety-one individuals who were permanently injured before May 4, 1974.

Section 2 appropriates \$110,000 to provide effective enforcement of Alaska's Local Hire Act to protect resident Alaskan workers in light of the State Supreme Court decision in Hicklin v. Orbeck, 565 P.2d 159 (1977), upholding AS 38.40 other than the provision requiring Alaska residence for one year.

Re: LOCAL HIRE AS 38.40.

The Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, respectfully requests your serious consideration of the attached supplemental budget to implement a viable LOCAL HIRE program at a maintenance level for the remainder of FY78.

I have briefly analyzed some of the major problems we are encountering in carrying out our obligation under TITLE 38 inasmuch as the BRU responsible for the program is both underfunded and understaffed and it is virtually impossible to address all the problem areas.

In our original revised program submission, we asked for seven positions to bring Local Hire up to maintenance level. At the time we made the request for seven positions we were not aware of the ramifications of the new Prudhoe Bay Unit Agreement which became effective April 1, 1977. This new agreement brought in many of the working interest owners under Title 38.40 for the first time because the original Prudhoe Bay lease was signed before the effective date of Title 38.40. The considerable and serious impact on enforcement capability that has occurred as a result of these newly covered activities and the remoteness of the areas involved has caused Wage and Hour to reassess the needs to be met to carry the purposes and intent of Local Hire. We have therefore amended our original revised program by the addition of one Investigator to the seven positions previously proposed which we believe will provide the minimum staff necessary to obtain and maintain optimum compliance under Title 38.

Members of the Wage and Hour Division have been working with contractors, subcontractors and suppliers of the Prudhoe Bay area since about July 11, 1977 assisting them in preparing their first quarterly employee report as required by Title 38.40 and with but a few exceptions all of the major owner companies have had considerable problems in the format of this report and most have asked for an extension of time in which to file.

It now appears that we will be auditing payrolls involving about 4,000 employees under this new agreement in addition to those contractors who are still engaged on previously covered activities that remain ongoing, maintenance, pump stations, etc.

Much of the work is being carried out on the slope, involves highly technical people at the drilling sites and in the gathering system. The Wage and Hour Division has had many requests from contractors requesting exemptions from Title 38 for certain employees who are not residents, and who are working in highly specialized fields. This type of investigation must first ascertain if the employees are doing the work as described in their job description which is often extremely detailed, and of course to ascertain if we have qualified resident Alaskans to take these jobs. It is apparent from our experience, in the last two months, that the companies involved on the north slope heretofore have not been concerned with resident hire and in most cases a large percentage of their crews are nonresidents. It also appears that many of the requests for exemption from Title 38.40 may not be granted because we will have resident Alaskans who are qualified and willing to take those positions. So it will be extremely important to have a staff on board by the time spring build up of workers takes place so that we can closely monitor new hire to ascertain that Alaska residents are given these jobs where they are qualified and available.

Our case load of discrimination cases has not diminished, in fact the reverse is true, many contractors being aware of the constraints imposed by the limited staff and dollars allocated to Local Hire are obviously testing our ability to enforce Title 38.

Another factor that must be considered, is that in the early spring, approximately 30,000 card holders will be required to renew their certification which will require individual re-evaluation of their applications. This will be performed in addition to new applications that continue to come in at an average of 800-1,000 per month, and must be processed in a timely manner.

Investigations, audits of the employers current personnel files, employee interviews, securing depositions, preliminary conferences court actions, etc., all require considerable travel flexibility and time in the field to assure maximum compliance. To achieve this goal based on past experience, we submit the additional Investigator will be located in Fairbanks which is the hub of new and ongoing activity. Further an Investigator at large will be located in Juneau to guarantee that the Director has immediate first hand knowledge of existing problems to assure maximum coordination of effort between the administration and regional enforcement activities.







Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18 of the Alaska Constitution, and in accordance with AS 24.30.060(b) and the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legislature, I am transmitting a bill making supplemental appropriations to the Department of Labor in the total amount of \$149,300.

Section 1 of the bill provides for \$39,300 for FY 78 supplements to weekly wage compensation benefits being received by some ninety-one individuals who were permanently injured before May 4, 1974.

Section 2 appropriates \$110,000 to provide effective enforcement of Alaska's Local Hire Act to protect resident Alaskan workers in light of the State Supreme Court decision in Hicklin v. Orbeck, 565 P.2d 159 (1977), upholding AS 38.40 other than the provision requiring Alaska residence for one year.



The amount approved for the supplemental is \$110,000. This amount represents the Department's request adjusted from seven months to five months. The request is based on hiring eight new positions for seven months. The adjustment to five months would allow funding the new positions to begin February 1, 1978, which is about the earliest date that the legislature could make a supplemental appropriation.

Although the Department is requesting eight positions in addition to the four currently authorized by RP 78-10X, approval of this supplemental does not change the Governor's FY 79 budget, which approves five additional positions. Unless the budget is changed by the legislature, only five additional permanent full-time positions will be established if the supplemental is appropriated as submitted. The Department may, of course, hire additional temporary positions as funding permits.

The Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, respectfully requests your serious consideration of the attached supplemental budget to implement a viable LOCAL HIRE program at a maintenance level for the remainder of FY78.

I have briefly analyzed some of the major problems we are encountering in carrying out our obligation under TITLE 38 inasmuch as the BRU responsible for the program is both underfunded and understaffed and it is virtually impossible to address all the problem areas.

In our original revised program submission, we asked for seven positions to bring Local Hire up to maintenance level. At the time we made the request for seven positions we were not aware of the ramifications of the new Prudhoe Bay Unit Agreement which became effective April 1, 1977. This new agreement brought in many of the working interest owners under Title 38.40 for the first time because the original Prudhoe Bay lease was signed before the effective date of Title 38.40. The considerable and serious impact on enforcement capability that has occurred as a result of these newly covered activities and the remoteness of the areas involved has caused Wage and Hour to reassess the needs to be met to carry the purposes and intent of Local Hire. We have therefore amended our original revised program by the addition of one Investigator to the seven positions previously proposed which we believe will provide the minimum staff necessary to attain and maintain optimum compliance under Title 38.

Members of the Wage and Hour Division have been working with contractors, subcontractors and suppliers of the Prudhoe Bay area since about July 11, 1977 assisting them in preparing their first quarterly employee report as required by Title 38.40 and with but a few exceptions all of the major owner companies have had considerable problems in the format of this report and most have asked for an extension of time in which to file.

It now appears that we will be auditing payrolls involving about 4,000 employees under this new agreement in addition to those contractors who are still engaged on previously covered activities that remain ongoing, maintenance, pump stations, etc.

Much of the work is being carried out on the slope, involves highly technical people at the drilling sites and in the gathering system. The Wage and Hour Division has had many requests from contractors requesting exemptions from Title 38 for certain employees who are not residents, and who are working in highly specialized fields. This type of investigation must first ascertain if the employees are doing the work as described in their job description which is often extremely detailed, and of course to ascertain if we have qualified resident Alaskans to take these jobs. It is apparent from our experience, in the last two months, that the companies involved on the north slope heretofore have not been concerned with resident hire and in most cases a large percentage of their crews are nonresidents. It also appears that many of the requests for exemption from Title 38.40 may not be granted because we will have resident Alaskans who are qualified and willing to take those positions. So it will be extremely important to have a staff on board by the time spring build up of workers takes place so that we can closely monitor new hire to ascertain that Alaska residents are given these jobs where they are qualified and available.

Our case load of discrimination cases has not diminished, in fact the reverse is true, many contractors being aware of the constraints imposed by the limited staff and dollars allocated to Local Hire are obviously testing our ability to enforce Title 38.

Another factor that must be considered, is that in the early spring, approximately 30,000 card holders will be required to renew their certification which will require individual re-evaluation of their applications. This will be performed in addition to new applications that continue to come in at an average of 800-1,000 per month, and must be processed in a timely manner.

Investigations, audits of the employers current personnel files, employee interviews, securing depositions, preliminary conferences court actions, etc., all require considerable travel flexibility and time in the field to assure maximum compliance. To achieve this goal based on past experience, we submit the additional Investigator will be located in Fairbanks which is the hub of new and ongoing activity. Further an Investigator at large will be located in Juneau to guarantee that the Director has immediate first hand knowledge of existing problems to assure maximum coordination of effort between the administration and regional enforcement activities.


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
