earn a degree. For R.N.'s who come with no prior college credit, the time may extend to four years. Of these students, only 5-10 graduate annually. Attrition from the program generally results from financial and/or family pressures.

Most of the R.N. students have children. Many are single parents. In the past, R.N. students have come from such varied careers as Art, Journalism, Sales, Publicity, etc. Some have given up jobs in these areas and have relocated their families.


If a stipend would become available in the future, the student numbers might double, and attrition from financial pressures might decrease. Also, stipends for a short-term intensive period of 4-6 weeks and/or summer sessions might encourage part-time study.

You asked about the estimated cost of a state subsidy or stipend.

I believe it should be similar to the annual median salary plus tuition and relocation expenses to and from the home community.

I appreciate being able to give input on such an important proposal. Perhaps in the next mailing to our members, we can request that they send comments to you directly.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

The Select Committee on Telecommunications has considered House Bill 802, relating to special appropriations to both the Legislative Affairs Agency and to the Office of the Governor to provide for representation of Alaska at the World Administrative Radio Conference.

Certainly there can be no guarantee at this time that Alaskan representatives would be able to participate in full delegate status. In fact, that would be somewhat amazing, although the consultants to the Legislature on telecommunications are following up this possibility.

However, even without voting delegate status at the World Administrative Radio Conference, a presence for Alaska is vital, in the opinion of the committee. Every ten or fifteen years, major conferences of this sort are held with representatives from all of the nations of the world to "carve up" allocations of radio spectrum space for use in radio, television, data transmission, and other uses. At present, major issues involve the use of broadcasting satellites, television-broadcasting satellites, and the general applications to communication satellites. Alaska has a major interest in these matters.

Without participation by the State, the United States will be represented by persons determined by the United States State Department and the Federal Communications Commission. As we know, Alaska has a very unique status among the states with regard to its communications problems. If the person selected by the Federal Communications Commission and the State Department can be daily contacted by representatives of the Governor's Office and the Legislature, we are far less likely to be left out in the cold when these important decisions are made.

The appropriation may appear somewhat large, but that is as a result of the extended period over which it will be used. It is intended to provide all the funding for a consultant or senior representative to each of the two branches of government. It is not intended that a layman from the Governor's Office or that a legislator be sent to Geneva, Switzerland for these conferences. It is much more important that the Legislative Council and the Governor's Office of Telecommunications advising the Governor, obtain two persons who are very well versed in the highly technical fields involved at the conference in Geneva.

Attached is a proposed budget for the two representatives. Hopefully, they would work together in most cases (as have consultants to the Governor's Office of Telecommunications and the Legislature in previous years on other subjects) and the budget anticipates that they would share certain overhead and secretarial expenses.

The committee strongly urges that the legislation be considered as soon as possible and expedited through the legislative process. The bill provides an immediate effective date, so that the Office of the Governor and the Legislative Council could act immediately upon passage of the legislation even if that were to happen in mid-session. Considering the extensive preparation for this highly complex and technical conference, such action would indeed be appropriate.

Dear Senator Sackett:

The following information is submitted in response to requests from Senator Hohman and Senator Butrovich this morning during discussions before your committee on the Pioneer Homes.

The budget request for the Kotzebue home, exclusive of ASHA costs, was developed by adding 25% to the cost of the Palmer home (the home with the highest operational costs). For FY 78 the request is \$500.3 (\$18.6/bed plus 25% times 20 beds plus inflation).



This chronic condition of hearing loss and susceptibility to disease is one of Alaska's leading health problems and this funding will assist the Department in management and prevention. An additional activity which can be covered by this funding is prevention of noise-induced hearing loss and this should be included in the stated purpose.

To effectively support the additional activities generated by the infusion of these needed funds, a line item designation should be made to the Personal Services category to fund a full-time clerical position to assist the Bethel regional audiologist and a one-half time clerical position for Anchorage.


