III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

Anton Larsen Road presently receives low priority, summer only, maintenance. Once year around maintenance is begun our work load will increase drastically in the areas of drainage, grading, brush control, and snow removal. Also, the existing road alignment presents a serious and hazardous working condition which will have to be corrected. In order to provide the required level of service, we will need to continue devoting two (2) employees to the road during the summer plus we will need the additional efforts of four (4) employees for winter maintenance from Oct. 15 to April 15. These employees for winter maintenance will represent 24 man months (plus overtime) of additional expense. Other ongoing additional expense will be for equipment useage, and supplies. Also, during the first year, FY'79, there will be a major expense incurred for the acquisition of additional equipment. Funding source will be the General Fund. The attached two sheets outline the anticipated added winter expense.
