



6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating the Alaska Marine Highway Authority."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 \* Section 1. AS 19 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

9 CHAPTER .0. ALASKA MARINE HIGHWAY AUTHORITY.

10 ARTICLE 1. CREATION AND ORGANIZATION.

11 Sec. 19.70.010. ALASKA MARINE HIGHWAY AUTHORITY. There is created  
12 the Alaska Marine Highway Authority. The authority is a public corpora-  
13 tion of the state. The corporation is an instrumentality of the state  
14 within the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities but has a  
15 legal existence independent of and separate from the state and has  
16 continuing succession until its existence is terminated by law.

17 Sec. 19.70.020. MEMBERSHIP AND VACANCIES. The authority consists  
18 of five directors: The commissioner of transportation and public  
19 facilities, who shall be a director ex officio with voting privileges;  
20 three directors appointed by the governor from communities in the state  
21 served by the marine highway system; and one director appointed by the  
22 governor from a community in the state not served by the marine highway  
23 system. The appointment of each director other than the commissioner  
24 of transportation and public facilities is subject to confirmation by  
25 the legislature. The directors appointed by the governor serve at his  
26 pleasure for four-year terms. They must be residents of the state and  
27 qualified voters at the time of appointment and shall comply with the  
28 requirements of AS 39.50 (conflict of interest). The directors first  
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3 qualified for reappointment. A vacancy in a directorship occurring  
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5 the original appointment but only for the unexpired term. Each director  
6 before entering upon his duties shall take and subscribe to an oath to  
7 perform the duties of his office faithfully, impartially and justly to  
8 the best of his ability. A record of the oath shall be filed with the  
9 Office of the Governor. The directors of the authority serve without  
10 compensation, but are entitled to travel and per diem expenses as pro-  
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5 Sec. 19.70.050. POWERS OF AUTHORITY. In addition to other powers  
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- 7 (1) sue and be sued;

16 real and personal property for its purposes;

18 provisions of this chapter and the procedures set out in AS 09.55.240 -  
19 09.55.460;
- 20 (8) operate, maintain, improve and extend a system of ferries  
21 connecting with the public streets and highways of the state and in-  
22 cluding such boats, vessels, wharves, docks, approaches, landings and  
23 appurtenances as the authority determines to be necessary or desirable  
24 for safe and efficient operation of the ferry system so as to best serve  
25 the public;
- 26 (9) do all acts and things necessary, convenient or desirable  
27 to carry out the powers expressly granted or necessarily implied in this  
28 chapter.

1 The authority is authorized to operate its ferry system under the name  
2 "Alaska marine highway system".

3 Sec. 19.70.060. COMPREHENSIVE LONG-RANGE PLAN. The authority,  
4 with the cooperation of the Department of Transportation and Public  
5 Facilities, shall prepare a comprehensive long-range plan for the  
6 development and improvement of the marine highway system. The plan  
7 shall be revised and updated at least every five years.

8 ARTICLE 3. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY.

13 domain land in fee simple or easements which it considers necessary for  
14 present public use, either temporary or permanent, or which it considers  
15 necessary and reasonable for the public use. By the same means, the  
16 authority may obtain material, including clay, gravel, sand, or rock, or  
17 the land necessary to obtain the material, including access to it. The  
18 authority may so acquire the land or materials notwithstanding the fact  
19 that title to it is vested in the state or a department, agency, com-  
20 mission or institution of the state.

21 Sec. 19.70.080. DECLARATION OF TAKING. A declaration of taking,  
22 in the form of an order signed by . majority of the directorship of the  
23 authority, declaring that the real property, or an interest in it, or  
24 any easement is necessary for the public use of the authority, is suf-  
25 ficient to vest title in the authority. However, a declaration of  
26 taking is not effective until eminent domain proceedings have been in-  
27 stituted in the proper court, and a copy of the declaration of taking is  
28 filed in the office of the recorder located in the recording district  
29 where the land is located. The authority may pay or have paid, from the

1 appropriate fund, into court the amount it considers represents a rea-  
2 sonable valuation for the land, easement or materials taken.

3 Sec. 19.70.090. AUTHORITY TO CONDEMN OR ACQUIRE PUBLICLY OWNED  
4 PROPERTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXCHANGE. When property, which is devoted  
5 to or held for another public use for which the power of eminent domain  
6 may be exercised, is taken for purposes set out in this chapter, the  
7 authority may, with the consent of the person or agency in charge of the  
8 other public use, condemn other real property to be exchanged for the  
9 real property so taken. This section does not limit the authorization  
10 of the authority to acquire, other than by condemnation, property for  
11 those purposes in any other manner.

12 Sec. 19.70.100. AUTHORITY TO PURCHASE PROPERTY FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
13 EXCHANGE. When a majority of the directorship of the authority declares  
14 that it is in the best public interest of the state to do so, the  
15 authority may acquire by purchase or otherwise privately or publicly  
16 owned land or an interest in it for the purpose of exchanging it for  
17 privately or publicly owned land which the authority is authorized by  
18 law to acquire.

19 Sec. 19.70.110. VACATING OF LAND OR RIGHTS IN LAND. The authority  
20 may vacate land, or part of it, or rights in land acquired for use in  
21 the marine highway system by executing and filing a deed in the approp-  
22 riate recording district. Upon vacating, title reverts to the persons,  
23 heirs, successors, or assigns in whom it was vested at the time of the  
24 taking. The authority may transfer land considered no longer necessary  
25 for use in the marine highway system to the Department of Natural  
26 Resources for disposal. The proceeds of disposal by the Department of  
27 Natural Resources shall be credited to the funds from which the purchase  
28 was originally made.

29 ARTICLE 4. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Our Chief Counsel has reviewed the language of Alaska Senate Bill 371 which would create an Alaskan Marine Highway Authority. He has advised us that 23 USC 129(g) would not allow an independent authority to use Federal-aid highway funds to acquire and reconstruct ferries.

23 USC 129(g) which authorizes Federal participation in the construction of ferry boats expressly prohibits such ferry boats being under the control of an independent authority when it says in 23 USC 129(g)(4):

"The operating authority and the amount of fares charged for passage on such ferry shall be under the control of the State, (emphasis added) . . ."

As stated in the bill:

"The purpose of this chapter is to establish an authority for the operation, management, and planning and construction of facilities for the marine highway system that is independent of the State government." [Sec. 19.70.130]

An authority independent of the State government is not under the control of the State and could not qualify for Federal funds under 23 USC 129(g)(4).


