12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

13 * Section 1. For the purpose of paying the cost of flood control pro-
14 jects, port facilities development projects under AS 30.15, and small boat
15 harbor projects under AS 35.10.090 - 35.10.120, general obligation bonds of
16 the state in the principal amount of not more than \$34,250,000 shall be
17 issued and sold. The full faith, credit and resources of the state are
18 pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest and redemption pre-
19 mium, if any, on these bonds. These bonds shall be issued under the provi-
20 sions of AS 37.15 as those provisions read at the time of issuance.

21 * Sec. 2. (a) If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the quali-
22 fied voters of the state, a special fund of the state to be known as the
23 "1978 Flood Control, Port Facilities Development, and Small Boat Harbors
24 Fund" shall be established, to which shall be credited the proceeds of the
25 sale of the bonds described in sec. 1 of this Act except for the accrued
26 interest and premiums. There is appropriated from the "1978 Flood Control,
27 Port Facilities Development, and Small Boat Harbors Fund" to the Department
28 of Transportation and Public Facilities the amount of \$34,250,000.

29 (b) The specific uses of the proceeds of these bonds shall be as set

out in secs. 3 - 5 of this Act.

Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for port facilities development projects to be allocated in accordance with the Port Facilities Development Act (AS 30.15), and for various small boat harbor projects to be allocated in accordance with AS 35.10.090 - 35.10.120, appropriated, but not limited, to the following projects and estimates notwithstanding the provisions of AS 24.30.037;

13 shall be reimbursed to the general fund from the proceeds of the sale of the

16 issued shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the state at the next
17 general election and shall read substantially as follows:







I would say that though we are laying blame on agencies of the government we really are not as concerned with who is to blame but with the life and safety of kids.



In my opinion the Department of Education is the culprit. The Department is responsible for school buildings and are supposed to be the advocates of children's education in the State of Alaska. However, they are not. The Department of Education spends the majority of its time on rules and regulations and continuing to erode the authority of local school boards.

For the future we recommend the legislature consider appropriating all construction bond monies directly to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. By doing this we would have only one agency to work with/through. Thus there would be less confusion in communications and authority.

I have enclosed the costs to the district thus far which does not include \$1,107 per month for a fire watch. Evening and weekend use of the building requires additional fire watch time. The costs, also, do not include a lot of travel expense and much time spent by district personnel.

Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 447, an Act providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$45,562,900 for the purpose of paying the cost of capital improvements for constructing, repairing, equipping and upgrading school facilities was introduced in the Senate on May 2, 1978 by the Senate Health, Education and Social Services Committee and was referred to the Senate Finance Committee.

The State's Bond Counsel, Mr. C. Richard Walker of Orrick, Herrington, Rowley and Sutcliffe has advised that general obligation bonds of the State and nearly all other state and local government bonds are issued in the denomination of \$5,000, the standard unit.

Using CS for Senate Bill No. 447 as an example, according to Mr. Walker, this would result in issuing less than the total amount of bonds authorized or in issuing one odd bond in the denomination of \$2,900 along with 9,112 bonds in the usual denomination of \$5,000.

Issuing a bond in an odd denomination causes extra time, expense and confusion in connection with the preparation of the resolution, notice of sale, official statement and other documents relating to the bonds, the printing of one odd bond with all of its special coupons, and all of the accounting and paying activities.

On the other hand, it would be highly unusual to find an estimate of expenditures, used in connection with determining the principal amount of nearly a forty-six million bond issue, that was within \$5,000 of being a perfectly precise estimate. Consequently, it is respectfully recommended that your Committee round off the principal amount of the proposed bond issue to the nearest \$5,000 and make an adjustment of one of the projects enumerated in the bill to conform with the adjustment.

It is to be noted in Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 447, that no section is provided for an appropriation from the general fund to the State Bond Committee to pay for expenses incident to the sale and issuance of the bonds authorized.

This is likely to have happened as a result of reviewing the original Senate Bill No. 447 which did not provide a Section as indicated above. A copy of the original bill is attached as is a copy of the Senate Journal dated January 31, 1978 which discloses the Governor's letter of transmittal for a package of bond proposals including Senate Bill No. 447. It is to be noted that in the Governor's letter of transmittal that the cost of issuance and sale for the \$72,200,000 of bonds is included in the "Amounts authorized in sec. 1 of each of these bills includes funds to pay the cost of bond sale and issuance."

In the original Senate Bill No. 447 the projects enumerated do not total to the full amount of the bond authorization, thus leaving some funds for the expenses of sale and issuance.

The projects enumerated in CS for Senate Bill No. 447 do total to the full amount of the authorization, that is \$45,562,900 without a section in the bill providing for expenses of issuance and sale.

The normal formula for calculating selling expenses, although not followed in the original Senate Bill No. 447, is to use a factor of .0035 times the principal amount of the bonds to be issued.

Therefore in reviewing CS for Senate Bill No. 447, it is respectfully recommended that a new Section be added to provide for selling expenses of $\$45,562,900 \times .0035$ or \$159,470 or rounded to \$159,000.

Such section would be Section 3 with the present Sections 3, 4 and 5 being renumbered Sections 4, 5 and 6.

Enclosed is a chronology of events and documentation concerning the Kotzebue School. We all appreciate your support and help and that of the Budget and Audit Committee.

I would say that though we are laying blame on agencies of the government we really are not as concerned with who is to blame but with the life and safety of kids.


While we are laying blame, however it appears that the blame is with Public Works (DOTPF) but I don't believe this to be true. That Department is simply the most visible. In my opinion the Department of Education is the culprit. The Department is responsible for school buildings and are supposed to be the advocates of children's education in the State of Alaska. However, they are not. The Department of Education spends the majority of its time on rules and regulations and continuing to erode the authority of local school boards.

For the future we recommend the legislature consider appropriating all construction bond monies directly to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. By doing this we would have only one agency to work with/through. Thus there would be less confusion in communications and authority.

I have enclosed the costs to the district thus far which does not include \$1,107 per month for a fire watch. Evening and week-end use of the building requires additional fire watch time. The costs, also, do not include a lot of travel expense and much time spent by district personnel.

SUBJECT: G. O. Bond Bills

All G. O. bond measures introduced by the Governor failed to appropriate the proceeds of the bonds they authorized. In any case where a bond bill introduced by the Governor survives in its original form, at least the following change should be considered (example language taken from SB 624, a bill introduced by the Senate Finance Committee as a duplicate for HB 711):

"* Sec. 2. . .The amount of \$60,100,000 is appropriated from the '1978 Transportation Facilities Construction Fund' to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. The proceeds of the bonds shall be allocated statewide as follows:"

Inclusion of the above language, modified as to amount, construction fund and department, will appropriate the funds. You may also want to consider whether the proceeds should be appropriated or allocated. Projects "allocated" may have funds shifted from project to project. Projects "appropriated" have specific amounts earmarked only for each project.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. For the purpose of paying the cost of capital improvements for constructing, repairing, equipping, and upgrading school facilities, general obligation bonds of the state in the principal amount of not more than \$59,470,000 shall be issued and sold. The full faith, credit and resources of the state are pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on these bonds. These bonds shall be issued under the provisions of AS 37.15 as those provisions read at the time of issuance.

* Sec. 2. If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified voters of the state, a special fund of the state to be known as the "1978 School Construction Fund" shall be established, to which shall be credited the proceeds of the sale of the bonds described in sec. 1 of this Act except for the accrued interest and premiums. The amount of \$59,470,000 is appropriated from the "1978 School Construction Fund" to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. The proceeds of these bonds shall be allocated by the governor as follows:

If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified voters of the state, the amount of \$208,000 or as much of that amount as is found necessary is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the state bond committee to carry out the provisions of this Act and to pay expenses incident to the sale and issuance of the bonds authorized in this Act. The amounts expended from the appropriation authorized by this section

shall be reimbursed to the general fund from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized by this Act.

* Sec. 4. The amount withdrawn from the public facility planning fund for the purpose of advance planning for the improvements financed under this Act shall be reimbursed to the fund from the proceeds of the sale of bonds authorized by this Act.

* Sec. 5. The question whether the bonds authorized in this Act are to be issued shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the state at the next general election and shall read substantially as follows:

Proposition

State General Obligation School Construction

Bonds \$59,470,000

Shall the State of Alaska issue its general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not more than \$59,470,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing, repairing, equipping, and upgrading school facilities?
