



Senate State Affairs Committee increased the amount of the Governor's Bill by \$2,430,000 for the urban centers and changed the grant in Sec. 2 to 90% grants to the urban centers.

The CSSB 449, FINANCE, replaced the language in the Governor's original bill for Grants to Municipalities, indicating 50% of the eligible cost under A.S. 46.03.030.





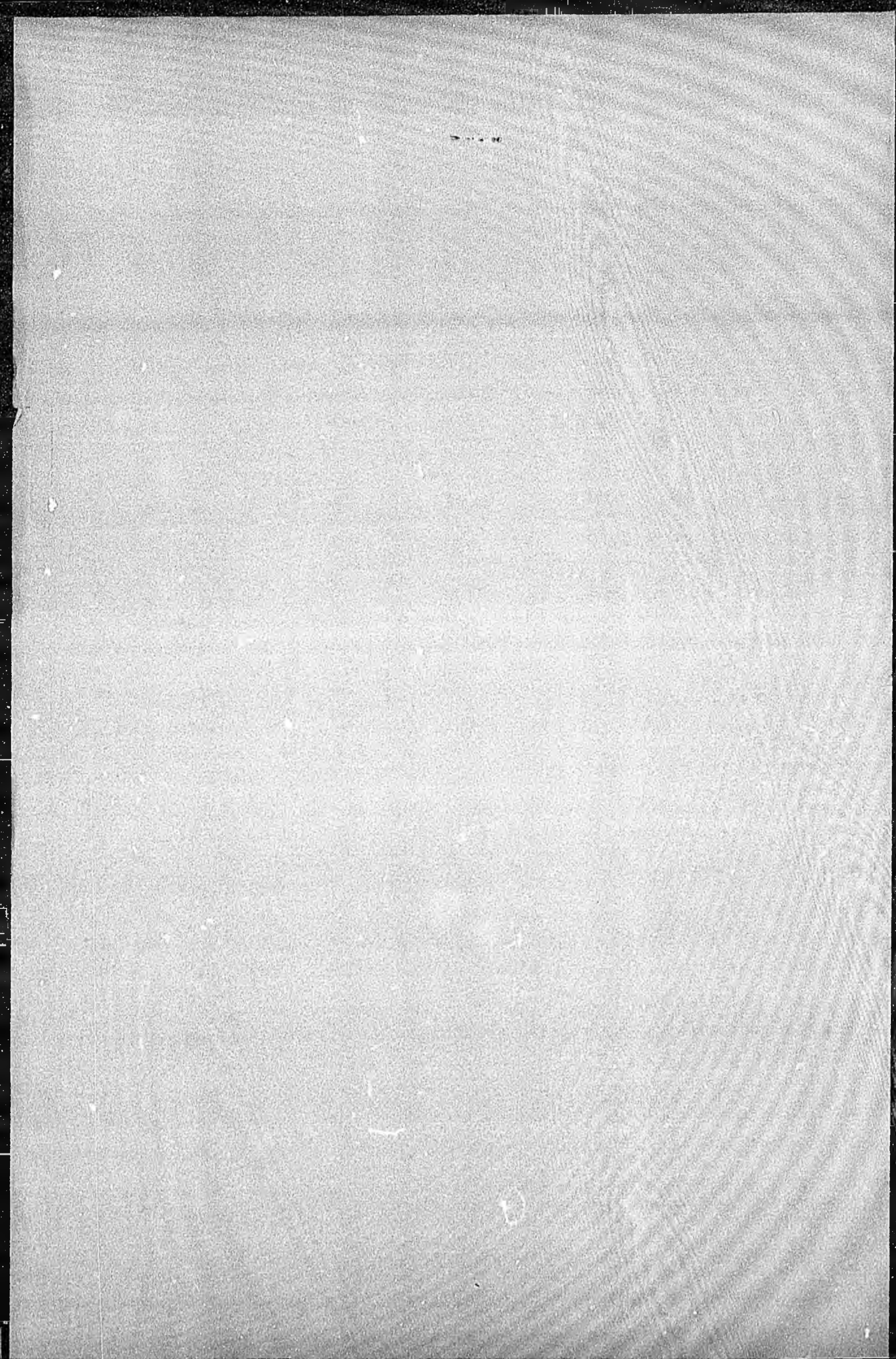

SUBJECT: G. O. Bond Bills

All G. O. bond measures introduced by the Governor failed to appropriate the proceeds of the bonds they authorized. In any case where a bond bill introduced by the Governor survives in its original form, at least the following change should be considered (example language taken from SB 624, a bill introduced by the Senate Finance Committee as a duplicate for HB 711):

"* Sec. 2. . .The amount of \$60,100,000 is appropriated from the '1978 Transportation Facilities Construction Fund' to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. The proceeds of the bonds shall be allocated statewide as follows:"

Inclusion of the above language, modified as to amount, construction fund and department, will appropriate the funds. You may also want to consider whether the proceeds should be appropriated or allocated. Projects "a located" may have funds shifted from project to project. Projects "appropriated" have specific amounts earmarked only for each project.







LETTER OF INTENT FOR SB 451

The Senate Health, Education and Social Services Committee has considered SB 451. We recognize the problems faced by the Finance Committee in trying to construct bond packages. However, we do recommend the Finance Committee seriously consider adding one item and increasing one item in SB 451. We recommend adding an item of \$3,750,000 for General Classroom and Office Space on the Juneau Campus, an item high on the list of priorities as seen by the Associated Student group. We recommend increasing the amount under the heading Storage Facilities for Hazardous Materials, Fairbanks Campus, from \$300,000 to \$1,680,000. This would provide badly needed storage space to protect University property and supplies.

The Alaska State Legislature,

Following a review of the University of Alaska, FY 1979 Capital Improvement Request which was approved by the Board of Regents at their meeting in Kenai, the Alaska Student Lobby has established three capital requests as their highest priority.

The Lobby did not take exception, generally, to those items prioritized by the Board under the first five groups:

- A. Protection of life or health of students or general public.
- B. Protection of investment in plant.
- C. Projects mandated by Federal law or existing contract.
- D. Completion of existing structures.
- E. Planning Studies.

however, we do take specific exception with their prioritization under the sixth group - Facilities development for instruction and research program needs - or new facilities.

Each member campus of the lobby was asked to choose one new facility on their campus which students felt was of the most critical need. When these were selected the Lobby prioritized the selections on a statewide basis. The results of this prioritization are considerably different than what has generally been the trend, at least from within the University.

Three facilities were chosen for their need, likelihood of passage by the legislature, acceptance to the voters of Alaska, and finally their ability to facilitate growth.

First Priority Statewide

General Classroom and Office Building, Anchorage Campus

Total construction cost \$5,000,000

Annual operating cost \$162,000

This new facility is designed as a 33,000 square foot classroom and office building consisting of approximately 40 classrooms serving 40 students each and 50 offices of 100 square feet each.

Second Priority Statewide

Arts and Humanities Building, Juneau Campus

Total construction cost \$3,750,000

Annual operating cost \$150,000

This new facility would provide general classroom space which will tie in with existing campus facilities and programs. There is a growing population in the Auke Bay Area along with an increasing number of students. There are no facilities available on campus or in the community to have specialized or large general meetings. Maintenance and operation costs can be expected to run near \$3.50 per square foot. Some of this cost may be off set by fees for certain revenue type functions.

Presently more than 50% of all classes taught by the Juneau campus are taught in local secondary school facilities. There are no large general meeting facilities or classrooms which can accomodate large classes available in the community at times convenient to college students and programs.

Third Priority Statewide

Tanana Valley Community College, Phase I

Total construction cost \$8,662,000

Annual operating cost \$190,000

This provides for construction of a Technical Education Center near the Fairbanks campus for technical career education.

The facility would consist of 50,000 square feet of flexible open space which can accomodate a variety of programs.

The margin between each of these three statewide priorities is fractional, however it is important that for the first time students across the state have recognized that they greatest need is for general classroom space in Anchorage. We, the students, live with these facilities daily and know first hand what the needs are. We respectfully request the inclusion of these three facilities in the University GO Bond package to go before the voters this year.

Documentation of Need: Tanana Valley Community College will experience significant increases in enrollment over the next five years in order to accommodate new program development it is essential that additional space be available. In addition to classes which are already in existence, the community college is developing a winter studies program which is designed for seasonal workers. In order for TVCC to provide educational services for the Fairbanks area and to train students for jobs related to the Alaskan economy, it is essential that technical instruction space be provided. Educational programs which are needed and for which there is no specific laboratory space in Fairbanks at the moment are: programs in heavy equipment, auto technology, mechanical equipment of buildings, health occupations, fluid power hydraulics, and electricity, aircraft technology, and fire science. None of these programs can be accommodated on the University campus or at the Hutchison Career Center. In addition to those new programs, adequate space is also needed for a continuation of programs in office occupations, construction technology, and adult basic education.

Tanana Valley Community College had an enrollment of 278 the very first semester of its existence. The second semester of the 1974-75 academic year, the enrollment was 1,206. The current enrollment is approximately 2425 students as of October 28, 1977, with 7221 credit hours (excluding short courses). In addition, we expect a substantial enrollment in the Winter Studies Program. Enrollment for the TVCC for the next five years will continue to increase to between 2500 to 4000 before leveling off, providing adequate facilities are available for program offering.

The question of the need for a technical education center for TVCC while the Hutchison Career Center operates within close proximity of the University continually arises. Since the establishment of TVCC, the Hutchison Career Center has basically been unavailable for program development. Recently the new superintendent expressed a willingness to cooperate with the University of Alaska and TVCC in offering programs. With this change in attitude, we will be able to realize a significant improvement which will permit the development of additional vocational/technical programs for the community of Fairbanks. This is a big help, but it does not address the need for the community college to develop a full-fledged technical education program. The Hutchison Center has the capacity to offer a variety of programs, but is a long way from being a comprehensive vocational/technical center.

The school district utilized the building during normal school hours throughout the school calendar. Approximately 400 students are currently enrolled. To attempt to coordinate daytime vocational programs in the facility which is

basically being used for secondary students would pose significant problems. The school district also offers some night classes. Due to the need for substantial hours of laboratory time in all vocational programs, it is unlikely that the community college could satisfy the needs of associate degree students with the amount of space that would be available. Because of the basic lack of daytime facilities and limited facilities available at night, it is essential that the community college have a building to offer the appropriate vocational programs for Fairbanks. TVCC hopes to be able to expand its course offerings in the career center next semester. That will amount to between 5 and 7 classes. But that will only scratch the surfact of the occupational program needs of Fairbanks.

II. Analysis Impact on Operational Expense:

Maintenance and Operation on 55,000 square feet @ \$3.45/sq.ft. = \$189.750 per annum.

III. Documentation of Estimated Capital Cost:

\$157/sq.ft. X 55,000 sq.ft. = \$8,662.0 (This figure is projected by consultant quantity surveyors for Fairbanks for 1979 construction.)

IV. Identification of Alternatives Considered:

Continue sharing University space and leasing high schools - this alternative was rejected because it would deny new career programs to community college students. The new programs planned do not duplicate those offered at present at the Hitchinson Career Center and new space is therefore necessary. (see attachment A)
