

SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE LIMITED ENTRY STUDY COMMITTEE

PURPOSE--PLAN OF WORK

The overall goal of the special legislative committee on limited entry is to recommend changes to the limited entry law which would improve the present system of commercial fisheries entry limitation. It is evident that the people of Alaska still want the program and that the intended impact is being realized; but there exists a need for the regulatory structure to better fit the actual circumstances and conditions inherent to Alaska's fisheries.

There are particular aspects of the present system which have aroused special concerns; the rapidly increasing value of permits beyond the purchasing of financing power of many Alaskans; the inability of many resident Alaskans to enter the salmon fisheries while substantial numbers of non-residents remain and continue to enter the fisheries; and the administrative burdens realized both by fishermen and the state in implementing the present limited entry schemes. While it is our intent to encourage a full scale reexamination of the Alaska limited entry system the strengths of our existing limited entry system such as intra-family transferrability provisions and the maintenance of equal opportunity to enter commercial fishing are very important to retain. The committee should look specifically at the problem areas previously mentioned, and to the greatest extent possible attempt to design a program which has the flexibility to adapt to the varied circumstances present in the various regions of Alaska. Lastly, any recommendation for changes to the limited entry system must be thoroughly, legally researched to be defensible in court.

The budget of the special committee is designed to minimize the costs of this investigation. The committee should take advantage of existing expertise in the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, the Legislative Affairs Agency, and the Department of Commerce and Economic Development. Detailed legal analysis and related needs should be arranged through contracts.

SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE LIMITED ENTRY STUDY COMMITTEE

PURPOSE--PLAN OF WORK

The overall goal of the special legislative committee on limited entry is to recommend changes to the limited entry law which would improve the present system of commercial fisheries entry limitation. It is evident that the people of Alaska still want the program and that the intended impact is being realized; but there exists a need for the regulatory structure to better fit the actual circumstances and conditions inherent to Alaska's fisheries.

There are particular aspects of the present system which have aroused special concerns; the rapidly increasing value of permits beyond the purchasing or financing power of many Alaskans; the inability of many resident Alaskans to enter the salmon fisheries while substantial numbers of non-residents remain and continue to enter the fisheries; and the administrative burdens realized both by fishermen and the state in implementing the present limited entry schemes. While it is our intent to encourage a full scale reexamination of the Alaska limited entry system the strengths of our existing limited entry system such as intra-family transferrability provisions and the maintenance of equal opportunity to enter commercial fishing are very important to retain. The committee should look specifically at the problem areas previously mentioned, and to the greatest extent possible attempt to design a program which has the flexibility to adapt to the varied circumstances present in the various regions of Alaska. Lastly, any recommendation for changes to the limited entry system must be thoroughly, legally researched to be defensible in court.

The budget of the special committee is designed to minimize the costs of this investigation. The committee should take advantage of existing expertise in the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, the Legislative Affairs Agency, and the Department of Commerce and Economic Development. Detailed legal analysis and related needs should be arranged through contracts.
