"An Act making a supplemental appropriation to the Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Public Health; and providing for an effective date."

The FY 1978 appropriation for Communicative Disorders was funded through program receipts, federal funding and State funds. Near the close of the fiscal year, RP-78-999 was processed to record salary increase funds of 18.5 necessary to fund salaries for the balance of the fiscal year. Due to administrative oversight, the necessary accounting documents were not recorded on the State accounting system.

The result of the error is that the State accounting system reveals a lapsing balance of \$41,059.15. However, the amount is misleading because it is made up of a \$44,965 shortfall in program receipts due to unearned revenues under the Rural CAP contract. Also, \$5,800 of the CCRB Federal funds were not earned.





RE: Allakaket School - HB 94

Ron Lind and Joe Cooper, Superintendent of the Yukon Koyukuk School District, approached both Garrey and myself this afternoon concerning a problem with the language in HB 94.

Apparently, as the language is currently written, all the insurance funds awarded to cover the loss of the Allakaket school will lapse into the general fund. According to Joe Cooper they expect to receive somewhere around \$600,000 in claims, far above the \$120,000 in the appropriation.

Ron talked with the Department of Law and together they recommend two possible solutions to the problem:

1. Leave the section as it is, assuming the Governor signs the appropriation, and then amend another bill to add a section clarifying that part of HB 94. Something like, "up to \$120,000 of the insurance claim will lapse into the general fund."
2. Under the wording in the general appropriations bill last year, the state can advance insurance funds to the appropriate agency before the insurance money is received by the claiming party. Ron suggested that perhaps the Dept. of Transportation and Dept. of Education could get together and begin this process. In this event, the Governor would veto that portion of HB 94.

Garrey suggested to Ron that it might be easiest for the Governor simply to veto the language in HB 94 which says, "Insurance proceeds received as a result of the school fire on January 25, 1979, will lapse into the general fund upon receipt. Ron was to check with the Department of Law to see if this could be done

I told Ron I would call him Wednesday morning after talking with you on this matter.

Based on the assumption that those units that grant the optional \$10,000 exemption would also grant the \$50,000 authorized in this bill. The State would lose approximately \$850,000 in revenue. Currently three of the taxing jurisdictions that grant the \$10,000 current exemptions have their taxing ability limited by AS 29.53.045 & 50 and also AS 43.56.010. Therefore, any additional exemptions would decrease locally generated revenue but be offset by Oil and Gas Tax revenues. This increase in oil and gas tax revenues would be a direct dollar for dollar reduction in State General Fund.

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act making a special appropriation to the Depart-

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 \* Section 1. The sum of \$4,500 is appropriated from the general fund to  
12 the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for the delivery of  
13 mail to the Cosna Wien Lake Area.

14 \* Sec. 2. The unexpended and unobligated portion of this appropriation  
15 lapses into the general fund June 30, 1980.

16 \* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
