11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

12 \* Section 1. For the purpose of paying the cost of energy conservation,

14 general obligation bonds of the state in the principal amount of not more  
15 than \$18,100,000 shall be issued and sold. The full faith, credit, and  
16 resources of the state are pledged to the payment of the principal of and  
17 interest and redemption premium, if any, on these bonds. These bonds shall  
18 be issued under the provision of AS 37.15 as those provisions read at the  
19 time of issuance.

20 \* Sec. 2. If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified  
21 voters of the state, a special fund of the state to be known as the "1980  
22 Facilities Upgrade Construction Fund" shall be established, to which shall  
23 be credited the proceeds of the sale of bonds described in sec. 1 of this  
24 Act except for accrued interest and premiums. There is appropriated from  
25 the "1980 Facilities Upgrade Construction Fund" to the Department of Trans-  
26 portation and Public Facilities the amount of \$18,100,000, allocated in

POSITION PAPER

HOUSE BILL NO. 560

"An Act providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$18,100,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of energy conservation, code upgrade, and architectural barrier removal for State facilities; and providing for an effective date."

H.B. 560 authorizes general obligation bonds in the amount of \$18,100,000 to be administered by the Department of Transportation and provides \$10,000,000 for funding energy conservation projects statewide, \$5,800,000 for Life and Safety code upgrade and \$2,300,000 for architectural barrier removal in State facilities. This act would also provide for advance planning funds for these purposes which would be reimbursed from sale of the bonds.

The estimated costs covered by H.B. 560 are based on a statewide survey of all State facilities. Complete upgrade of State facilities would be a six year program depending on future funding.

The State Health Planning and Development Agency and Department of Health and Social Services support HB 560.

(Note: Keith Cherkin, DOT is assigned to coordinate the H.B. 560 program. He is responsible for the position paper and fiscal note on H.B. 560).

Priority Locations for Technical Energy Audits and Energy Conservation Measures

For the first phase of the Energy Conservation capital projects, priority locations will be public facilities in rural communities which currently self generate. The following items support that concept.

1. These facilities are entirely dependent on fossil fuels.
2. The cost of fuel in these rural communities is relatively higher than other areas of the State. Therefore an equivalent energy savings produces the best economic return to the State.
3. Locations which self-generate offer the greatest potential for the use of waste heat. The generation equipment will naturally be near the primary facilities thus lowering the cost of transporting waste heat, and the institutional barriers that would exist with a utilities equipment will not exist.
4. Each location can be examined to determine whether it should continue to self-generate or whether a viable local utility exists which could more economically supply energy and thereby transfer the economic value to the private sector.

The following are the fifty (50) locations in ten regions selected as priorities for technical energy audits and subsequent energy conservation measures. The ten regions will be addressed in the following order. Conservation measures which yield the best payback (maximum 10 years) will be funded until all funds are committed.





Dear Mr. Speaker:

The House Judiciary Committee, in considering HB 562, received a recommendation from the Department of Law that the bill be split in order to avoid any possible conflict with the "one subject rule." In addition, the Committee felt that at this juncture smaller projects should be funded by direct appropriation rather than bond issues. Direct appropriation should permit projects to be on-stream at least one year sooner and the administration has in recent years moved rather slowly on bond issues.

For the above reasons the Committee has removed from CSHB 562 all of the smaller projects and recommends that the Finance Committee consider direct appropriation for them. Recommended projects and amounts follow:

Armory construction, Sitka . . . . .	\$687,500
Public Safety Building, Galena . . . . .	720,000
Trooper Housing, Fort Yukon Five-Mile Holy Cross. . . . .	300,000


