



III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

To increase staff to handle very substantial increase in loan activity caused by elimination of the requirement for bank participation. This fiscal note assumes an increase in dollar volume of loans from \$90 million to \$150 million per year, and, therefore, assumes an appropriation would be made for loan capitalization or that the Department of Revenue would be able to dedicate additional money from the General Fund surplus to the loan programs.

The staff necessary to process loans in a reasonable time frame (4 to 6 weeks) is directly proportional to the dollar volume of loans, so the level of staffing must be tied to the dollars available. If the participation requirement is removed and additional loan funds are not available, no increase in staff would be required. The increase in the number of applications would, in that case, result in a backlog of an estimated five to six months in processing time. See attached analysis of fiscal note figures.

SUBJECT:

The Governor today has instructed the Department of Commerce and Economic Development to reduce the bank participation rate from 25% to 10%. This change will be placed in effect immediately.

The F.C.C. of the first session of the 11th Legislature indicated that through participation and any other mechanism for leveraging that the department originate new loans in FY '80 of \$90 million. For the period July 1 through December 31 of this year, the Department of Commerce issued commitments totaling \$48.8 million. Of this amount \$38.1 million were State funds and \$10.7 million were bank funds (see Attachment A). The department anticipates that for FY '80 we will comply with the \$90.0 million guideline indicated by the Legislature.

While the subject of bank participation has been somewhat controversial, the positive aspects of the program have not received the attention they deserve. By utilizing the private financial community to originate, service and monitor loans, the State receives the benefit of the expertise of the private sector. As the interest rate differential between the State and commercial sector has widened, a corresponding increase in the number of applications has resulted (see Attachment B). The current processing time from receipt of application until action by the credit committee is approximately ten weeks. If bank participation were completely eliminated, substantial time delays in excess of this would result.
