8 * Section 1. AS 37.05.315(a) is amended to read:

9 (a) When an appropriation is made as a grant to a municipality,
10 the Department of Administration shall promptly notify the municipality
11 of the availability of the grant. When the Department of Administration
12 receives an agreement executed by the municipality which provides that
13 the municipality (1) will spend the grant for the purposes specified in
14 the appropriation; (2) will allow, on request, an audit by the state of
15 the uses made of the grant; and (3) assures that, to the extent consis-
16 tent with the purpose of the appropriation, the facilities and services
17 provided with the grant will be available for the use of the general
18 public, the Department of Administration shall pay the grant directly
19 to the municipality. The agreement executed by a municipality under
20 this section shall be on a form furnished by the Department of Adminis-
21 tration. Not less than 20 percent of the grant shall be paid to the
22 municipality within 10 days of the effective date of the agreement.
23 The remainder of the grant shall be paid either in monthly installments
24 equal to the amount of grant money the municipality expended in the
25 previous month or in a lump sum as determined by the Department of
26 Administration. Earnings from investment of grant money become part of
27 the grant and may be used only for the purposes of the grant.

Information presented to the department by the Tlingit and Haida Central Council, and by the proposed contractors to that organization, has resulted in the preparation of a revised position paper. Following the submission of our original position paper on March 2, 1981, we were afforded the opportunity to review a copy of the proposal to conduct the employment survey.

The following appear to be positive factors:

1. The consultants pledge cooperation with the Alaska Department of Labor, Employment Security Division. They indicate that they wish to build on the cooperative agreement between the Department of Labor and the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida.
2. The consultants are enthusiastic and appear energetic to implement a plan to put rural Southeast Alaska people to work.
3. The consultants appear to have knowledge of pending developments by Native regional and village corporations which will potentially put people to work.
4. The consultants have clarified that the proposal will be for the people of rural Southeast Alaska, not only for Native people.
5. The consultants indicate that a mechanism will be developed for updating of the information obtained during the initial survey.

Potentially negative factors include:

1. The time table for the study (four months) seems unrealistically tight for the size of the project and the dollars involved.
2. The relationship between the Talent Bank of Sealaska Corporation and the proposed survey is currently unclear.
3. Significant portions of the information indicated to be developed during the survey work should be available through review of the files of the Department of Labor, Research and Analysis Section. The consultants indicated that they plan to do so as a part of the study.
4. There does not appear to be a clear linkage of people to jobs as opposed to general comments that this is a planned outcome.
5. The elements of cost indicated in the proposal would probably not be consistent with state policy if the department was awarding contracts for such work directly, rather than through an intermediary.

POSITION PAPER/Department of Labor

The department continues to recommend that the proposal be reviewed by the State Manpower Services Council at the next meeting of that council in Juneau on April 2 and 3, 1981. The department endorses the concept which has been presented to more thoroughly explore the status and availability of the potential workforce of rural Alaska. Prior to executing one proposal, such as that which has been submitted, it is suggested that the ramifications of the single action on other requirements statewide should be considered. Further, an analysis should be made of any follow-up requirements after the initial survey is completed to ensure that action taken gives consideration to the costs of training programs and other support which might later be necessary.

The department does not support this bill unless it is considered an action that is totally a trial basis or a pilot approach to explore the possibilities of this type approach to other rural areas throughout the State.

A fiscal note representing our current understanding of the support which would be necessary from our department has been prepared.

\$160,000.00 will maintain 5.5 full time equivalent (FTE) positions within the Departments of Labor and Education in FY 82 for the Alaska Career Information System (AKCIS). The funds will offset a reduction in other funding sources including a two year matching federal developmental grant.

\$88,700.00 will pay for 3.0 FTE positions in the Department of Education. \$71,300.00 will partially pay for 2.5 FTE positions with the Department of Labor, Research and Analysis Section. Funds acquired through user fees (fees paid by users of AKCIS) will pay the additional expense of the 2.5 FTE position plus other program expenses comprising the 400.0 FY 82 budget.

Funds required during succeeding years should remain constant or decrease depending on whether an increase in user fees will offset inflation. Any funds requested in the future will go through the Department of Education's normal budget process.

The Alaska Department of Education position paper on HB 233.

The department supports this bill.

The Alaska Career Information System (AKCIS) provides Alaskan and selected out-of-state occupational and educational information to individuals involved in making career decisions. Originally, the AKCIS was funded by contributions from the State Manpower Services Council; the Alaska State Advisory Council on Vocational and Career Education; the Alaska Vocational Education Planning Council, the Alaska Department of Education; the Alaska Department of Labor, Research and Analysis Section; the Alaska Occupational Information Coordinating Committee (AOICC); and the National Occupational Information Coordinating Committee (NOICC). A cooperative effort and a one time only pooling of funds by the above agencies resulted in the completion of the initial development stages of an Alaskan system, which is the best single source of Alaskan occupational and educational information available.

Presently, the main financial support of the AKCIS comes from the Department of Education, NOICC, and fees charged to users of the system. The NOICC grant expires November 30, 1981. The system is designed to become self-supporting through the receipt of user fees. It is a realistic aim as the potential "market" is there. However, in the near future, the chances of that do seem slim. Therefore, in order to maintain the system with current, accurate Alaskan data, partial support by the State is necessary.

The House Resources Committee will today consider two bills related to the Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund - HB 237 which removes the maximum allowable capitalization of the loan fund, and HB 394 which is a special appropriation to the Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund to meet demand for agricultural loans. Following is a quick summary of the situation.

Basically, demand for loans from the Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund exceeds the supply of money in the fund. Additionally, the Department of Revenue is no longer able to purchase loans from the loan fund as anticipated- due to legislative action last year rescinding Dept. of Revenue's authority to purchase loans from the fund. (See attached statutes) These two factors leave the Fund and farmers in a serious predicament. Farmers need money to purchase the seed and fertilizer necessary for spring planting, and the loan fund is without funds. At the March 19, 1981 Loan Fund Board Meeting, \$1,900,000 in loans were approved but due to the limited capitalization of the fund (\$20 million limit) other approvable loans were not granted. However, the approval of \$1,900,000 in loans was predicted upon the belief that the Dept. of Revenue would purchase these loans, which is not the case.

The summary of need supplied to the Division of Agriculture for the Revolving Loan Fund totals \$9,838,000, and is broken down as follows:

Within the Governor's budget \$23 million is allocated to the revolving loan fund. These funds, however, would not be available to farmers until July, too late from spring planting.

AGRICULTURAL LOAN FUND SUMMARY

The Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund (ARLF) is the primary source of low interest loans for farm development and associated processing facilities. The fund was established, in accordance with legislative and administrative policy, to allow reinvestment of income from non-renewable resources into the renewable resource of agriculture. The Fund has grown, since 1953, to a total capitalization of over \$20 million with the bulk of this capital (\$16 million) having been added as a part of the State's large scale development program which began in 1978 (see the attached summary of the progression of added capital).

Loans from ARLF are made to farms of all sizes, in all areas of the State. The amounts loaned range from less than \$10 thousand to amounts in excess of \$1 million with the greatest number of borrowers falling in the under-\$50 thousand category. The total of 12-31-80 outstanding loans made per farm is as follows:

As the State's development program proceeds, ARLF will continue to play a primary role in financing developing areas, farms and processors. This role is required by reluctance of other financing institutions to invest in an industry with no proven track record. Our agricultural industry is too new to have developed that track record, and, as an industry, is still incomplete. It is estimated that a developmental period of from five to ten years will be required before any substantial trend toward alternative financing sources can take place.

Once the industry has become established and has developed the needed performance record, the move to alternative financing sources can begin. In the long run, it is not in the best interest of the farm community for the industry to be based on the concept of continued low-interest loans from a single governmental source. Very soon ARLF must undergo structural and procedural changes which will ease these farm-related borrowers from reliance on the Fund and into the market for other types of financing. A decreasing role for ARLF is projected after the initial five-year development phase of each new enterprise and farm area.

The Division of Agriculture's FY 82 budget request as approved by the Governor adds \$23 million to the capitalized size of the Fund. This amount will fund the planned agricultural development needs for the next year as outlined in the Department's overall agricultural development schedule. In addition to this increase in capitalization of the Fund, the statutory fund size limit will have to be changed. We have recommended an increase to \$200,000,000, which will eliminate the need for annual fund size increases over the next three years, as additional capital is needed.

It would also be advisable to increase the maximum allowable loan size per farm. At the present time, the limit of \$500,000 per farm for farm development loans is often restrictive. A dairy, beef, or pork production unit will normally see a required investment of \$1,000,000 per farm. The allowable amounts for operating capital and chattel (equipment or livestock) are also restrictive for large, economic size units producing these products.

Through use of the Department of Revenue's willingness to purchase proven loans from the Fund, it will not be necessary for a supplemental appropriation to provide operating funds for already financed farms this spring. However, at this time, there are no funds available to finance new operations until additional capitalization is added.

(4) either audited or unaudited financial statements, including balance sheets and profit-and-loss statements for the preceding three fiscal years, and/or copies of all federal and state income tax returns which have been filed by the applicant for those three fiscal years;

(5) pro forma financial statements which show the projected income and expense for the following year;

(6) proof that the applicant has the necessary skills and training to conduct the business as required;

(7) qualified collateral appraisal;

(8) a detailed written statement describing how the loan funds will be used and the borrower's plan of repayment from projected cash flow.

(b) Each applicant must provide necessary proof of insurance coverage naming the agricultural revolving loan fund as loss payee.

(c) Supporting documentation must reflect the extent to which the business will contribute to both the community and agriculture within Alaska.

(d) Applications shall be submitted to the Alaska Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund, Department of Natural Resources, P.O. Box 1088, Palmer, Alaska 99645. (Eff. 4/29/77, Reg. 62)

11 AAC 39.040. LOAN LIMITATIONS, TERMS, RATES, AND ELIGIBILITY. (d) Approval of loans by the board shall be by a majority of votes of the board membership.

(e) Following board approval of an application for a loan, the application shall be forwarded for approval to the commissioner, along with all necessary supporting information in full or summary form, including a summary of the board action and reasons for it. (7) "loan fund" means the agricultural revolving loan fund;
