You have asked that I estimate the affect on the mill rate as a result of the current school construction projects. The school estimates a cash requirement through the end of calendar year 1984 of \$40,900,000. I have projected this out to show bond sales and debt service requirements.

To estimate mill rates, I assumed that the annual debt service for a million dollars will be the same as the cost for the bonds we sold in calendar year '81 and '82, and assumed the assessed valuation will remain level at our current estimated values.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, ALASKA RELATING TO STATE FUNDING AND CONTROL OF SCHOOLS WITHIN BOROUGHS.

WHEREAS, HB 279 proposes for the State to assume 100% funding for schools within boroughs, and,

WHEREAS, there is currently a time lag of at least two years before the Boroughs are reimbursed for bonded expenses for school construction, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Houston City Council that the Matanuska-Susitna Borough and other Boroughs to retain control of the schools through local school districts,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, ALASKA SUPPORTS A MINIMUM OF 90% STATE FUNDING FOR SCHOOLS, SUPPORTS ZERO TIME LAG IN REIMBURSEMENT, AND SUPPORTS MAXIMUM LOCAL CONTROL OF SCHOOLS.

You have asked for a section-by-section analysis of the amendment prepared by your subcommittee to CSHB 279 (Finance) am related to school construction.

Sec. 1. No substantive changes, only rewritten for clarity.

Sec. 2. Adds a requirement that the Department of Education administer grants to regional educational attendance areas and school districts for construction, rehabilitation or improvement of school or education-related facilities.

Sec. 3. Adds a new article dealing with the duties of the Department of Education relating to construction, rehabilitation, and improvement of schools and education-related facilities.

Sec. 14.07.180. Allows the assembly or council of a municipality that is a school district or a regional school board to request a project. The request must be accompanied with an evaluation of the condition of school or education-related facilities in the school district or regional educational attendance area and a determination of need for the project. The Department of Education must rank projects requested, prepare estimates of the costs of the projects, recommend appropriations for certain projects, and provide copies of reports generated by this process to the governor and to the legislature. The department is required to consider certain factors in ranking projects.

Sec. 14.07.190. Allows the assembly or council or a municipality that is a school district or a regional school board to request the assumption of planning, design and construction responsibilities for school or education-related facilities. The Department of Education must provide for assumption of responsibilities by a municipality and may provide for assumption of responsibilities by a regional educational attendance area if requested.

Only a limited amount of money may be used for construction management costs of a project assumed, depending on the total amount of appropriations made for the project.

Sec. 4. A regional school board may recommend to the Department of Education projects for construction, rehabilitation, and improvement of schools and education-related facilities and plan, design, and construct the project when responsibility is assumed after applying to the department for this assumption. Under existing law a regional school board may provide for construction, rehabilitation or upgrading of facilities when grants are made to it by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

Sec. 5. Eliminates provision for assumption of responsibilities relating to planning and construction of an educational facility by a regional educational attendance area from the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

Sec. 6. Eliminates provision for joint assumption of responsibilities with the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for the planning, design and construction of an educational facility by a regional educational attendance area.

Sec. 7. Eliminates provision for making appropriated funds for costs of an educational facility project available to a regional educational attendance area or a municipality by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. The department is still authorized to make the funds available to a municipality for a public works project.

Sec. 8. Reimbursement to a municipality for costs of school construction for previous years is increased from 80 percent to 90 percent. 90 percent of payments made during the current fiscal year for retirement of principal and interest on indebtedness incurred after December 31, 1981 for projects that exceed \$25,000 will be reimbursed. 90 percent of cash payments made after June 30, 1982 for projects that exceed \$25,000 will be reimbursed.

Sec. 9. Adds new requirements that reimbursement for current school construction costs be reduced by money used for single purpose sporting or recreation uses that are not suitable for other activities. Reimbursement is not reduced for construction of a small swimming pool, tank, or water storage facility used for water sports. Reimbursement is reduced by the difference between the amount of money used to construct a competition size or larger swimming pool and the amount of money that would have been used to construct a small pool, tank or water storage facility. For purposes of reimbursement, indebtedness for bonds is incurred after the bonds are sold, reimbursement for cash payments are made only after payment is made to the vendor and reimbursement may not be made for costs that are incurred under a contract after the contract has been released.

Sec. 10. The statute dealing with school construction, repair, and improvement projects carried out by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities or granted to a regional school board by the department is repealed. The provision requiring compliance with a notice provision that has been previously repealed is repealed in this amendment.

Sec. 11. The effective date is July 1, 1982.

This draft adopts the language supplied with the request. I do not think that this bill adequately addresses the mechanics of the transfer of funds for school construction between DOTPF, DOE, and the school district or REAA. We have supplied the bill as requested to meet your deadline.

III. ANALYSIS (See Fiscal Note Preparation Instructions, Section III)

This bill would have the state pay 100% of local debt service related to school construction as well as cash payments made for construction. Payments would be accelerated to the year after, vs. a two year lag as it is now.

Above includes bond issues outstanding as of 12/31/80 only and does not include cash payments that may have been made unrelated to debt service as they are unknown. FY 82 includes FY 80 and FY 81 amounts for "catch-up"; FY 83 shows debt service paid for FY 82, etc. The "80%" portion is as the current law is written; the "20%" portion shows the incremental effect of this bill. No future bond issues have been factored in as they are indeterminate.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. The sum of \$6,178,400 is appropriated from the general fund
11 for payment as a grant to the Fairbanks North Star Borough for operating and
12 capital expenditures for the 1982 Arctic Winter Games.

13 * Sec. 2. The appropriation made by this Act shall be disbursed in
14 accordance with AS 37.05.315.

15 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
16 070(c).

physical fitness and sports participation.

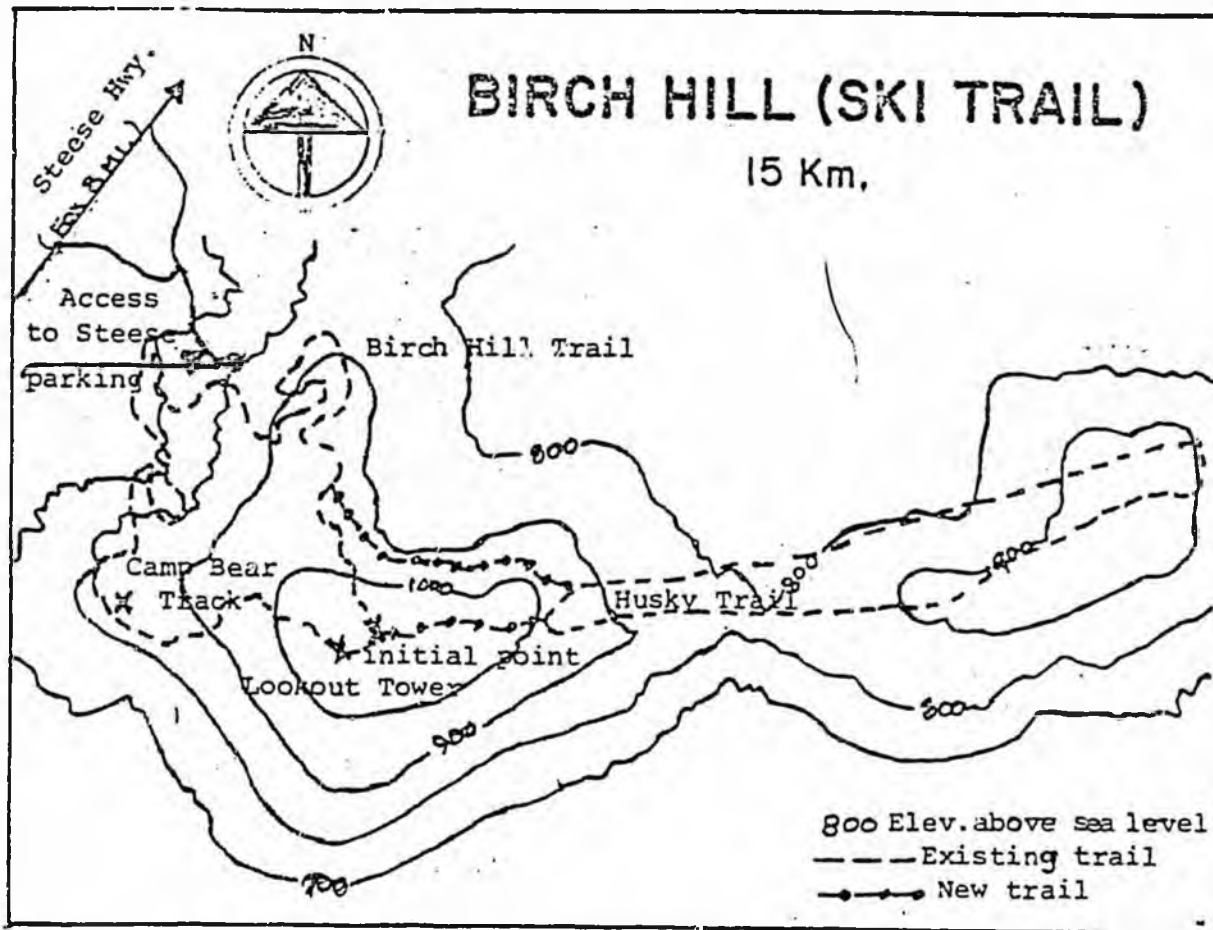
In this respect our staff conducts a continuous public service

BIRCH HILL SKI TRAIL

CAPITAL REQUEST: \$105,400

In 1982, the Arctic Winter Games will be held in Fairbanks. The Birch Hill Ski Trail has been designated as the site where cross-country ski races will be conducted.

In order to adequately test racers' technical, tactical and physical capabilities, some trail renovation is necessary.

Approximately 4 km's of Birch Hill and 6 km's of Husky Trail need renovation. An additional 5 km's of trail could be cut to create a continuous 15 km loop. The entire trail should be 15 feet wide to provide for dual tracks and must avoid steep grades and sharp turns. This entails considerable renovation of the existing trail.
