

- 2) The borrower may dispose of grain held as collateral with the consent of the department. Proceeds from the sale of collateral will be applied to the loan.
- 3) Loans will not exceed three years. Annual payments of accrued interest during the term of the loan will be paid by the borrower.
- 4) Standards for the grain grading, prices, volume or weight control are in conformance with US Dept of Agriculture standards.
- 5) The proposed bill establishes the Alaska Grain Reserve Fund for the purpose of financing loans. The fund will consist of legislative appropriations. The Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources will administer the fund.
