RE: Drafting error on HSC for CS for SS for SB 225(RES)

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This is to notify the Finance Committee that there are three drafting errors in House Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for Sponsor Substitute for Senate Bill 225 (Resources). The final draft does not represent correctly the actions of the House Resource Committee.

Attached is the corrected copy of the House Resources Committee version of SB 225. The final draft deleted language from the Senate bill that should not have been deleted. Therefore the following changes should be made:

Page 1, Line 13, after the word "area, insert "and"

Page 5, Line 5, after "sections 1 - 12" insert "excluding ASLS 82-221"

Page 5, Line 7, after "sections 15 - 21" insert " excluding ASLS 82-221"

The above changes return the bill to the original Senate version this committee received. Within the amendment the House Resources Committee put on this bill, (page 7, lines 7 - 14) there also is a drafting error. On page 7, line 10, the date should be July 1, 1989. instead of July 1, 1994.

Therefore, the attached work draft represents correctly what the House Resources Committee passed from Committee.

The House Resources Committee has passed out HCS SSSB 225 (Res), to create the Matanuska Valley Moose Range, but several errors in drafting have been pointed out to me. I understand that the Chairman of the Resources Committee will be communicating with you to point out these mistakes, but I wish to be sure that you know the language that was agreed to by the Department.

The Committee intended to pass out the Senate version of the bill [CS SSSB 225 (Res), dated 4/3/84], with the addition of language embodied in Sec 16.20.370 of the proposed bill. In drafting, the language of the amendment and the bill itself changed somewhat, and the product does not represent the compromise agreed to among the various parties, including the sponsor and the members of the House Resources Committee.


Three changes to the bill before you would restore the bill to reflect the negotiated agreement among the parties.

1. p.1, line 13 -- after "area," add and
2. p.5, line 5 and line 7 -- at the end of each of these two lines, add , excluding ASLS 82-221
3. p.7, line 10 -- delete "1994" and insert 1989
